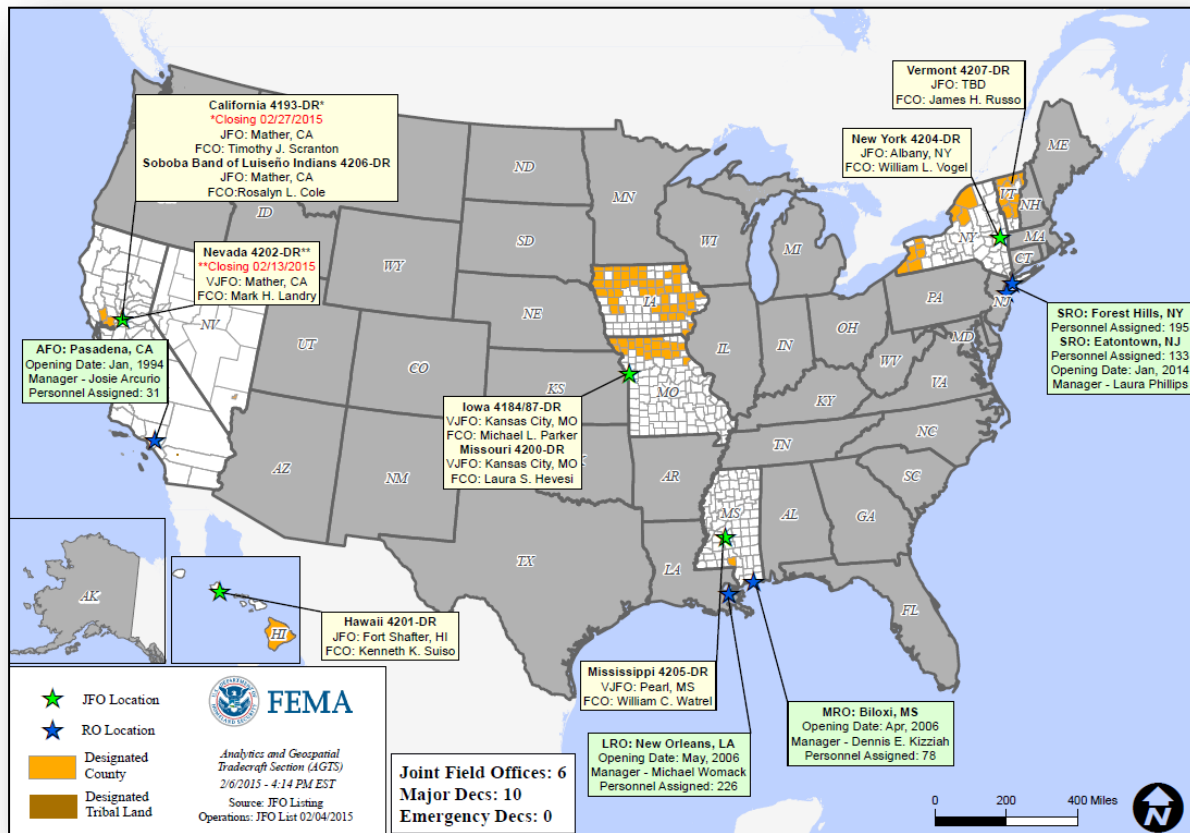

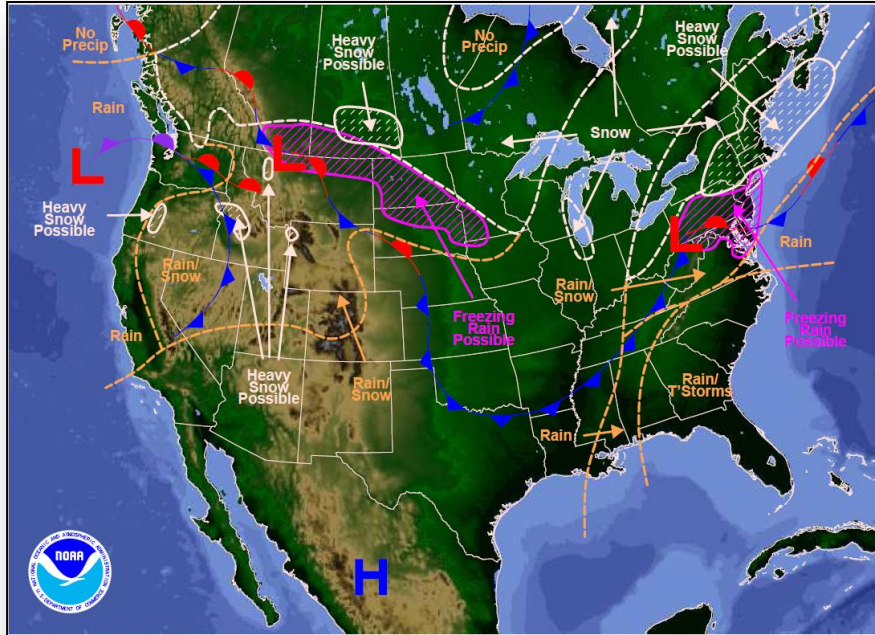

