Significant Activity – Jan 23-24

Significant Events: Severe weather - Lower Mississippi Valley and Southeast

Significant Weather:

- Freezing Rain – Mid-Atlantic and Northeast
- Heavy Snow – Northern Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley; Northeast
- Snow – Central Great Basin; Northern Intermountain to Northeast, Southwest, and Southern Rockies
- Rain and Snow – southern CA, Southwest, Central Plains to Great Lakes, Southern Appalachians to Northeast
- Rain – Southern Plains, Lower Mississippi Valley and Southeast
- Red Flag Warnings/Critical Fire Weather – Oklahoma and Texas
- Space Weather – Past 24 hours – none; next 24 hours – none

Tropical Activity Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Declaration Activity:

- Major Disaster Declaration Request - SD

Severe Weather – Lower MS/Southeast



Current Situation:

- The risk for organized severe weather has diminished across the Southeast

Impacts:

- Confirmed fatalities / Injuries: GA – 15 / 200; MS – 4 / 56; FL – 1 / 0
- Preliminary reports indicate 999 homes damaged or destroyed in MS; majority of damages in cities of Hattiesburg & Petal
 - 200 destroyed; 799 damaged (211 major, 187 minor, 401 affected)
- Power outages: 7k across Region IV (5,800 in NC)*
- Shelters: 1 open with 35 occupants in MS; 3 open with 121 occupants in GA (*ARC midnight shelter count as of 4:31 am EST*)

State/Local Response:

- GA EOC at Full Activation; Governor declared a state of emergency on Jan 22
- MS EOC at Normal Operations; Governor declared a state of emergency on Jan 21
- 77 National Guardsmen deployed to MS
- US&R MS-TF1 & MS-TF2 deployed to MS; GA-TF2 & GA-TF4 deployed to GA (state assets)
- Joint PDAs requested for GA & MS

Federal Response:

- FEMA NWC returned to Watch/Steady State
- FEMA NRCC released from alert status
- National IMAT West deployed to Region IV
- US&R IST White team, TN-TF1 and OH-TF1 released from Alert status
- FEMA Region II IMAT released from Alert status to support FEMA Region IV
- FEMA Region IV RRCC Deactivated; RWC at Enhanced Watch (7:00 am – 7:00 pm EST)
 - LNOs deployed to GA and MS EOCs; LNO demobilized from FL and AL



