


2-Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic






2-Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Post-tropical Cyclone Blanca (Advisory #35, as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located about 160 miles NW of Santa Rosalia, Mexico
- Moving N at 12 mph; this general motion is expected to continue today
- Maximum sustained winds decreased to 30 mph
- Expected to dissipate later today
- Additional rainfall accumulations of 1 to 3 inches over parts of the central and northern Baja California peninsula
- Light to moderate rainfall amounts associated with this low will also begin to increase over portions of the southwestern United States through Tuesday

Eastern Pacific – Disturbance 1






Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 am EDT)


