- Eastern Pacific – Disturbance 1 – High (70%), Tropical Depression 2E
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected through Sunday morning

Significant Weather:

- Flash Flooding – Central Plains, Upper and Lower Middle Mississippi valleys
- Rain and Thunderstorms – Central Great Basin to Southwest, Plains and Middle Mississippi Valley to Northeast; Gulf Coast to Southeast

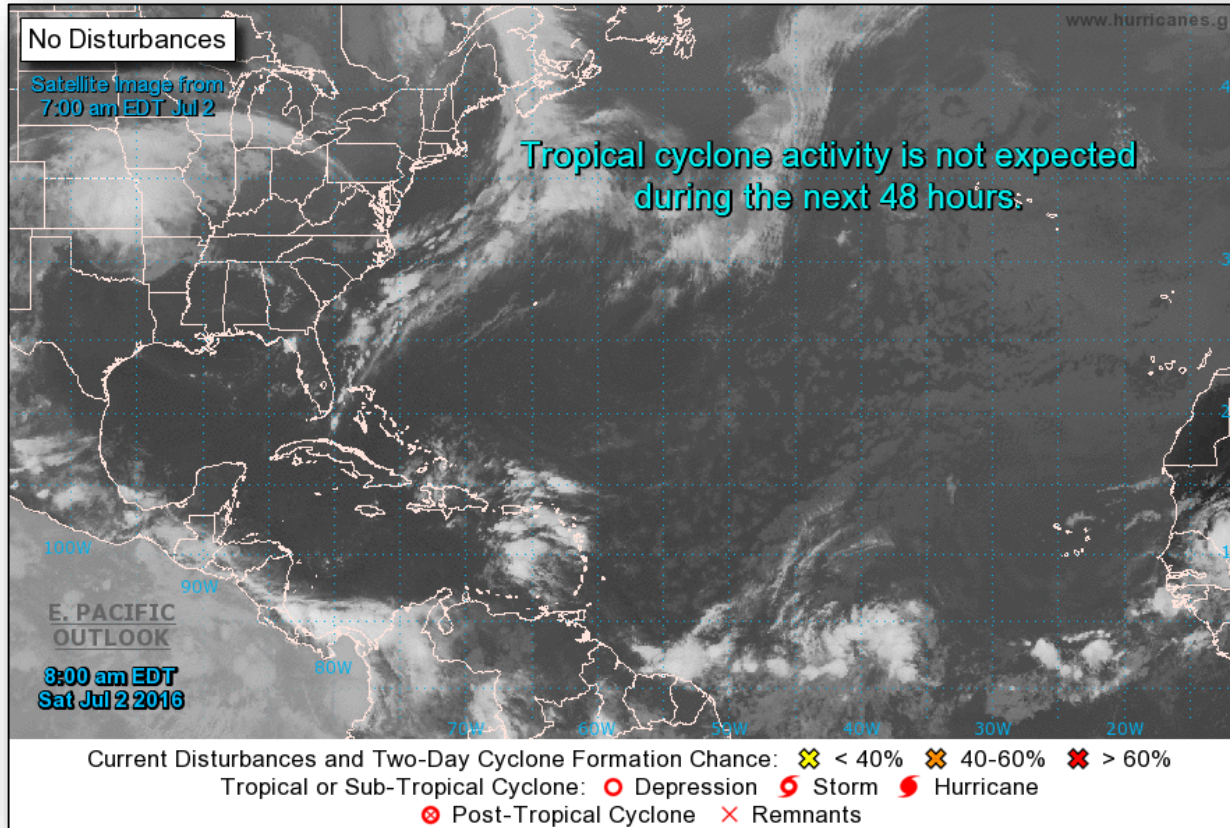

