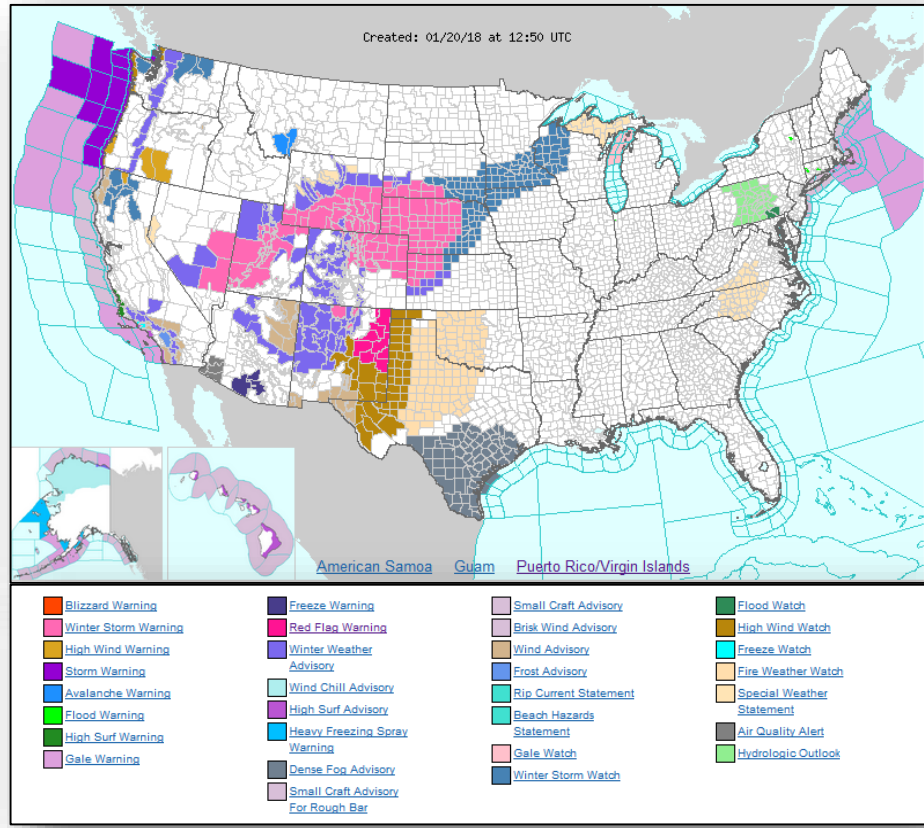

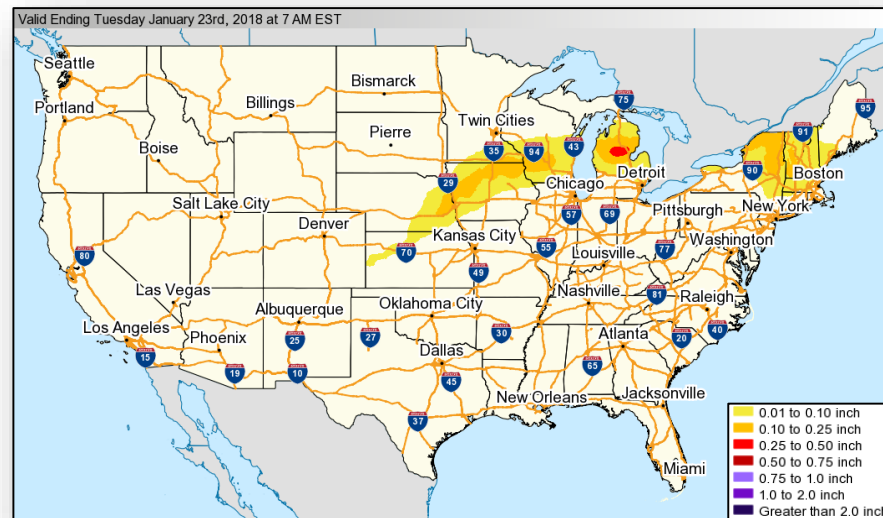
# Winter Precipitation Outlook

***Forecast Snowfall***



