Significant Activity: June 8-9



Significant Events: None

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Tropical cyclone activity not expected during the next 24 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Post-tropical Cyclone Blanca/Disturbance 1 – Medium (60%)
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones are expected through Wednesday night
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. territories

Significant Weather:

- Slight risk of Severe thunderstorms – Upper Midwest, Northern Plains, & NE CONUS
- Flash flooding – California and Southwest
- Red Flag Warnings – CA, OR, WA & AK; Elevated Fire Weather areas – OR & WA
- Space Weather: past 24 hours – minor: geomagnetic storms reaching the G1 level occurred; next 24 hours - minor geomagnetic storms reaching the G1 level are likely.

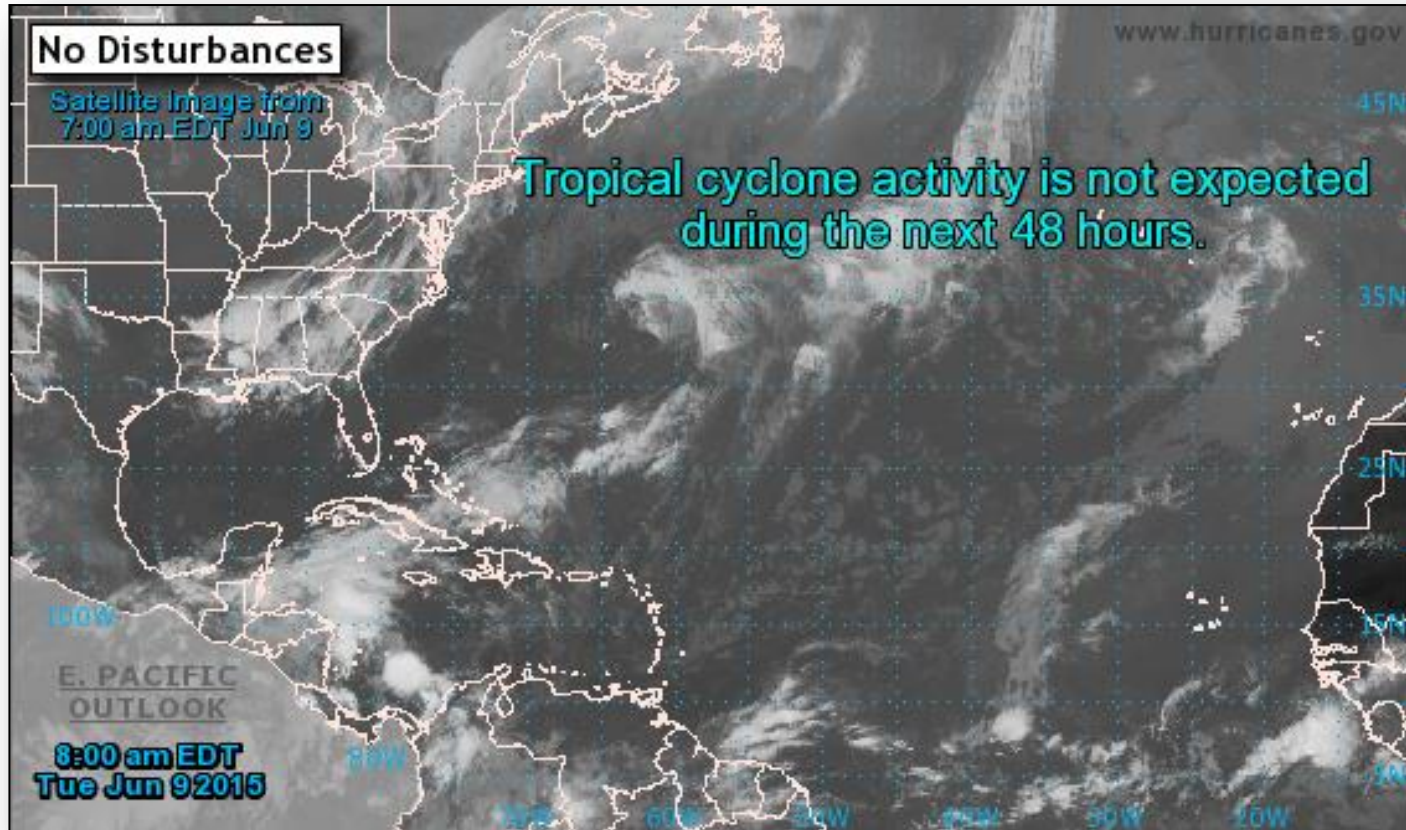

2-Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



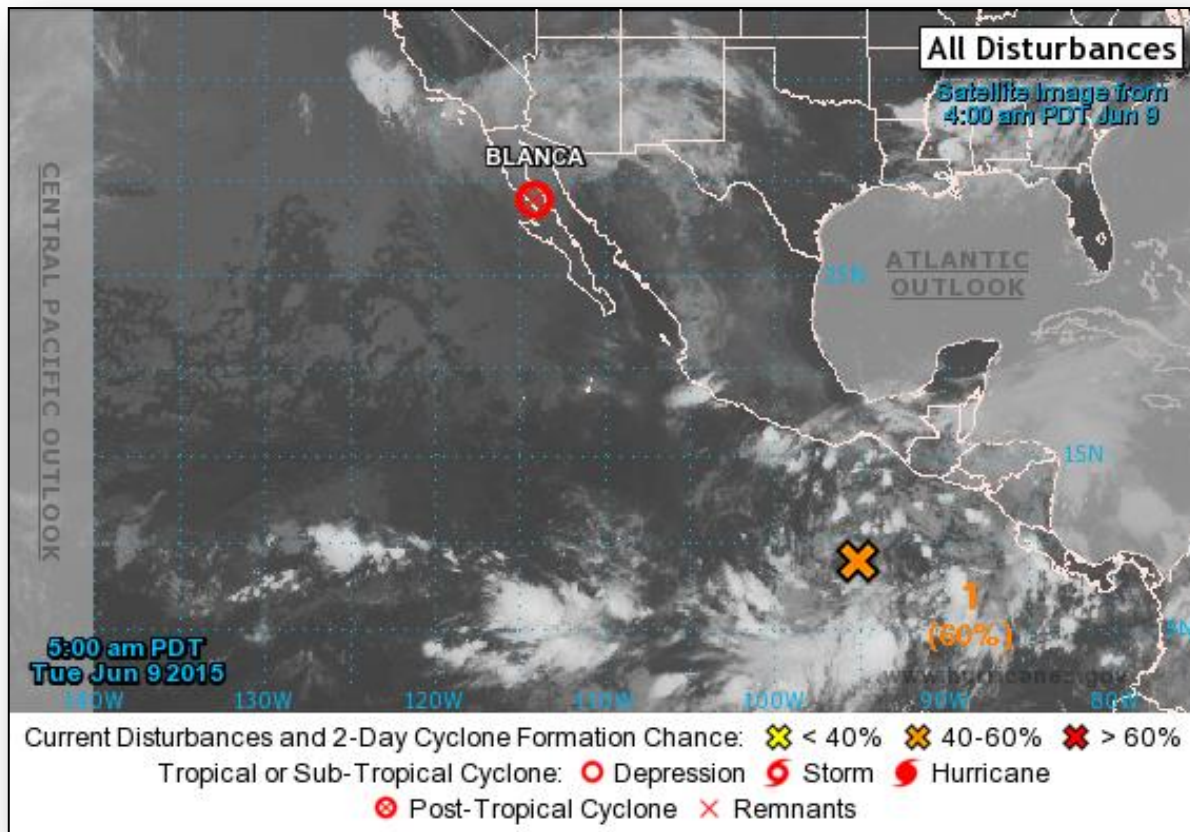
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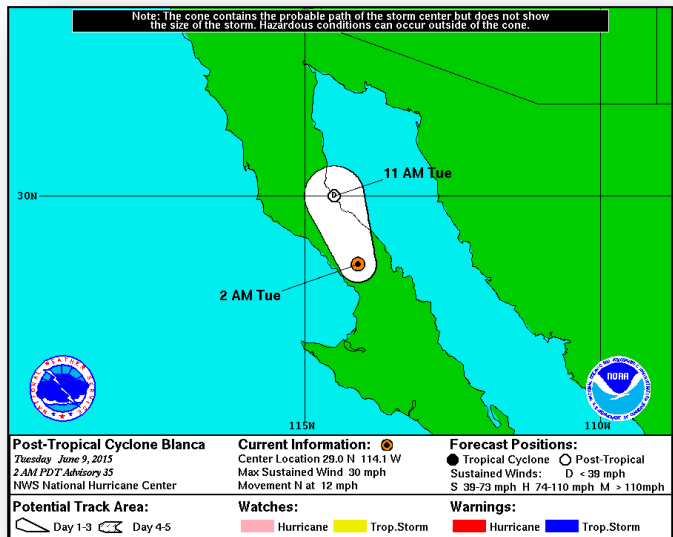
2-Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