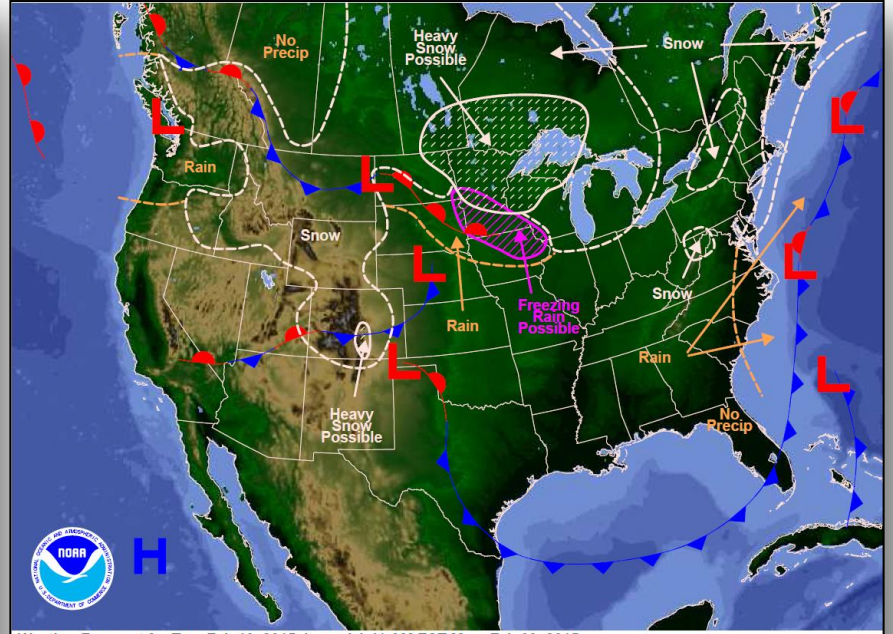


National Weather Forecast

