Winter Storm/Coastal Flooding – Eastern U.S.



Situation:

- Major winter storm dropped 1 to 3 feet of snow from the Central Appalachians to New England over the weekend. Strong winds, with gusts up to 75 mph reported.
- Coastal flooding from North Carolina to Massachusetts has subsided.

Impacts:

- No shortfalls or unmet needs; no requests for FEMA assistance
 - Fatalities: 32 (+18) (20 confirmed, 12 unconfirmed)
 - RIV: 16 fatalities (14 confirmed, 2 unconfirmed)
 - RIII: 11 fatalities (6 confirmed, 5 unconfirmed)
 - RII: 5 fatalities (all unconfirmed)
- Power: 20K (-113K) customer outages
- Transportation: 4K flights cancelled Sat/Sun; residual delays expected today
 - Mass transit systems resuming service with modified schedules/routes
- OPM closed DC Federal offices; many Local/State/Federal offices/schools closed

State/Local Preparations/Response:

- State of Emergencies declared: NY, NJ, VA, PA, MD, WV, NC, SC, KY, TN, & DC
- EOC Status: DC, VA remain Fully Activated
 - Partially Activated: DE, MD, PA, TN, MS; GA, KY Monitoring: NC
 - New York State & West Virginia returned back to Normal Ops
- Shelters: 18 (-18) open with 269 (+229) occupants in 8 States
- Approx. 2,300 National Guardsman activated




Estimated Snow Depth


