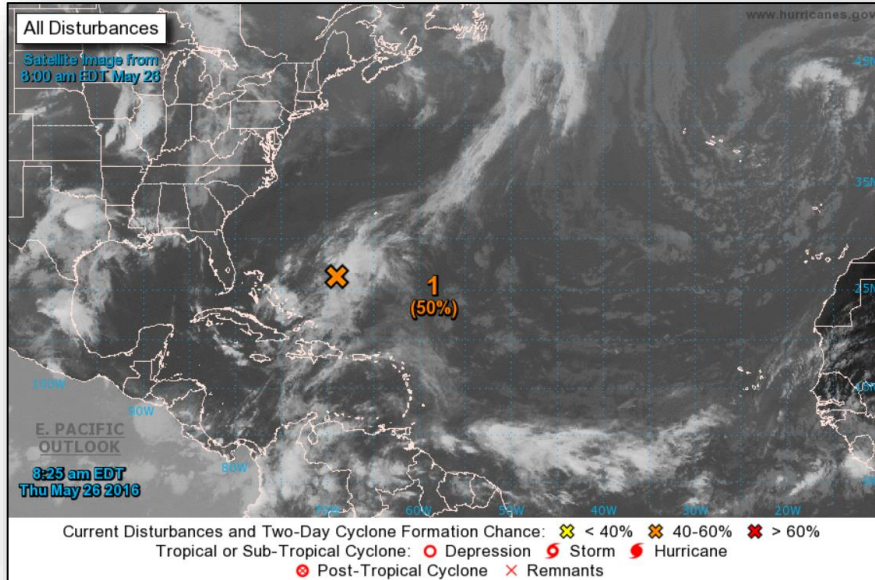

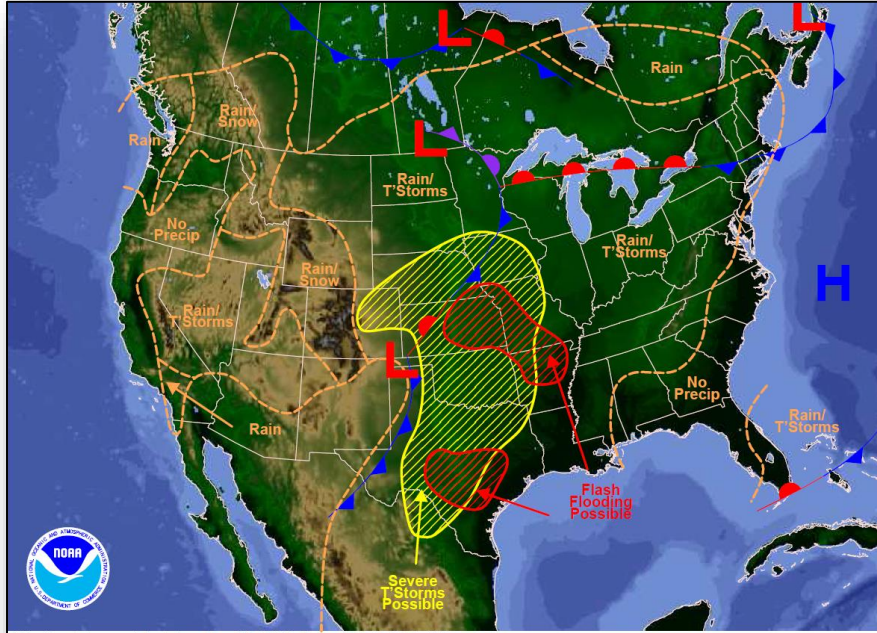
2-Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1: (as of 8:25 a.m. EDT May 26)

