# Significant Activity – Aug 2-3



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## **Significant Events:** Wildfires

### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic – Tropical cyclone activity not expected during next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Storm Hector; Disturbance 1 – Medium (50%) ; Disturbance 2 – High (90%); Disturbance 3 – Low (20%)
- Central Pacific – Tropical cyclone activity not expected during next 48 hours
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests

### **Significant Weather:**

- Elevated/Critical Fire Weather – CA, NV, WA, OR, ID, UT, WY, & MT
- Flooding – Portions of the Northeast and the Carolinas
- Severe weather – Northern Plains
- Red Flag Warnings – CA, NV, WA, OR, ID, and MT

### **Declaration Activity:**

- FMAG approved for South Valley Fire – OR
- Second FMAG FEMA-5266-FM-CA was approved for Carr Fire – CA (to include Trinity County)
- Major Disaster Declaration approved for Michigan

# Carr Fire – Shasta County, CA



**Current Situation:** Acres burned: 127k (+5k) ; Containment: 37% (+2%)

## Impacts:

- Structures / Homes:
  - Threatened: 1,324 (-300) homes, 22 multiple residences, 12 commercial
  - Damaged: 258 (+3) structures / 189 (+3) homes
  - Destroyed: 1,553 (+7) structures / 1,060 homes
- Minimal number of customers without power in Shasta County

## Health and Medical:

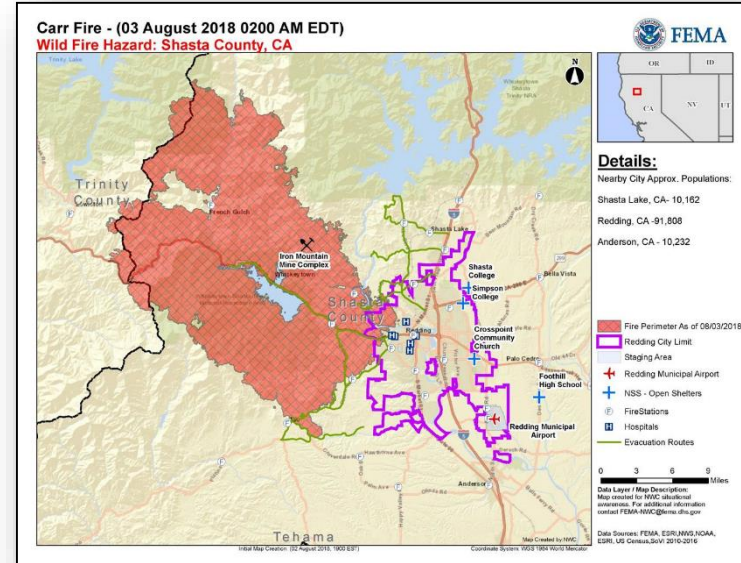
- Fatalities / Injuries: 6 confirmed / 1
- One hospital evacuated; one partially evacuated
- Eight intermediate care facilities fully evacuated

## Food, Water and Sheltering:

- Shelters / Occupants: 4 (-2) open / 152 (-20) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count)
- Evacuations: Mandatory evacuations in effect for about 24k people
- Staging Area established at Redding Municipal Airport
  - ISB Team and Cache deployed
  - Commodities repositioned: Cots, blankets, meals, and water

## Hazardous Waste:

- Pipeline fire threatening the Iron Mountain Complex has been extinguished

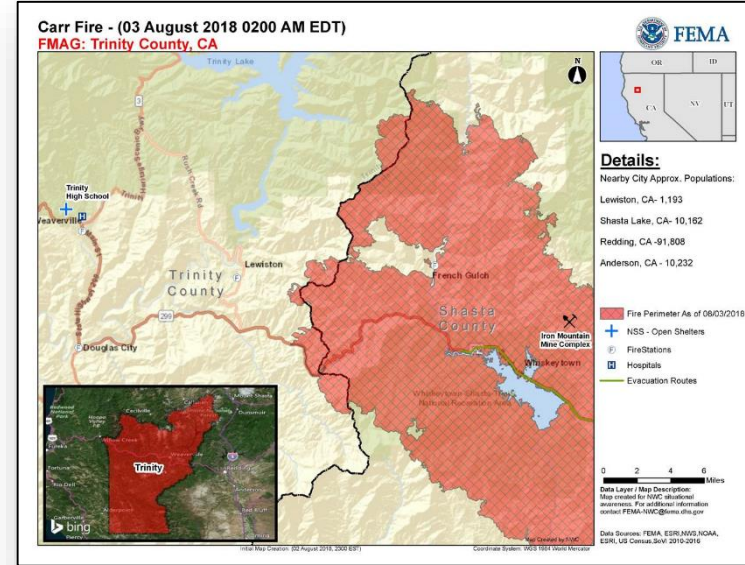
## Response

### State / Local Response

- CA EOC at Full Activation
- Governor declared a State of Emergency for six counties

