# Significant Activity: June 25-26



**Significant Events:** No Activity

**Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic: Tropical cyclone activity not expected next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific: Tropical cyclone activity not expected next 48 hours
- Central Pacific: No tropical cyclones expected through late Sat night
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. territories

**Significant Weather:**

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Southern Plains to Mid-Atlantic
- Flash flooding possible – Middle Mississippi & Ohio valleys to Mid-Atlantic
- Rain and thunderstorms – Southwest to Upper Mississippi Valley to Mid-Atlantic; Northern Intermountain
- Red Flag Warnings – AK, CA, NV, OR & WA
- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather areas – ISODRY Thunderstorms California, Nevada, and Oregon

**Space Weather:**

- Past 24 hours: Minor – G1 geomagnetic storms and S1 solar radiation storms occurred
- Next 24 hours: Minor –S1 solar radiation storms and R1 radio blackouts likely

- 12,000 Police & Fire public safety professionals from 70 countries
- Competing in 60 medal events for 1,600 medals

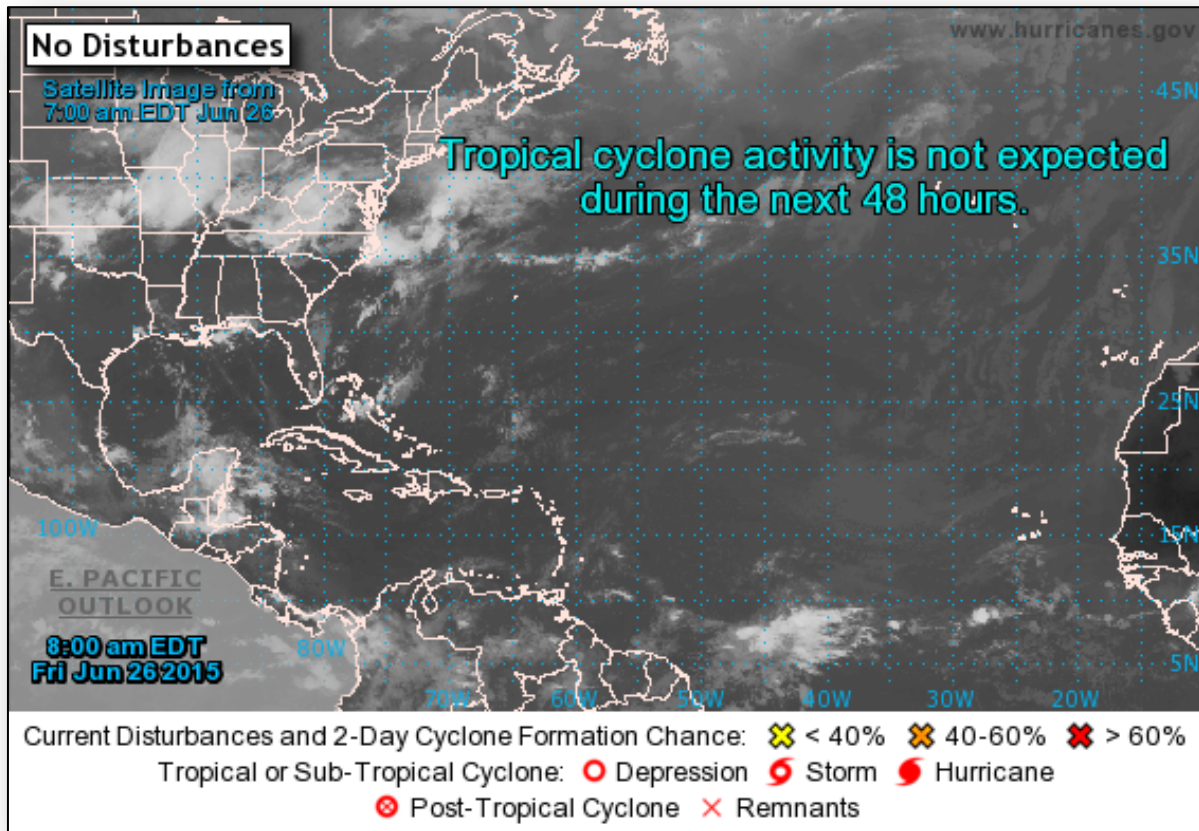

# 2-Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



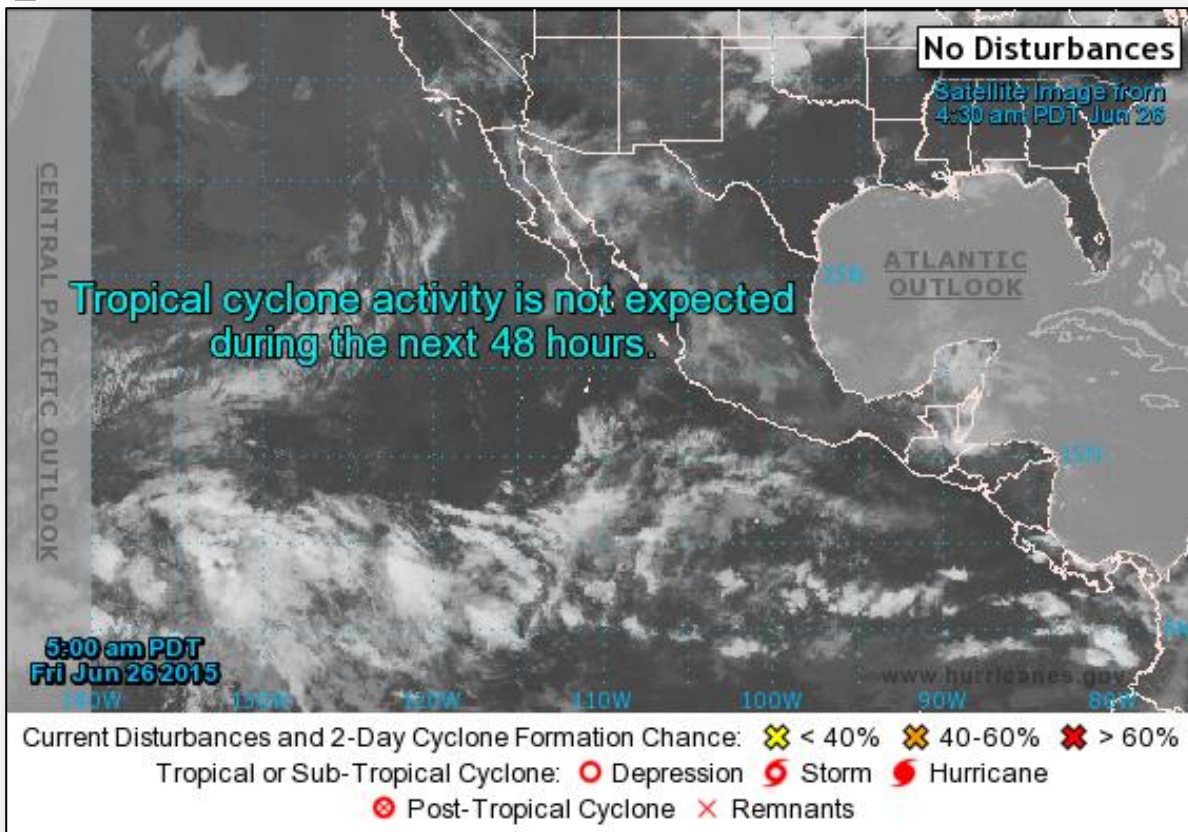
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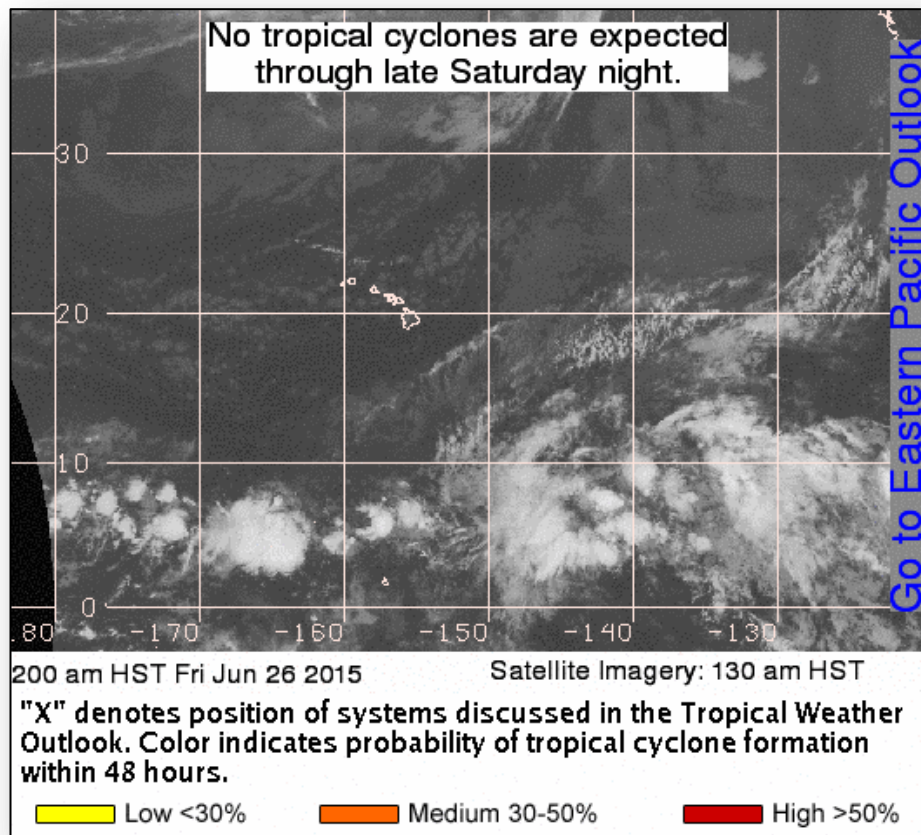
# 2-Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific

