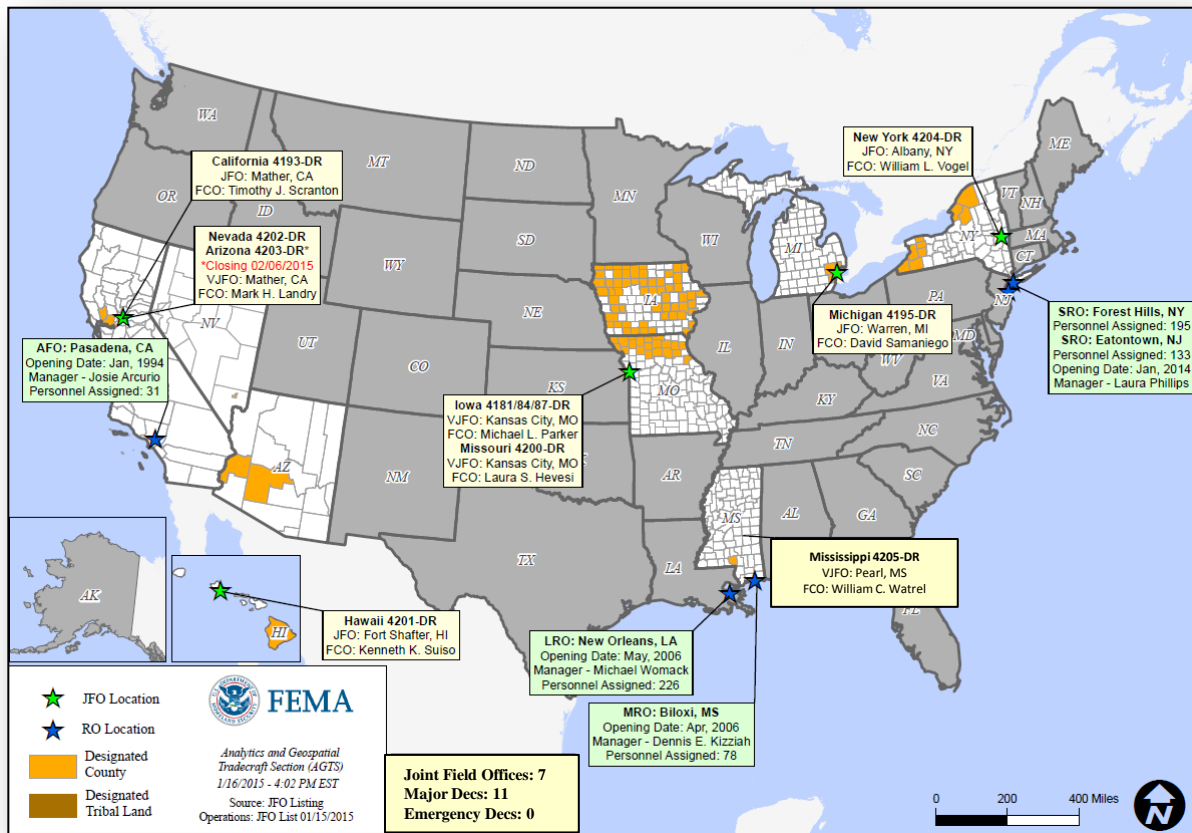

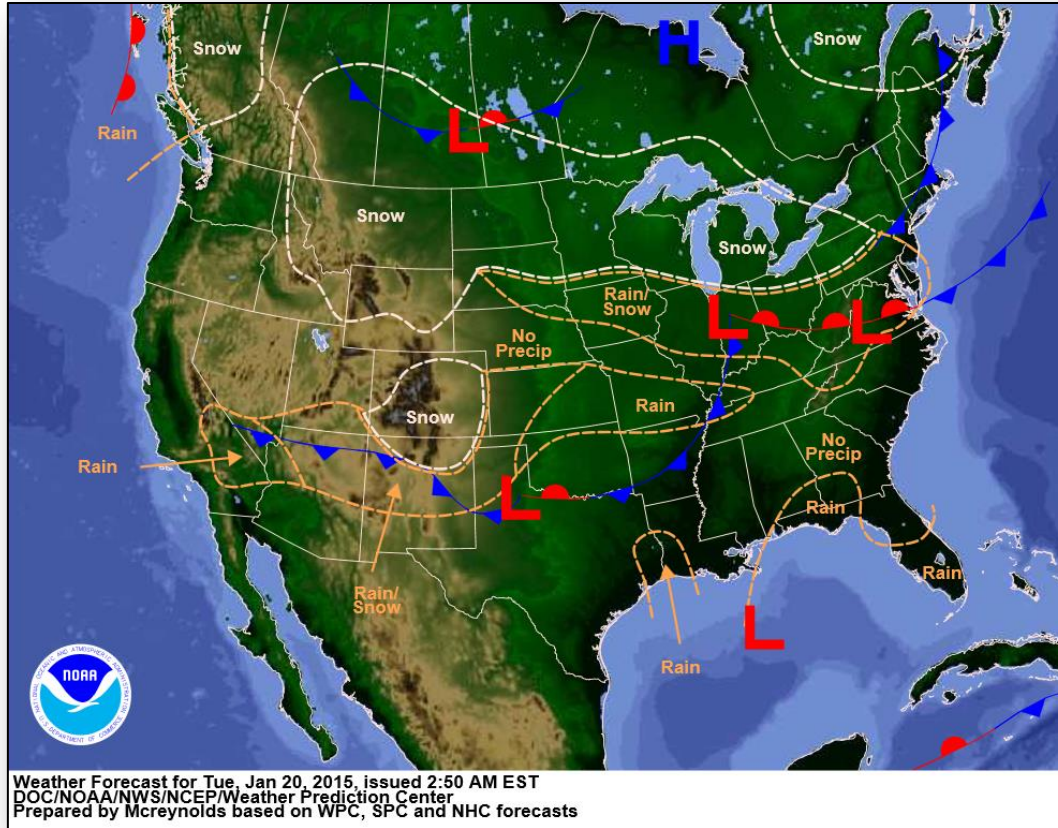

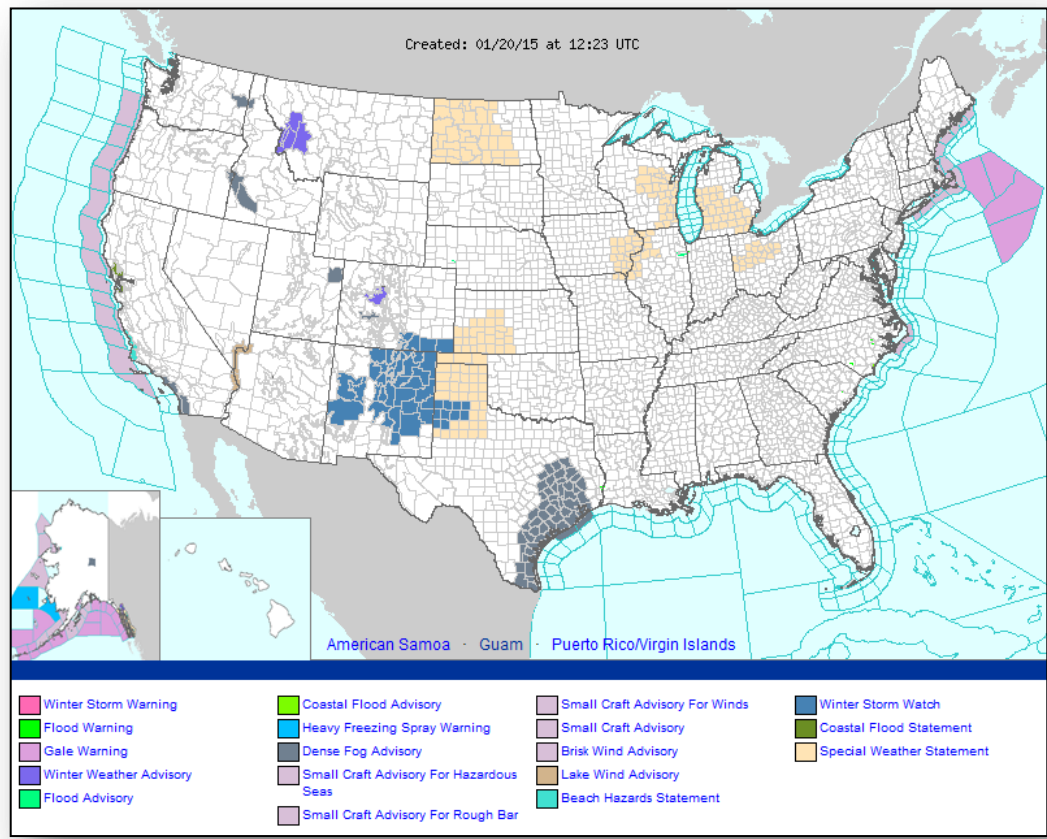