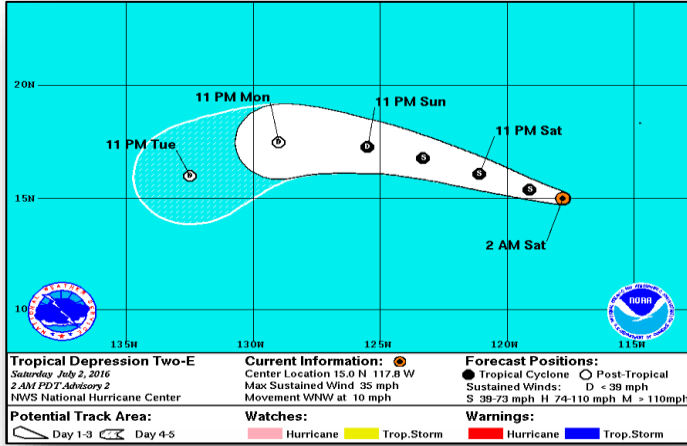

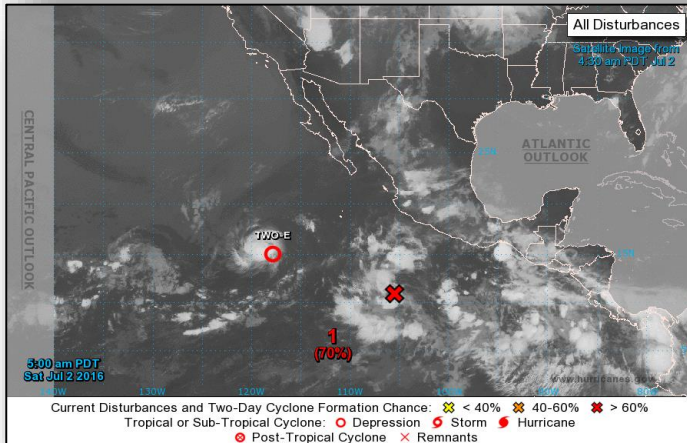


Tropical Outlook: Eastern Pacific



Tropical Depression 2E: (As of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

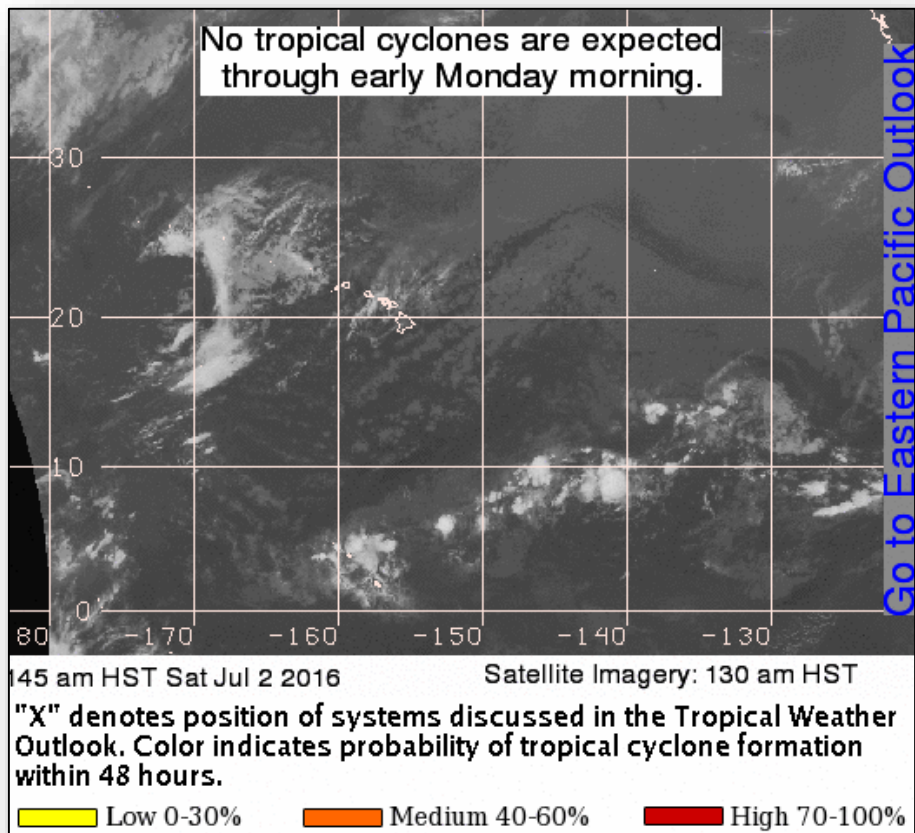
- Located 750 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California Peninsula
- Moving W to WNW at 10 mph
- Max sustained winds of 35 mph with higher gusts
- Not anticipated to impact U.S. interests



