- Hazardous travel conditions, road closures, cancelled/delayed flights, school/office closures, floods & mudslide damage to structures (WV & TN)
- Precautionary evacuation of 6-10 homes for flooding (PA)
- Approximately 58k customers without power across Regions I-VI* (as of 7:00 am EST)
 - Most in WV (33k), MS (10k), AR (5k) & TX (4k)
- One injury (mudslide in VA), no fatalities
- Shelters (w/occupants): VA (9 shelters w/ 22 occupants), WV (2 shelters w/15 occupants), KY (4 warming centers)




Observed Precipitation for Past 48-Hours




Total Forecast Ice






Total Forecast Snowfall






NCR Forecast Snowfall






Precipitation Forecast 1 - 3 Day