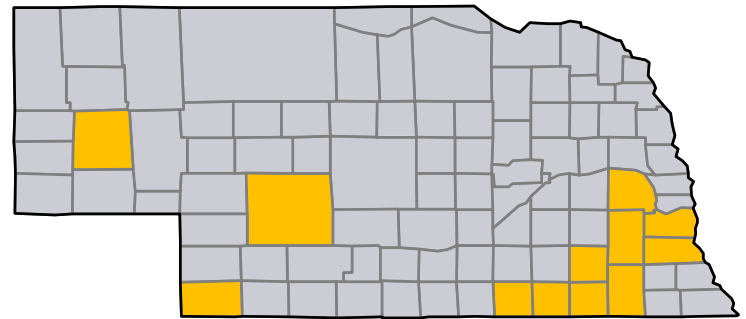


# Major Disaster Declaration – NE

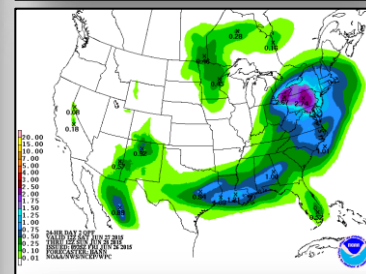
# Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



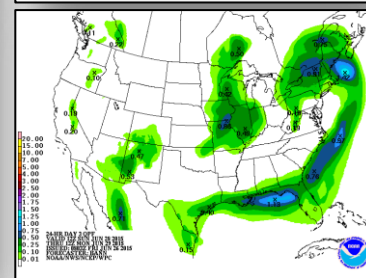

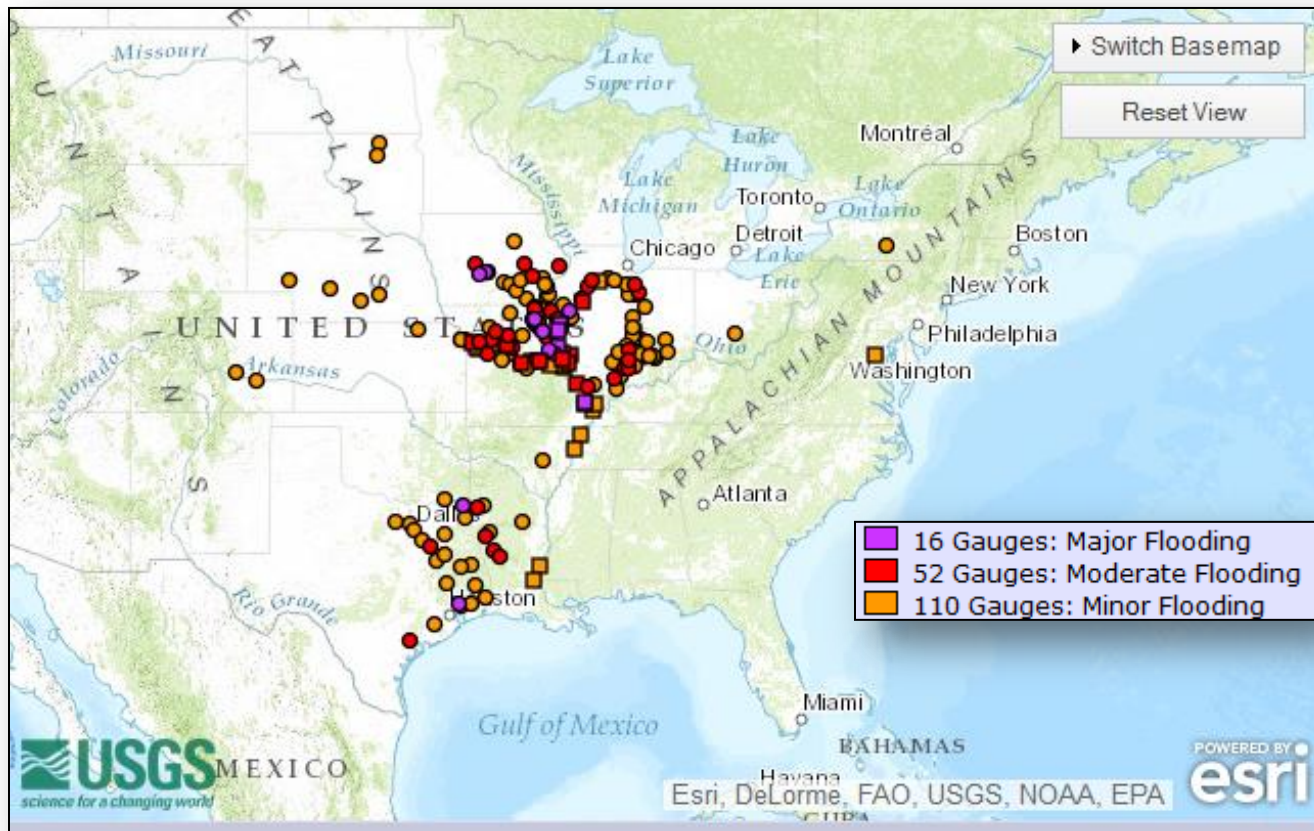

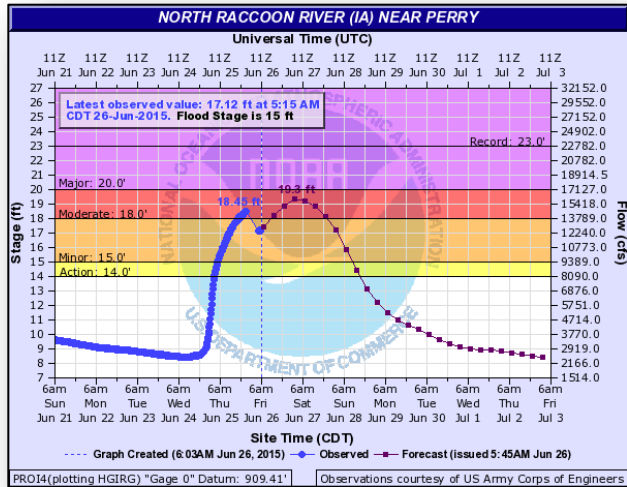


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# North Raccoon Creek near Perry, IA

