- Reported water system outage in Montecito (13,500 residents)



- Santa Barbara County EOC at Full Activation, 24/7
- Ventura County EOC returned to Normal Operations
- Elements of CA TF-2 & TF-5 are in use (state assets)
- Shelters: 4 open with 57 (+54) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count)
- Evacuations:
 - Santa Barbara County Over 6k residents remain under Mandatory Evacuation and 23k are under a Voluntary Evacuation Warning
 - Los Angeles County Approximately 40 homes in the city of Burbank remain under Mandatory Evacuation and Mandatory Evacuations continue for 23 homes near the city of Sunland
 - Ventura County All evacuations have been lifted





Forecast Ice Accumulation


