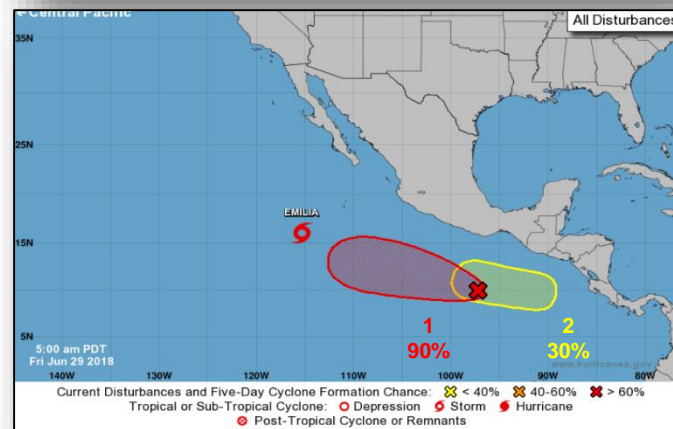
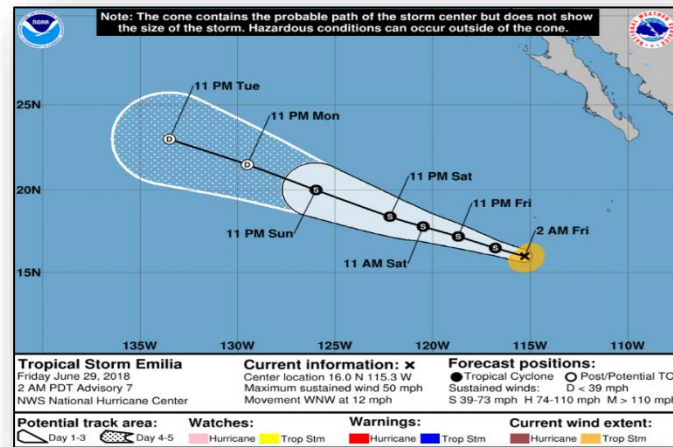
- 590 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California Mexico

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

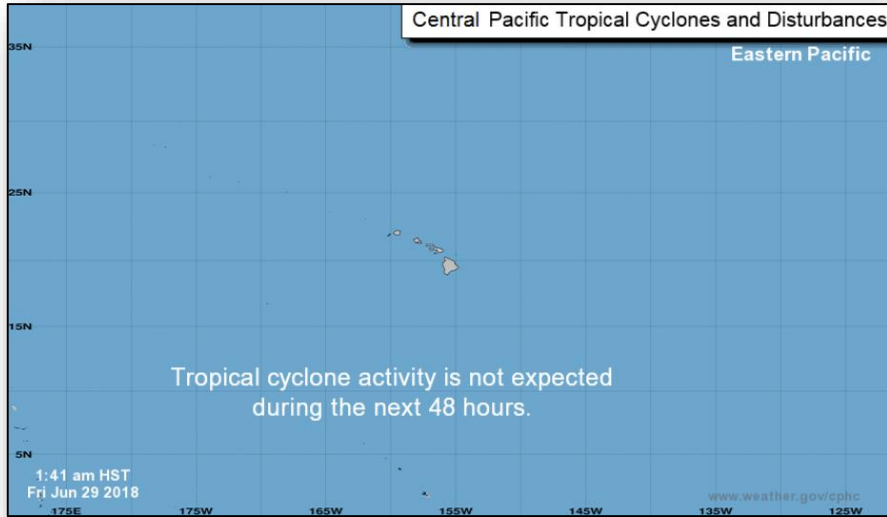
- A few hundred miles SSE of Acapulco, Mexico

