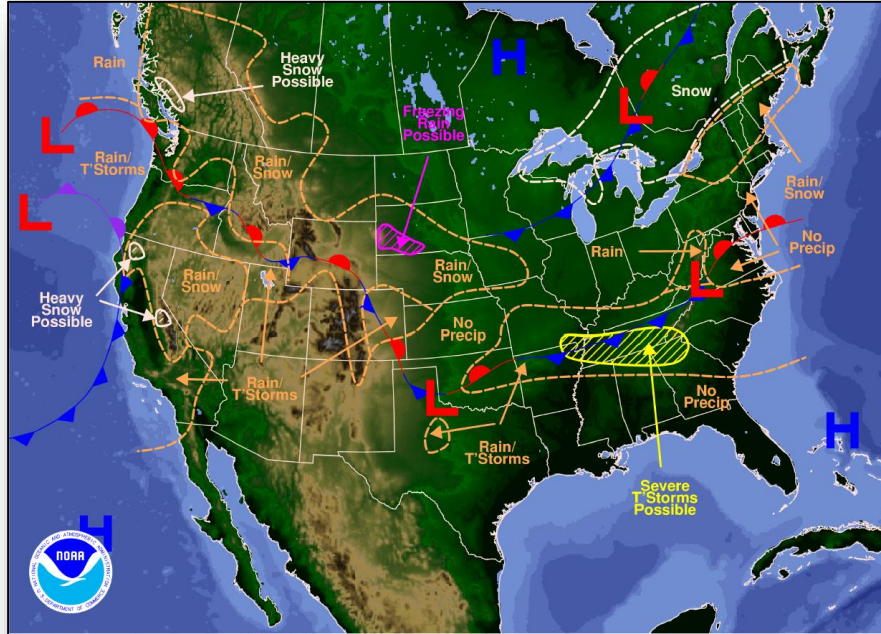

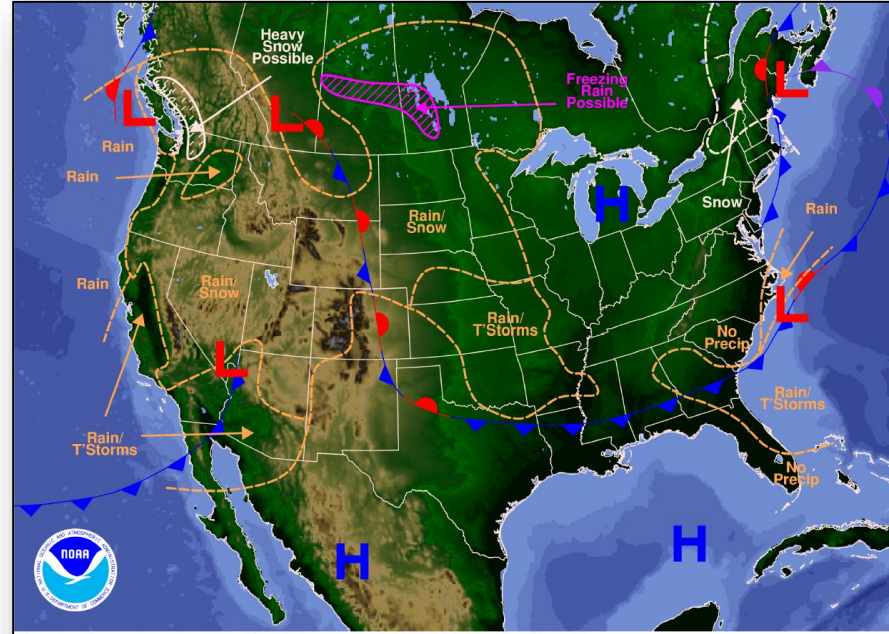

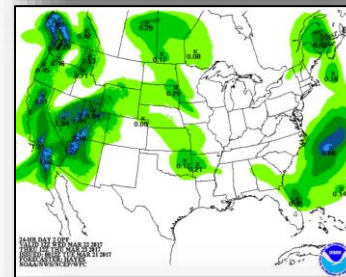
Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3