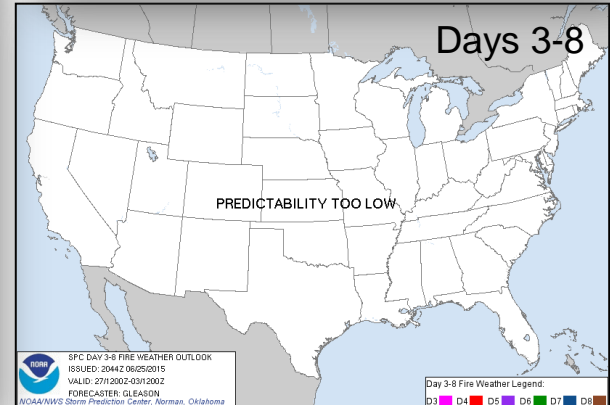
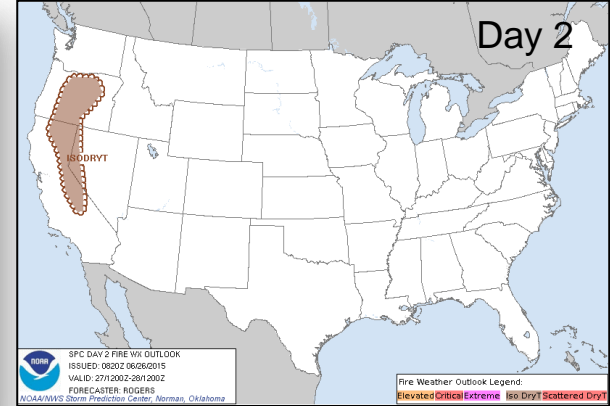
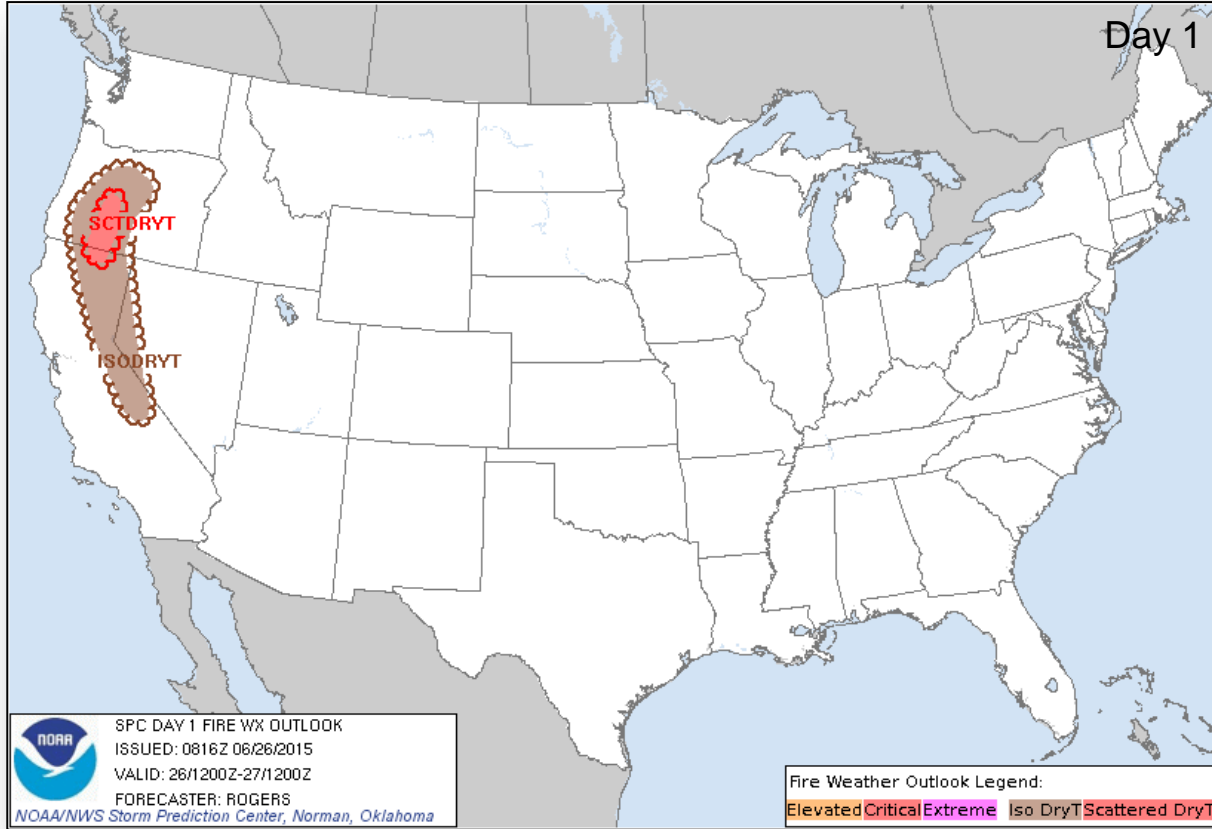
# Severe Weather Outlook, Days 1-3