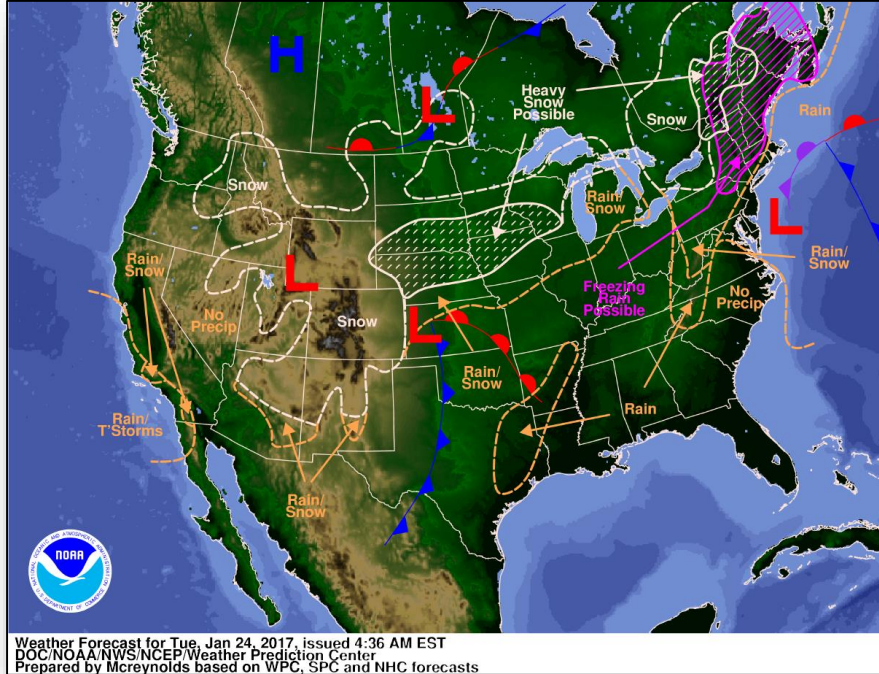

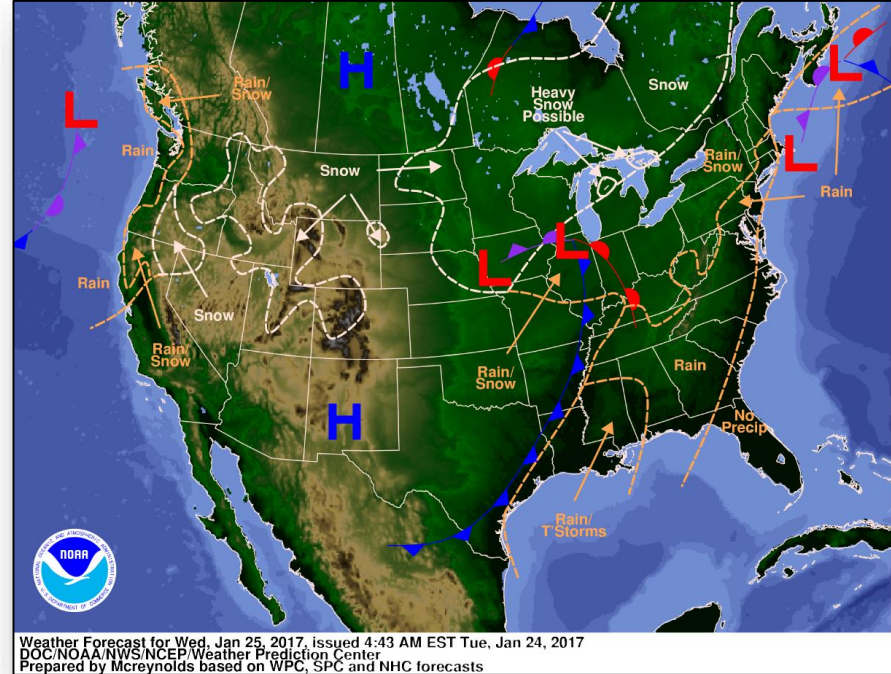

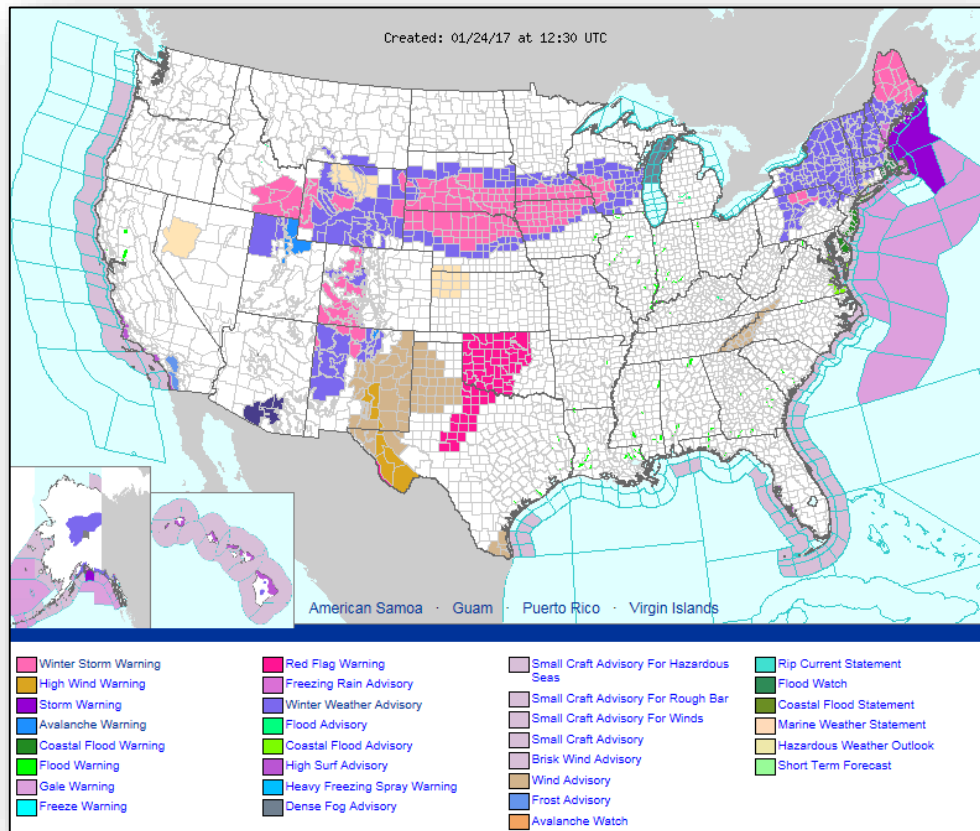

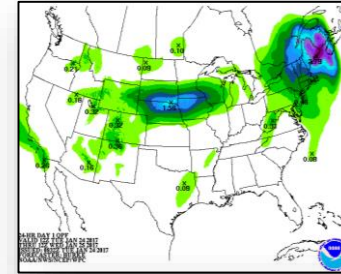

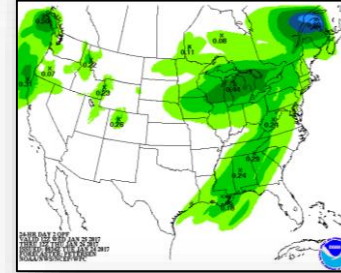
Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3



