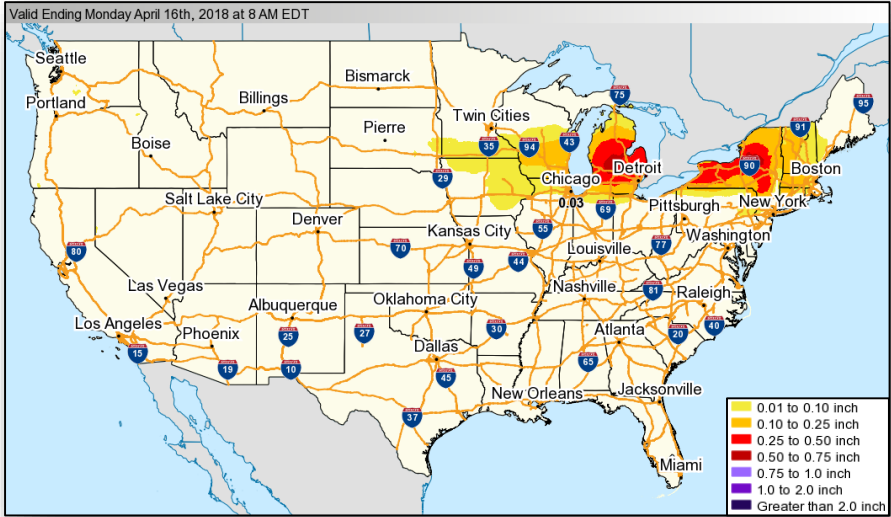
Winter Precipitation Outlook

Forecast Snowfall

