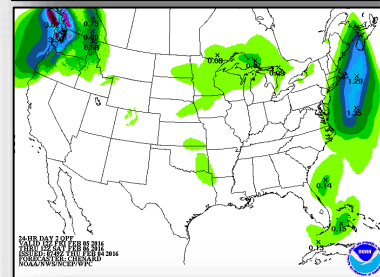
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



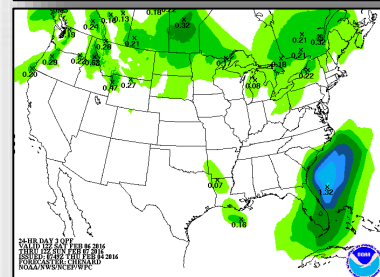

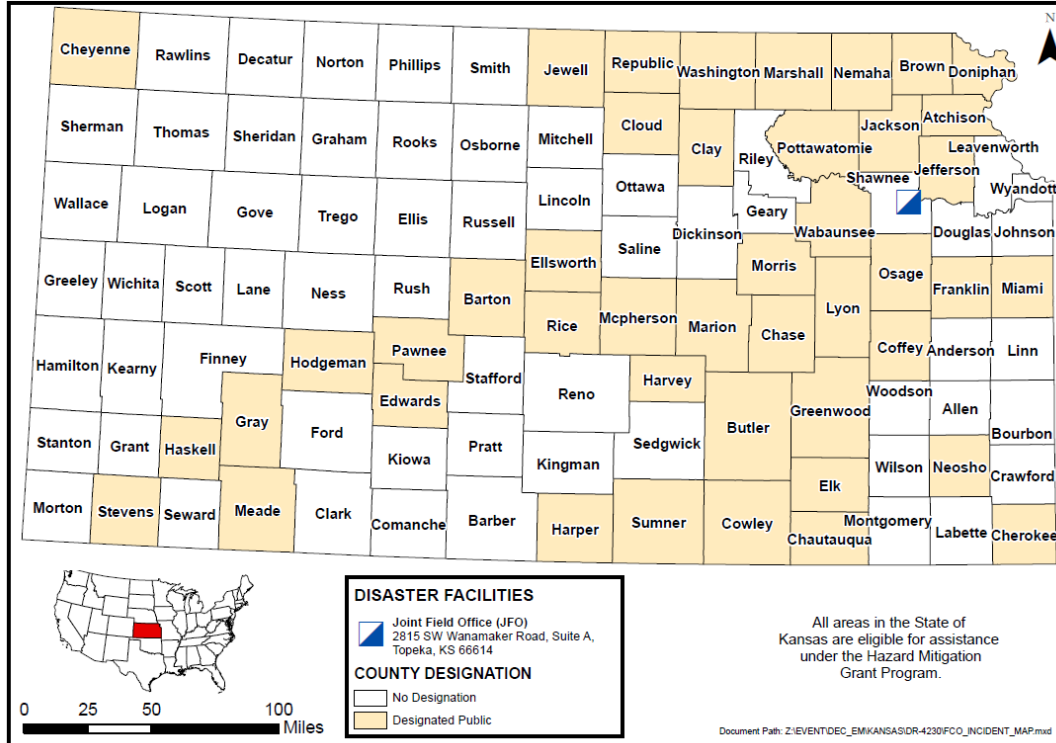


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COUNTY DESIGNATIONS as of August 31, 2015

FCO Comments

Public Assistance Field Readiness Program

- Developed in 2 weeks by field staff
- 80 staff trained
 - 22 FEMA Public Assistance
 - 39 FEMA Non-Public Assistance (Logistics/Operations)
 - 19 State Reservists
- Trainee titles earned by 30 Non-Public Assistance staff after 90 days field experience

'Purple Team' Concept

- State Reservists comprise one-third of Public Assistance field staff
- Each field team consists of both State and FEMA personnel
- 4 of 10 PA crews are led by State Reservists
- Reduced internal staffing requirements and created a true partnership with the State
