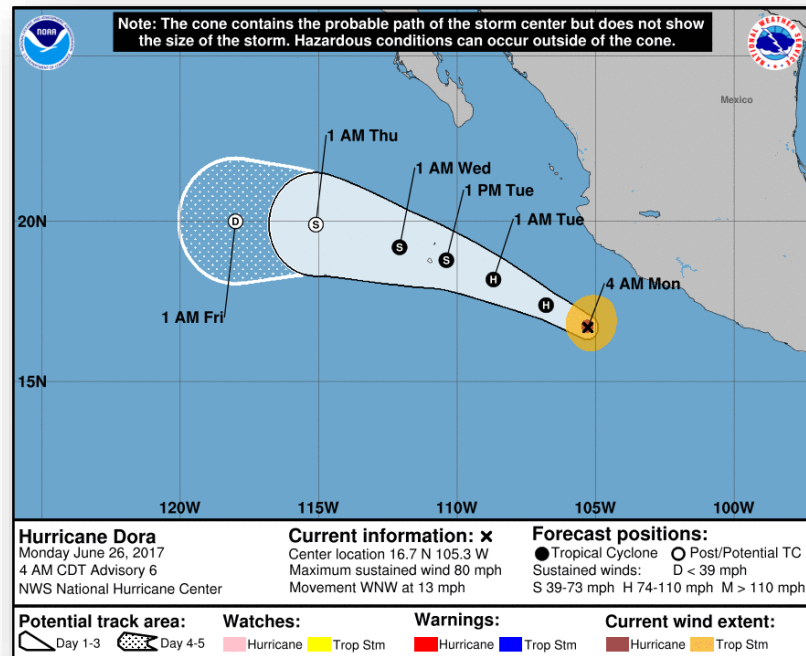
# Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



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## Hurricane Dora (Advisory #6 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

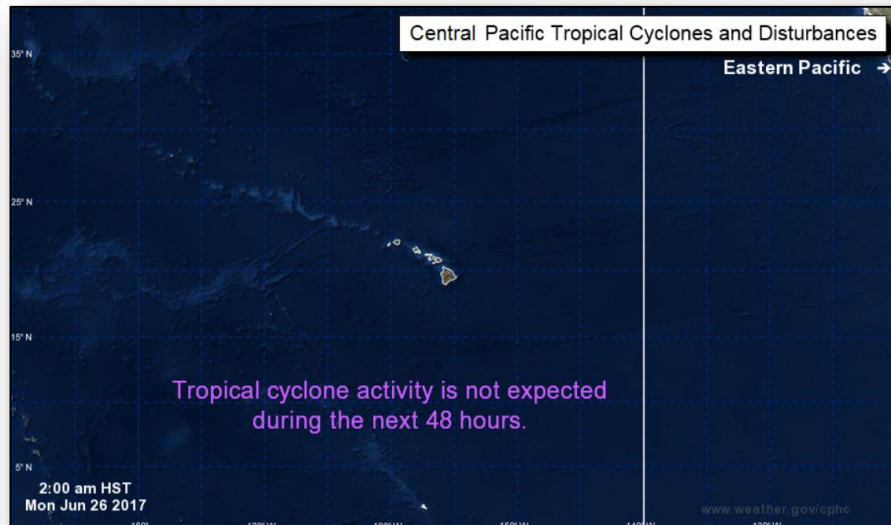
- No threat to U.S. or U.S. Territories
- Located about 170 miles SSW of Manzanillos, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 13 mph, parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds have increased to 80 mph
- Some strengthening is expected before weakening on Tuesday