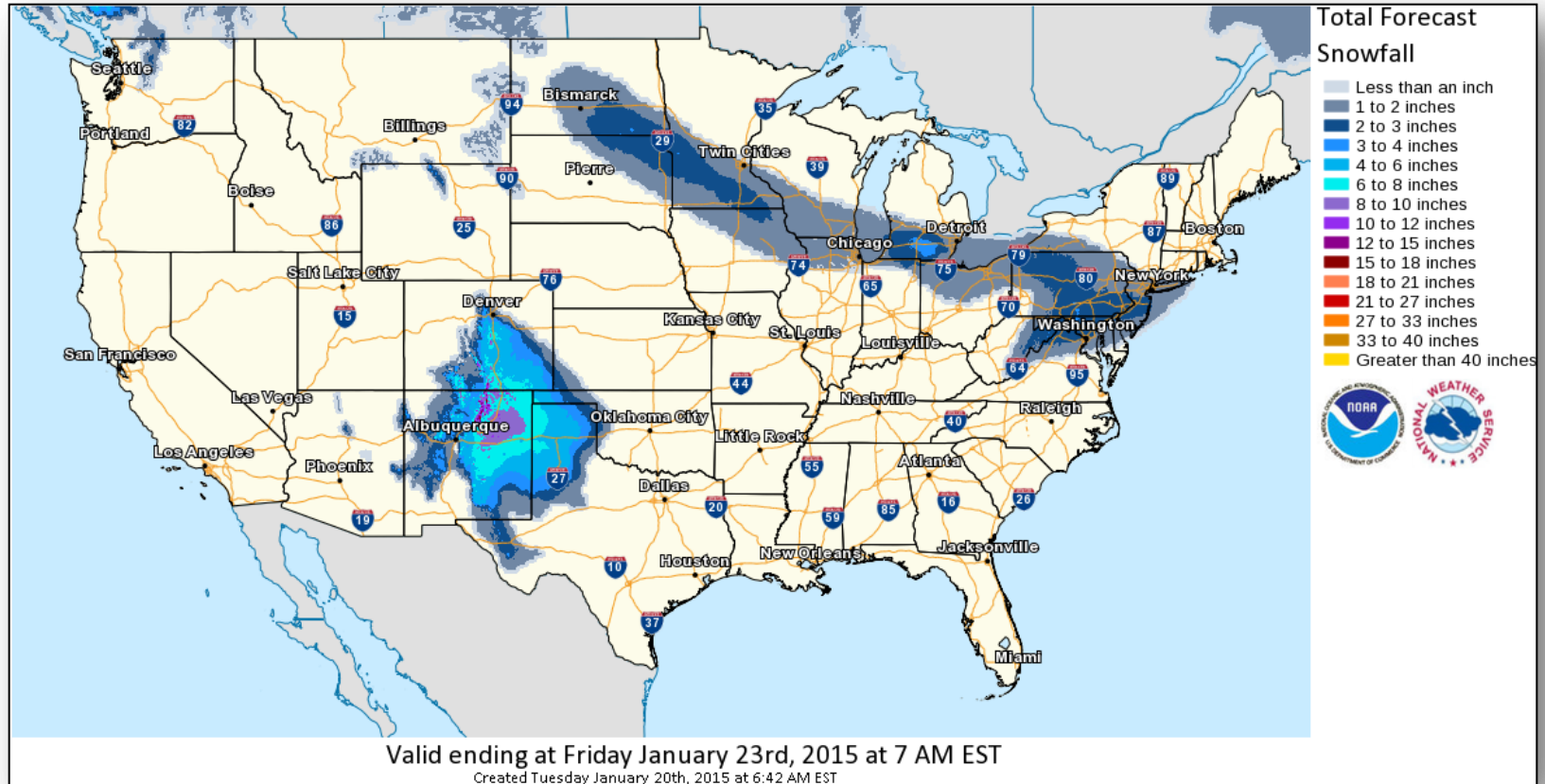

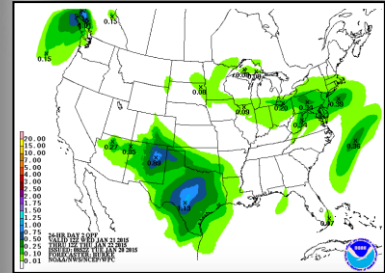
Total Forecast Snowfall



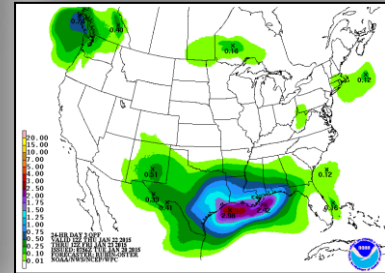
Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day