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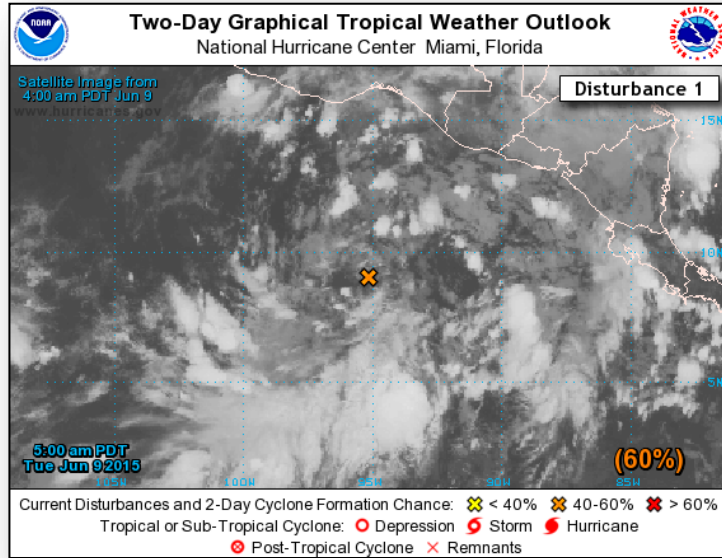
Eastern Pacific – Post-tropical Cyclone Blanca (Final)



Post-tropical Cyclone Blanca (Advisory #35, as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located about 160 miles NW of Santa Rosalia, Mexico
- Moving N at 12 mph; this general motion is expected to continue today
- Maximum sustained winds decreased to 30 mph
- Expected to dissipate later today
- Additional rainfall accumulations of 1 to 3 inches over parts of the central and northern Baja California peninsula
- Light to moderate rainfall amounts associated with this low will also begin to increase over portions of the southwestern United States through Tuesday

