
A large tornado(s) (unknown intensity) touched down near Jacksonville, AL (pop. 13k). The Storm Prediction Center reported damage in Calhoun, Etowah, Madison, Cullman, St. Clair, and Marshall counties.

Impacts

- No fatalities; 1 confirmed injury due to hail, total number of injuries is unknown (Region IV)
- Damage to Jacksonville State University
- Damage to multifamily housing unit, fallen trees and widespread hail damage to homes, roof damage to a detention center, roof damage and broken windows at a nursing home (no residents displaced or injured), mobile home destroyed, and damage to a middle school
- 10 shelters open; number of occupants is unknown
- 10k customers without power AL (10.5k peak in last 24 hours) (DOE EAGLE-I as of 7:35 a.m. EDT)



Winter Precipitation Outlook






Forecast Snowfall




Forecast Ice Accumulation

Precipitation Forecast

















Significant River Flood Outlook


