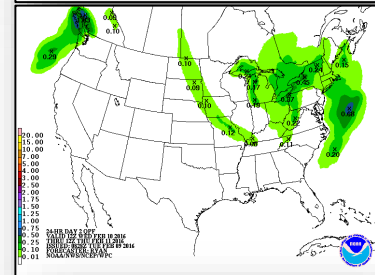
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



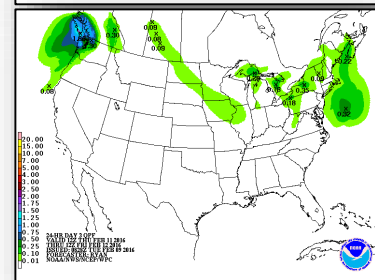

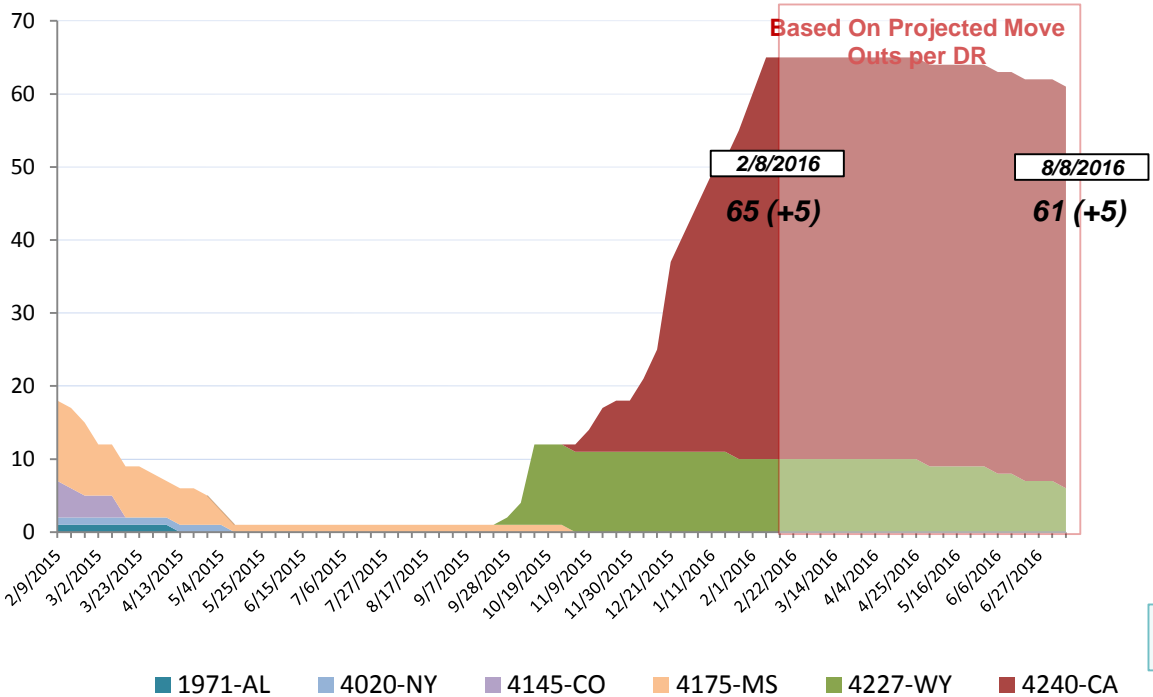