Eastern Pacific – Disturbance 1



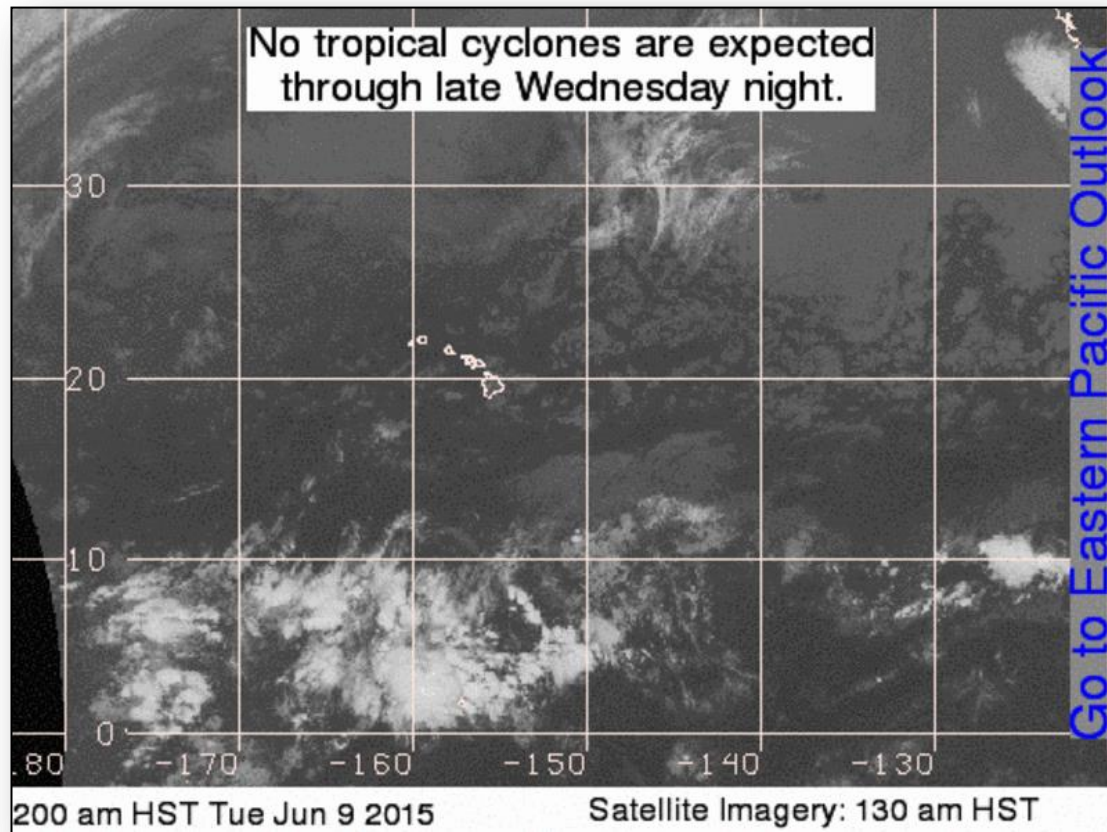
Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 am EDT)

- Centered several hundred miles south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Moving slowly northwestward or north
- Environmental conditions remain conducive for development
- Tropical depression is likely to form in next 2-3 days
- Probability of tropical cyclone formation:
 - Next 48-Hours: Medium – 60%
 - Next 5-Days: High – 90%

