Situation:

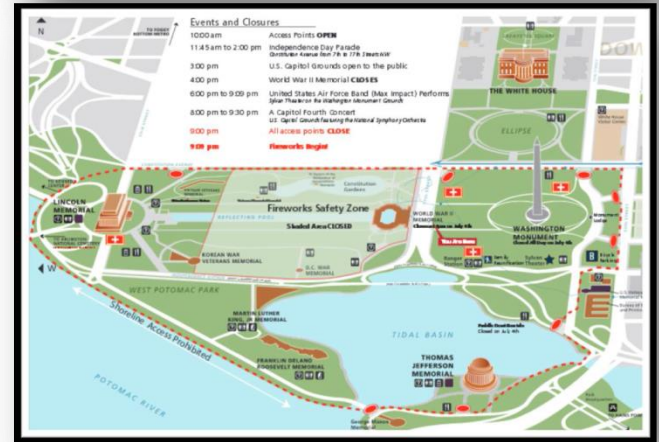
- On July 4, 2015, cities and towns across the United States will host numerous events to celebrate Independence Day
- Large Events:

- Threats: No credible threats identified (Traditional media reporting raised threats)

State/Local Response:

- Several State and Local EOCs will Partially Activate to monitor events
- No shortfalls or unmet needs reported

FEMA Response:

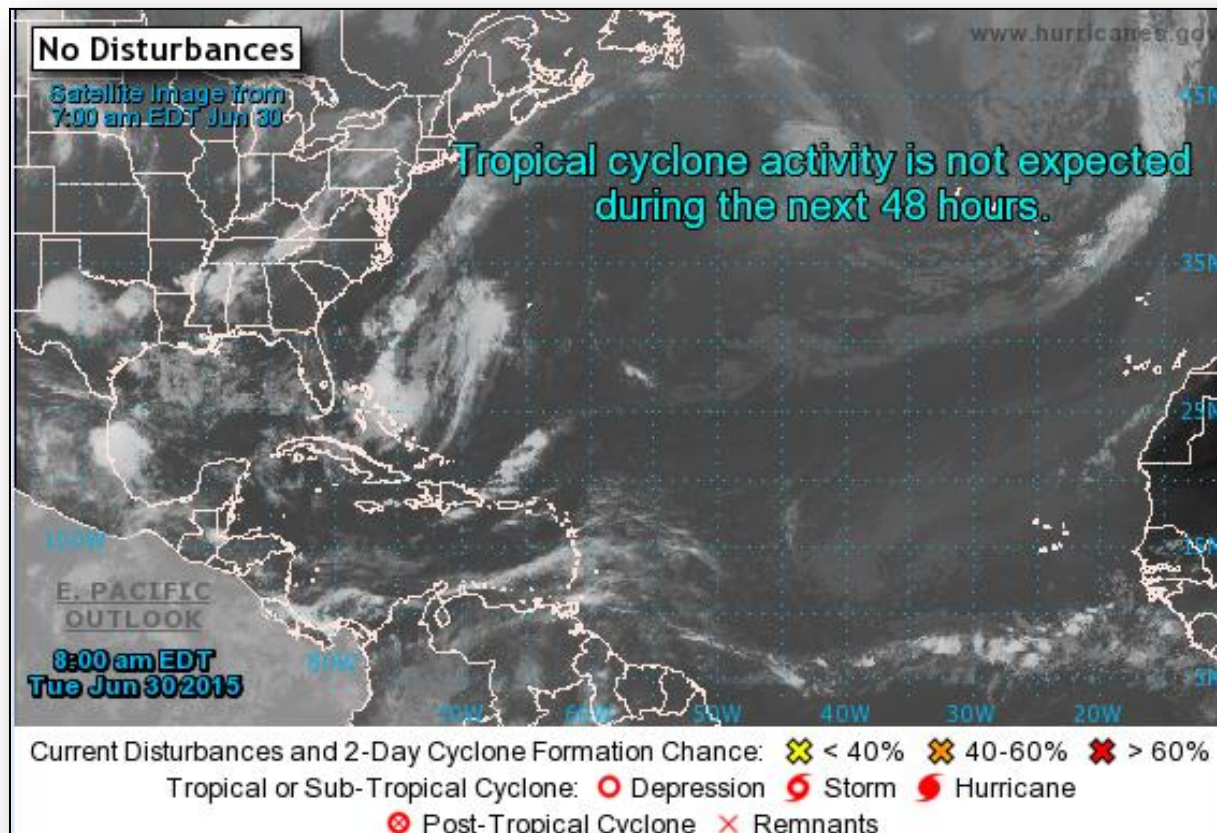
- FEMA RRCCs will remain at Normal Operations; all RWCs are monitoring:
 - FEMA Region II - RWC will be at Enhanced Watch on July 4th (11am to 11pm)
 - An LNO will deploy to the New York Police Dept. – Joint Ops Center
- National Response Coordination Center (NRCC) will not activate
- National Watch Center (NWC) will remain at Watch/Steady State
 - NWC Threat Monitoring Team (TMT) will be monitoring
- Office of National Capital Region Coordination (ONCRC)
 - LNOs will deploy to the MACC (DCHSEMA) & World Police & Fire Games
- No request for FEMA assistance