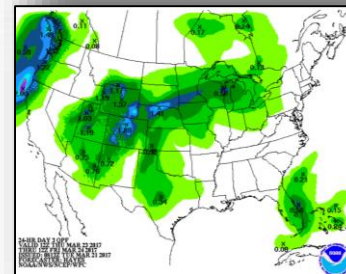

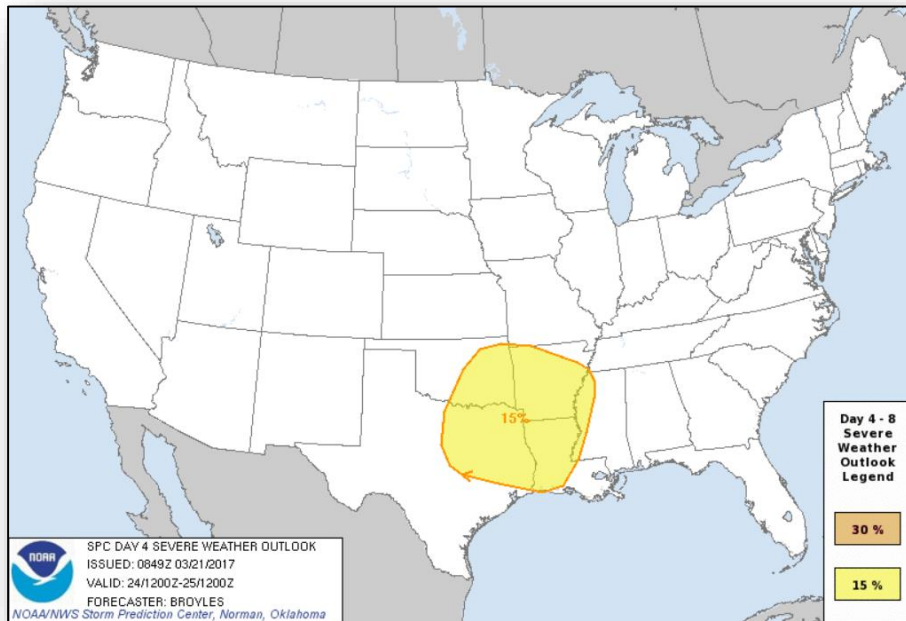
Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3



