# Flooding – Central U.S.



#### **Current Situation:**

Conditions throughout the region continue to improve as river levels recede within the Missouri River Basin. Kansas and Missouri are continuing to monitor the status of the levees as the crest moves downriver. Evacuees in Nebraska and Missouri are beginning to return to homes to assess flood damage.

### **Lifeline Impacts:**

#### Safety and Security:


- NE HHS has identified tetanus as a potential health hazard during response and recovery; monitoring
- NE: 18 school districts closed due to flooding

#### Food, Water, and Sheltering:

- Mandatory evacuations ongoing in numerous counties impacted by flood waters
- Shelters:
  - o NE: 7 (-2) open with 347 (-128) occupants
  - O IA: 4 open with 36 (+5) occupants (ESF-6, as of 6:53 a.m. EDT)

Health and Medical: Confirmed fatalities: 2 in NE, 1 in IA

<u>Transportation</u>: NE: Multiple road and bridge closures statewide; no major roadways or Interstates impacted