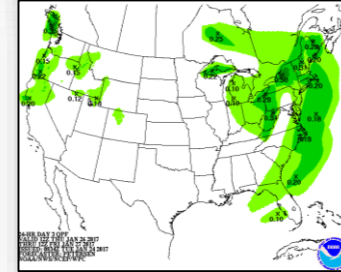

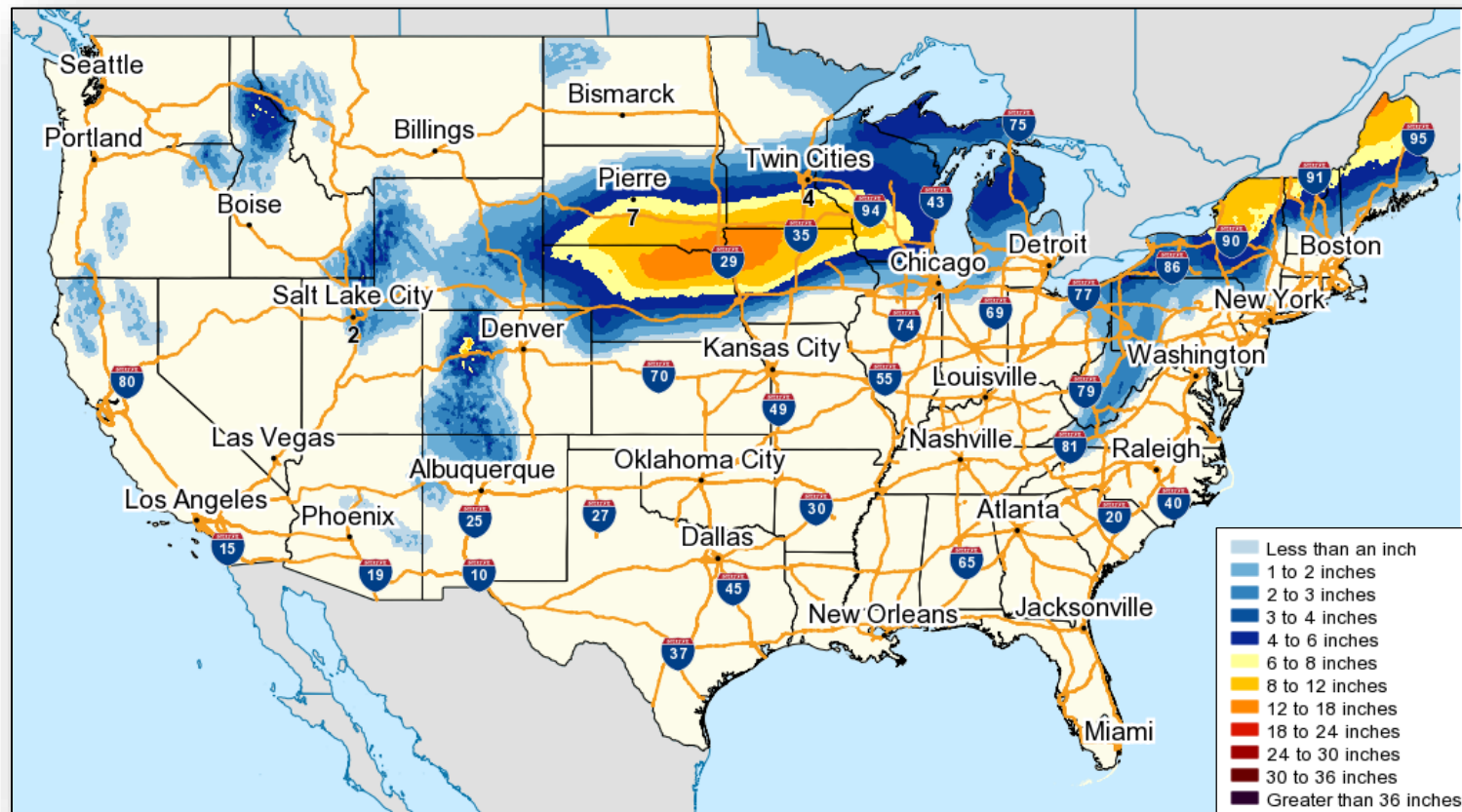

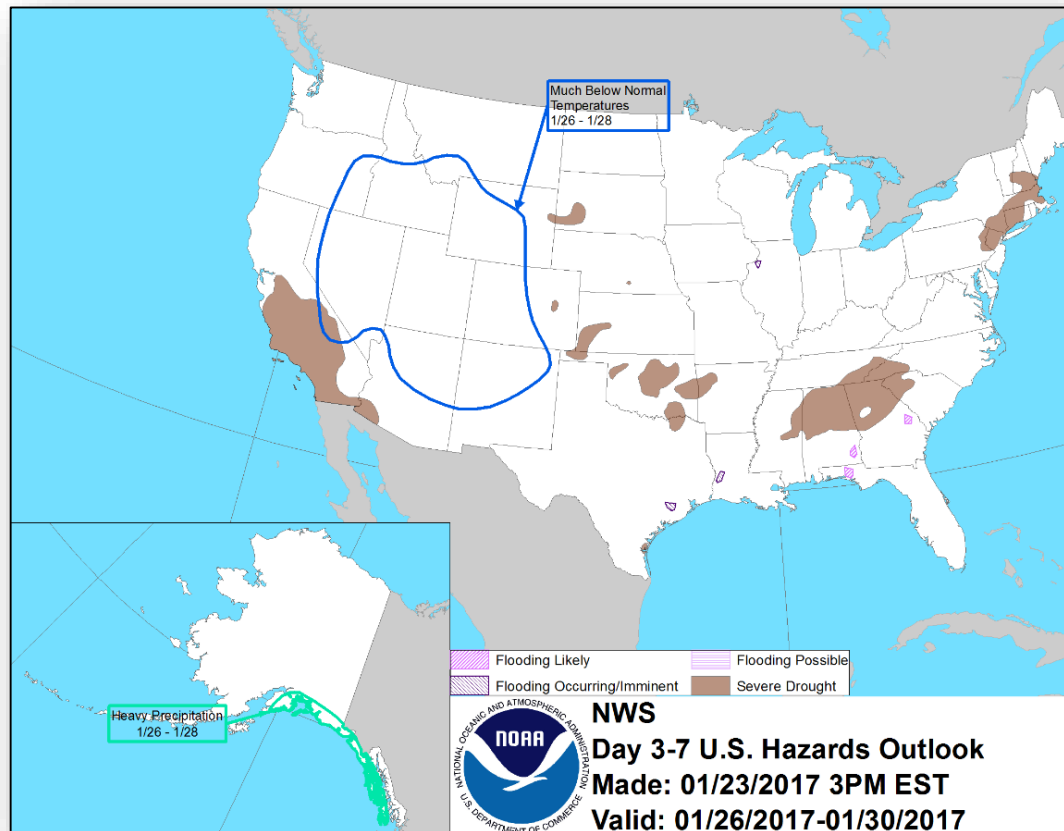
Forecast Ice – Days 1-3

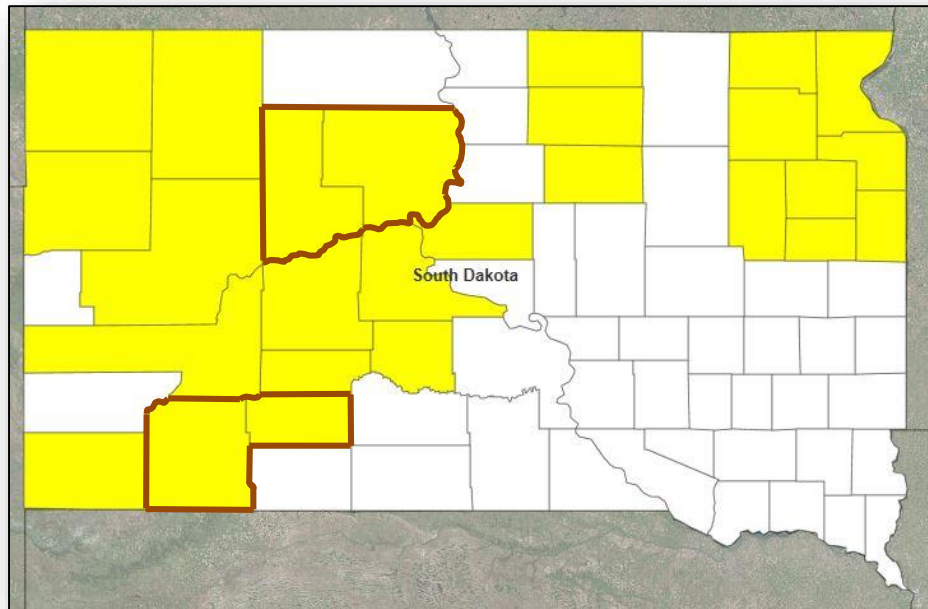

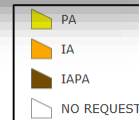

- Precipitating incident was severe