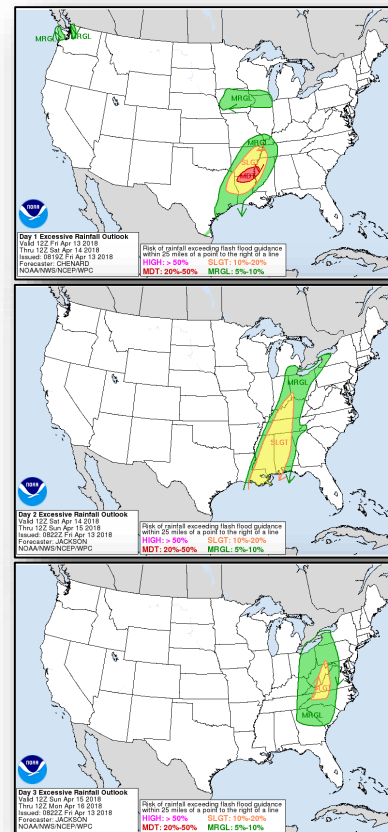
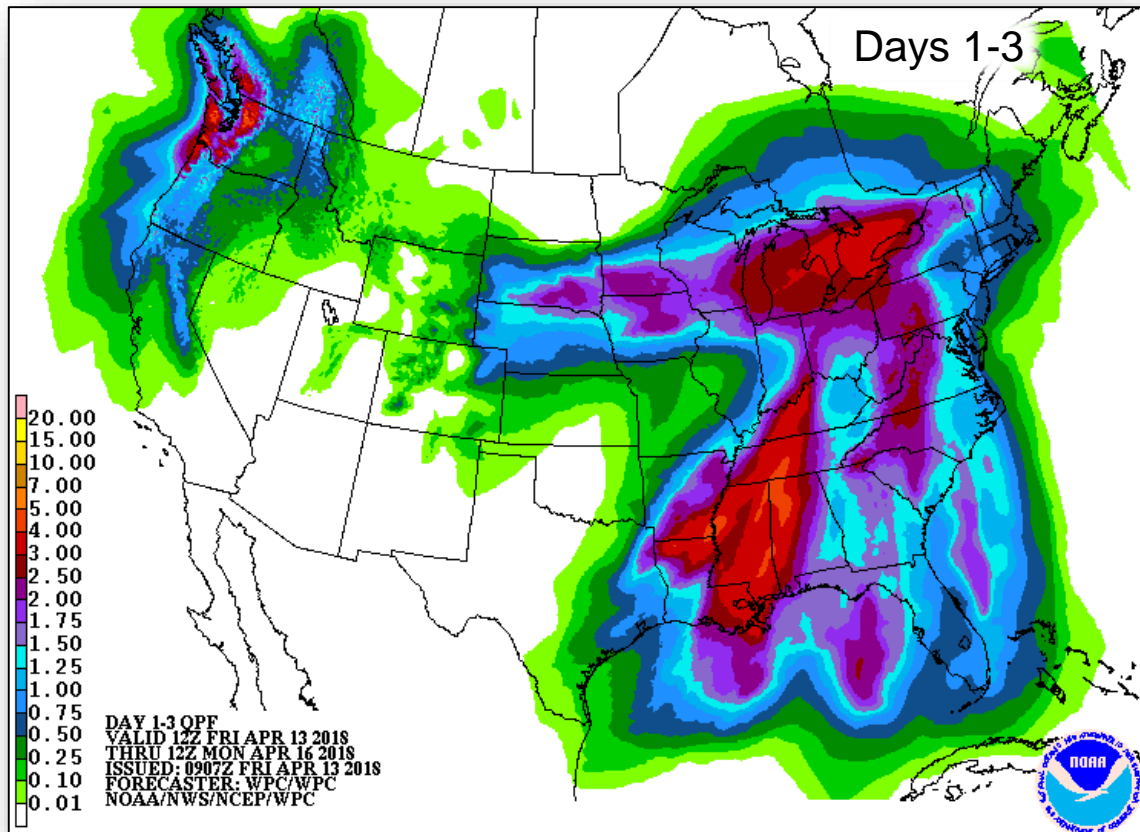


