- Shovel Creek Fire – North Star Borough, AK
- Flooding – Central U.S. *(Updated weekly on Wednesdays)*

## Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – No activity affecting U.S. interests
- Eastern Pacific – No threats to U.S. interests
  - Tropical Storm Barbara
  - Disturbance 1: Medium (60%)
- Central Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests

## Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Central Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley
- Flash flooding possible – Central Plains to Great Lakes

## Situation:

- Fire began June 21 and is burning in the Fairbanks North Star Borough approximately 20 miles NW of Fairbanks, AK (pop. 33k)

## Impacts:

### *Food, Water, Sheltering:*

- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 52 homes; voluntary for 145 homes; additional 400-500 homes expected to be included in mandatory/voluntary evacuations later today
- 1 shelter open with 6 occupants (ARC *Midnight Shelter Count* as of 6:35 am EDT)

### *Communications:*

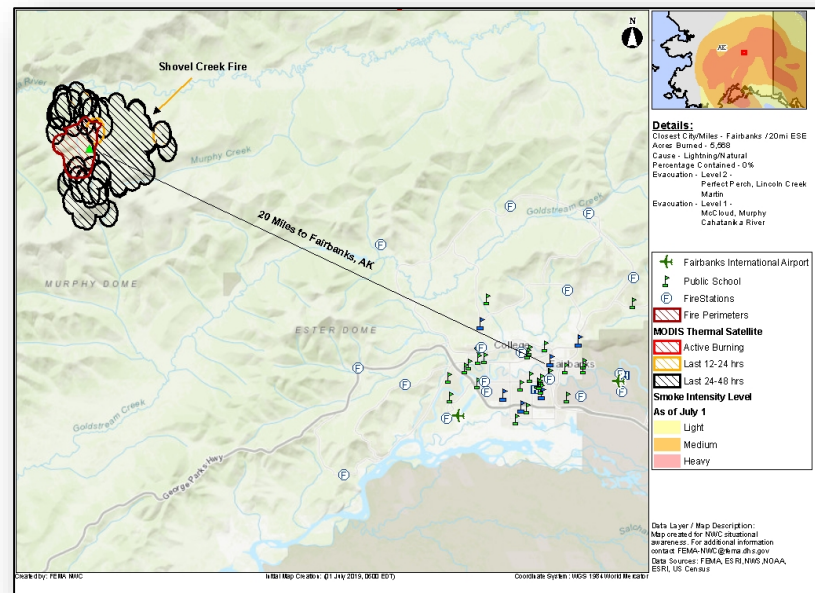
- 2 communication facilities (antennas and cell networks) threatened, may impact 911 calls
- Infrastructure and utilities threatened, including one powerline for McCloud sub-division

### *Transportation:*

- Smoke may delay flights into Fairbanks International Airport
- Over 20 roads and bridges threatened

## Response:

- FMAG approved on June 28
- AK EOC at Normal Operations
- FEMA Region X and NWC at Steady State and continue to monitor



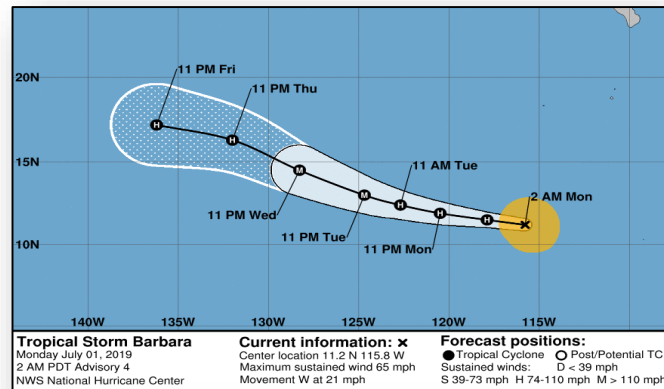
# Eastern Pacific



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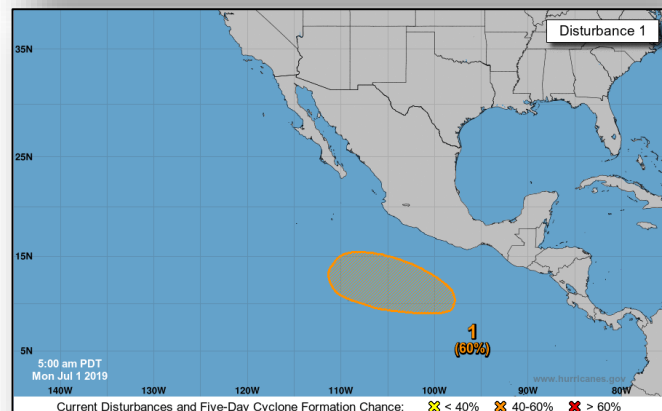
## **Tropical Storm Barbara** (Advisory #4 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- 895 miles SSW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving W at 21 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 65 mph
- Expected to become a hurricane later today
- Tropical storm force winds extend 140 miles



