





Categorical Outlook Legend: TSTM 1: MRGL








Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3









River Flood Forecasts






6-10 Day Outlooks



Develop an Evacuation Plan

- First find out if you live in a storm surge hurricane evacuation zone and if you're home would be unsafe during a hurricane
- If you are, figure out where you'd go and how you'd get there if told to evacuate; you do not need to travel hundreds of miles
- Identify someone, perhaps a friend of relative who doesn't live in a zone or unsafe home, and work with them to use their home as your evacuation destination
- Be sure to account for your pets, as most local shelters do not permit them
- Put the plan in writing for you and those you care about