Forecast Ice Accumulation

Precipitation Forecast



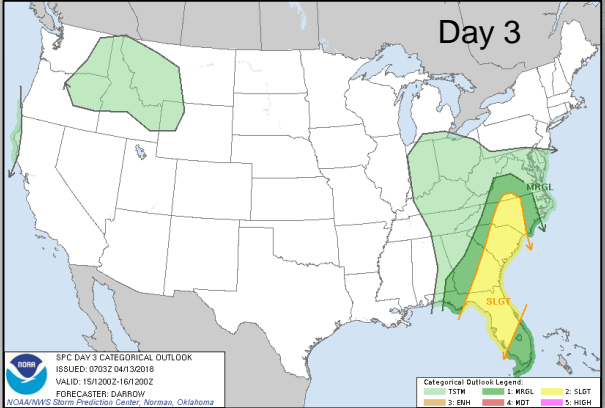
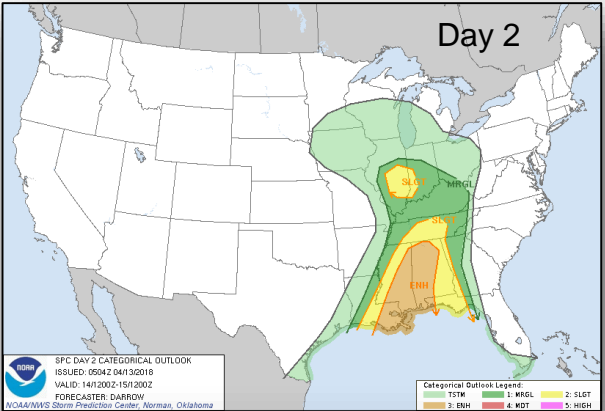
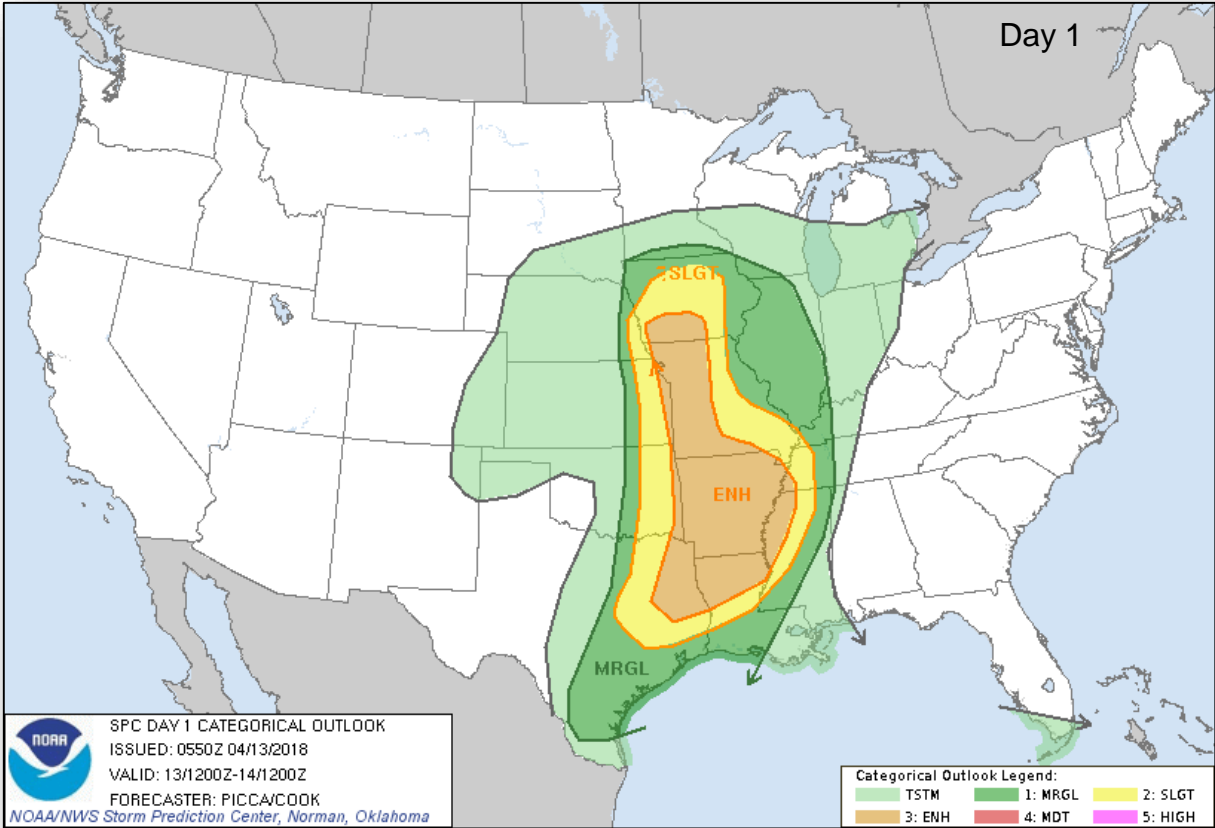