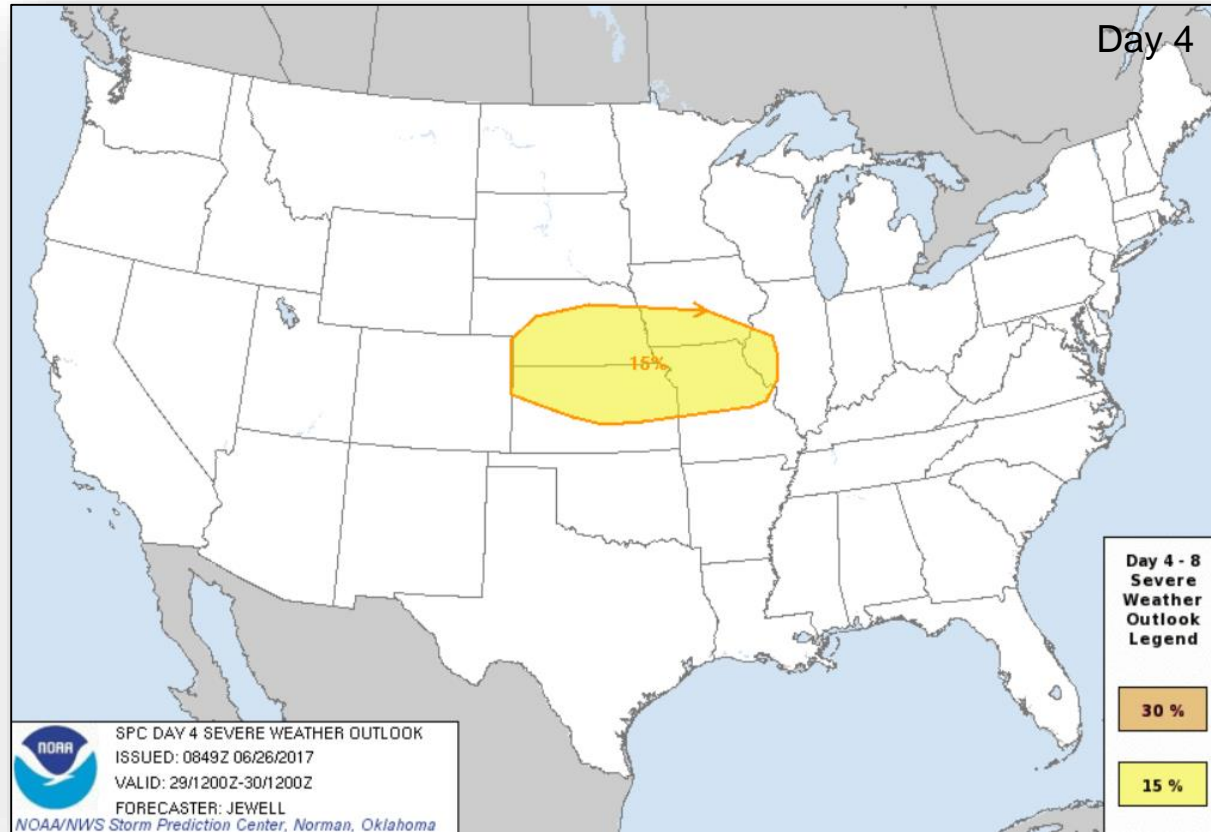

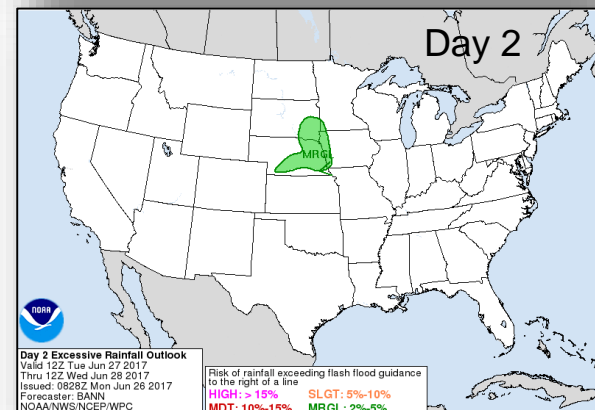
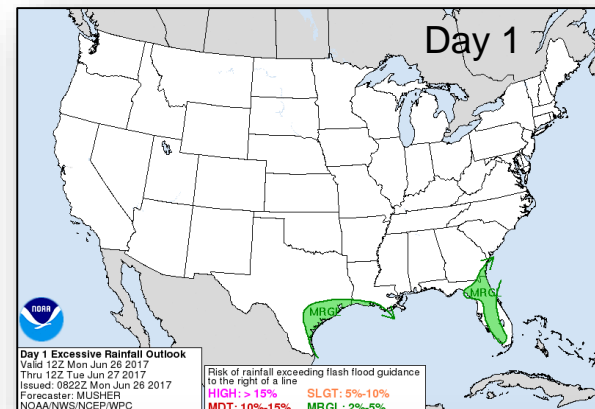
