

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic




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Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Disorganized showers and thunderstorms extending from the north-central Gulf of Mexico northward
- Gradually moving inland over southeastern LA
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (near 0%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Non-tropical low expected to form midway between Bermuda and the southeastern U.S.
- Moving slowly northward away from the U.S.
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)




Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



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Hurricane Fabio (Advisory #11 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- 615 miles SSW of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving WNW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 90 mph (CAT 1)
- Hurricane-force winds extend out 35 miles
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 160 miles
- Forecast to become a major hurricane later today or tomorrow, followed by steady weakening
- No threat to U.S. interests




Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific

5 Day Outlook






- 285 miles ESE of Guam




Forecast Heat Index







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
