### Earthquake – Southern California



<u>Situation:</u> A magnitude 7.1 earthquake occurred at 11:19 p.m. EDT, 10.6 miles NNE of Ridgecrest, CA (population 28k). Numerous aftershocks of up to M5.1 have occurred. USGS expects several hundred aftershocks to occur over the next week.

#### Safety & Security:

- Natural gas leaks and multiple fires in Kern County (CAL OES)
- Naval Air Station China Lake remains closed, assessing damage (CAL OES)
- 5,050 damaged structures; \$1.4M in total econ losses with the majority (\$99.2M) in Kern County

#### Food, water, and Sheltering:

- Shelters: 1 shelter / 129 occupants (ARC as of 6:00 a.m. EDT)
- Cooling centers set up at Burroughs H.S and Walmart in Ridgecrest

#### Health & Medical:


- No fatalities reported
- · Ridgecrest Regional Hospital is without power; remains evacuated

· Minimal power outages reported at this time

  - N-IMAT and Regional Log on the ground coordination at Edwards (ISB) and Bakersfield (State Staging Area)
- Staging Management Team from Atlanta deploying to Edwards (ISB)
- RRFs:
  - Immediate response package (food, water, cots, blankets, gens) to Edwards
  - o Trailers to the state at Bakersfield per their request
- LSCMS call center is standing up for 24 hour operations


