Kīlauea Eruption – Hawai'i County, HI



Situation

Six known fissure vents have opened in Leilani Estates subdivision. Lava spattering and high levels of sulfur dioxide are present around the vents. Over 250 earthquakes of magnitude 2.5 or higher recorded in the past week with no major damages to CIKR.

Impacts


- Evacuations: Residents of Leilani Estate & Lanipuna Gardens (1,650 people and 775 homes) under mandatory evacuations
- Shelters: 2 shelters open / 184 occupants (ARC Shelter Count 6:51 a.m. EDT)
- · Transportation:
 - FAA established Temporary Flight Restrictions through May 7 for airspace near Pahoa for non-relief aircraft operations
 - o Pahoa-Pahoiki road closed from Highway 132 to Highway 137
- Damages: 1 home destroyed
- Emergency water restriction "for health and safety needs only" in place for neighborhoods near the fissures
- Puna Geothermal Venture operations shut down; plant not at direct risk

- HI EOC at Partial Activation
- Governor declared State of Emergency & activated HI National Guard












Hazards Outlook – May 7-11