## **Disturbance 1** (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

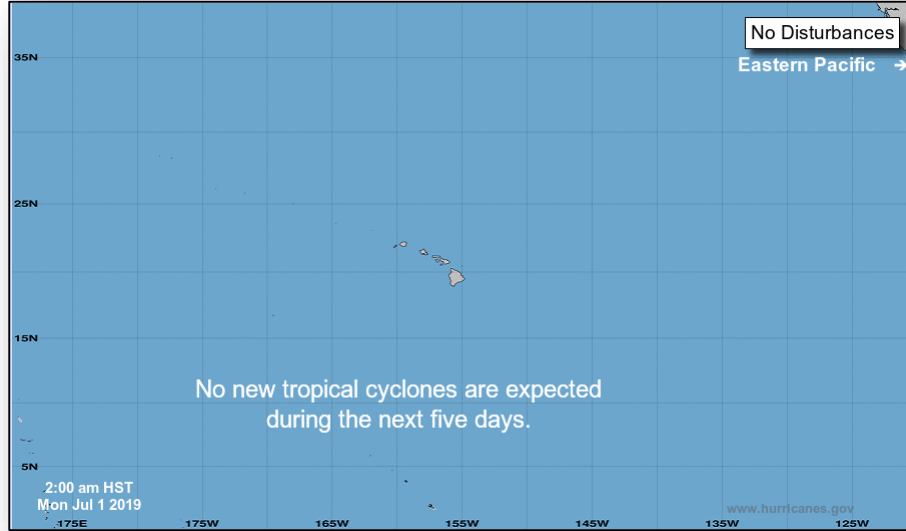
- Expected to form later this week several hundred miles south of the southern coast of Mexico
- Moving WNW
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (60%)
- No threat to U.S. interests

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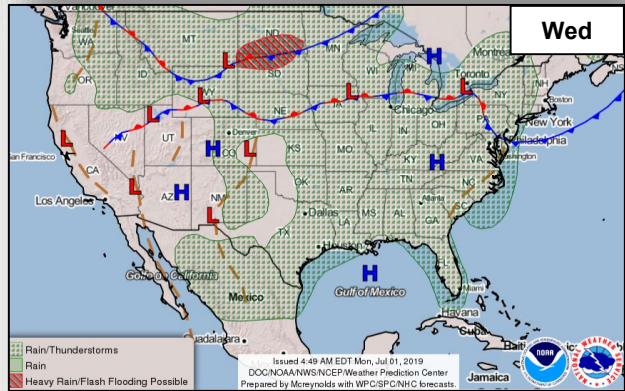

