The Russian River is steadily receding; currently at 35.64 ft with the expectation to drop below flood stage (32ft) Friday.

- Local Media reports approximately 2,000 structures damaged/destroyed in Guerneville and surrounding communities
- Multiple water rescues conducted

Food, Water, and Shelter

- · All mandatory evacuations for Yolo, Shasta, and Butte Counties have been lifted
- 3,297 persons / 2,062 households remain under mandatory evacuation orders in communities near the Russian River (CalOES).
- 2 shelters; 134 occupants (ARC Shelter Count as of 5:16 a.m. EST)


- Approximately 3k (-1k) customers without power in Sonoma County
- Pacific Gas & Electric has 7 EOCs activated in support of restoration efforts
 Transportation

State/Local Response

- CA EOC at Partial Activation (dayshift); Governor declared a state of emergency Thursday for five additional counties due to flooding from the Russian River
- CA National Guard provided 6 high water vehicles to assist with rescue operations





National Weather Forecast








Precipitation Forecast




Significant River Flood Outlook





Winter Precipitation Outlook






Forecast Snowfall