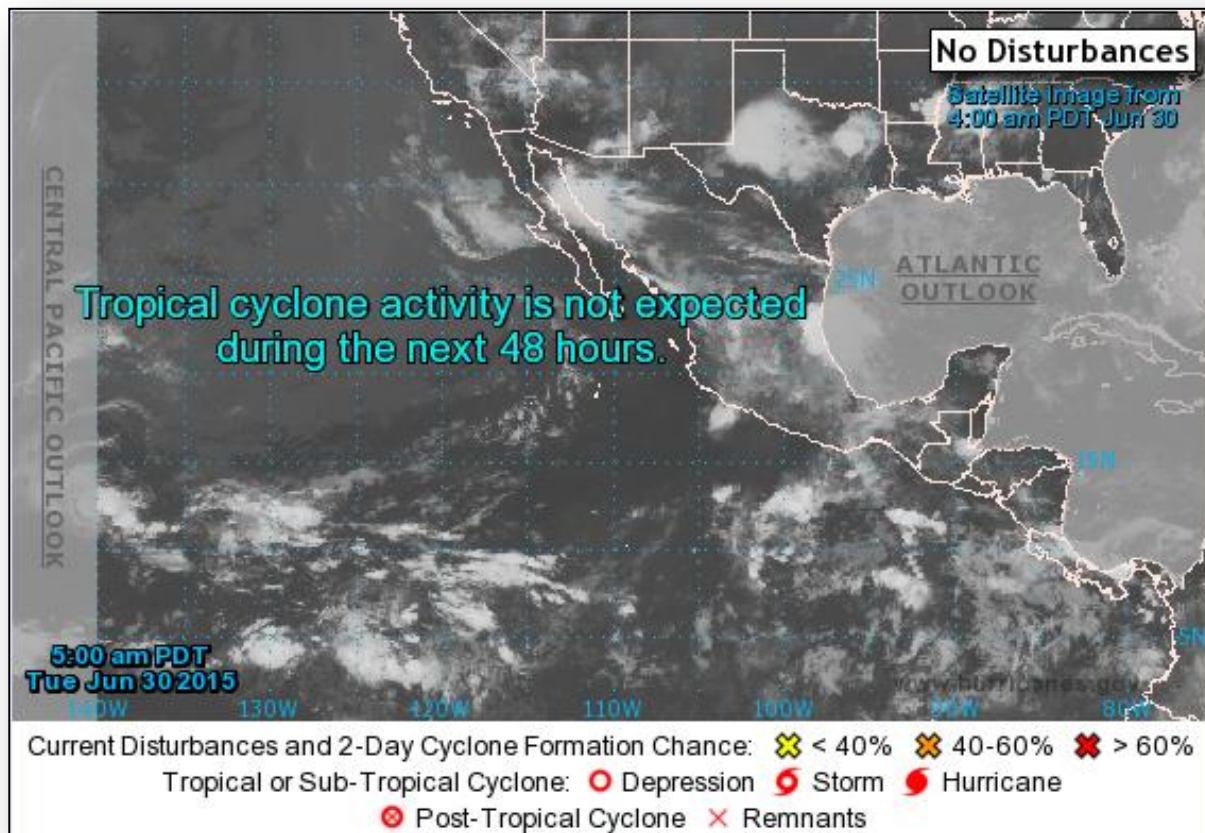

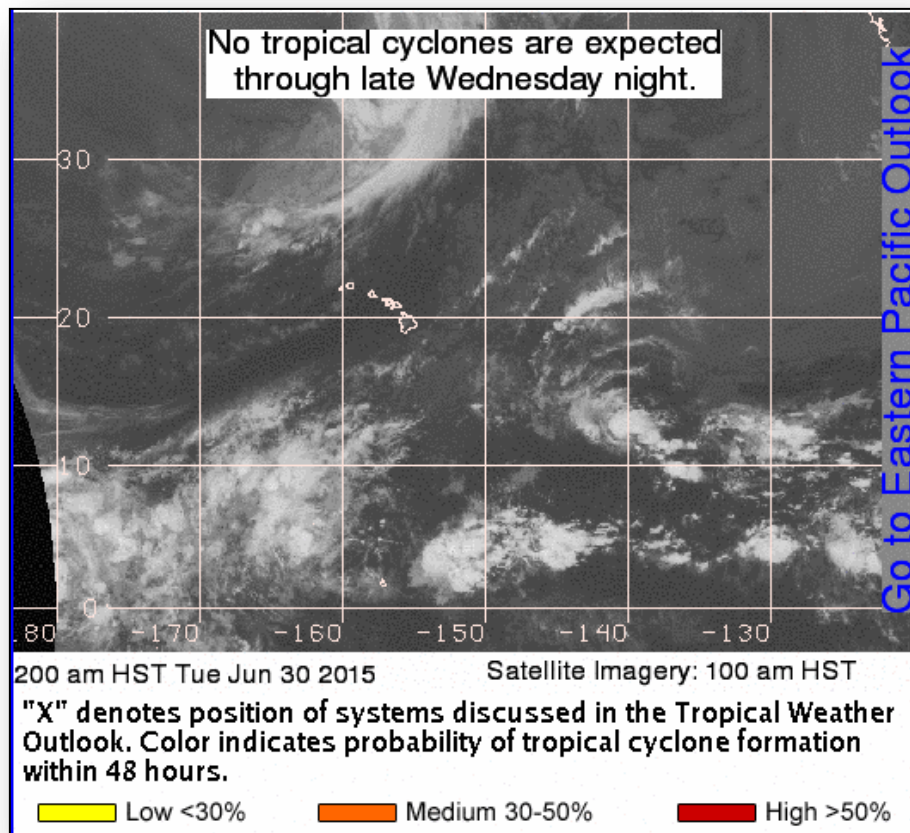

