Oroville Dam Spillway Erosion – CA



Situation

Potential failure of the auxiliary spillway in the Oroville Dam has resulted in emergency evacuations downstream. Current water level as of 7am EST, 890.21 ft (-8.32 feet in last 24 hours)

Impacts

- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 190k residents: 39k in Butte County, 76k in Yuba County, and 65k in Sutter County
- Three tribes are in impacted area; at least 70 tribal members have been evacuated
- 20 shelters open with 3,680 occupants (ARC Midnight shelter count as of 5:25 am EST)
- No injuries or fatalities reported

- · Emergency Declaration requested
- CA SEOC at Full Activation; Governor declared State of Emergency
- Three CA Task Force Swift Water Teams activated


Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3






Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3














Western U.S. River Forecasts








Forecast Snowfall – Days 1-3