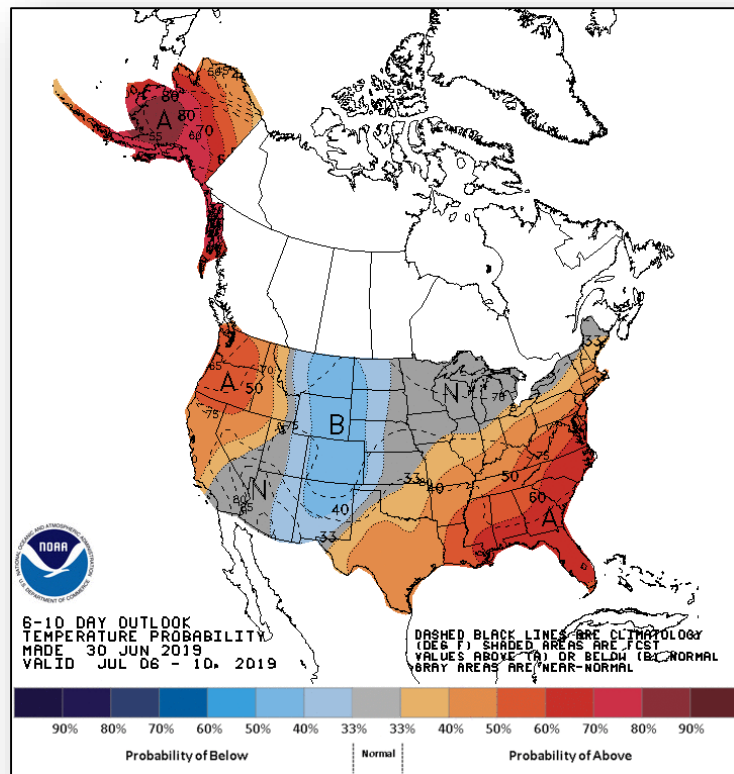

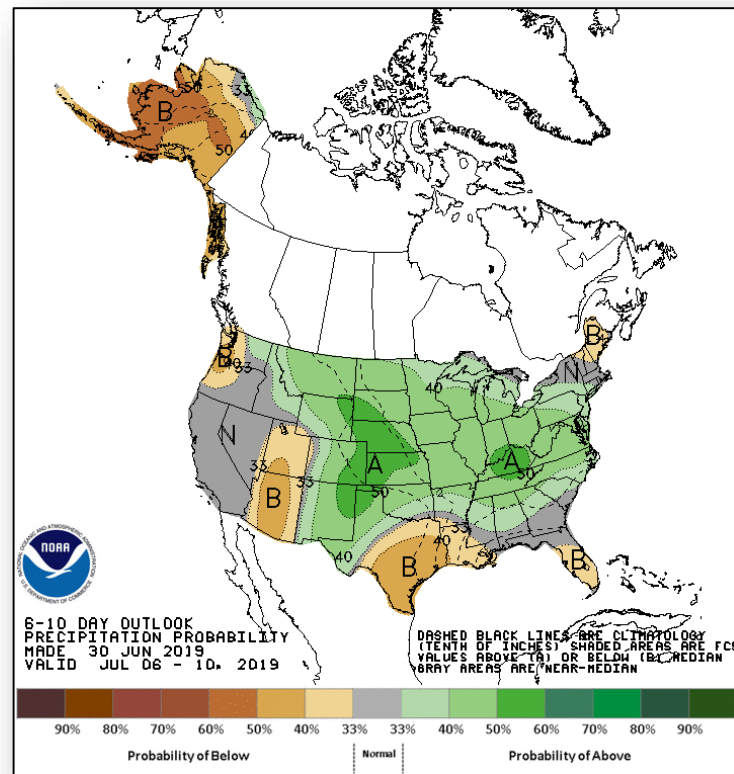
# Long Range Outlooks – Jul 6-10



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**6-10 Day Temperature Probability**



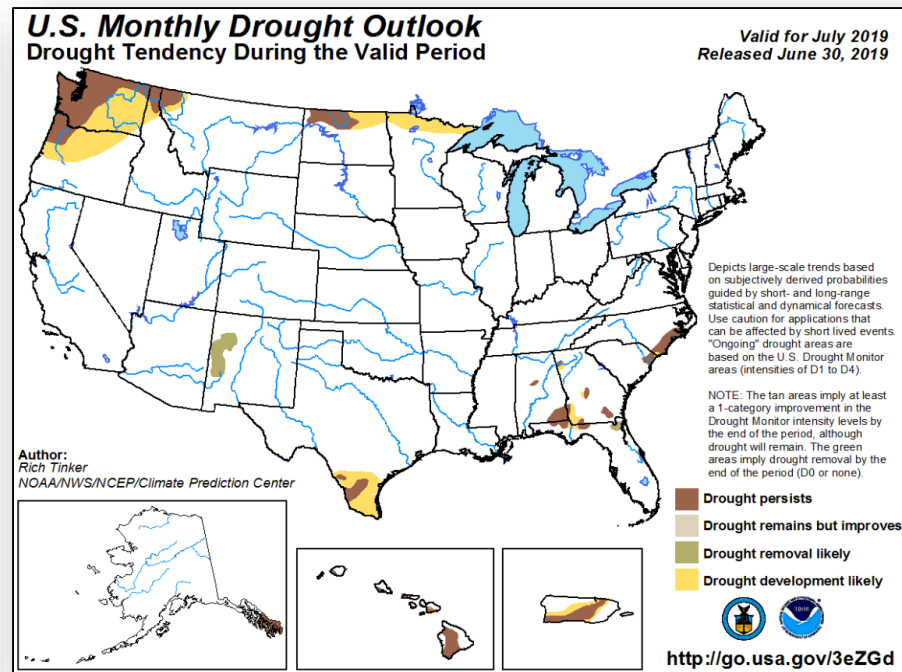
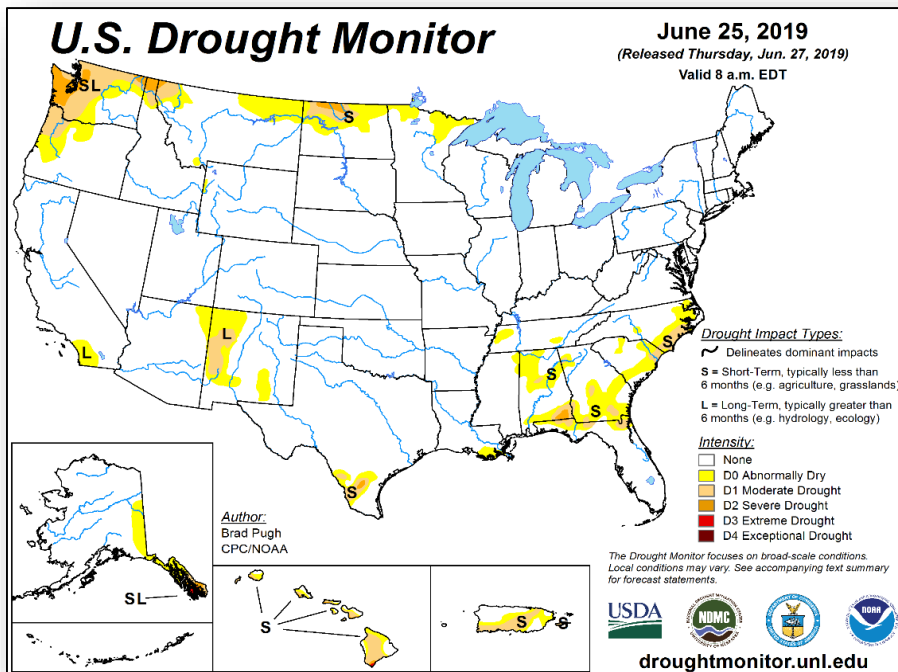
**6-10 Day Precipitation Probability**