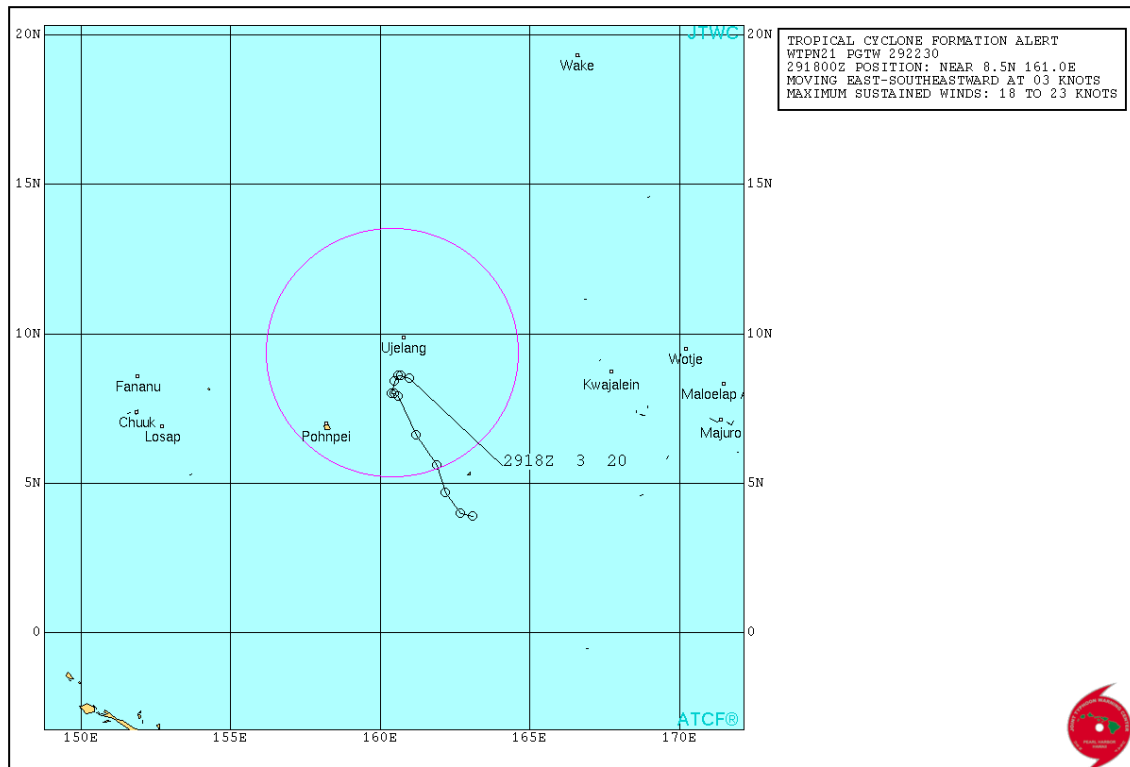

Tropical Cyclone Formation Alert Federated States of Micronesia