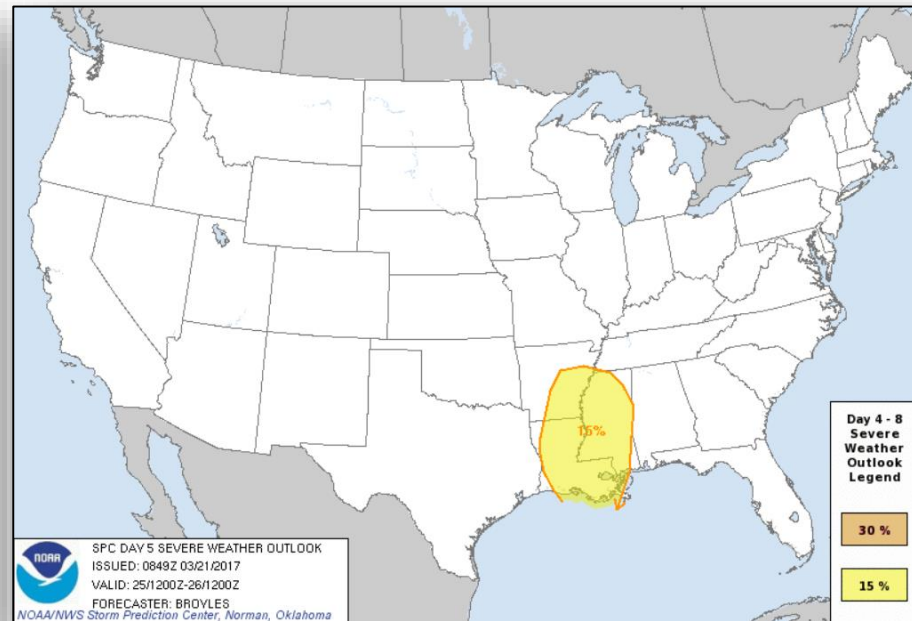
Severe Weather Outlook – Days 4-5

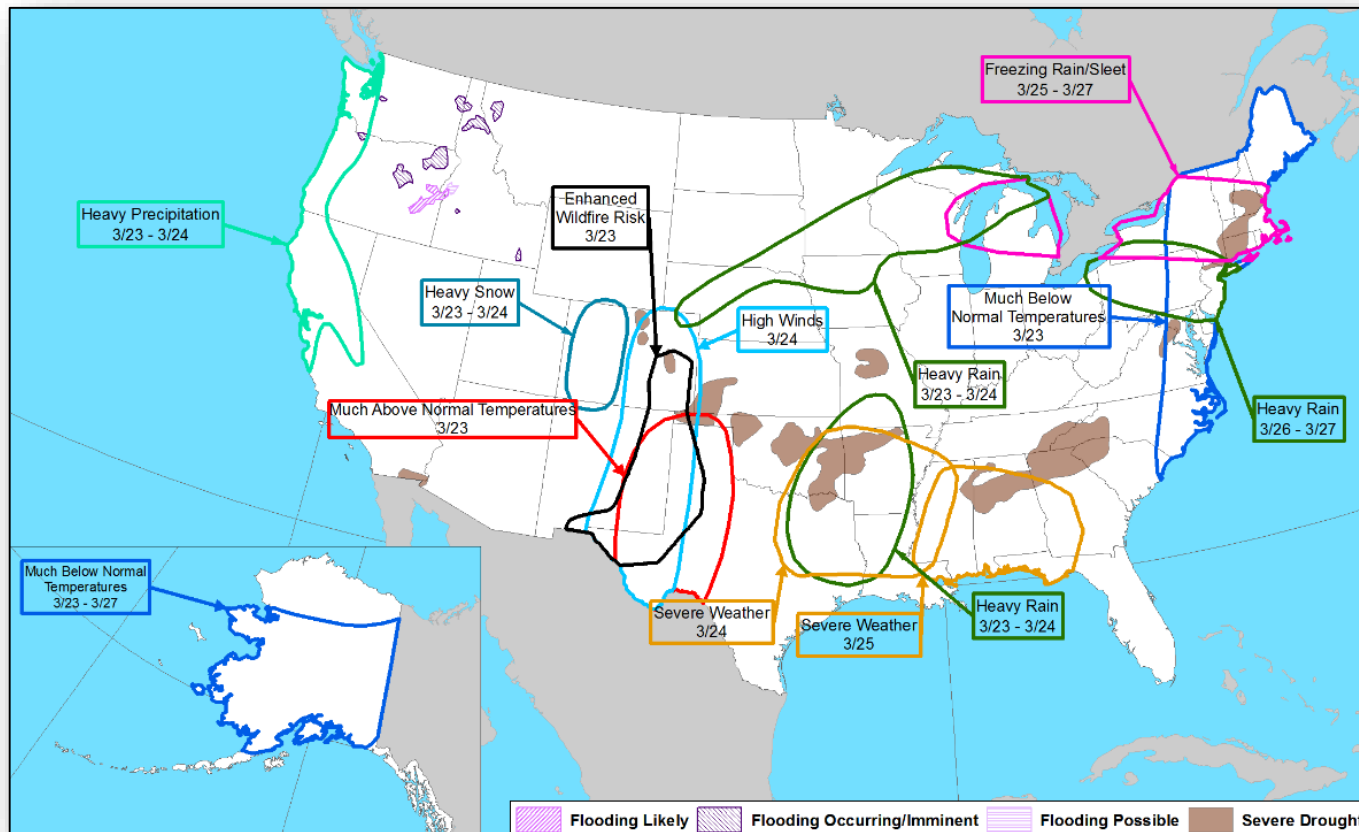

