Significant Activity – June 16-17



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Significant Events: None

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Disturbance 1: Medium (40%); Disturbance 2: Low (20%)
- Eastern Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected during the next 48 hours
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected during the next 48 hours
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests during the next 48 hours

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Central Plains to Great Lakes
- Flash flooding possible – Middle Mississippi Valley to Great Lakes
- Rain and thunderstorms – Northern Plains to Great Lakes, Lower Mississippi Valley to Southeast and Northeast
- Space Weather:
 - Past 24 hours: Minor; geomagnetic storms reaching G1 level occurred
 - Next 24 hours: None predicted

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Declaration Activity:

- Major Disaster Declaration approved - Kansas

Severe Weather – Nebraska (*Final*)



Current Situation

- Severe storms moved through eastern NE overnight with numerous hail and wind damage reports and a few brief tornadoes

Impacts


- Widespread wind damage to trees, power lines and homes in eastern NE; most of the damages are in Plattsmouth (pop. 6,500) in Cass County and Bellevue (pop 55k) in Sarpy County
- 50k customers without power statewide *(As of 7:45 am EDT. Customer outage data is provided by the Department of Energy's EAGLE-I system. Comprehensive National coverage of all electrical service providers is not available.)*
- No fatalities; 4 injuries in Plattsmouth

State/Local Response

- NE EOC at Partial Activation
- 1 shelter open with 1 occupant *(ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 4:50 am EDT)*
- NWS storm survey teams will be surveying damages today

Federal Response

- FEMA Region VII remains at Steady State
- No requests for FEMA assistance at this time




Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,500 miles ESE of southern Windward Islands
- Moving W at 15-20 mph
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (40%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located over northwest Caribbean Sea
- Moving slowly NW across Yucatan Peninsula into south-central Gulf of Mexico
- Conditions favorable for gradual development
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)




5 Day Outlook







Severe Weather Outlook – Days 1-2






Severe Weather Outlook – Days 3-4



Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk






