### Flooding & Tornadoes – Central U.S.



#### **Current Situation:**

Today there is a slight risk of severe thunderstorms over a portion of the Upper Midwest and Great Lakes. Despite a drying period over flood-stricken MO, OK and AR, major flood stages will continue in these areas for weeks.


#### Lifeline Impacts:

#### Safety and Security

- LA: USACE has delayed the opening of the Morganza Control Structure to June 6, opening a single bay; by June 9, numerous bays will be open
- IL: a number of levees forecast to overtop in Scott and Green counties in primarily agricultural areas; USACE working with local officials
- IL: portions of the Mississippi River expected to be among top five highest on record; portions of Illinois River forecast to reach near record to record flooding
- MO: Missouri River levels are still rising but are not forecast to crest for at least a few days

#### Food, Water & Sheltering:

- 24 shelters open with 429 (occupants (ARC Shelter report May 31)
  - OK: 8 / 136 (-43); KS: 2 / 6 (+6); MO: 5 / 75 (+4); OH: 5 / 108 (+11); AR: 3 / 81 (+8); IN: 1 / 0;
     IL 2 /2
- KS: Evacuations for Independence (pop 9,483) and Coffeyville (pop 10,295) due to Verdigris River flooding
- OK: voluntary evacuations remain in effect for 11 counties; mandatory for 1 community (Webber Falls; pop. 600)
- AR: voluntary evacuations remain in effect for 11 counties
- IL: voluntary evacuations for portions of city of Columbia (Monroe County)
- MO: mandatory evacuations for West Quincy (industrial area) due to levee breach; impacts to BNSF and Amtrak service; rest of impacted area is agricultural
- OK: 65 wastewater plants are having ongoing issues, most of which are bypasses; 4 communities have wastewater plants shut down
- OH: Power restored to the primary water plants in Montgomery County; boil water advisory has been lifted in Dayton (affecting 190k people)



### Flooding & Tornadoes – Central U.S.



#### Health & Medical

- OH: 1 fatality and 7 injuries
- OK: 6 confirmed fatalities and numerous injuries
- KS: 2 (+1) fatalities; 44 injuries
- MO: 9 fatalities; 20 injuries

#### Transportation

- Numerous road closures remain throughout impacted areas; road closures near West Quincy, MO due to levee breach; alternate routes available
- Coast Guard closed portions of the Mississippi and Illinois Rivers due to extremely highwater levels
- · Commercial navigation has been shut down along the Arkansas River
- Amtrak service suspended between Kansas City, KS to St. Louis, MO and between St. Louis and Fort Worth, TX
- Train track damage north of West Quincy due to levee breach; impacts to BNSF (cargo); alternate tracks available, will cause track congestion and slow cargo movement

### Severe Weather Outlook










### Hazards Outlook – June 2-6






