


Impacts:

 (Eagle-I DOE, As of 8:30 a.m. EST)
 - Majority of customers in National Capital Region 23K
- Over 1,000 flights cancelled; however, all airports remain open
- AMTRAK service from Boston to Brunswick, ME cancelled today

Response:

- All FEMA Regions remain at Watch / Steady State
- MA State EOC fully activated; NH EOC & NYC OEM partially activated
 - All other State EOCs at normal operations
- VT National Guard deployed personnel/equipment to MA for snow removal

Situation:



- Widespread wind damage


Response:

Open Field Offices as of February 15