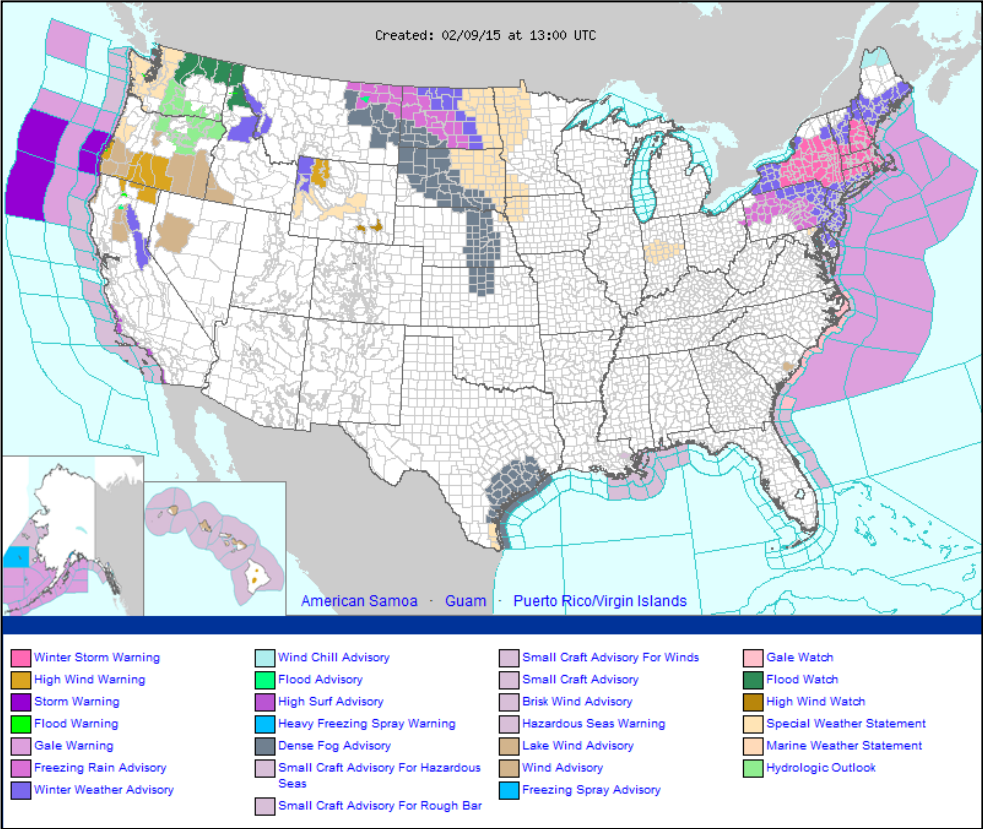

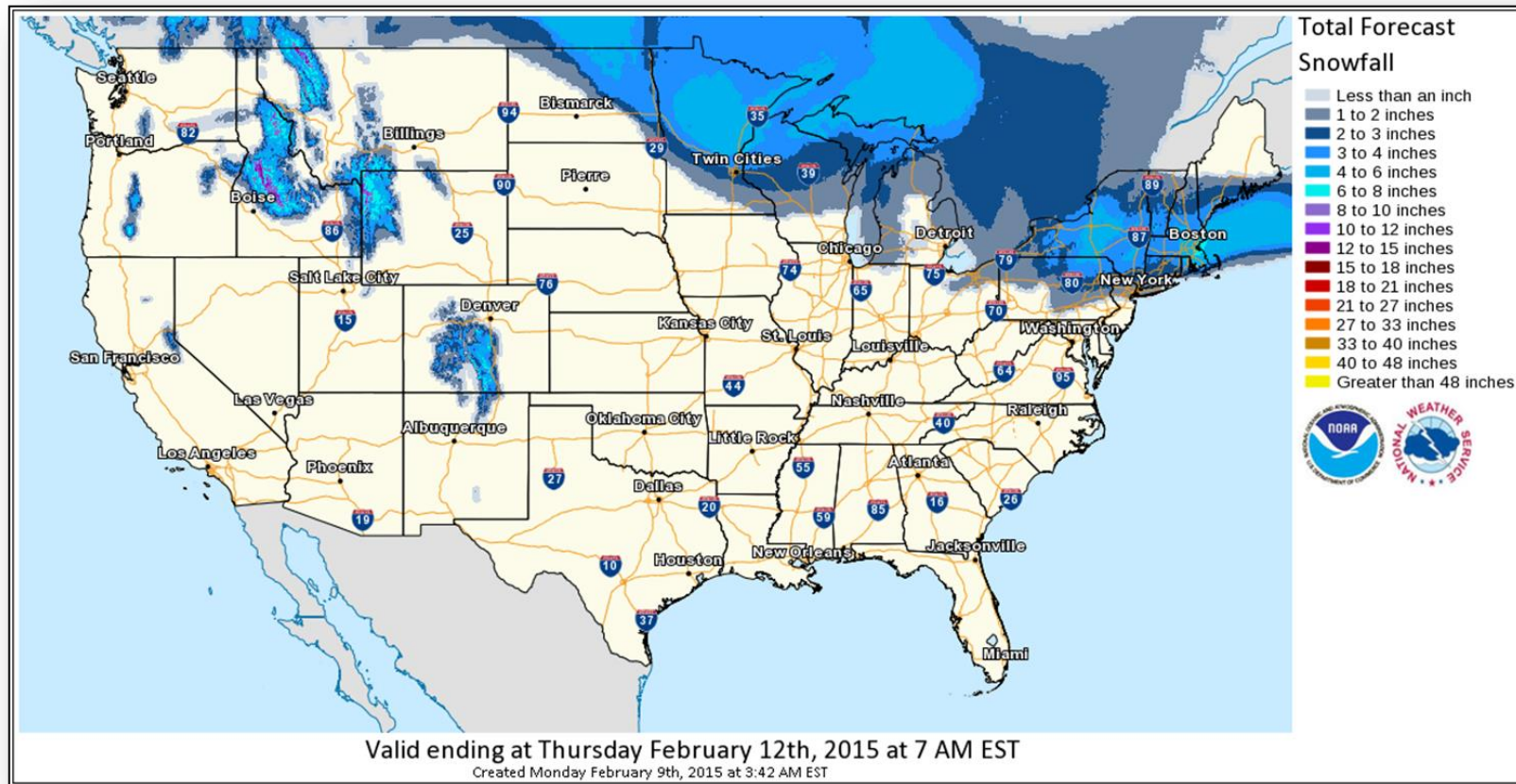

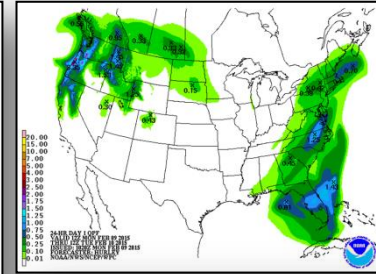
