


Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Could form several hundred miles SW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula in a few days
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 5 days: Low (20%)

<u>Tropical Storm Peter</u> (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

<u>Tropical Depression Seventeen</u> (Advisory #1 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 330 miles SW of the southernmost Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving NNW at 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Could become a tropical storm later today or on Mon

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Forecast to emerge off the west coast of Africa later today or tonight
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 5 days: Low (20%)



Tropical Storm Peter

Tropical Storm Peter (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 630 miles E of northern Leeward Islands
- Moving NW at 15 mph
- A turn back toward the WNW is forecast to occur this afternoon with that motion continuing into Wed
- On the forecast track, Peter is expected to pass well to the north of the northern Leeward Islands on Mon and Tue
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Some additional strengthening is forecast during the next day or so, followed by a slow weakening trend by late Mon and on Tue
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 45 miles





Tropical Storm Peter - Preparations

<u>Situation:</u> On the forecast track, Peter is expected to pass well to the north of the northern Leeward Islands on Monday and Tuesday. The outer rainbands could produce rainfall totals of 1-2 inches across portions of the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico late Sunday into Tuesday; could lead to areas of urban and small stream flooding.

- PR EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19 & earthquake recovery)
- USVI EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)


FEMA Region II Preparations:

- RRCC at Level III, day shift, with select ESFs, and DCE
- Deployed to USVI: IMAT A, IMAT B, DEC, LNOS, ESFs 3, 8, 12, 14, and DCE
- Deployed to PR: DEC, LNOS, ESFs 2, 3, 8, 12, 14, and DCE

FEMA/Federal Preparations:

- NRCC at Level III (COVID); postured to support increased staffing, if required
- FEMA NWC coordinating reporting and awareness with Region II and NHC
- Region V IMAT deployed to DC Caribbean in Puerto Rico
- National IMAT Blue, National IMAT Gold, and two back-up Regional IMATs available
- SMT and ISB teams deployed to Puerto Rico
- Mobile Emergency Communications (MERS) personnel and assets deployed to PR and USVI
- USCG: PR and USVI ports at Port Condition X-Ray (closed to inbound traffic) (Region II SPOTREP 5:16 a.m. ET)





76th United Nations General Assembly

<u>Situation:</u> The 76th Session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) is being held at UN Headquarters in New York, NY from Sep 14-30, 2021. The first day of the high-level General Debate will be on Tuesday, Sep 21, 2021.

- Sep 19-25 has been designated as an NSSE
- 83 world leaders are expected to be present, with a total attendance of approximately 2,000

Preparations:

- FEMA is lead federal agency for consequence management
- USSS is lead federal agency for security operations
- FBI is lead federal agency for intelligence, law enforcement, and overall crisis management
- NYPD is the lead for local law enforcement
- FAA established a 7 and 20 nautical mile Temporary Flight Restriction from 8:00 a.m. –
 5:00 p.m. ET for the duration of this event




- NWC at Enhanced Watch; NRCC at Level III (COVID-19); available to support
- Region II RWC at Enhanced Watch; RRCC at Level III (Tropical Storm Peter); available to support

- DEC is providing communications and mobile command functions to Region II and other Federal agencies as directed
- National IMAT Blue, CMCU, DEST and US&R on alert






National Weather Forecast












Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

6-10 Day Temperature Probability





6-10 Day Precipitation Probability