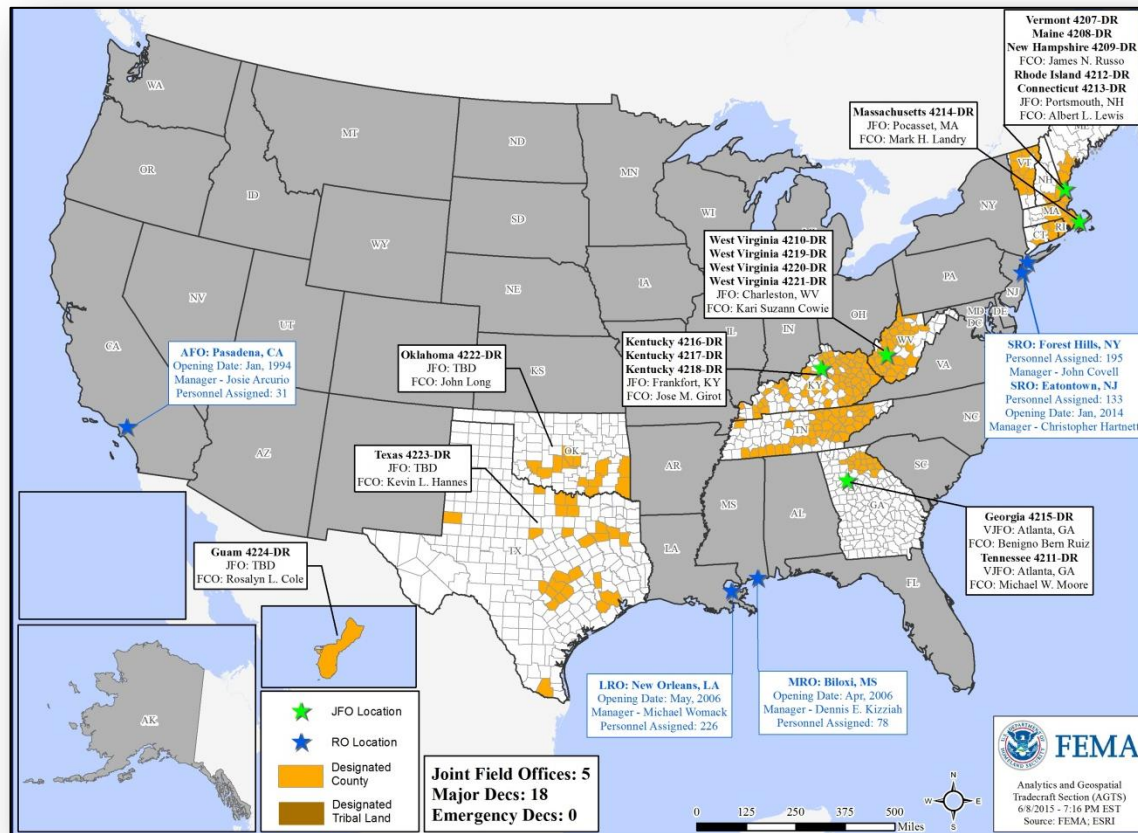

Open Field Offices as of June 9



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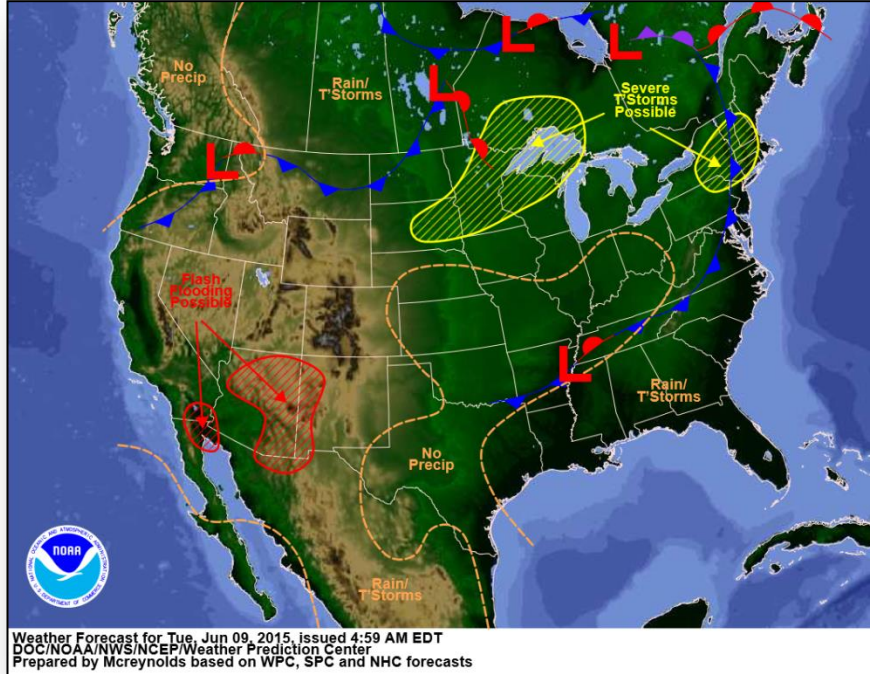

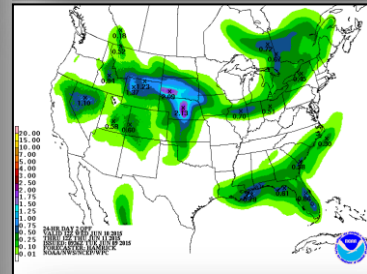
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