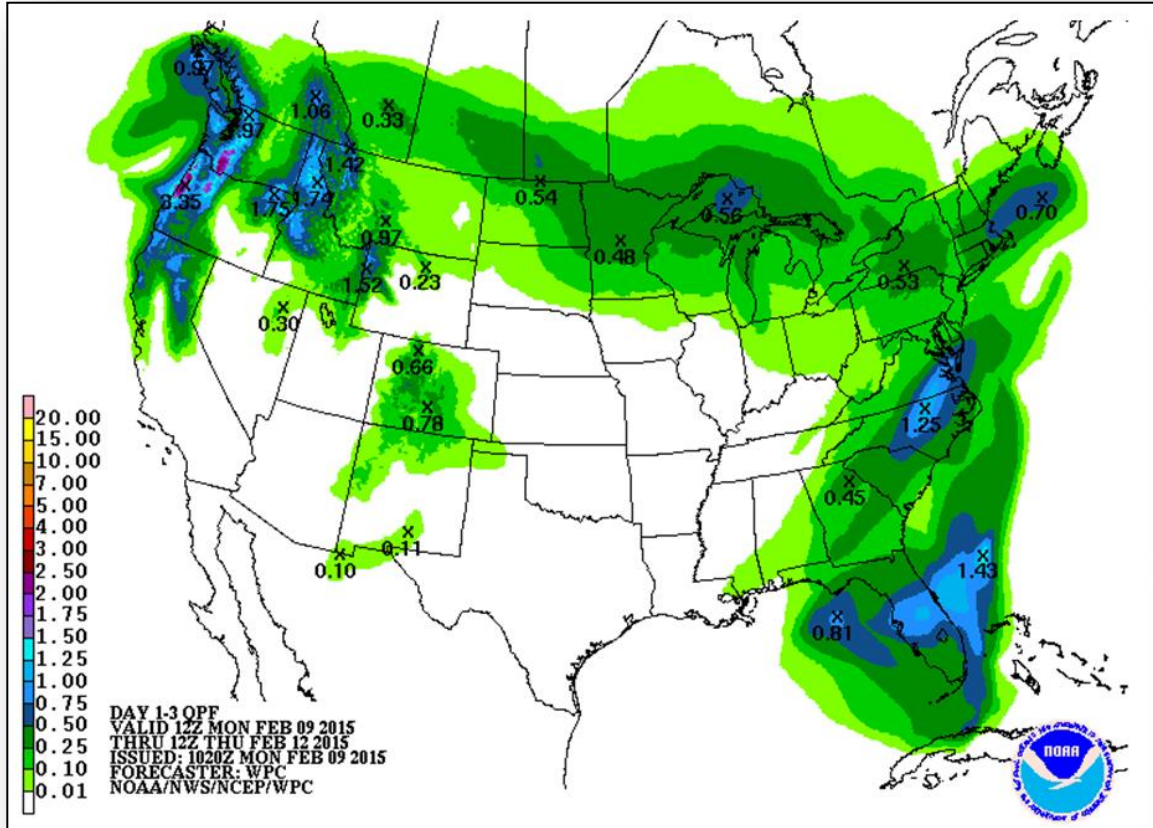
Total Forecast Snowfall