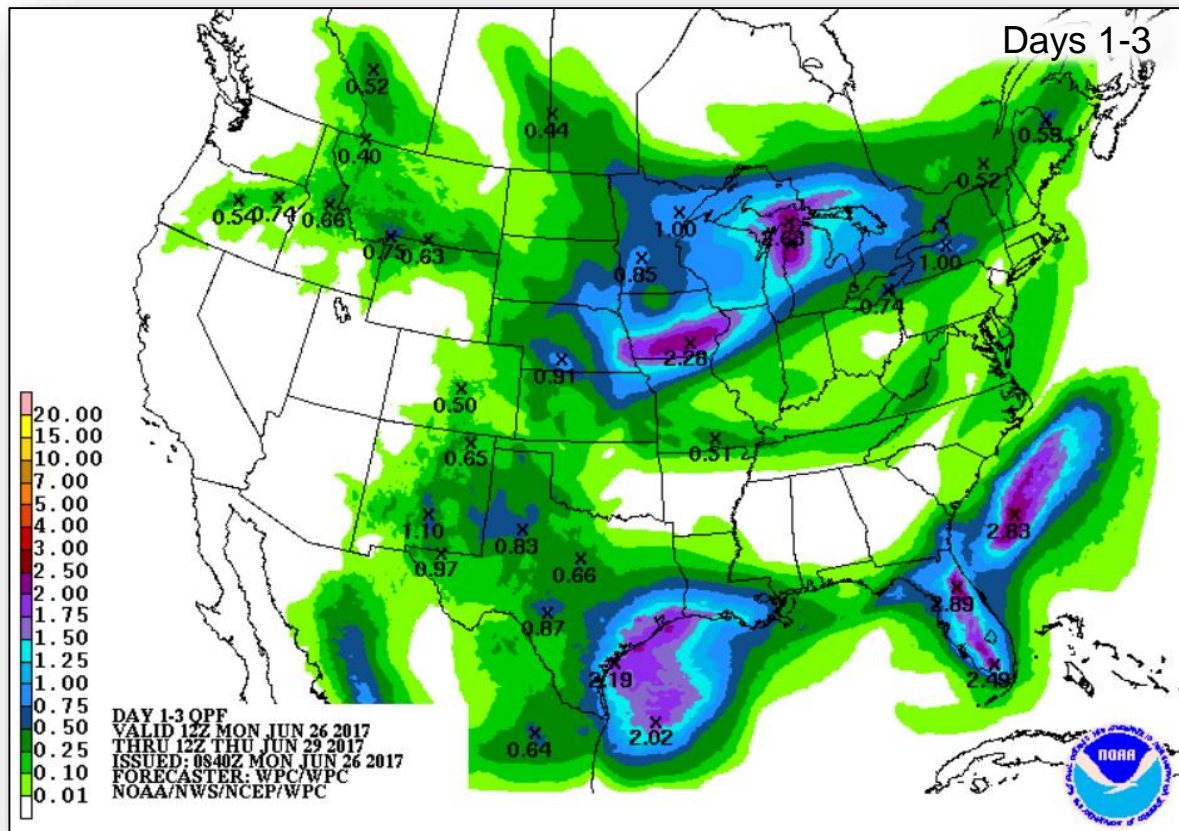
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# Precipitation Forecast / Flash Flood Risk



