Tropical Storm Michael (Advisory #19 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 30 miles W of Augusta, GA; moving NE at 21 mph
- Max sustained winds 50 mph
- Some additional weakening is expected today while the center remains over land
- Forecast to intensify as it becomes a post-tropical low over the Atlantic late tonight or early Friday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 160 miles

Forecast Impacts

- Storm Surge Watch in effect for Ocracoke Inlet, NC to Duck, NC
- Tropical Storm Warning in effect from Altamaha Sound, GA to Duck, NC and the Pamlico and Albemarle Sounds
- Storm surge of 2-4 feet is possible on the Sound side of NC Outer Banks from Ocracoke Inlet to Duck
- Gale to storm force winds expected over portions of southeastern VA, extreme northeastern NC, and Delmarva Peninsula as Michael becomes post-tropical off the Mic-Atlantic coast late tonight or early Friday
- Total rainfall accumulations of 4-7 inches, with isolated maximum amounts of 9 inches, are possible; this could lead to life-threatening flash floods
- · Isolated tornadoes are possible today over portions of SC, NC, and VA
- Swells will affect the coasts of eastern, northern, and western Gulf of Mexico through this morning; these swells are likely to cause life-threatening surf and rip current conditions







Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific












Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast