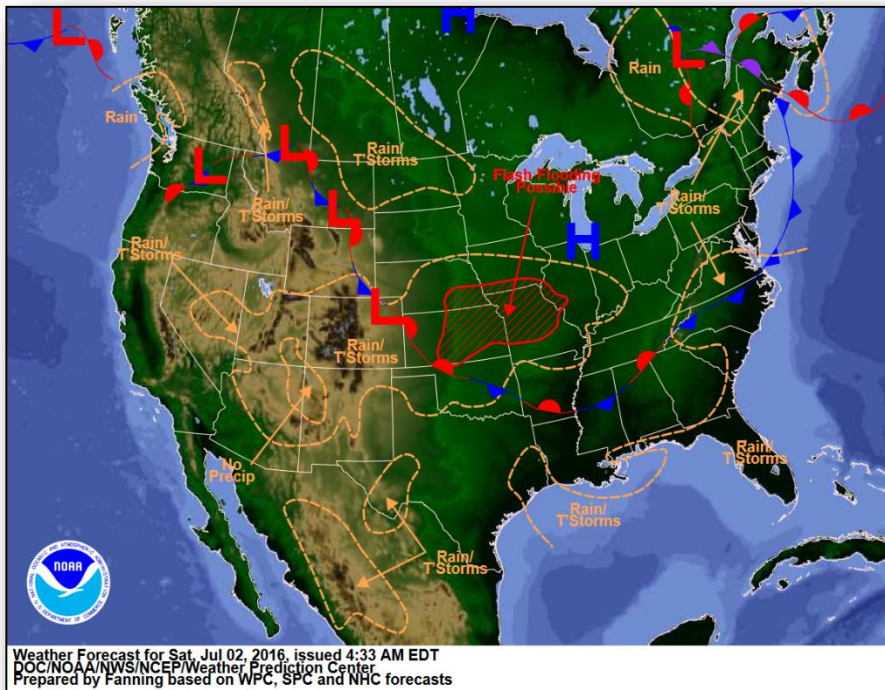
Disturbance 1: (As of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Shower activity associated with an area of low pressure
- Located 600 miles S of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving W at 10 to 15 mph
- Environmental conditions are favorable for a Tropical Depression to form during the weekend
- Not anticipated to impact U.S. interests
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (70%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)

