- Flash flooding possible – Carolinas
- Rain and thunderstorms – Central Plains; Southeast to Mid-Atlantic
- Heavy snow possible – Northern Intermountain, Northern Rockies, Northern Plains
- Rain and snow – Pacific Northwest to Upper Mississippi Valley, Sierras, Central Great Basin and Central Rockies
- Critical/Elevated Fire Weather areas – AZ, NM, TX, UT, CO & OK
- Red Flag Warnings – AZ, NM, TX & CO
- Space Weather:
  - Past 24 hours: Minor – geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level occurred
  - Next 24 hours: Minor – geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level expected

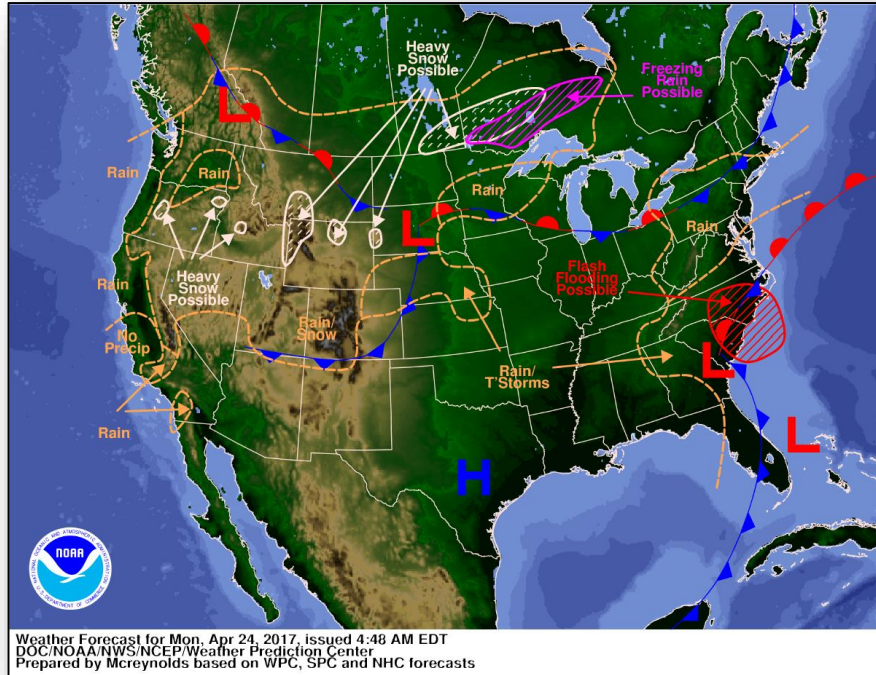

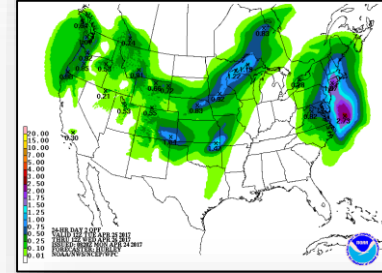
# Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3