winter storm during December 24-26, 2016



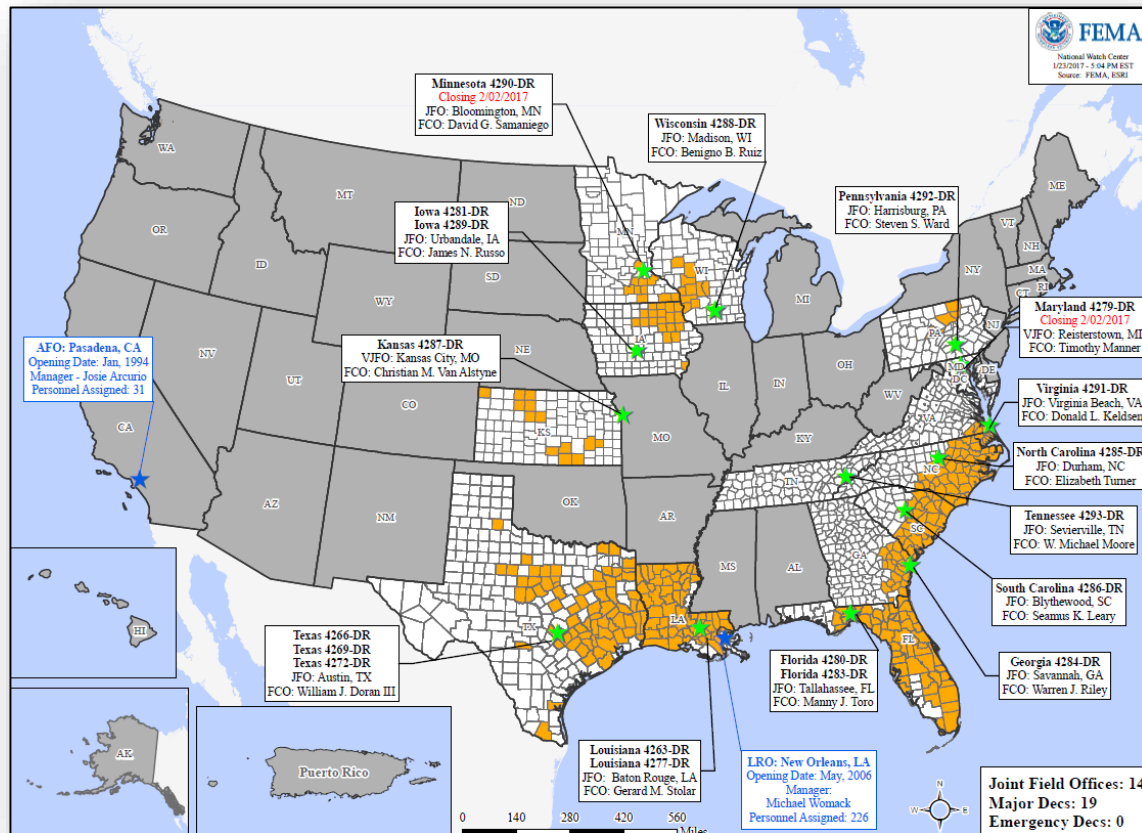
Tribal boundaries delineated in bolded lines