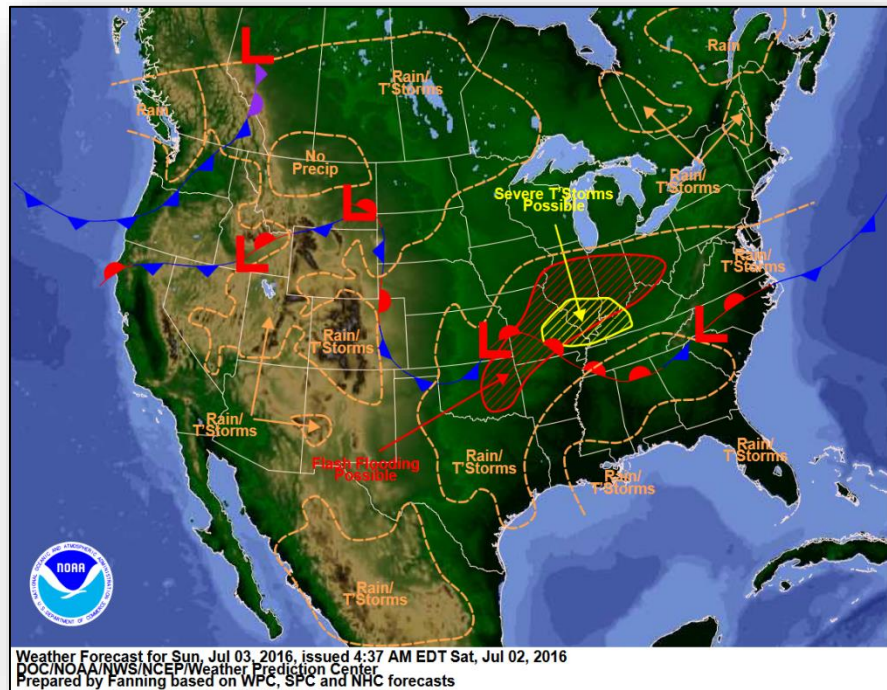

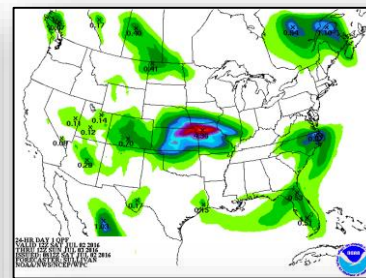
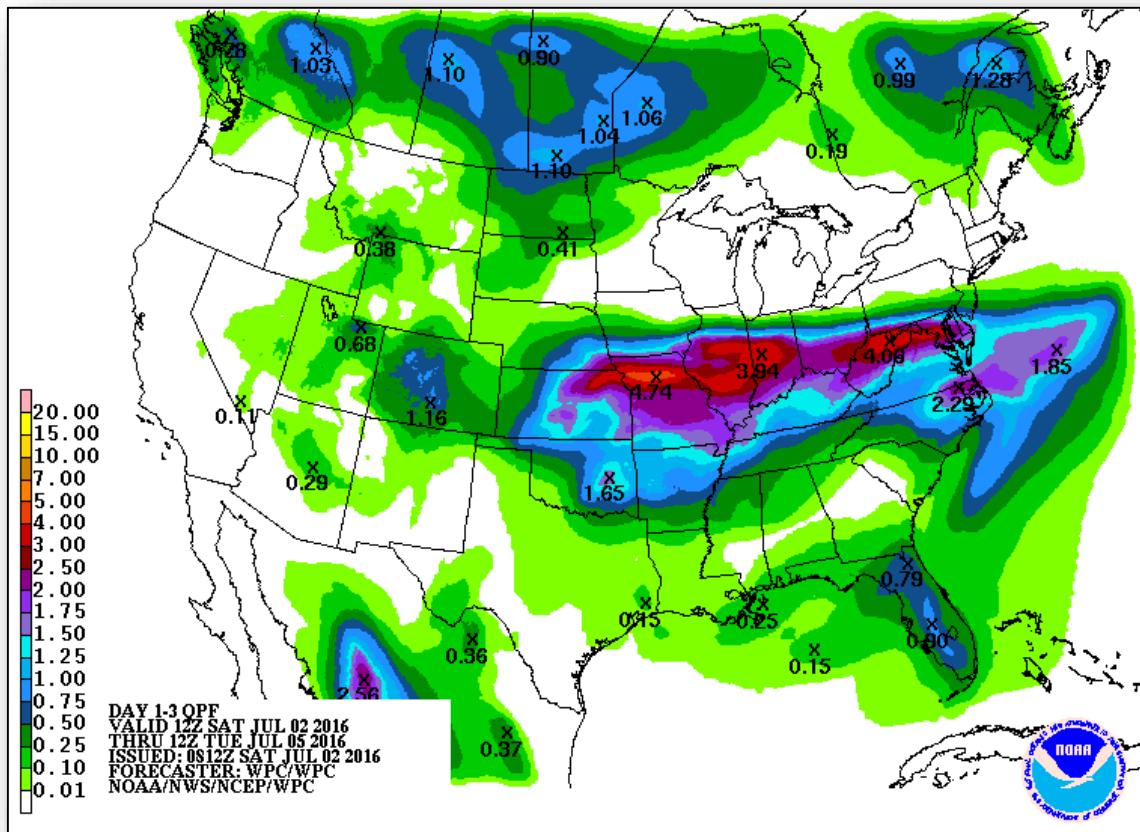
Severe Weather Outlook: Day 1 - 3



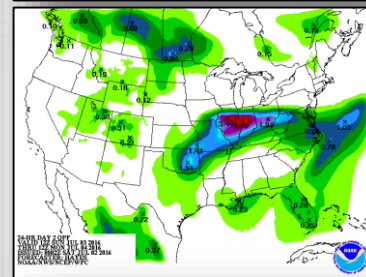
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



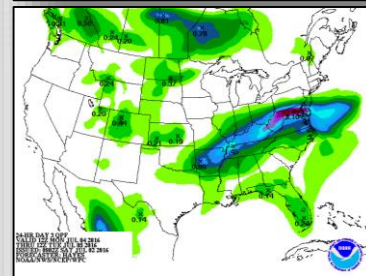
