Civil Unrest - Baltimore, MD

Situation:

- Violent riots/looting erupted in Baltimore, MD yesterday following the funeral of a local citizen who died while in police custody
- Law enforcement vehicles & approx. 20 structures were burned
- Widespread property damage to local businesses
- Rioters targeted first responders
- Fifteen police officers & one firefighter injured; three police in serious condition
- · Several additional injuries reported; no incident related fatalities

State Response:

- MD Governor declared State of Emergency for Baltimore
- MD State EOC activated to Level II (Partial Activation)
- MD Nat. Guard activated & assisting State & City Police
- MEMAC & EMAC resources requested for law enforcement assistance
- Baltimore City EOC is Fully activated at Level 1
- Baltimore City public schools closed today; State Offices on Liberal Leave
- One emergency shelter open at the War Memorial
- Citywide curfew starting tonight (10:00 pm 5:00 am EDT) for 1 week
 - School aged curfew is 9:00 pm





- 1.7M residents exposed to Severe / Violent shaking
- ▲ 8M people affected; 1.4M require food & shelter assistance
- ▲ Nepal Government reports approx. 4,400+ fatalities, 8,000+ injured & extensive damage, primarily in Kathmandu
- Power outages continue; cell phone & internet service intermittent
- ▲ Strong aftershocks >M5 expected for weeks to months

- Kathmandu IAP is open & operating at maximum capacity
- USAID deployed one Disaster Assistance Response Team
- ▲ US&R VA-TF1 (USA-1) in country; CA-TF2 (USA-2) ETA today
- 16 open spaces designated for displacement sites
- U.S. funding \$10M for assistance (DoS)






Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day