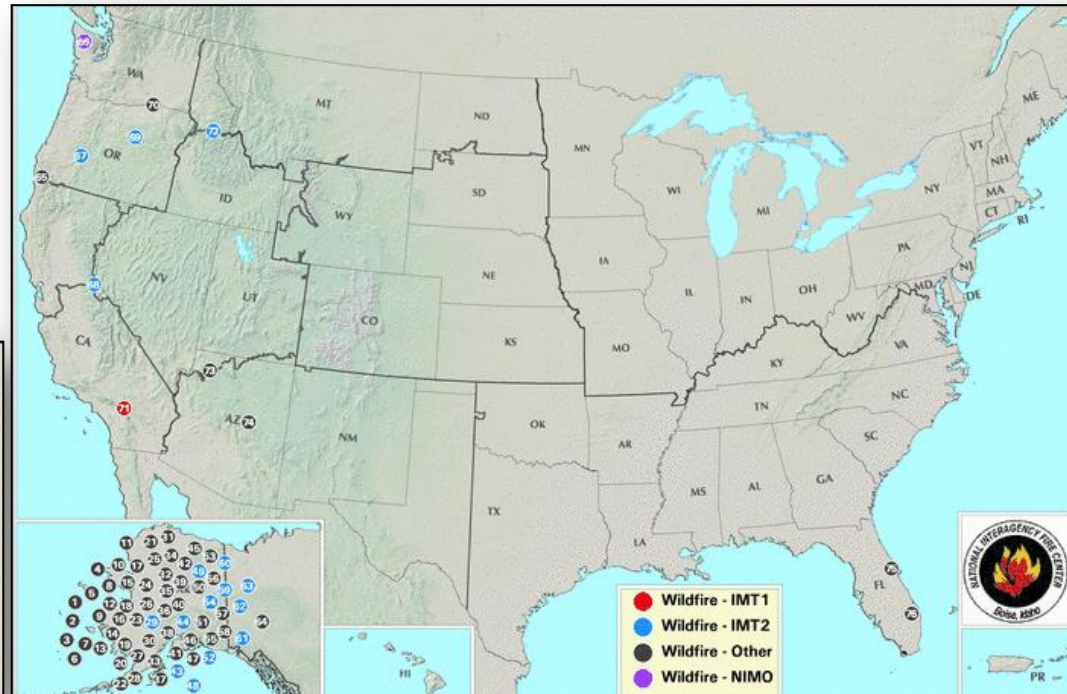

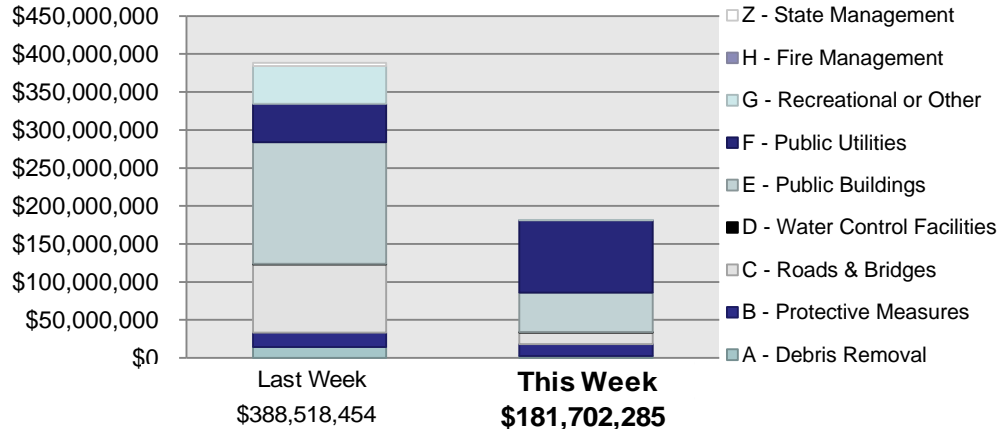

In the Past 2 Weeks – 6/15/2015 