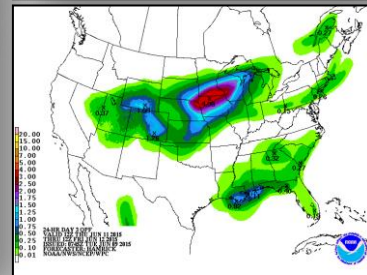

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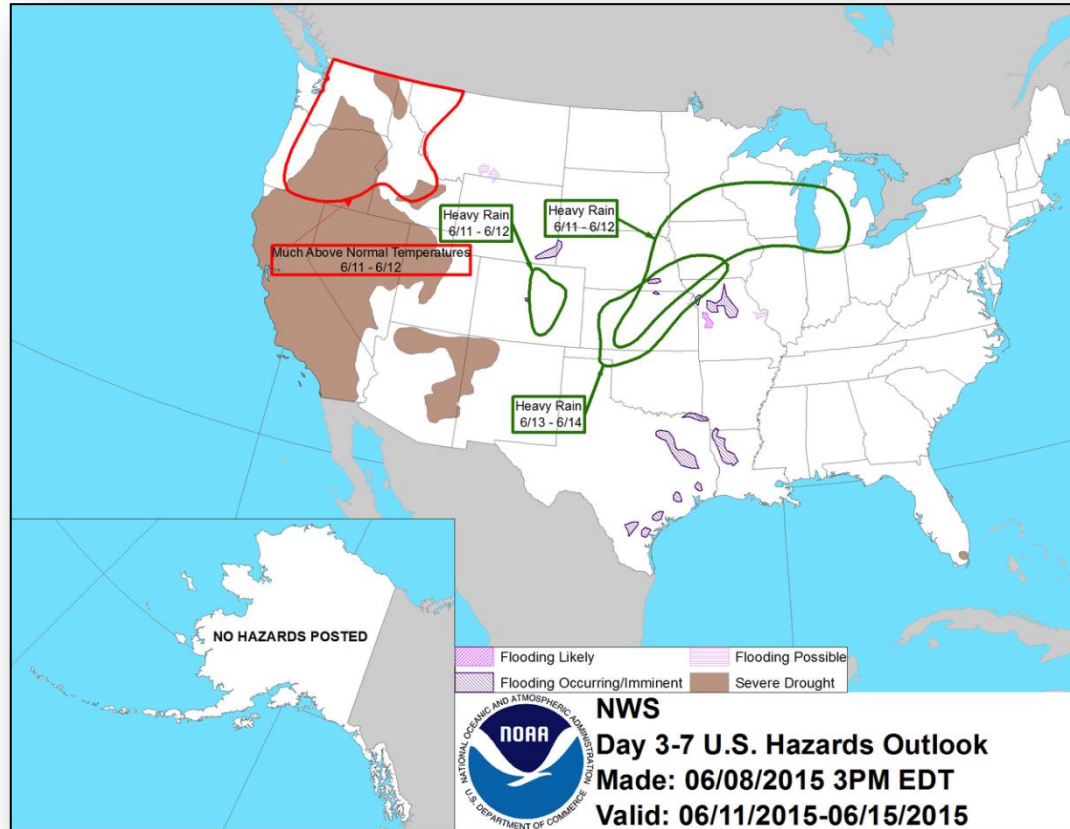