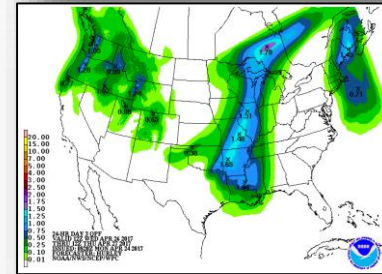

# Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-3





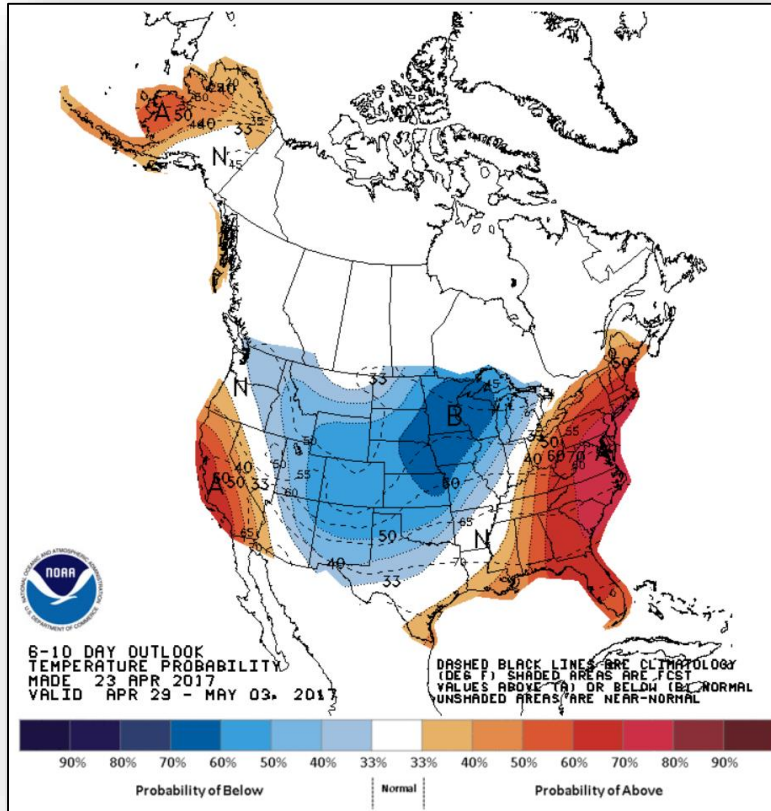
# Severe Weather Outlook – Days 4-7



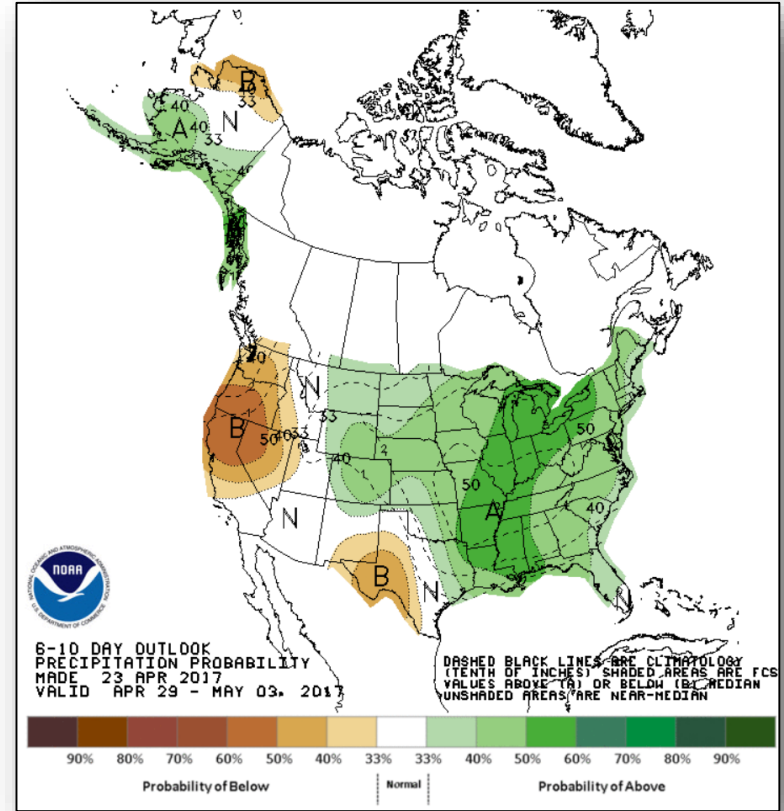
