Flooding – Hawaii

<u>Current Situation:</u> The heaviest rain affected Maui and the Big Island on Monday but will shift to Oahu and Kauai today. Widespread rainfall total amounts of 10-15 inches are anticipated with higher amounts in isolated areas. Flash Flood Warning continues for Oahu through the morning, and a Flood Watch continues for Oahu and Kauai counties



HI EOC at Partial Activation (Severe Weather and COVID-19); State of Emergency declared

FEMA / Federal Response:

- FEMA Region IX RWC and NWC continue to monitor; Region IX IMAT-1 is available
- US&R is prepared to deploy with IST and swift water rescue task force





Water Contamination - Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, HI

<u>Current Situation</u>: Petroleum contamination of water was confirmed on December 3 in the Red Hill Water Shaft (one well within the US Navy closed-loop water system on Oahu) and Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam (JBPHH) on-base community housing. The Red Hill shaft was closed November 28. The Navy continues to flush clean water through the distribution system and conduct testing; it could take 4-10 days to meet EPA drinking standards. (NOC Note Update NOC 1241-21)

The Honolulu Board of Water Supply (BWS) reduced production of the Halawa Shaft by 50% as a precautionary measure. The Halawa Shaft provides metro Honolulu with 20% of its drinking water. BWS does not anticipate any shortfalls but will continue monitoring. The water contamination is unrelated to the ongoing flooding (due to a Kona low) occurring over the Hawaiian Islands and is contained to Joint Base Peal Harbor-Hickam


Lifeline Impacts: (Region IX SPOTREP Update #5; as of 9:49 p.m. ET)

Safety & Security:

- JBPHH Security Team increased patrols through neighborhoods as families move to lodging Health and Medical:
- Hawaii Department of Health (DOH) recommends all Navy water system users avoid using the water for drinking, cooking, or hygiene
- 34 personnel treated at Tripler Army Medical Center
- Navy and DOH are investigating and are performing sampling and analyses

Food, Water, Shelter:

- 22,000 gallons of water was distributed; 73k gallons delivered to date
- Honolulu Board of Water Supply provided 3k 2.5-gallon emergency water containers to the Navy
- Navy has authorized temporary lodging and is providing clean drinking water to affected families;
 1,335 (+335) families are in hotels


HI EOC at Partial Activation (Severe Weather & COVID-19)

- USACE to provide temporary water filtration system
- USCG deployed personnel to the Crisis Action Team to provide incident management support
- EPA deployed two on-scene commanders




National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






FEMA Common Operating Picture