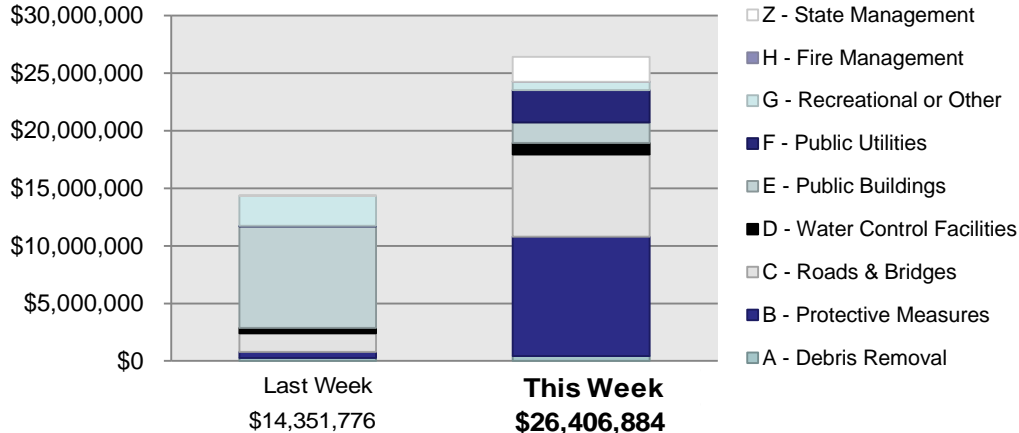

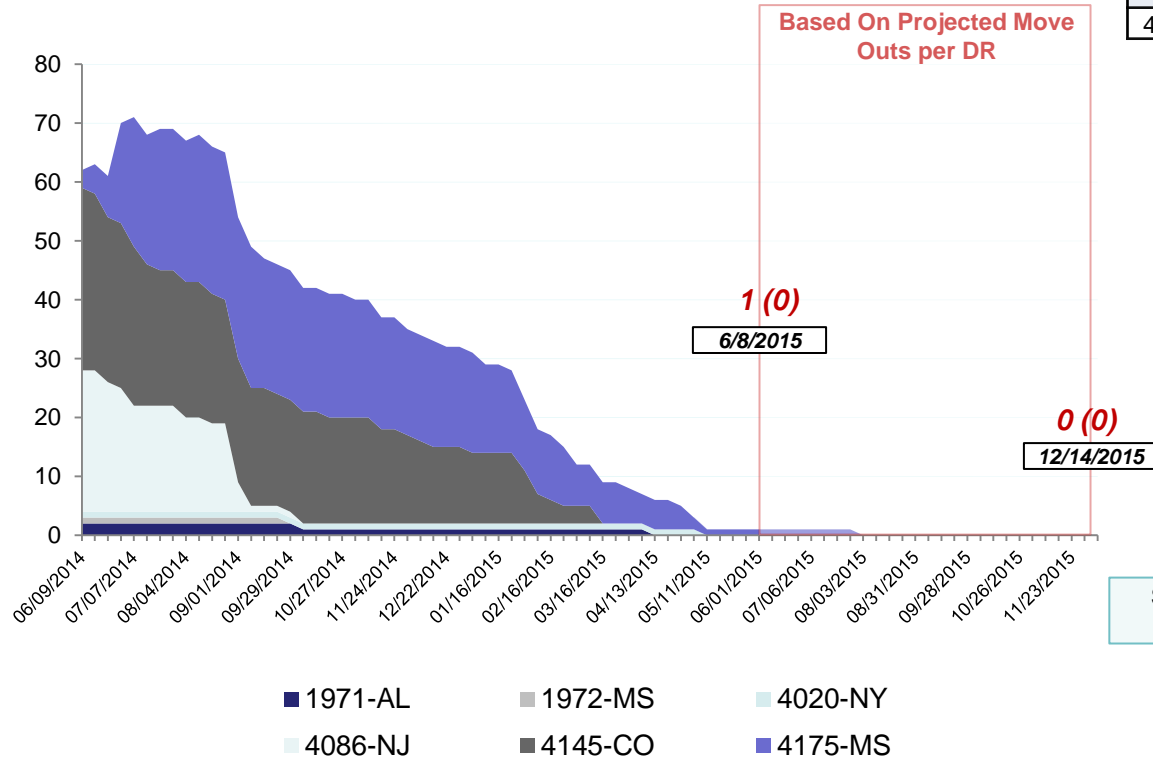
PA Highlights

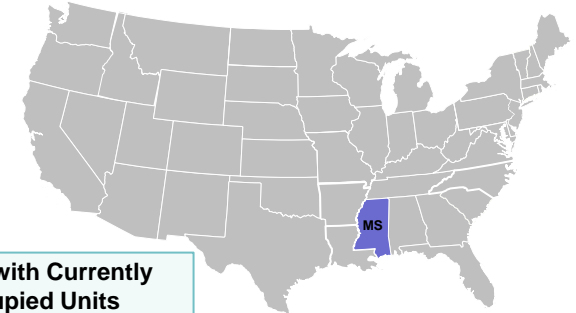
Direct Housing