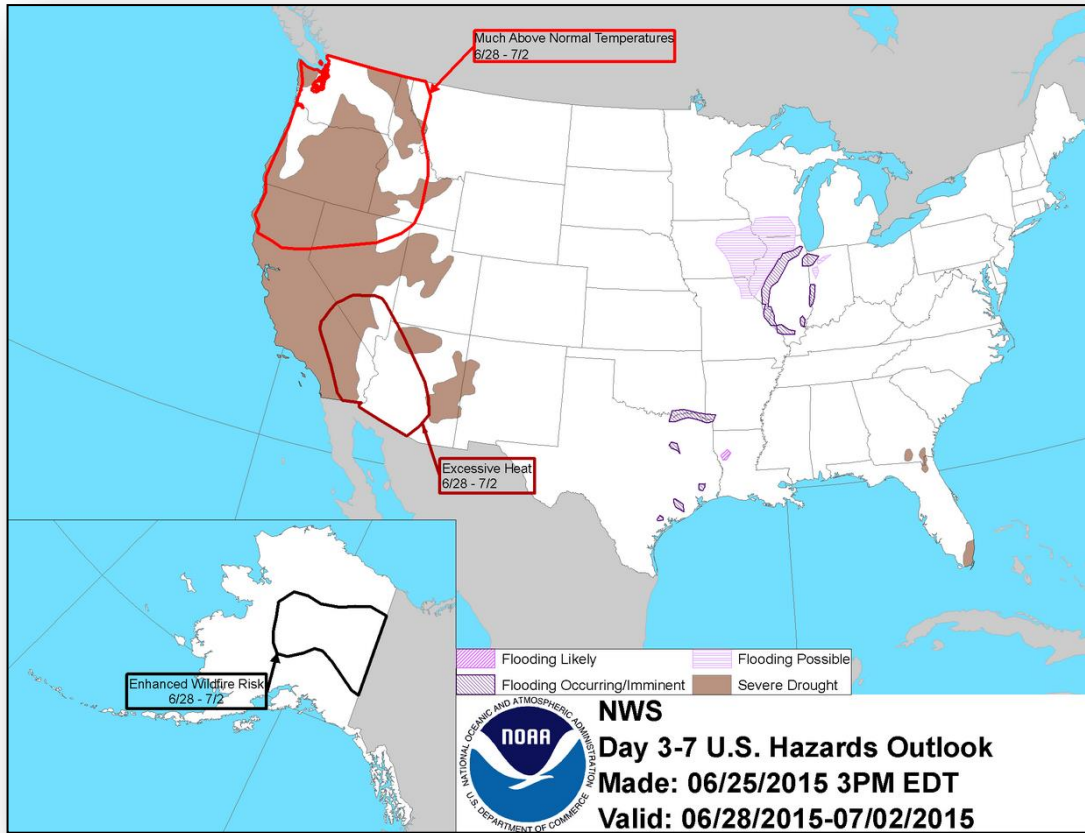

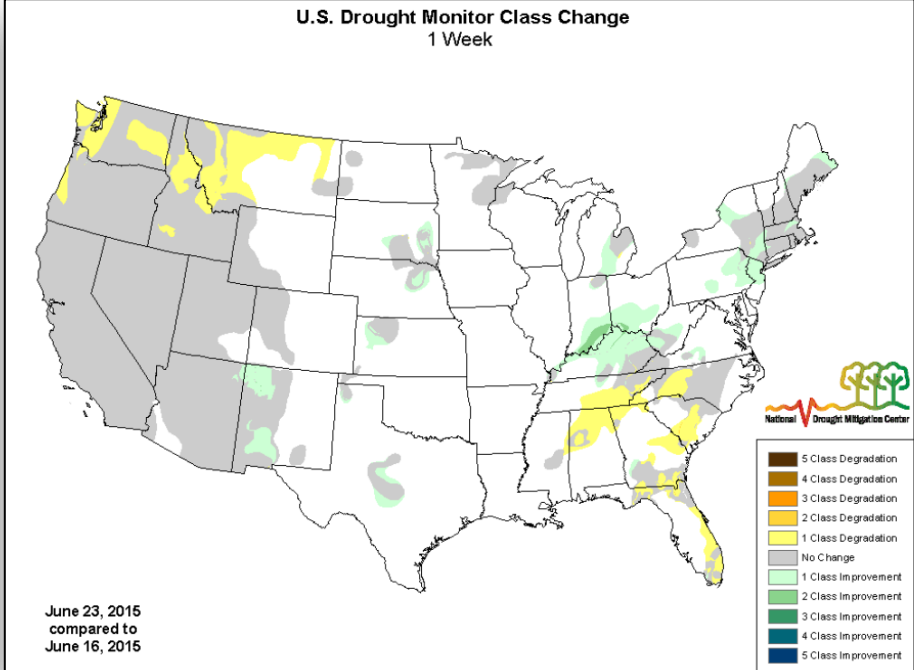
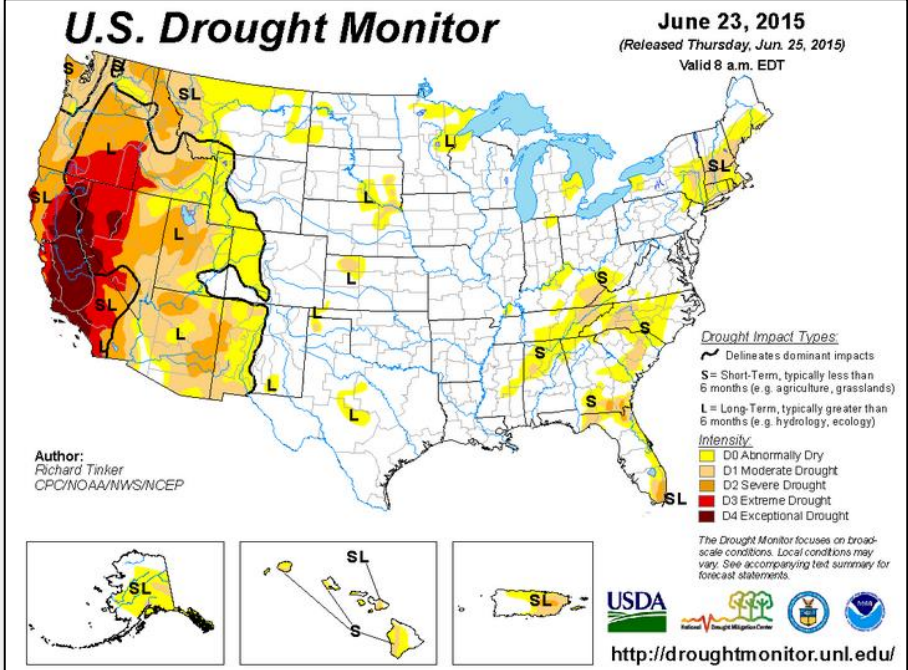
