Impacts

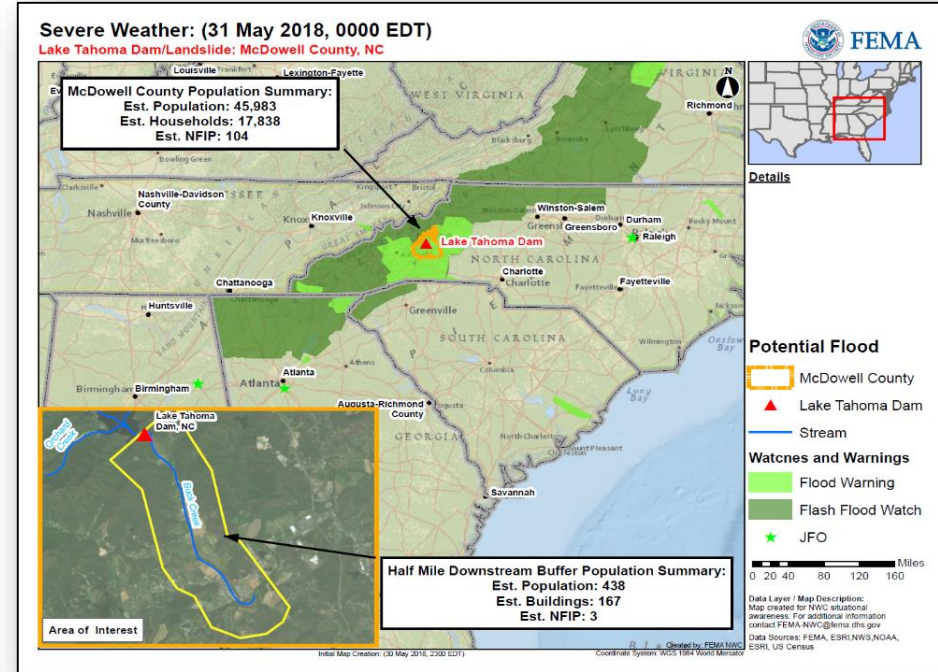
- Significant road, bridge, and structure damage occurred
- Tahoma Dam Landslide, McDowell County, NC:
 - Engineers inspected the dam and determined it safe
 - Evacuation orders have been lifted and the incident is stabilized

- KY, MS, and AL EOCs at Monitoring

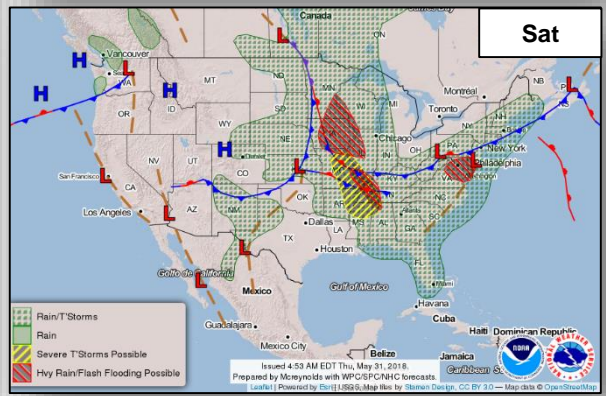
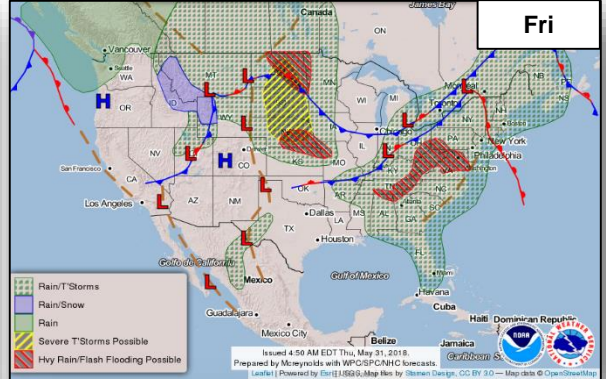
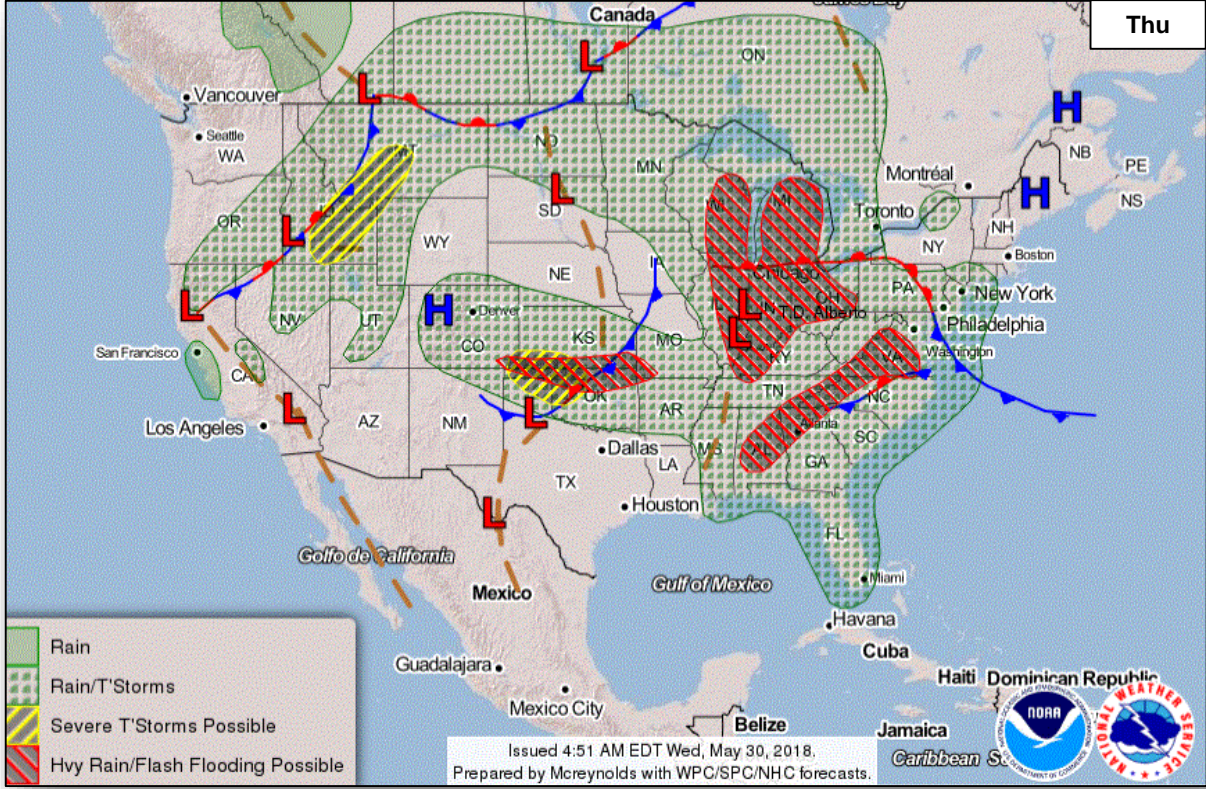