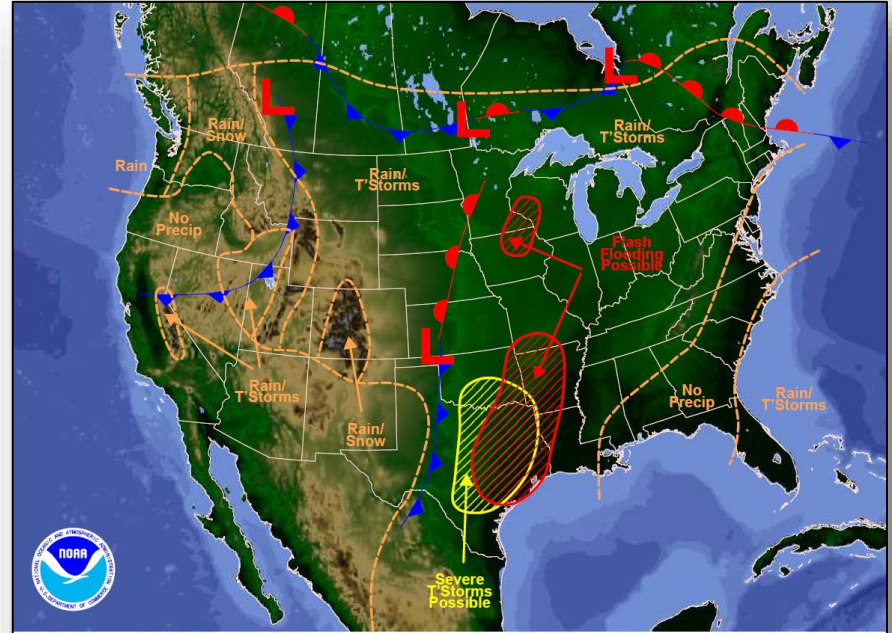
- A low pressure area between Bermuda and the Bahamas is gradually becoming better defined
- Increasing shower activity
- The system is moving west-northwestward or northwestward toward the southeastern United States coast
- Environmental conditions are expected to become more conducive for tropical or subtropical cyclone formation by Friday
- An Air Force reconnaissance plane is scheduled to investigate this low on Friday
- Formation chance – 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance – 5 days: High (70%)

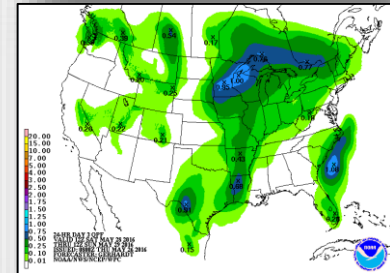
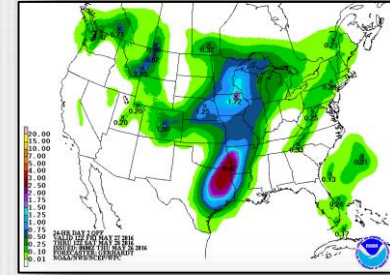
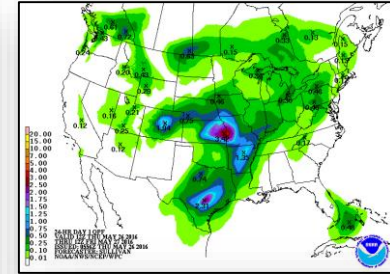
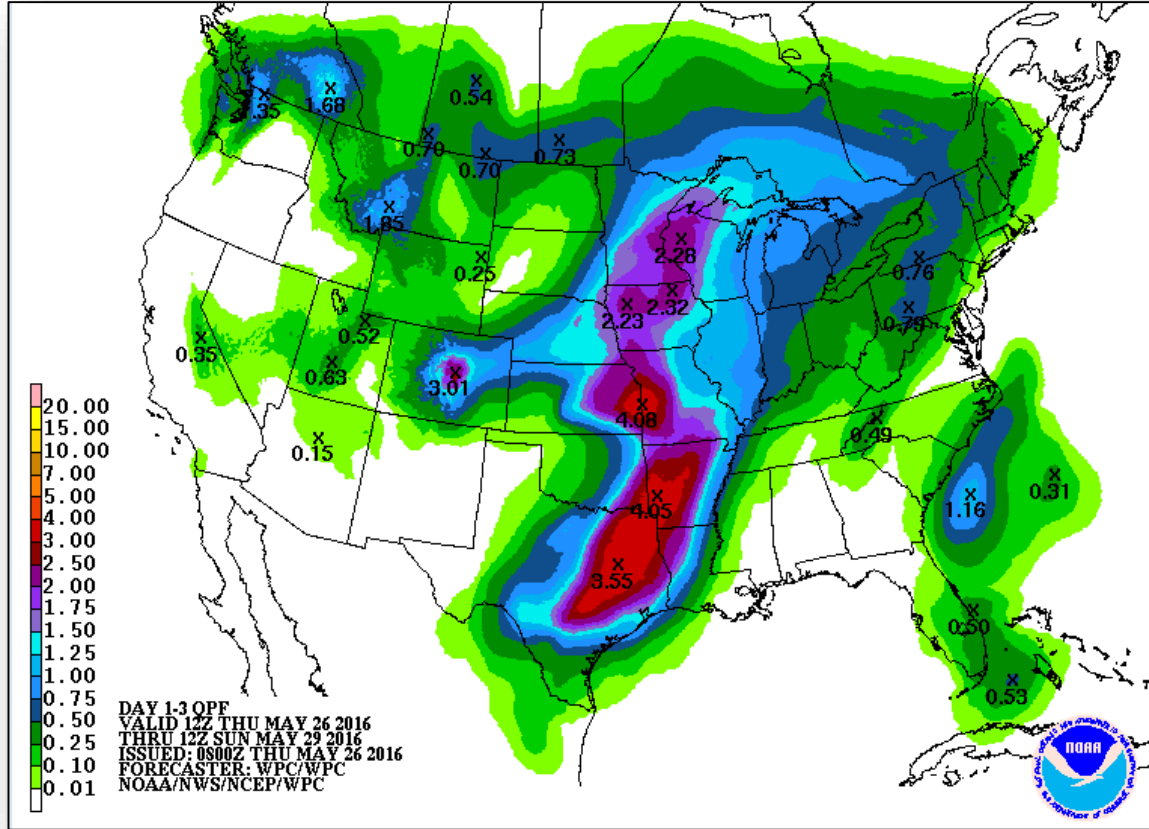
Severe Weather Outlook: Days 1-3