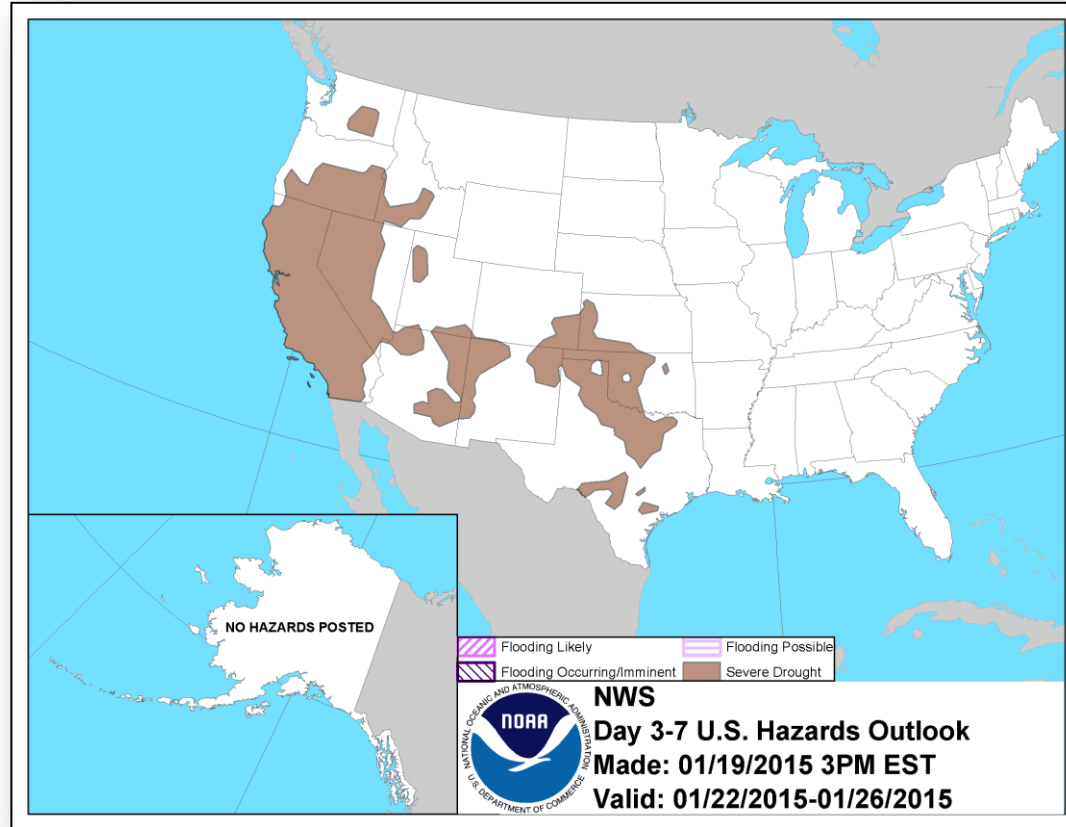

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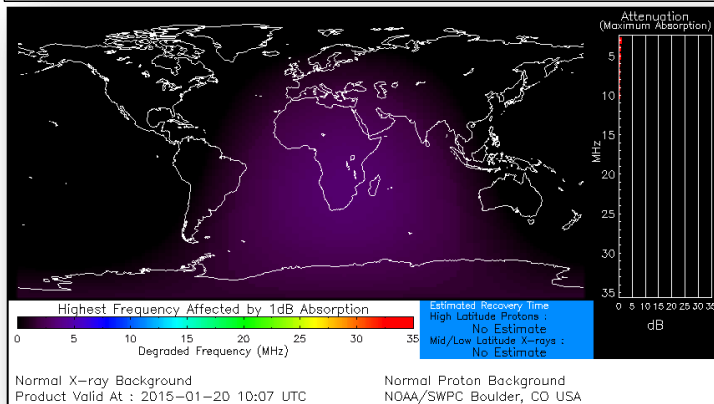

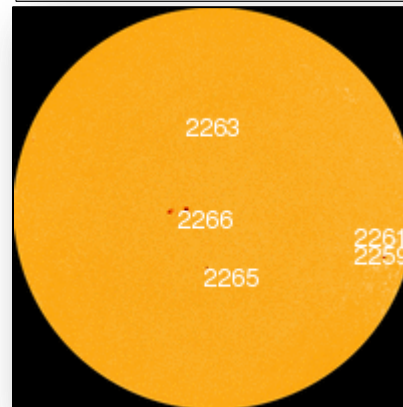

