- Kīlauea eruption

## **Significant Weather:**

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Central Plains
- Critical and elevated fire weather and dry thunderstorms – Southwest to Central Great Basin and Southern/Central Plains
- Red Flag Warnings – CA, AZ, NM, TX, CO, OK, KS, ME & NH
- Space Weather – Past 24 hours: None; next 24 hours: None

**Earthquake Activity:** No significant activity

**Declaration Activity:** Major Disaster Declaration Request – Hawaii

# Kīlauea Eruption – Hawai'i County, HI

## Situation

Fifteen fissure vents have formed in and around the Leilani estates subdivision. Small earthquakes continue in the southern coast of the Big Island and activity has more than doubled over the last 48 hours with a slight increase in magnitude. No major damages to critical infrastructure have occurred as a result of these earthquakes.

## Impacts


- **Evacuations:** 1,775 residents of Leilani Estates & Lanipuna Gardens (835 homes) under mandatory evacuation; Leilani Estates residents allowed limited reentry
- **Shelters:** 2 shelters / 186 (-44) occupants (*ARC Midnight Shelter Count, 5:56 a.m. EDT*)
- **Damage:** 36 structures (27 homes) affected
- Portions of Highway 130, Pahoia-Pahoiki Road, and [Alaili Road](#) closed
- Puna Geothermal Venture (PGV) Power Plant **removed all pentane fuel from facility**
- Water supply to lower Puna shut down; a 50% “restricted use” in effect for lower Puna (pop 3,500); for public use, water spigots were installed near entrance to Lava Tree State Park and a water truck has been positioned near mailboxes
- FAA extended Temporary Flight Restriction through May 15

## State / Local Response

- HI EOC at Partial Activation (days only)
- Governor declared a State of Emergency & activated HI National Guard
- [Governor requested a Major Disaster Declaration on May 9, 2018](#)

## FEMA Response

- FEMA Region IX RWC & Pacific Area Watch at Steady State; continue to monitor
- Four FEMA Region IX LNOs deployed to HI EOC & Hawai'i County Civil Defense
- National IMAT East-1 deployed to HI-EMA (O'ahu) & [Hawai'i County, HI](#)
- Portions of National IMAT East-2 & Region IX personnel deployed to HI-EMA (O'ahu)
- FEMA NWC is monitoring




# Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific

## Tropical Depression ONE-E (Advisory #3 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,420 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving west at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Depression forecast to degenerate into a remnant low by tonight or early Saturday





- Development of a tropical cyclone within the next 24 hours is High







# Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast






# Declaration Request