# Fire Weather Outlook, Days 1-8



# Hazard Outlook, June 28 – July 2



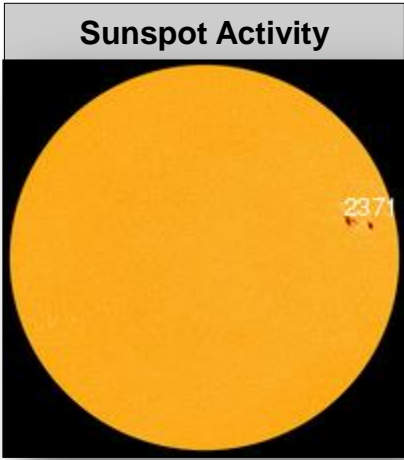
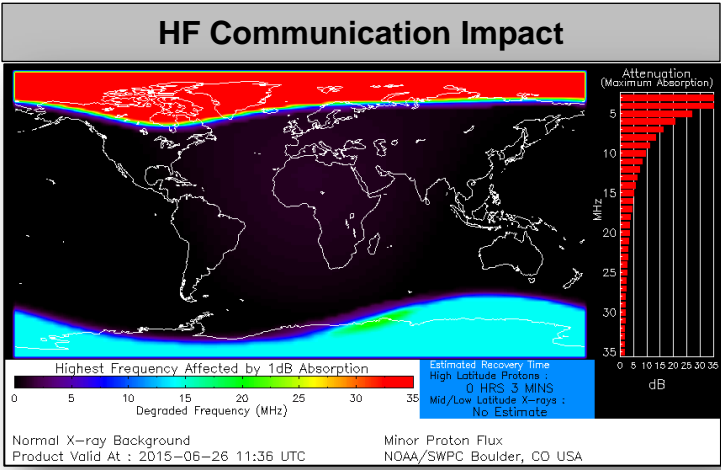