### FEMA Response

- Emergency Declaration FEMA-3398-EM-CA approved July 28, 2018
- **FMAG FEMA-5266-FM-CA approved on August 2, 2018**
  - **Additional FMAG was approved for Trinity County**
- FMAG FEMA-5259-FM-CA approved July 23, 2018
- National Watch Center continues to monitor and report as warranted
- Region IX:
  - RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
  - IMAT-2 deployed to CA EOC (supported by ESFs 1, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 12, & DCO)
  - LNOs deployed to CA EOC and Shasta County EOC

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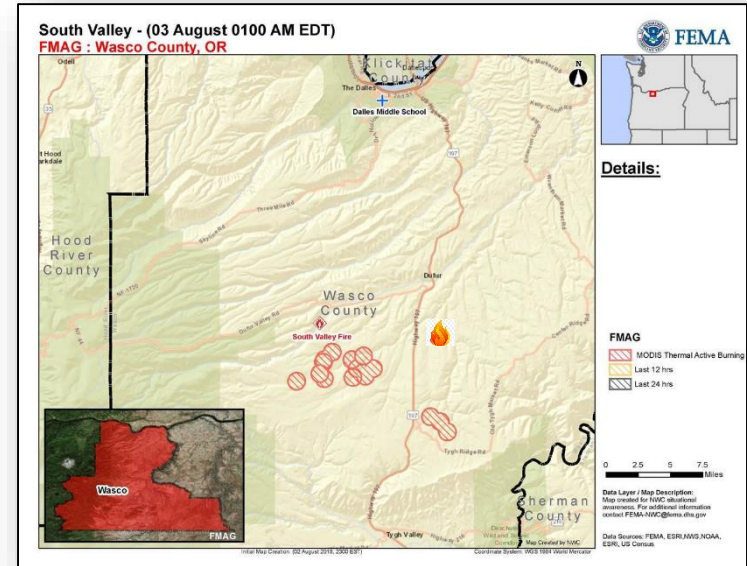

## Current Situation

- Fire began July 29, 2018 and is burning on Federal, State and private land in and around the community of Dufur & Tygh Valley. (pop. 1k)
- Also threatening salmon hatcheries, salmon streams, railroad lines, state parks, & mature wheat fields
- Evacuations: Mandatory/Voluntary evacuations for 400 people