Sunspot Activity

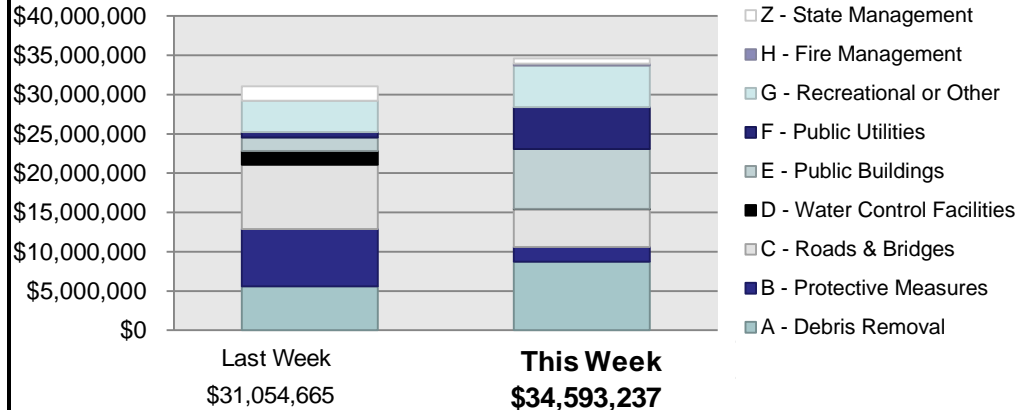

Public Assistance Obligated per Category In the Past 2 Weeks – 1/5/2015 through 1/19/2015