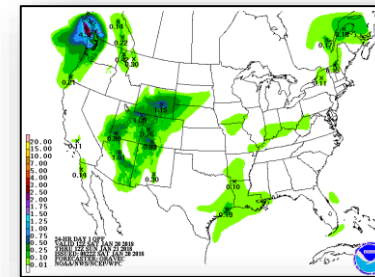
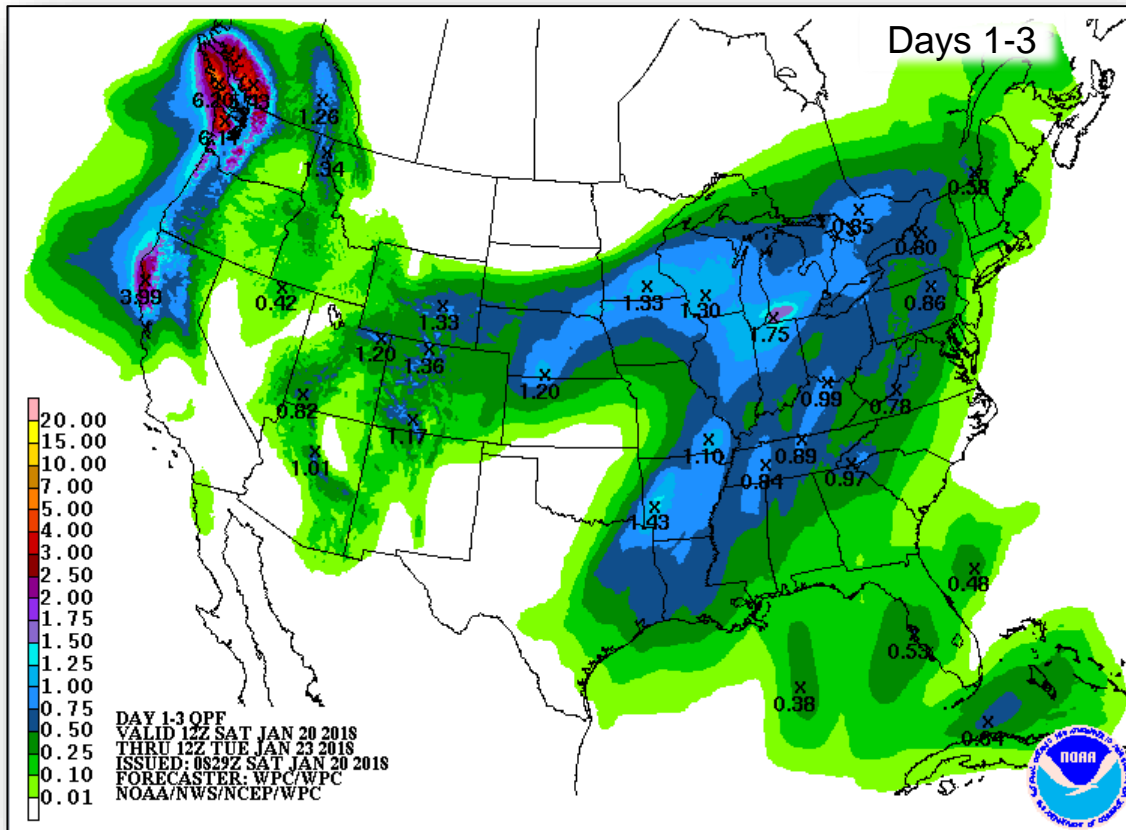
***Forecast Ice Accumulation***



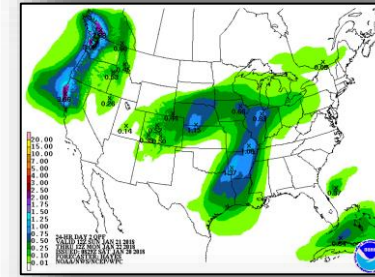