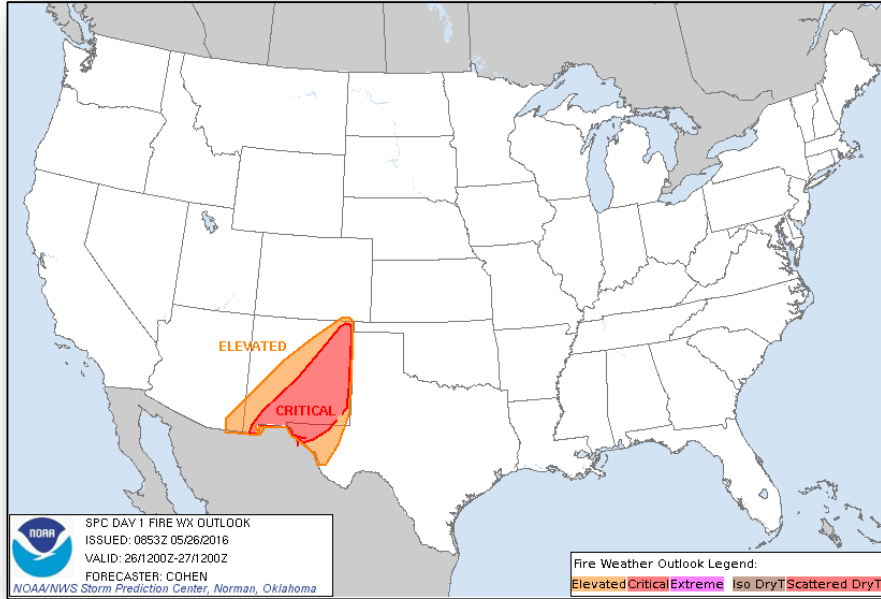
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