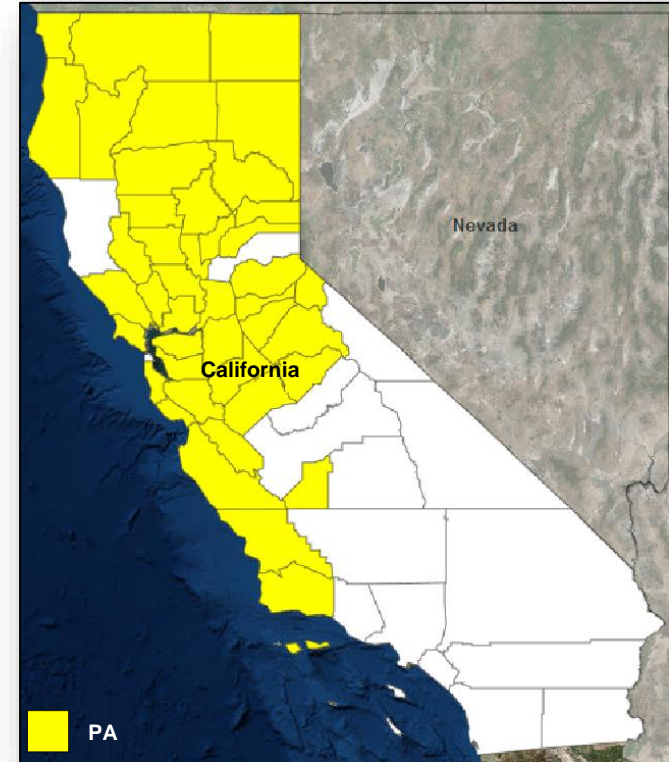

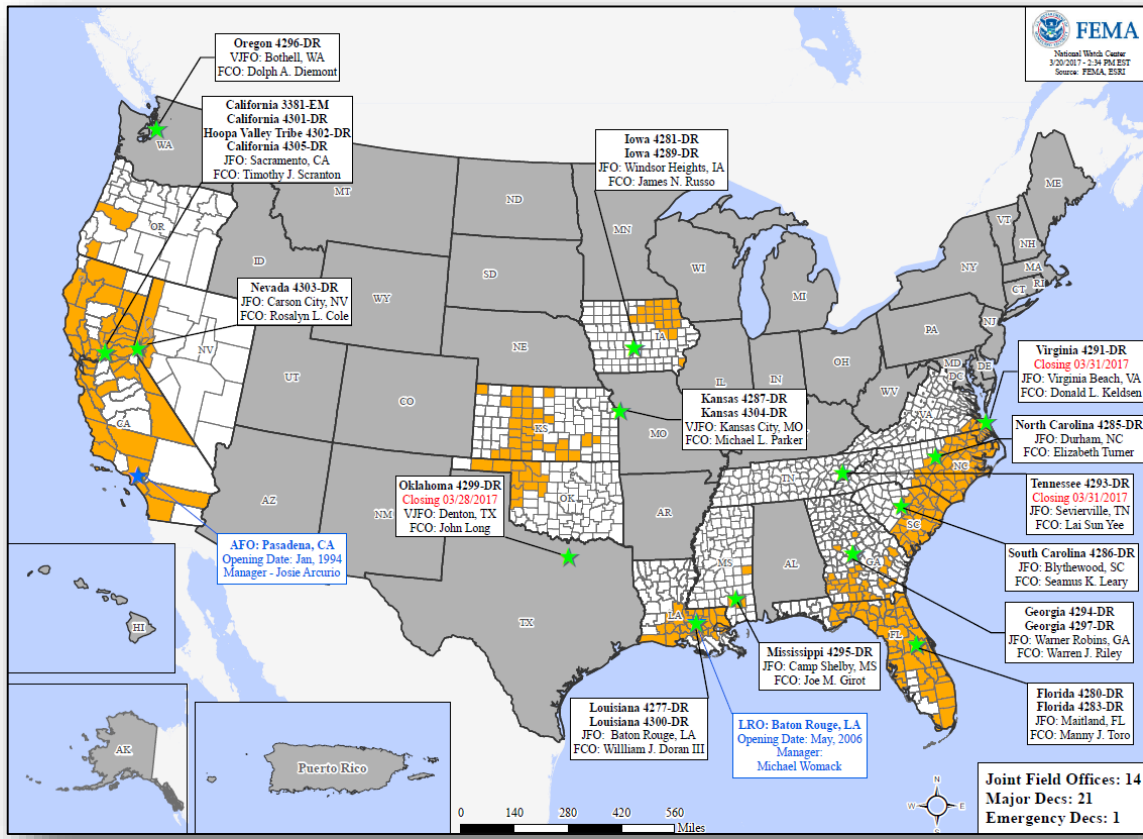


California

