Kīlauea Eruption – Hawai'i County, HI



Situation

On May 3, a lava flow broke to the surface in lower Puna on the Big Island of Hawaii. Twenty fissure vents have formed in and around the Leilani estates subdivision. Air quality in southeast area of Lanipuna Gardens has been rated "condition red" (immediate danger to health) for high levels of sulfur dioxide. HVO increased the Aviation Color Code to RED due to increased ash emission. Volcanic-tectonic seismicity continues.

Impacts

- Evacuations: Mandatory evacuations for approximately 2k residents (900 homes)
- Shelters: 3 (+1) shelters / 357 (+114) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count, 5:38 a.m. EDT)
- Injuries / Fatalities: 3 injuries / 0 fatalities
- Damage: 36 structures (27 homes) impacted
- Transportation:
 - o Portions of Hwy 130, Hwy 132 and local roads closed
 - FAA Temporary Flight Restriction extended through May 26

State / Local Response

- HI EOC at Partial Activation (days only)
- · Governor declared a State of Emergency and activated HI National Guard
- EMAC activated for assistance from other states






National Weather Forecast





Severe Weather Outlook






Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast