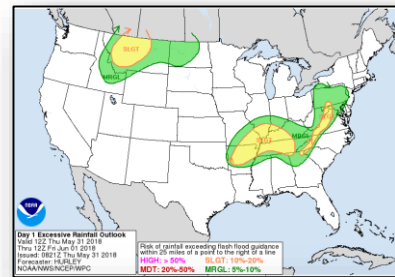
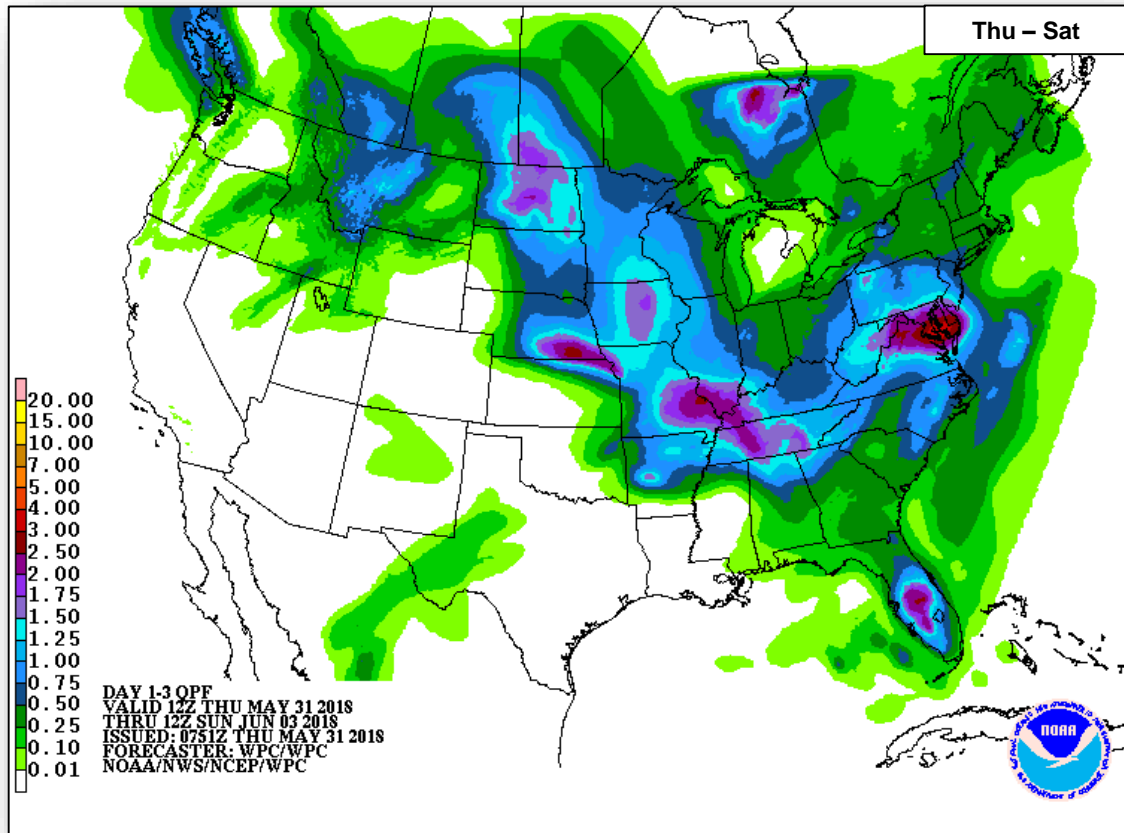
National Weather Forecast