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

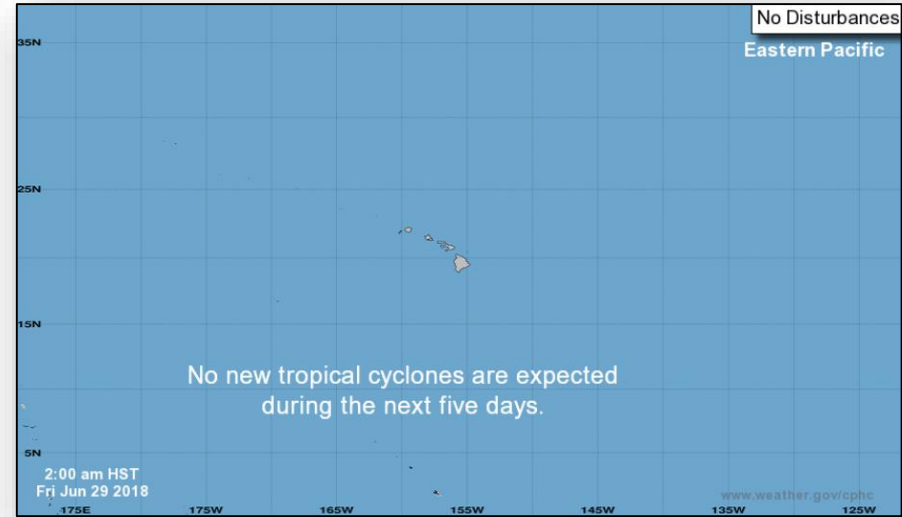
- Moving W to WNW, south of Central America and Mexico