through 6/29/2015



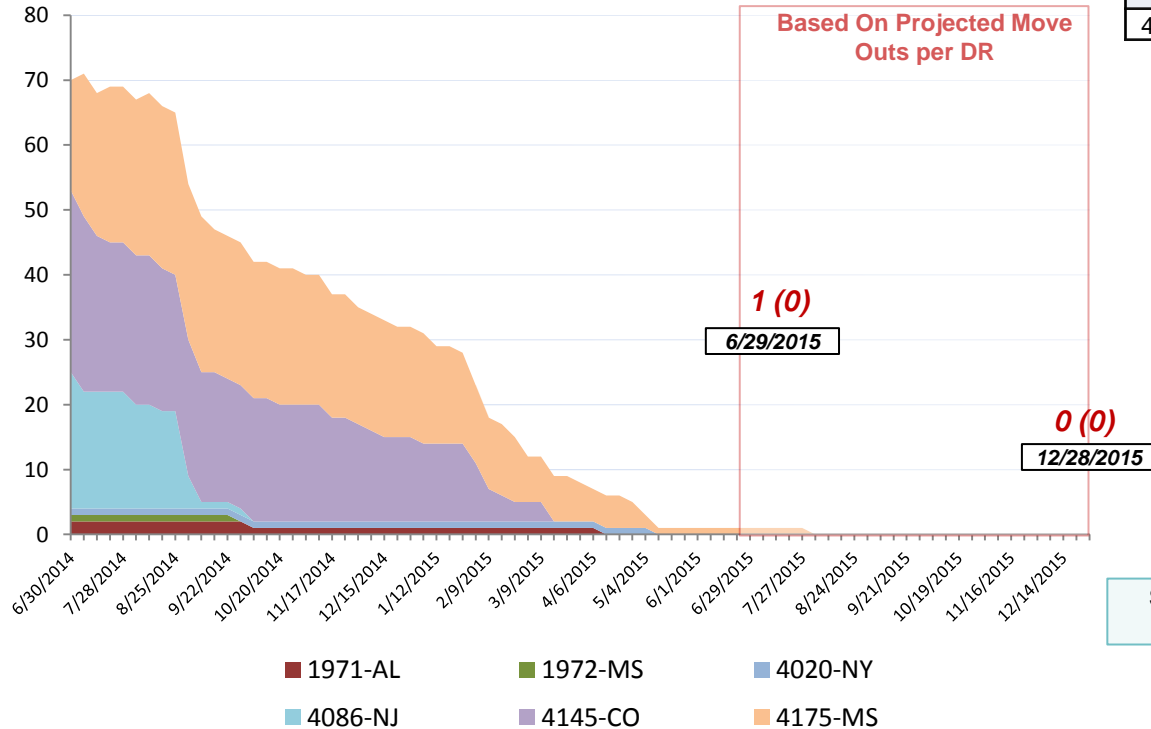
PA Highlights

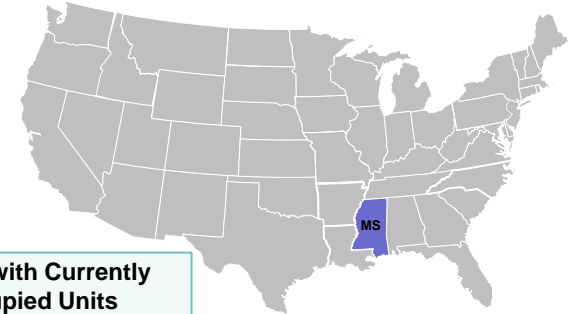