# 6-10 Day Outlooks

**6-10 Day Temperature Probability**



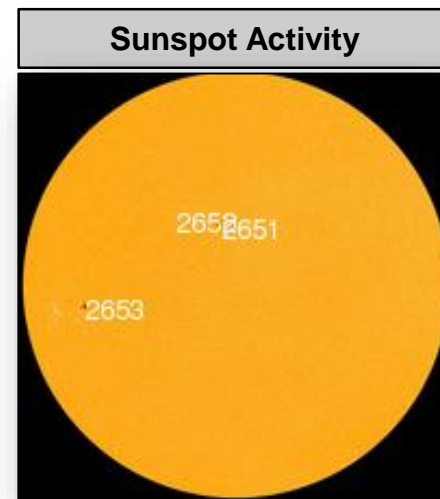
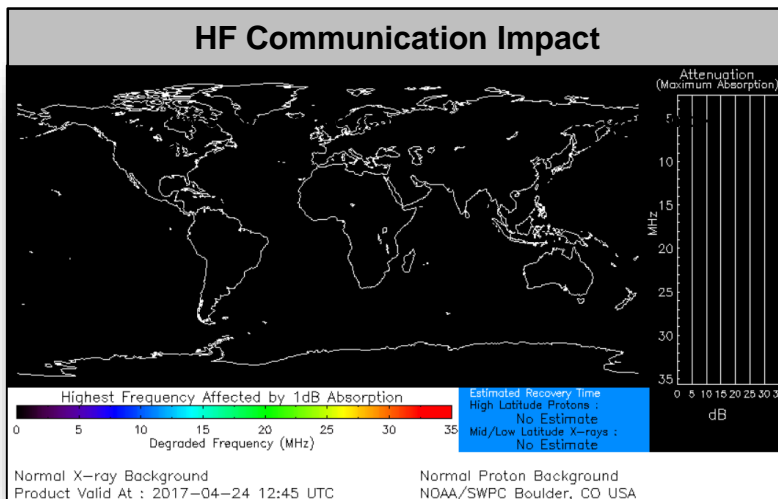
**6-10 Day Precipitation Probability**