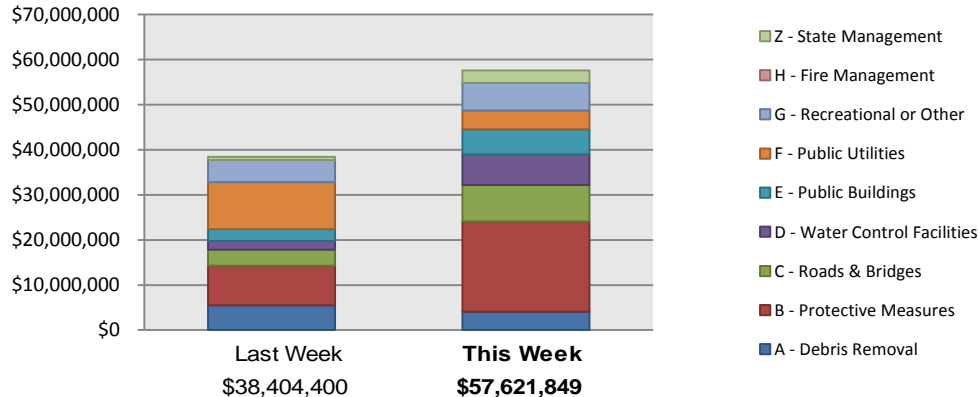

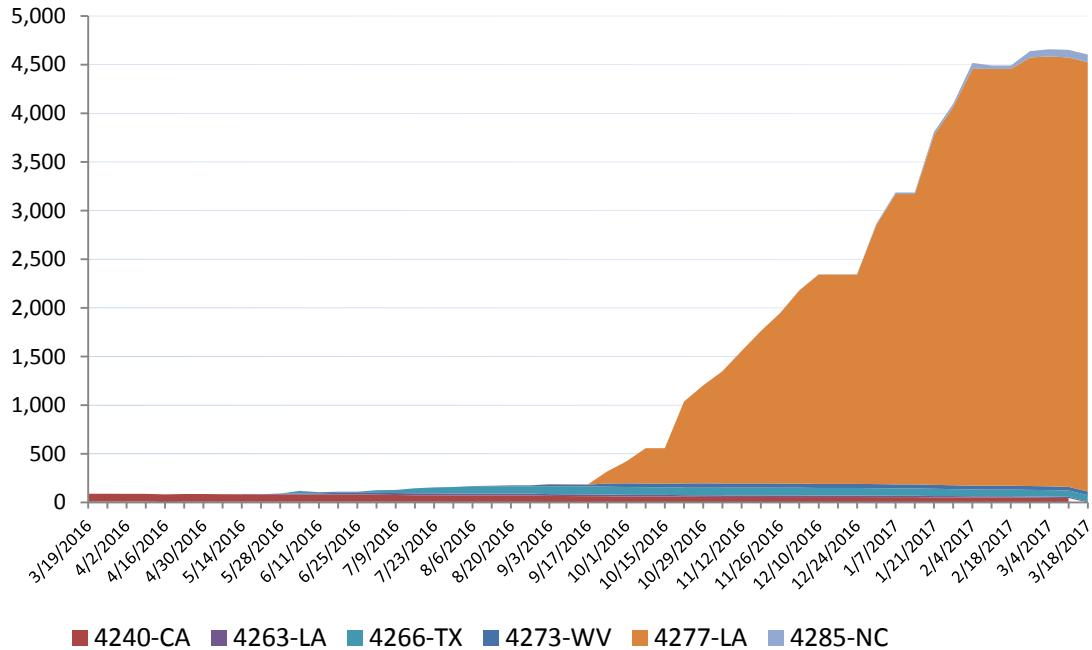