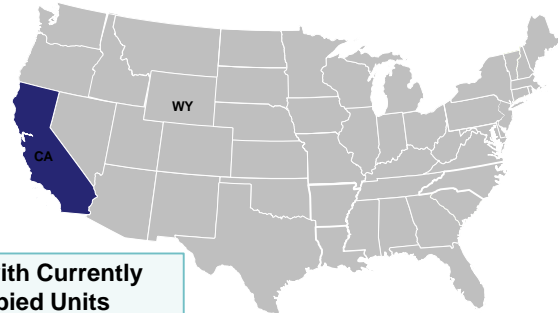

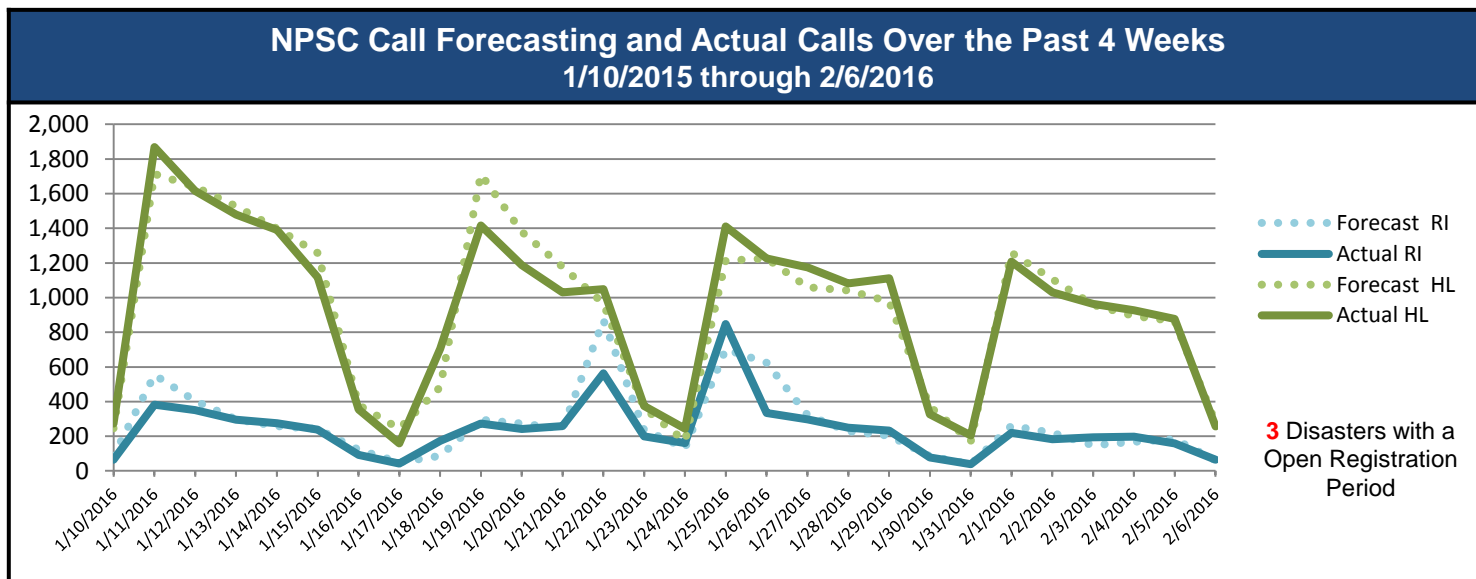


States with Currently Occupied Units

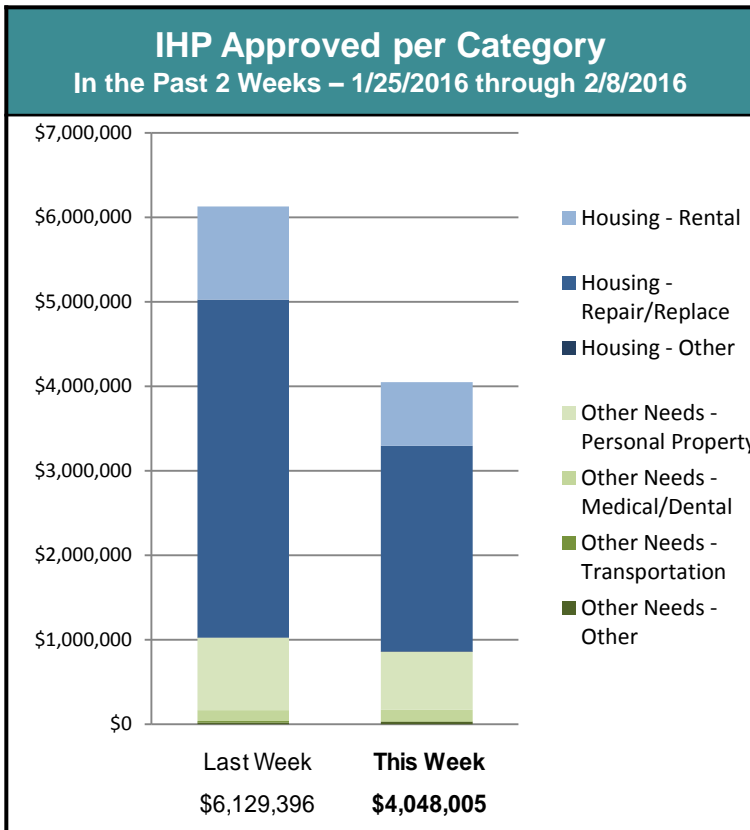