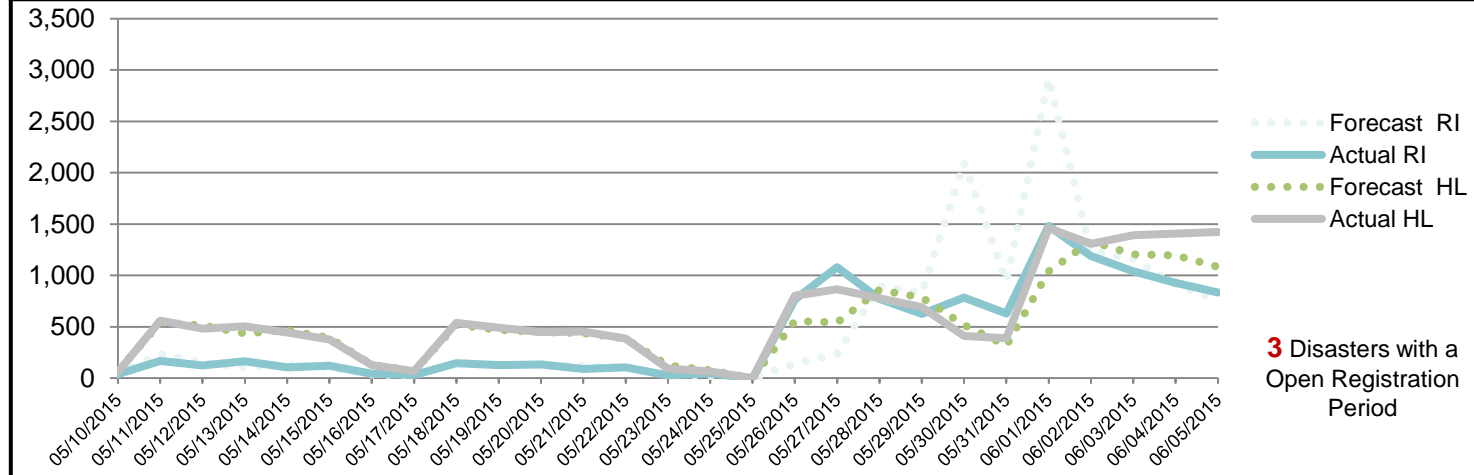

NPSC Call Forecasting and Actual Calls Over the Past 4 Weeks 5/4/2015 through 5/30/2015

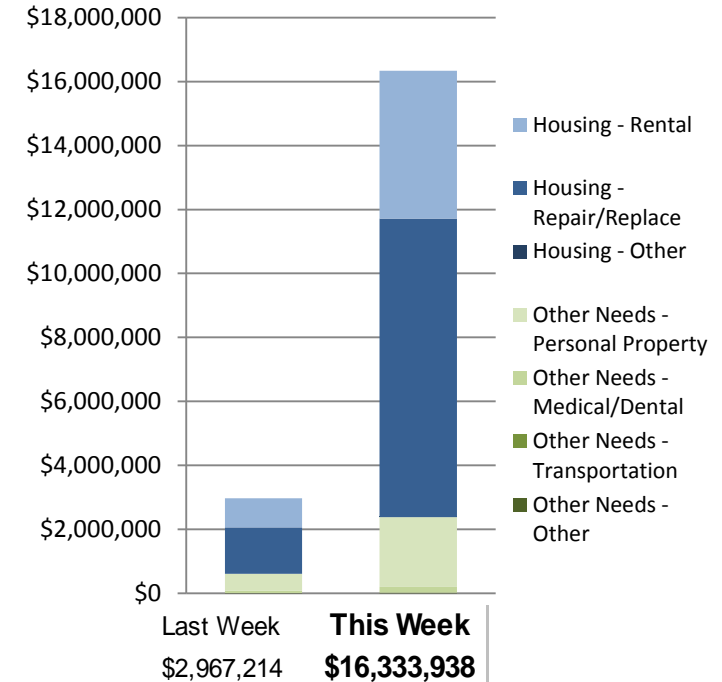