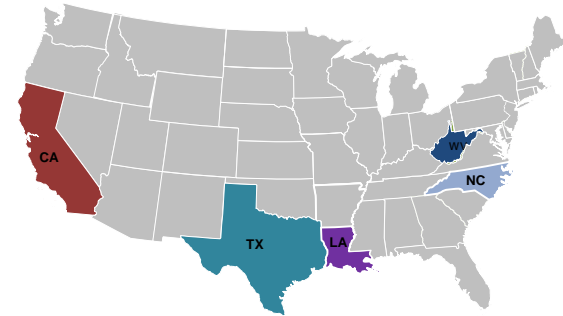

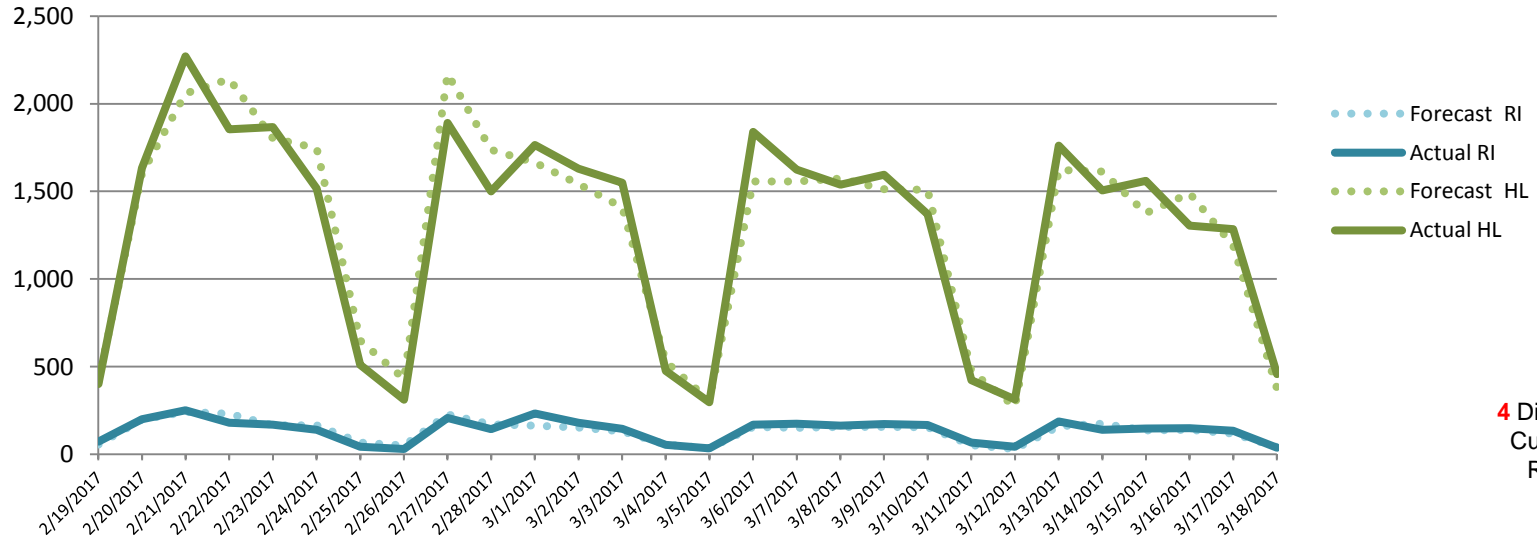

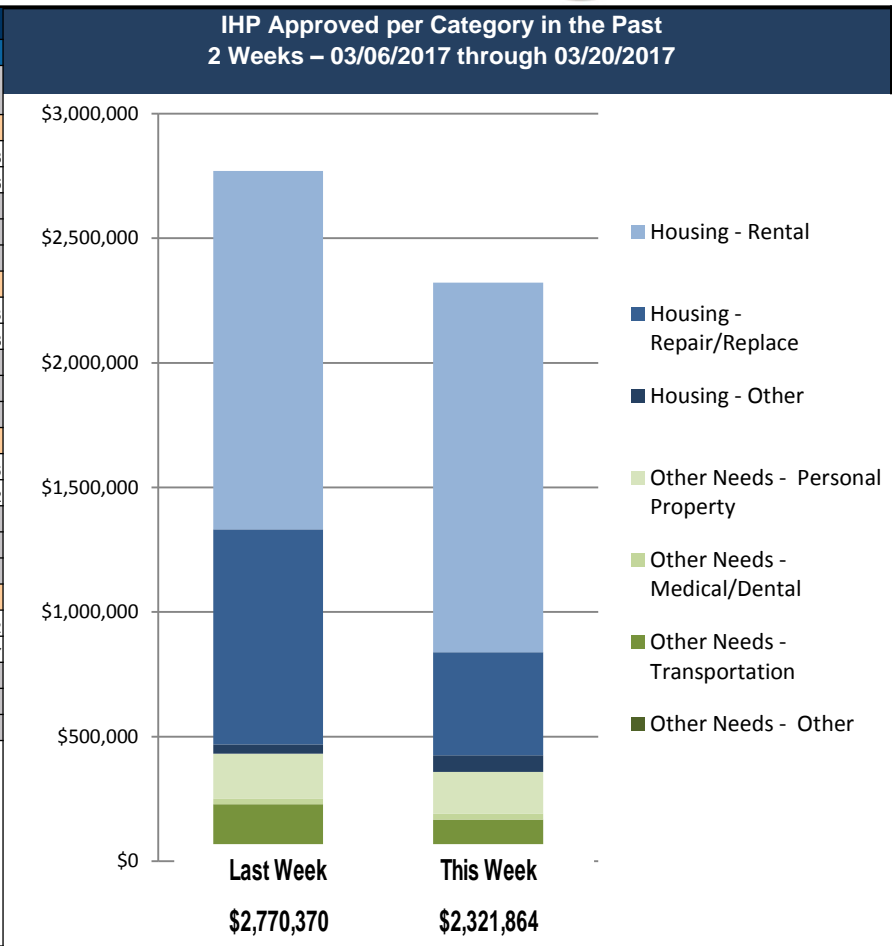