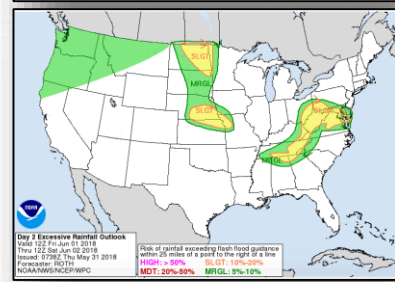
Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast



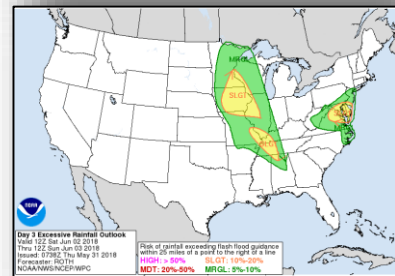

Severe Weather Outlook



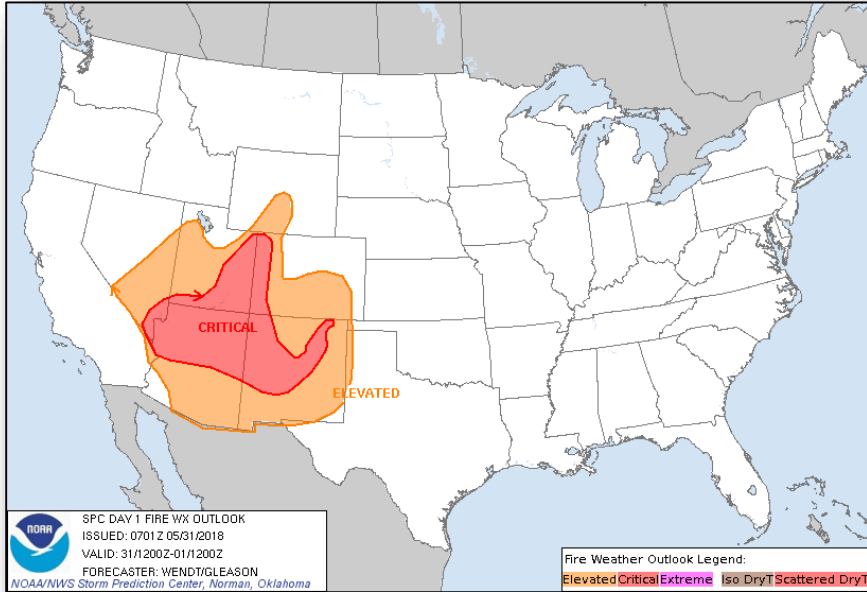

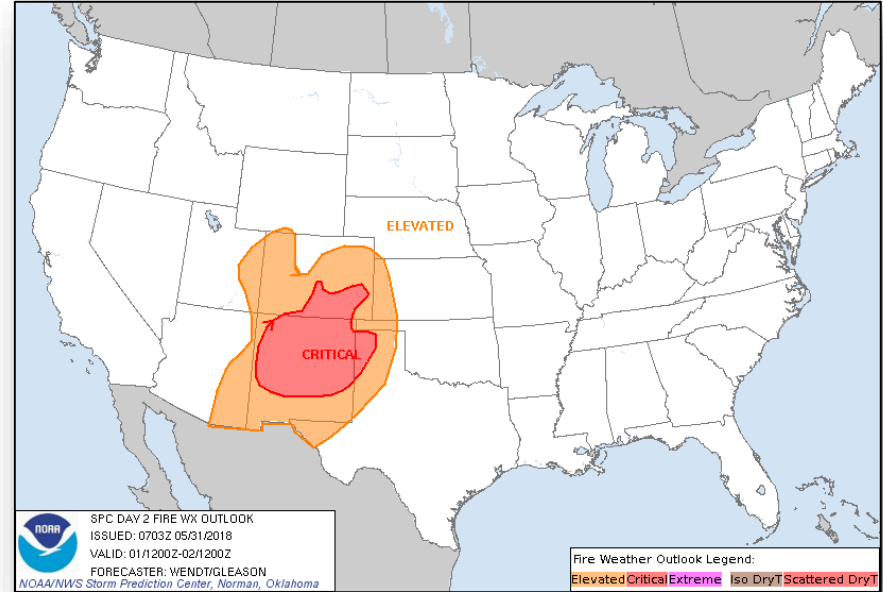
Fire Weather Outlook