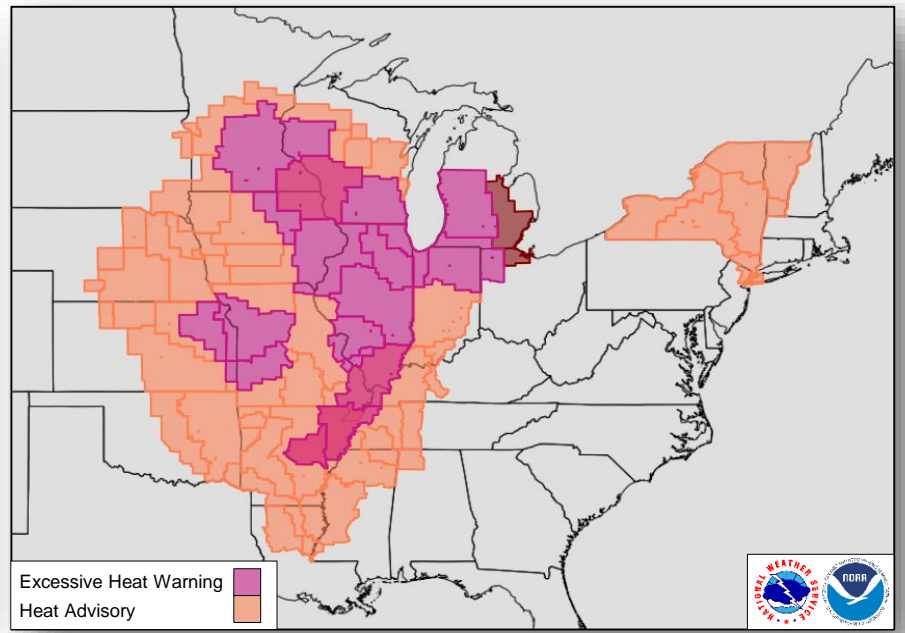
Forecast Heat Index

Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast



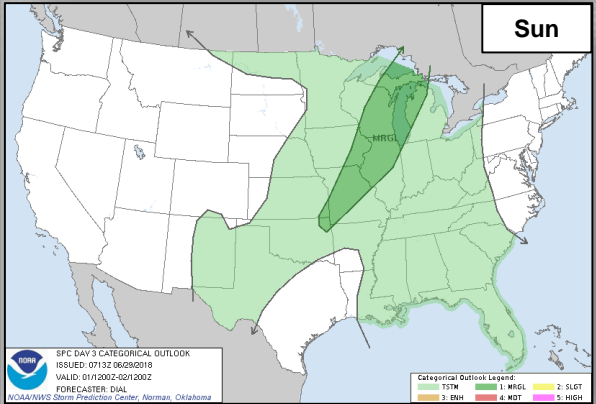
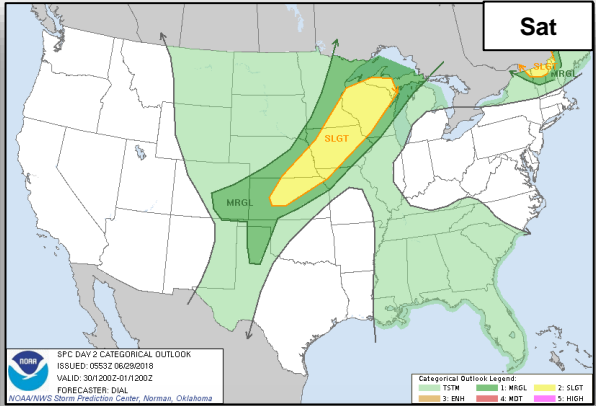
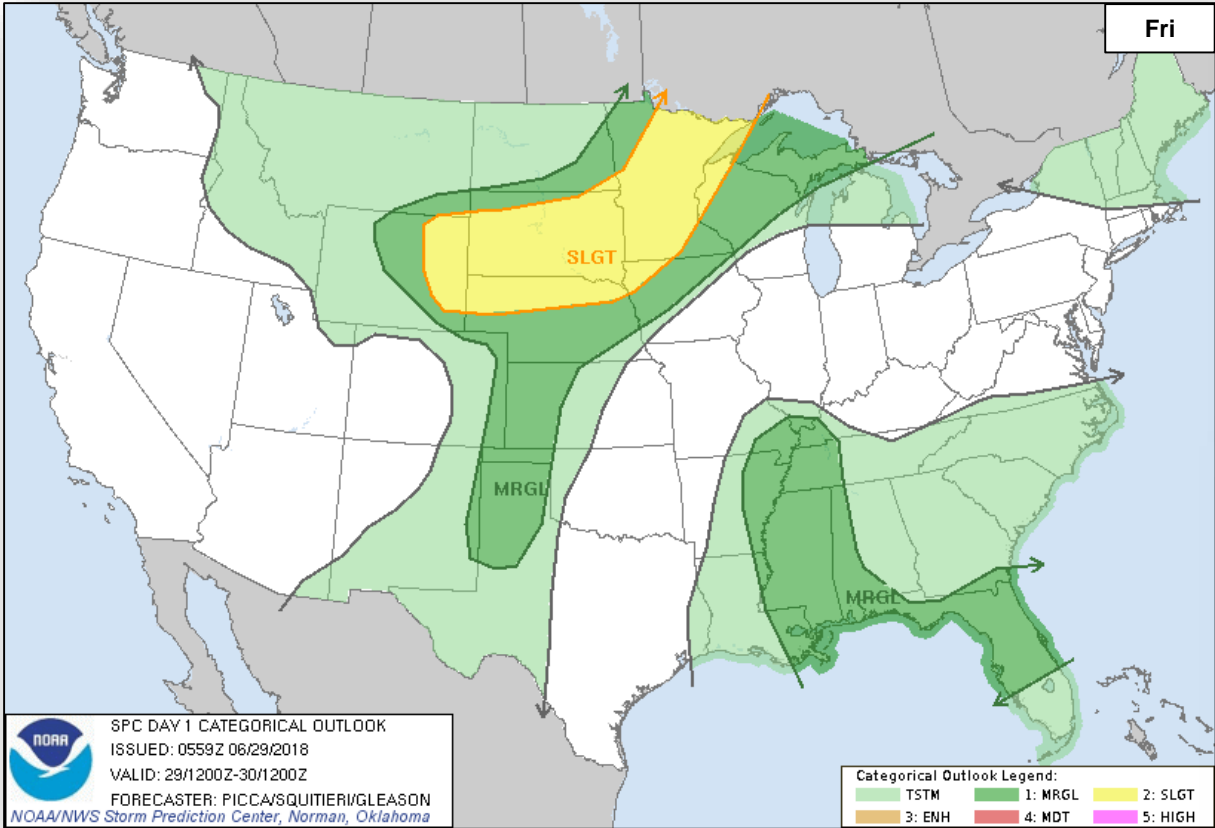

Current Situation

- Fire began June 27, 2018, nine miles north of Fort Garland, CO (pop. 600) in the Sangre de Cristo Mountains
- Threatening 1,100 homes, 2 commercial properties, 800 other minor structures, utilities, equipment, and a railroad
- The fire has burned through the Forbes Park subdivision and into the Wagon Creek subdivision; extent of damage unknown
- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 800 people

Response

- CO EOC is at Partial Activation (in-state wildfires)
- Denver MOC at Watch / Steady State
- FMAG approved on June 28, 2018