- FEMA Region X at Steady State, continues to monitor



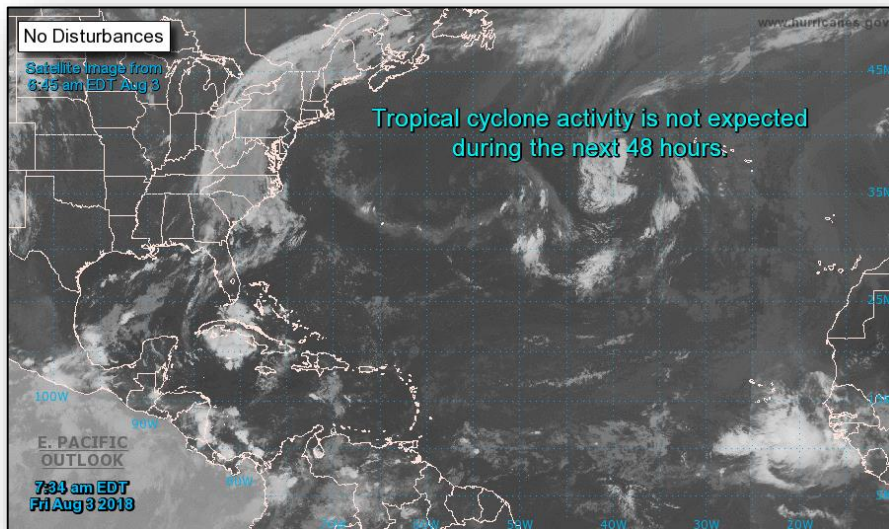

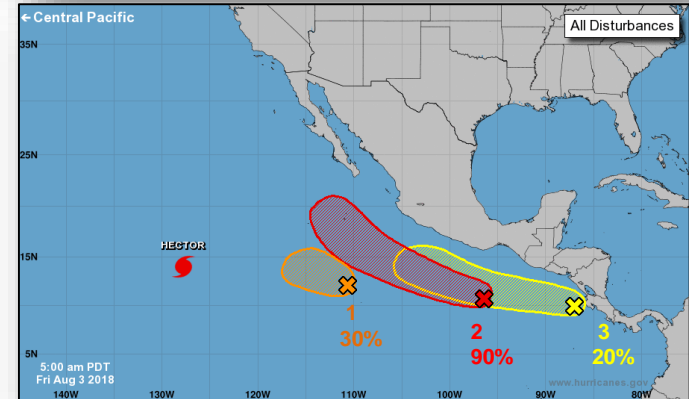
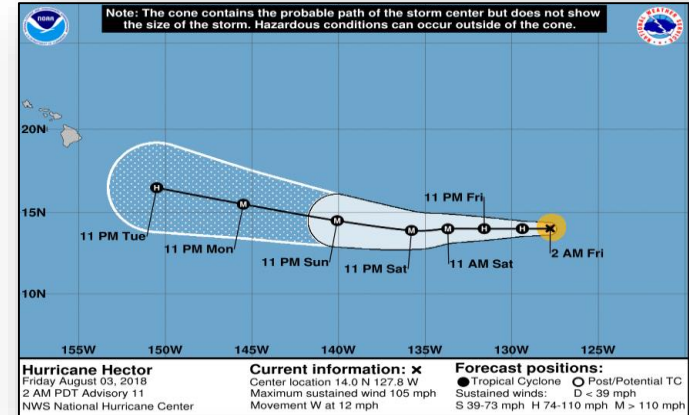
- Several hundred miles SSW of Manzanillo, Mexico

## Disturbance 2 (as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

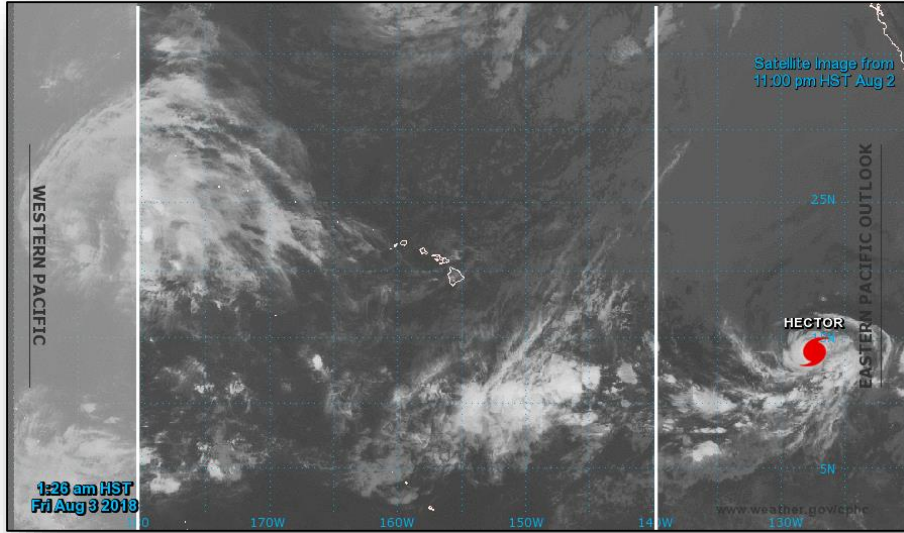
- Several hundred miles SSW of the Gulf of Tehuantepec