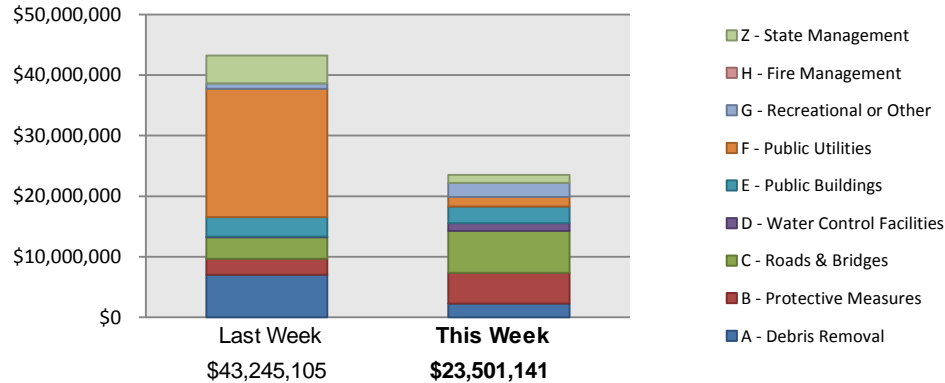

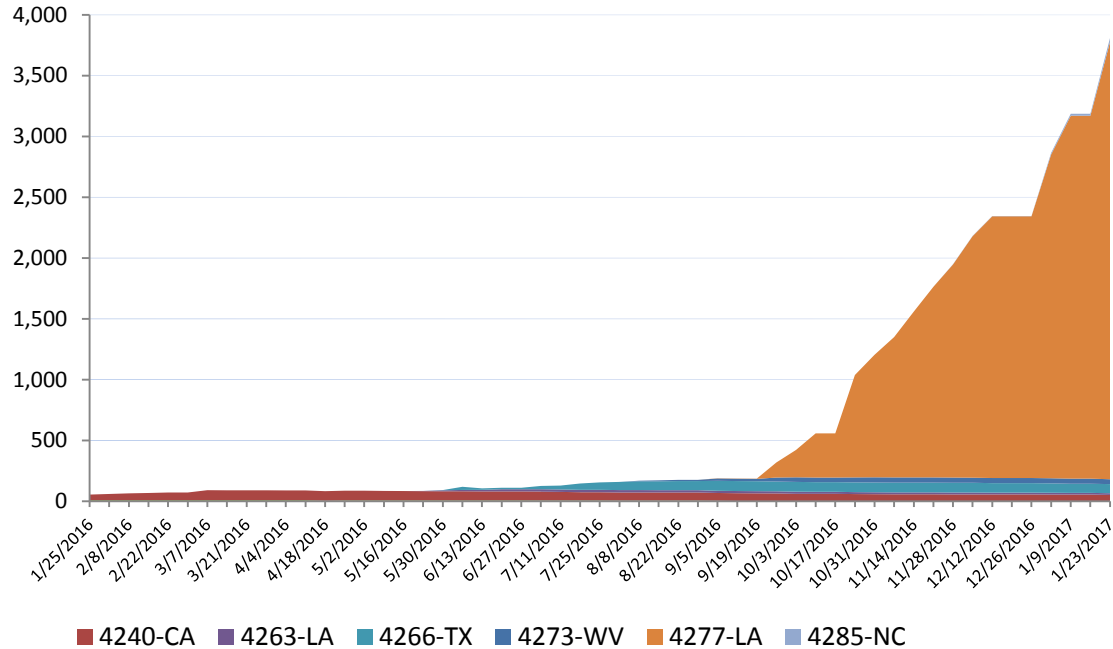

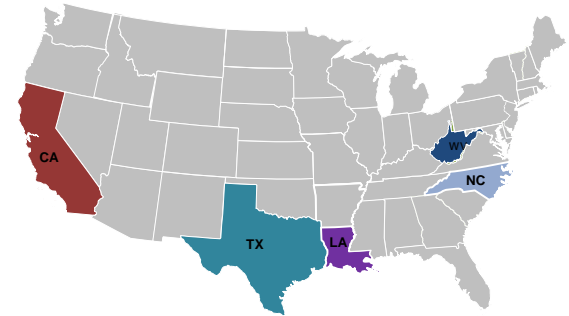

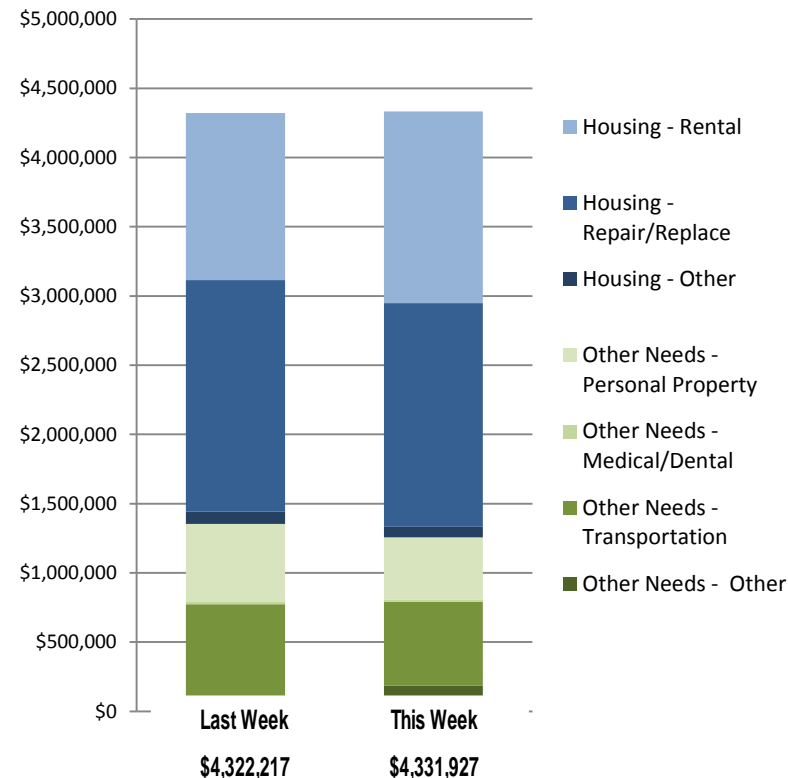