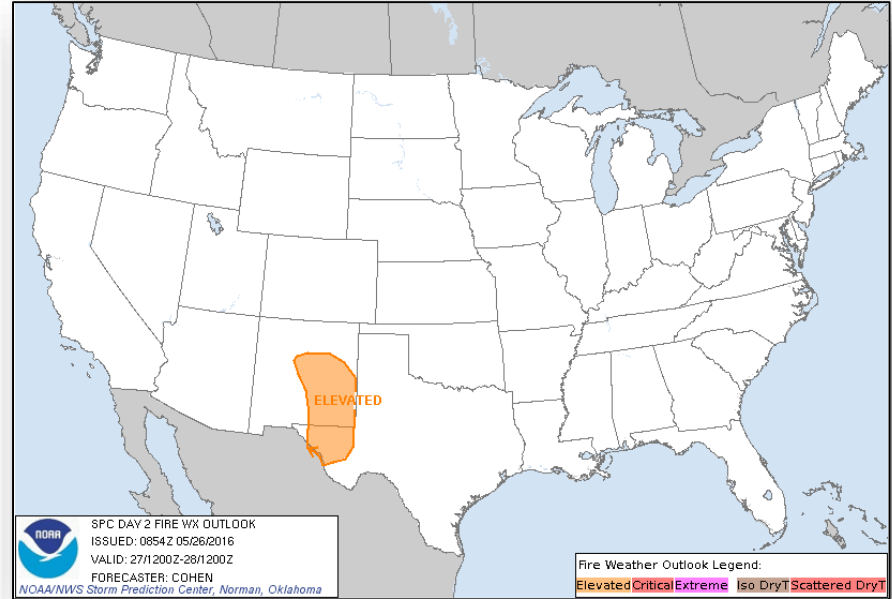

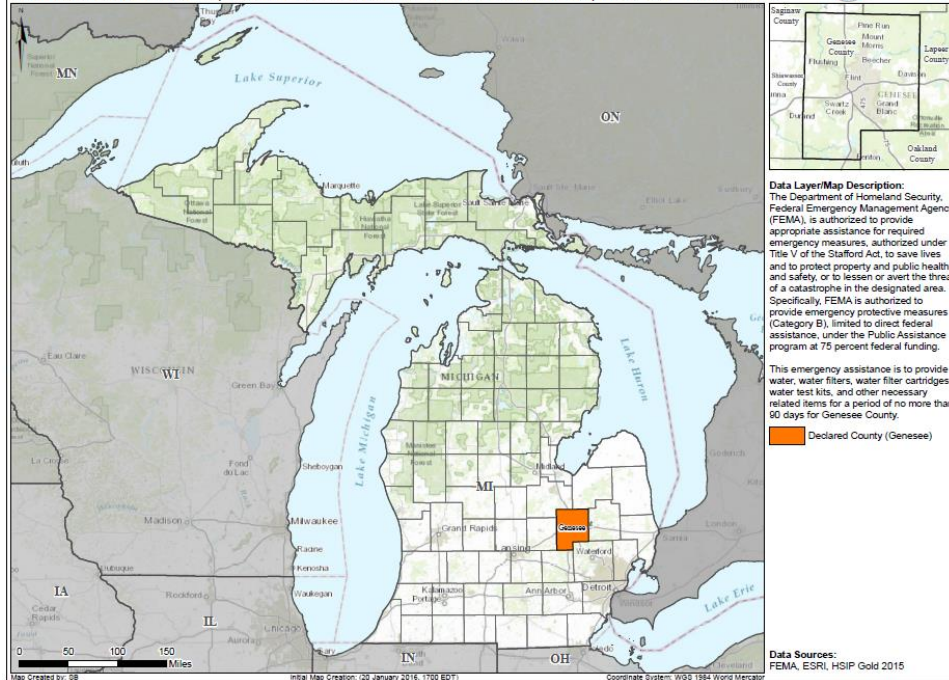

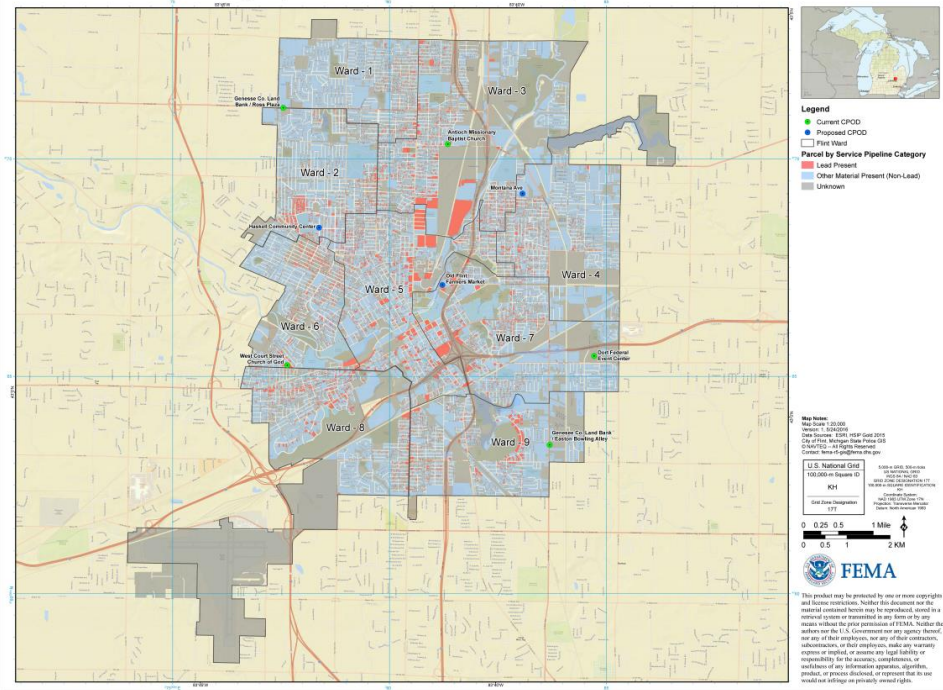