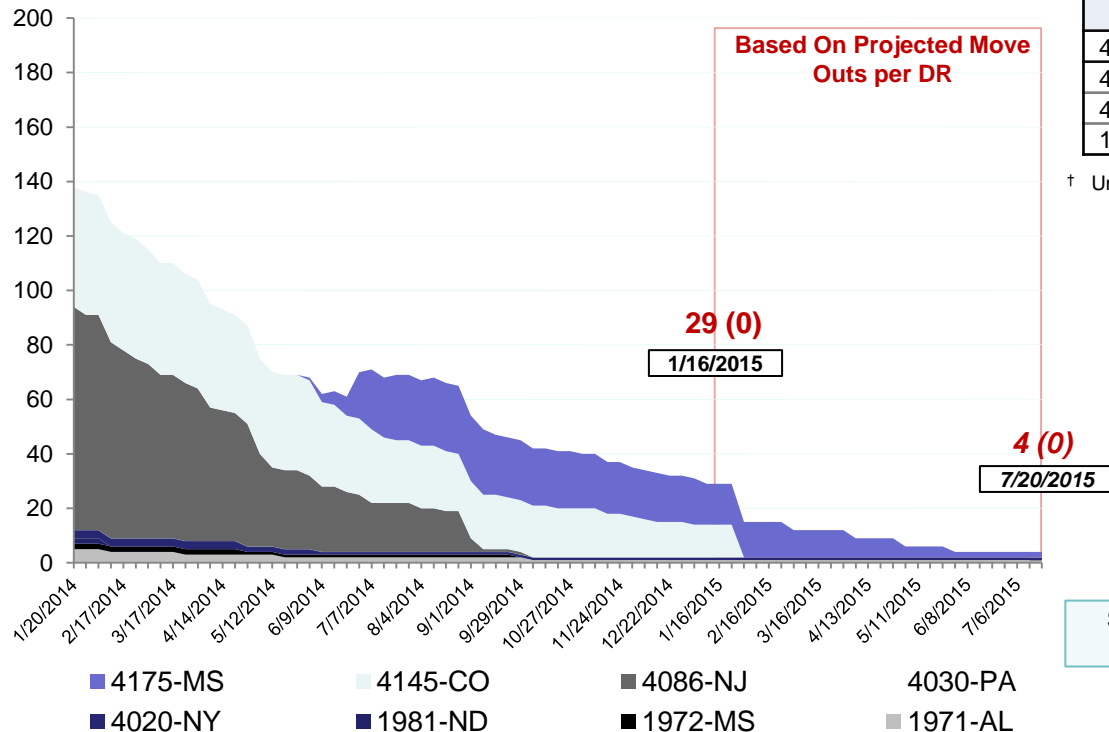
PA Highlights

Direct Housing

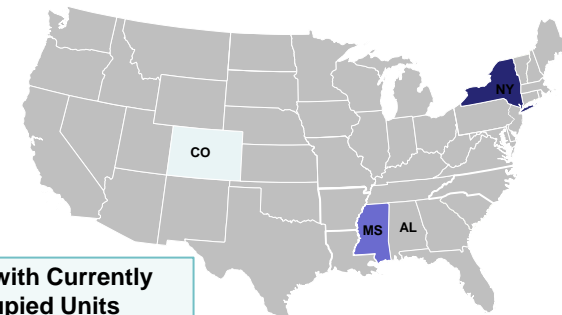


Total Households in FEMA Direct Housing per State

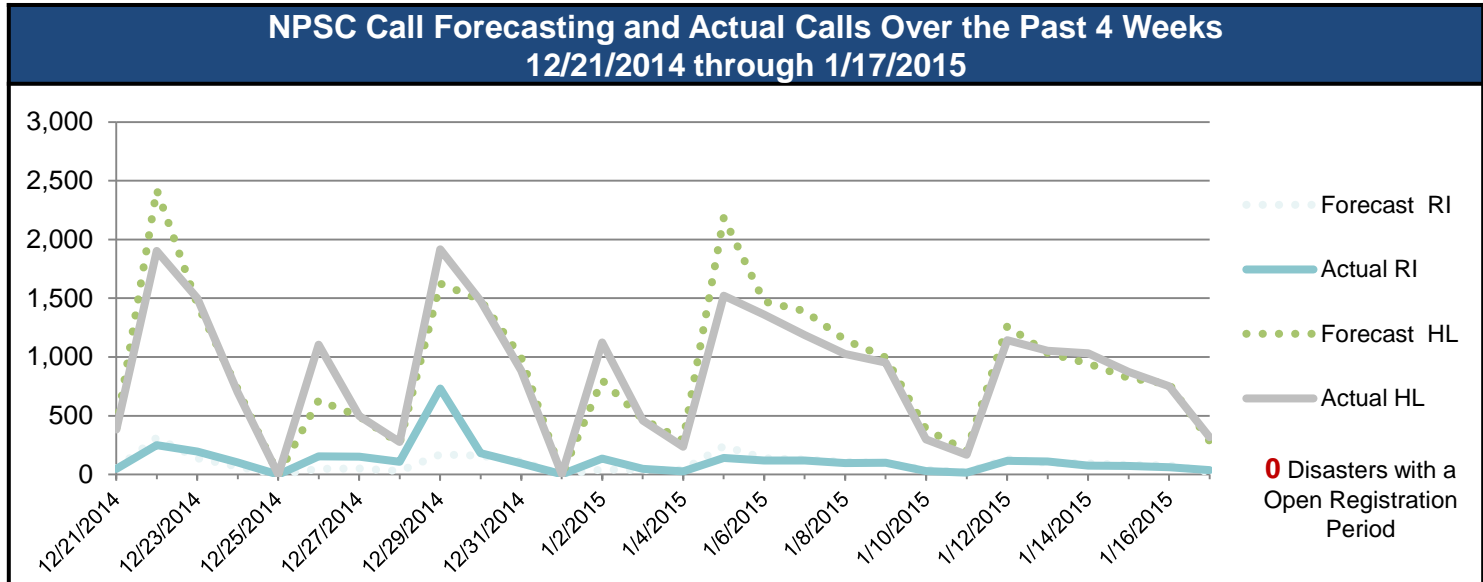

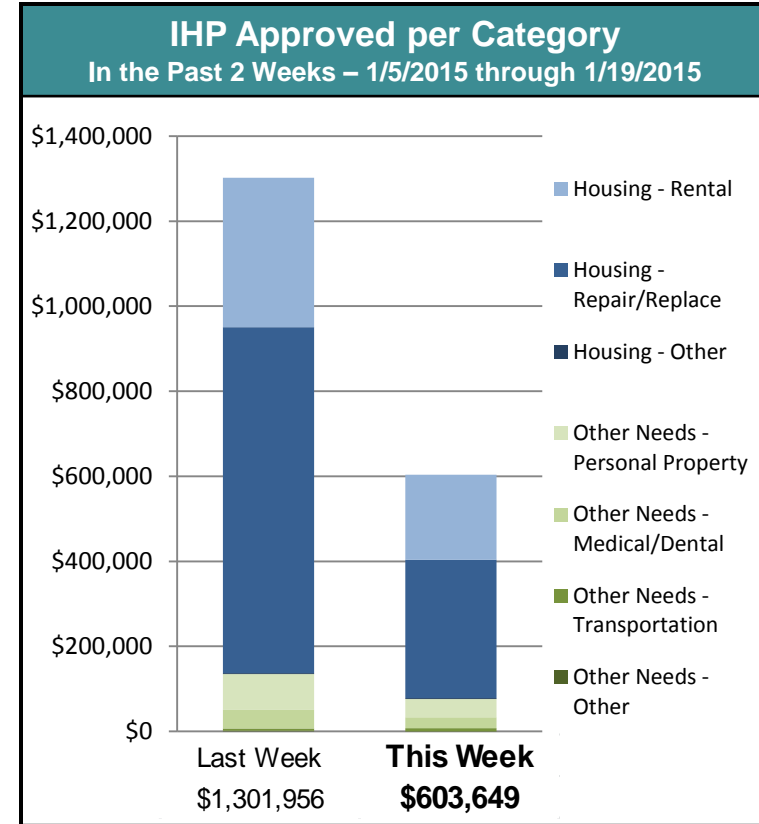