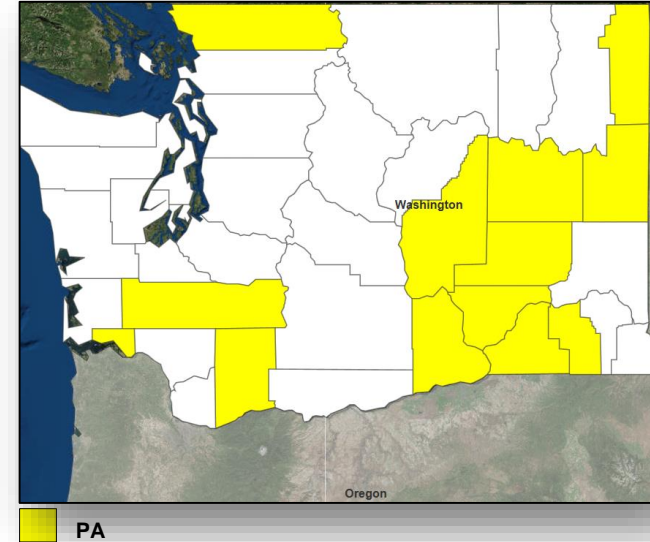

- FCO is Thomas J. Dargan





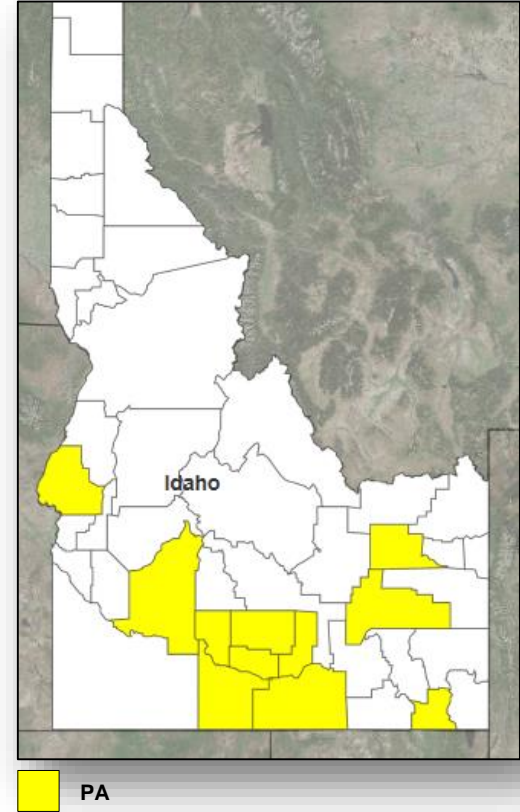

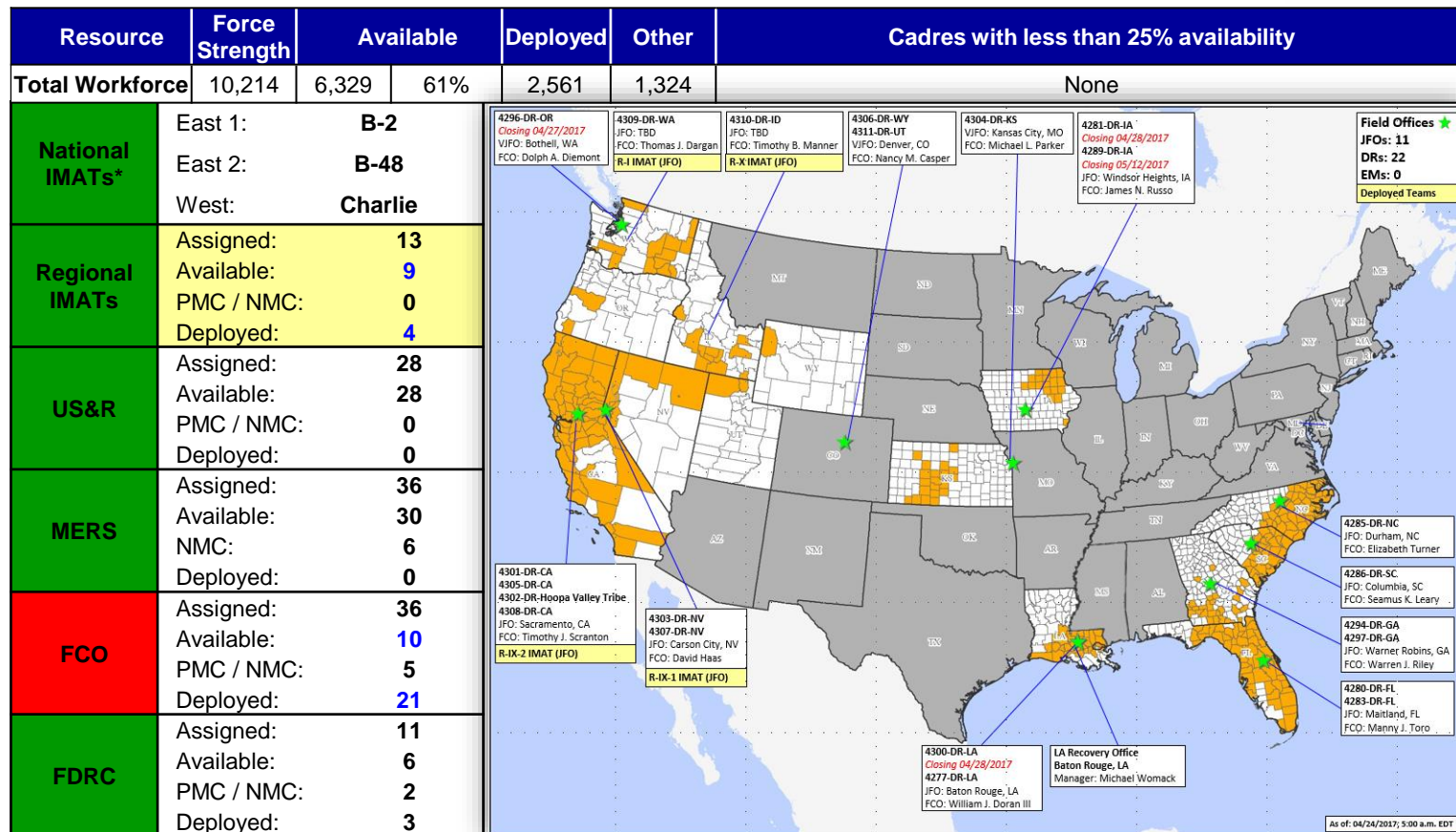