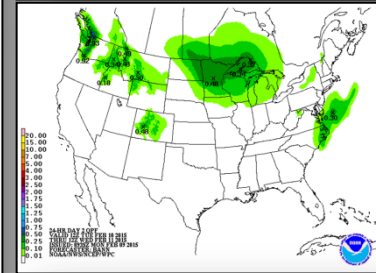
Total Forecast Ice



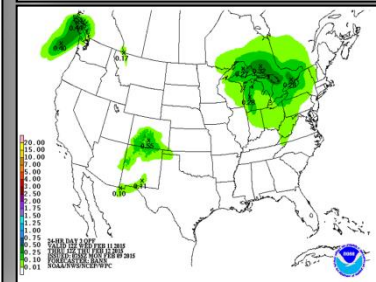
Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day

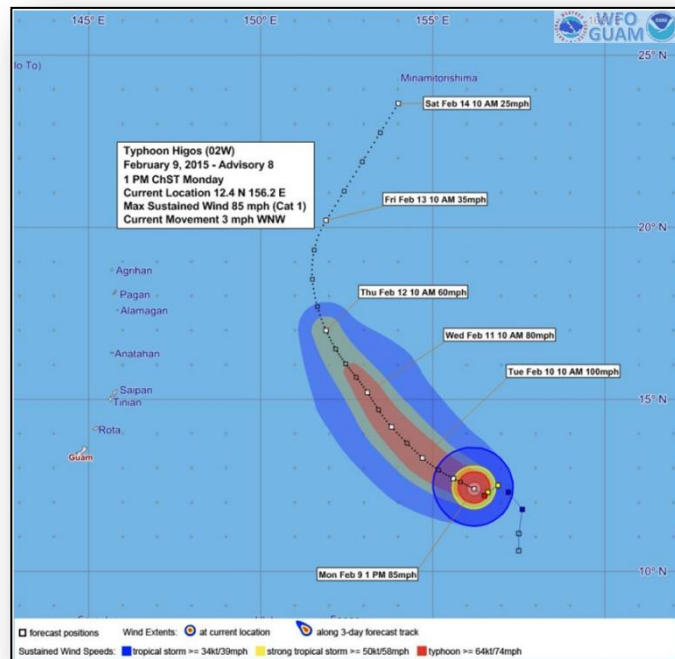

Western Pacific – Typhoon 02W (Higos) Final



Typhoon 02W (Higos) (Advisory 9, as of 4:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located about 750 miles east of Guam
- Moving NW at 5 mph; turn toward the N expected
- Maximum sustained winds of 90 mph
- Continued intensification through Tuesday morning
- Expected to be Tropical Depression by Saturday
- Typhoon force winds extend outward to 35 miles
- Tropical Storm force winds extend outward 115 miles
- No coastal Watches or Warnings in effect
- No threat to US territories
