
<u>Tropical Storm Leslie</u> (Advisory #36 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- 445 miles NE of Bermuda
- Moving NNW at 14 mph







- Swells will continue to affect portions of Hawaii today




National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast