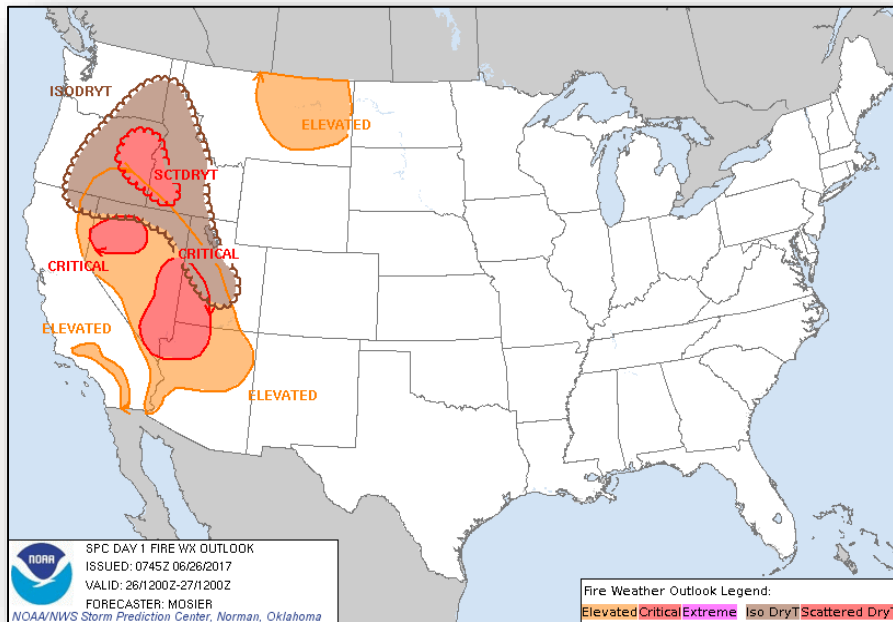

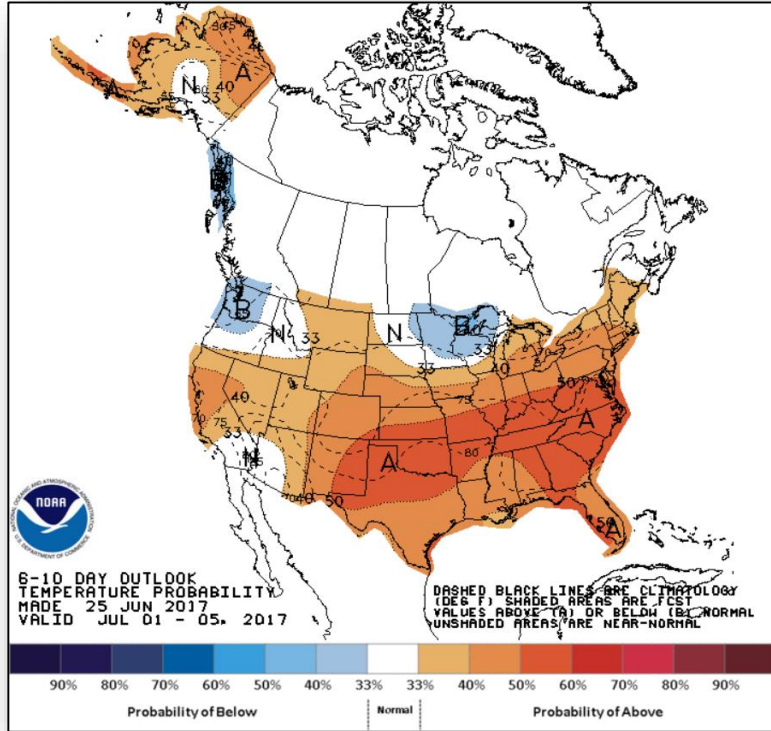

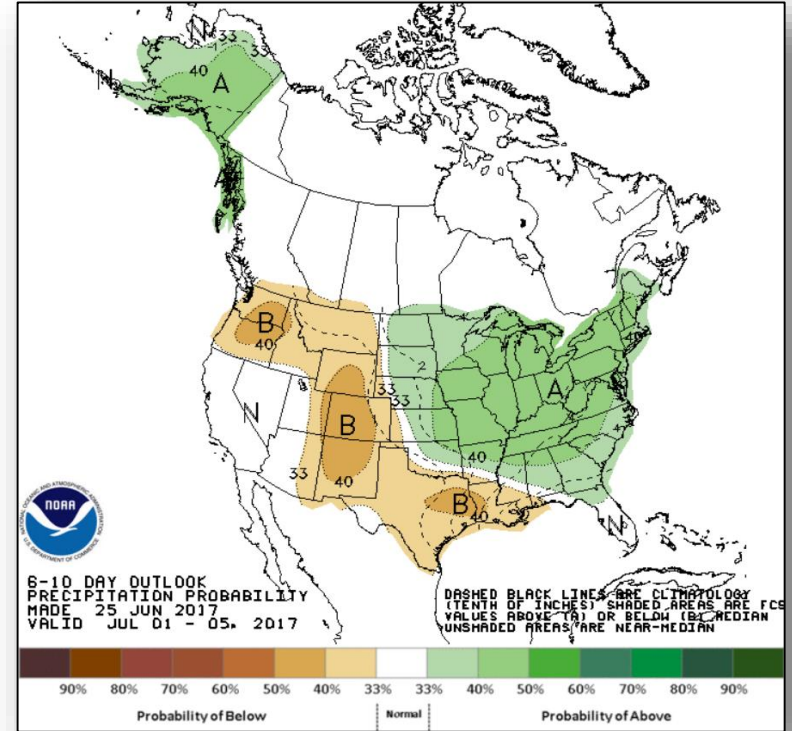
# 6-10 Day Outlooks



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**6-10 Day Temperature Probability**