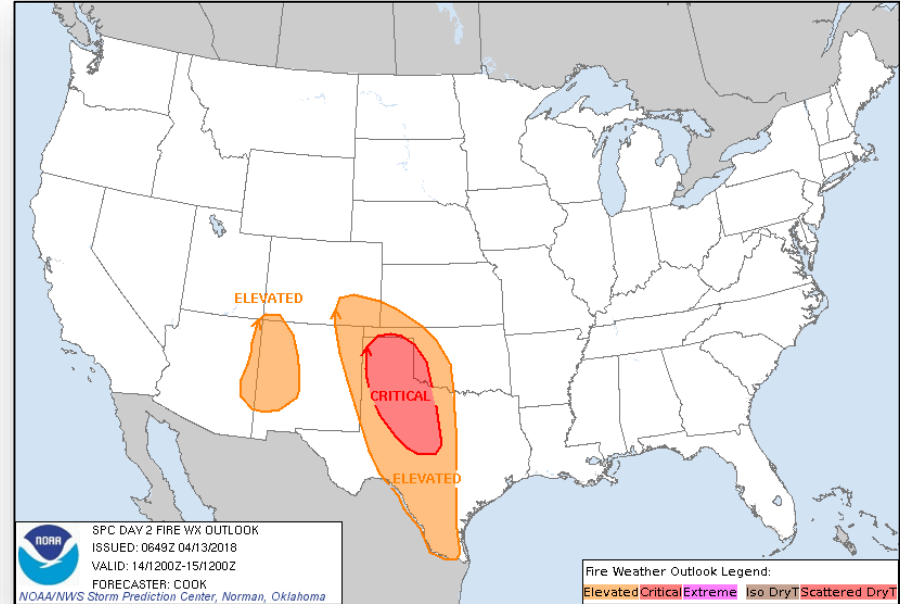
Fire Weather Outlook

Current Situation

- Fire began April 12, 2018 and is threatening communities around the areas of Woodward, Sharon, Moreland, Dewey and Mutual (pop 12,000)
- Threatening homes, wind farms, oil fields, and utilities
- Voluntary/Mandatory evacuations in effect for 200 people

Response

- Denton MOC remains at Steady State
- OK state EOC Monitoring
- FMAG approved on Apr 13, 2018
- No additional requests for FEMA assistance; no unmet needs at this time

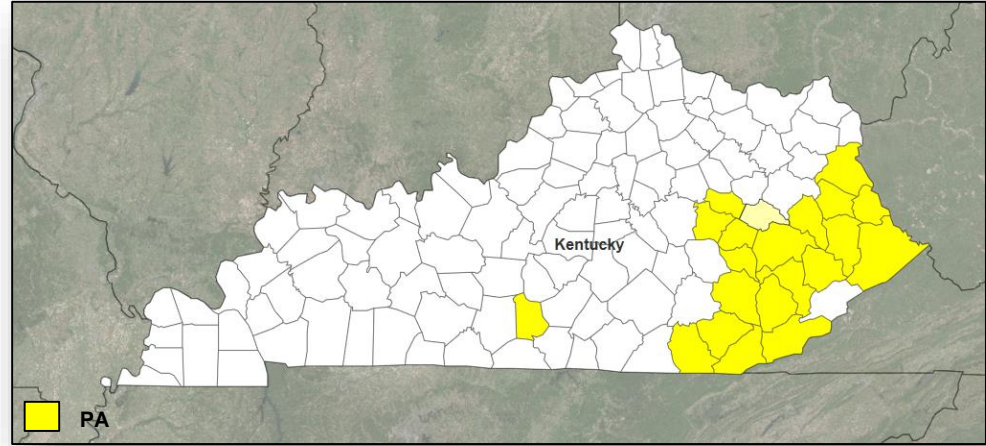

- FCO is Manny J. Toro



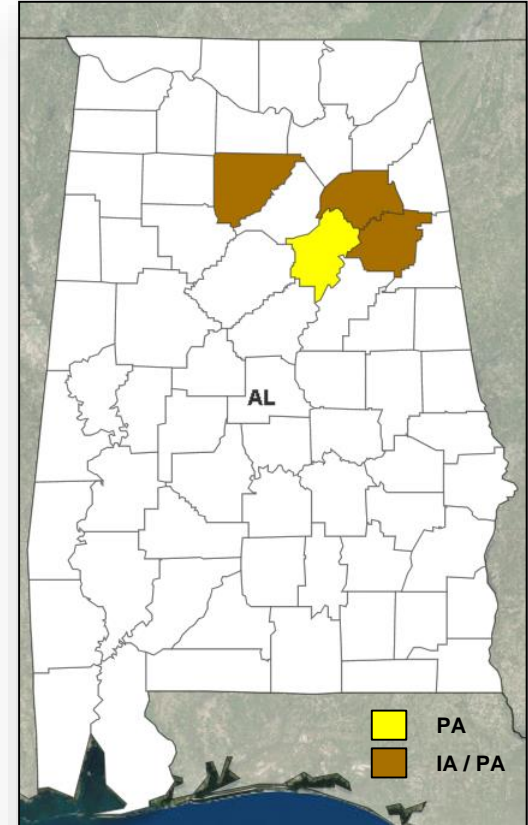