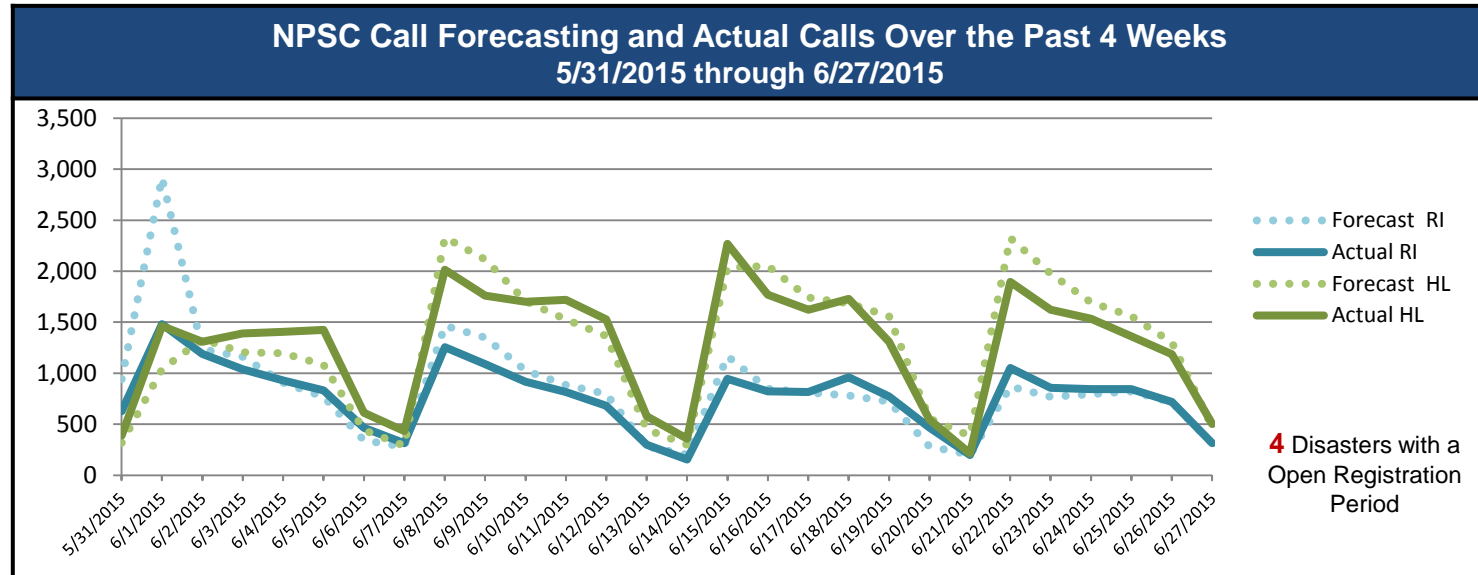

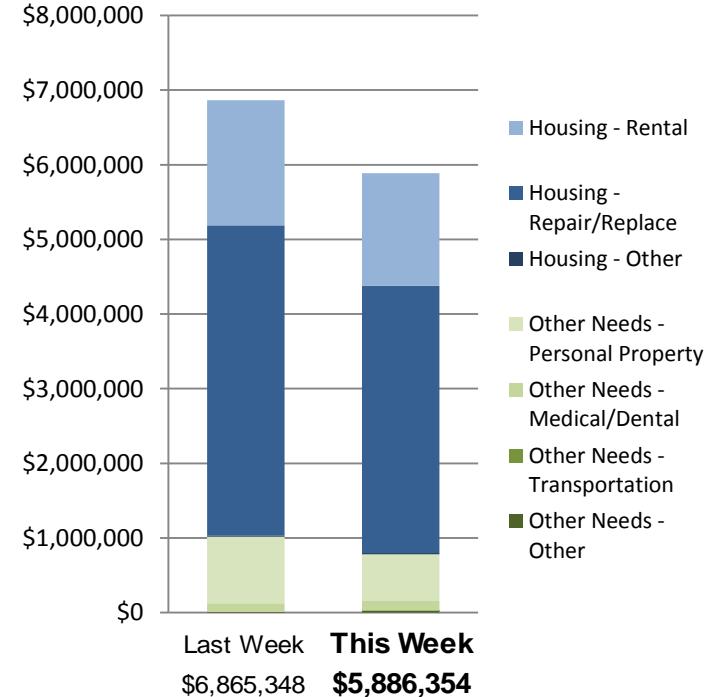