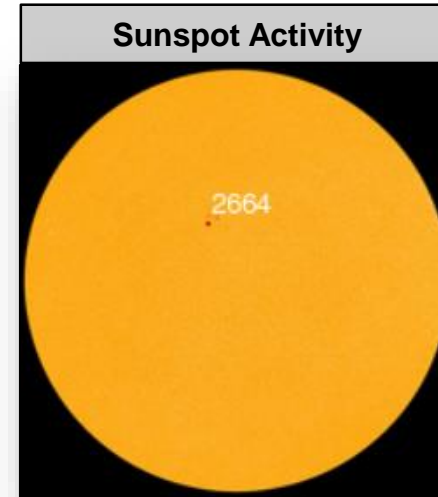
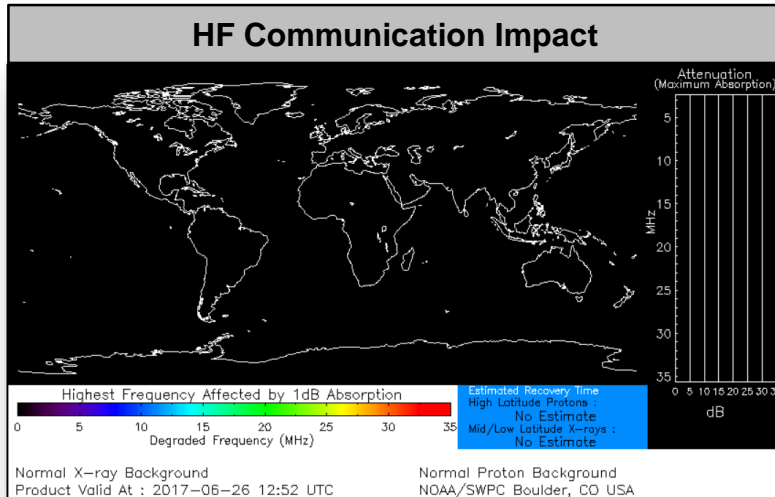
**6-10 Day Precipitation Probability**

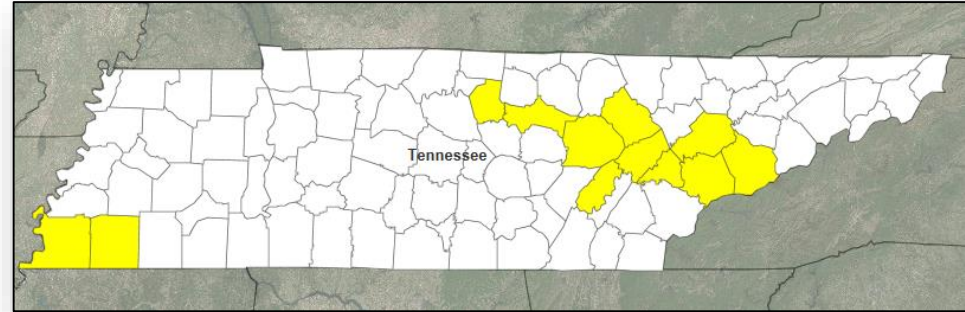

- Provides:
  - Public Assistance for 12 counties
  - Hazard Mitigation statewide

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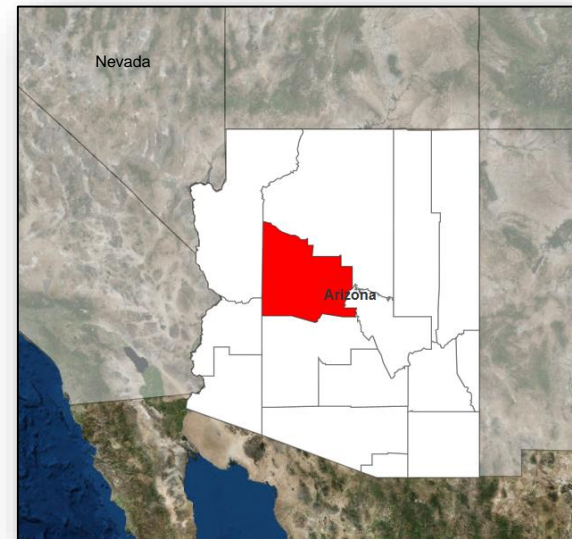