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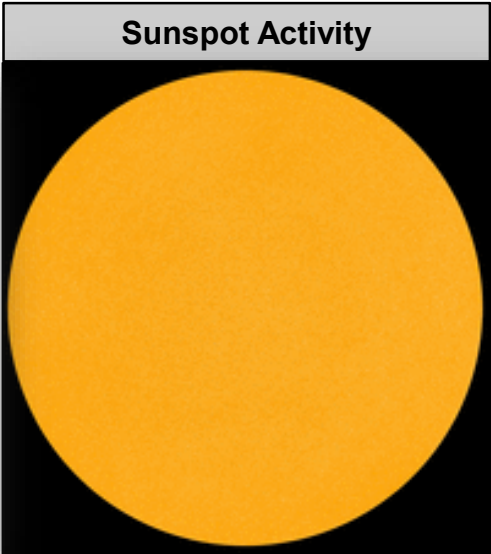
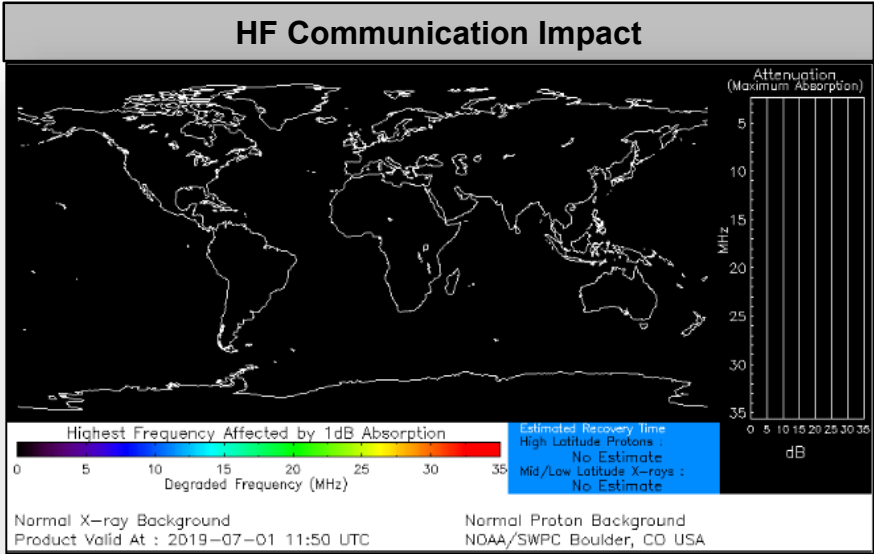