## Current Situation

- Fire began June 23, 2017 and is burning 13 miles SSE of Prescott
- Fire is threatening 1,550 homes near the communities of Pine Flat, Breezy Pines, and Walker
- Two Arizona Power Service lines and a communications tower are threatened, and roads into Pine Flat are closed
- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 208 people
- 1 ARC shelter open with 3 occupants *(ARC Midnight Shelter Count)*

## Response

- AZ EOC at Normal Operations
- Region IX RWC remains at Watch/Steady State
- FMAG approved on June 25, 2017

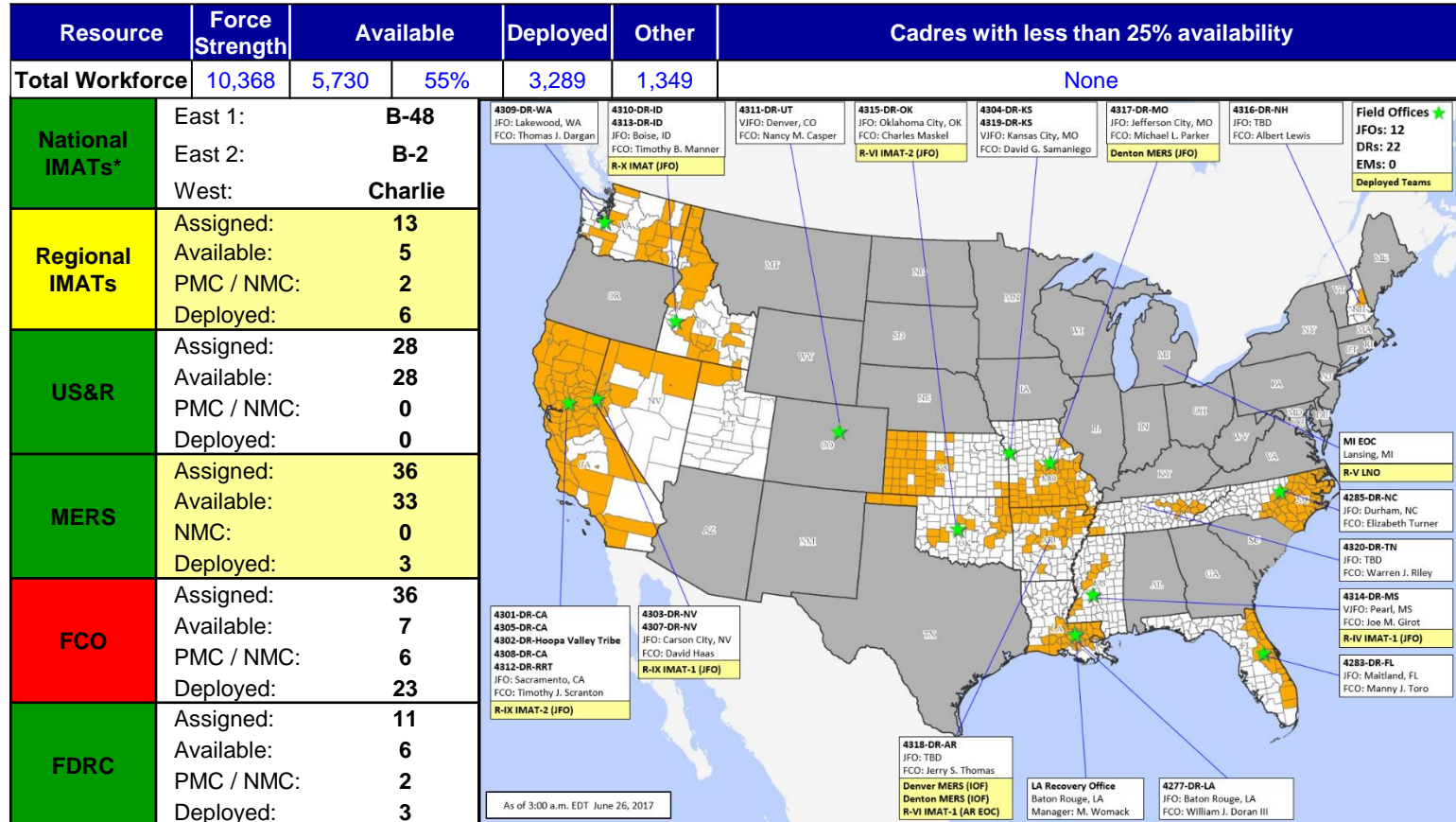