## Disturbance 3 (as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

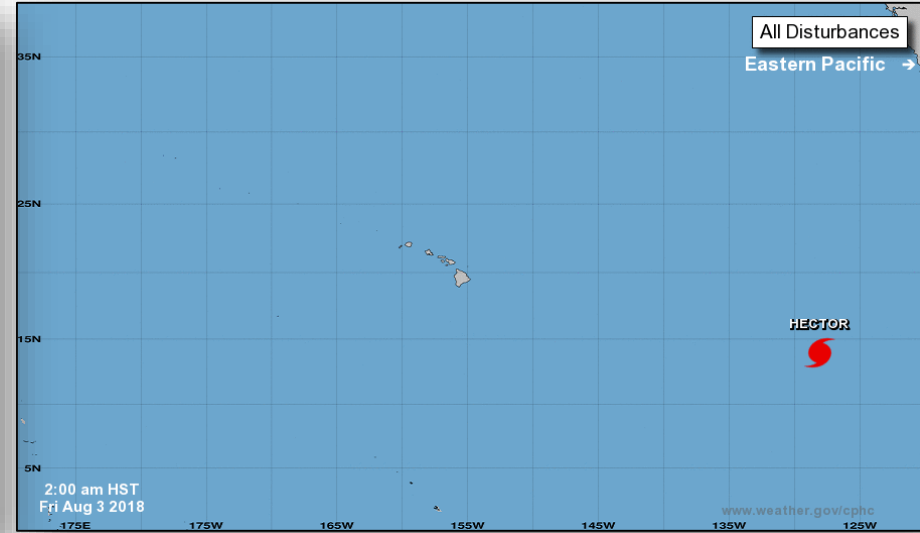
- Tropical wave near Central America

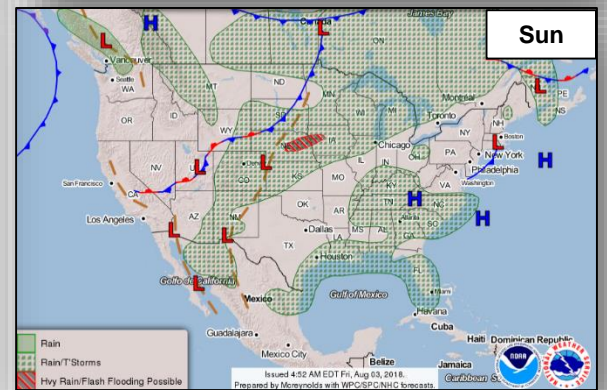
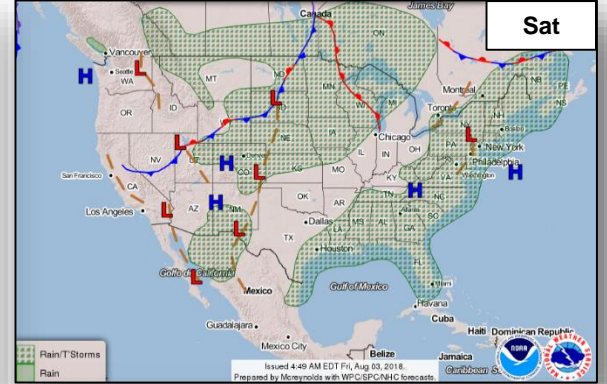
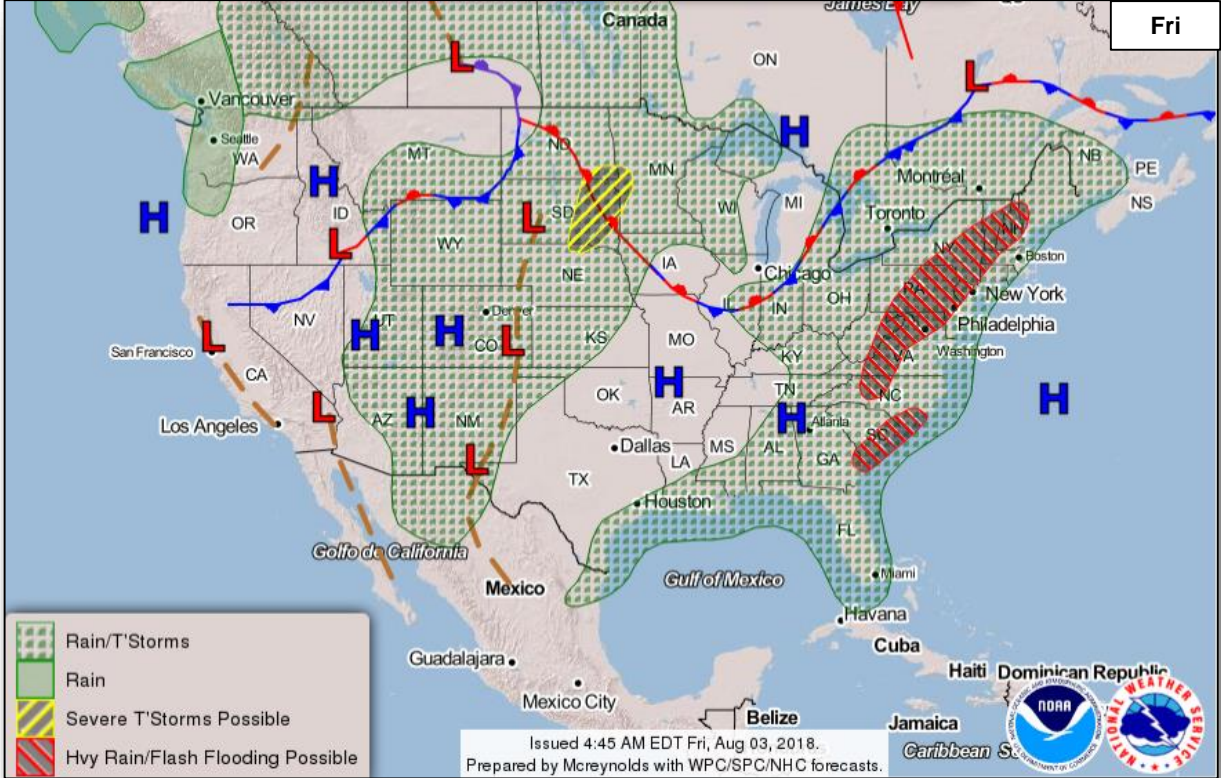


**48 Hour Outlook**



**5 Day Outlook**

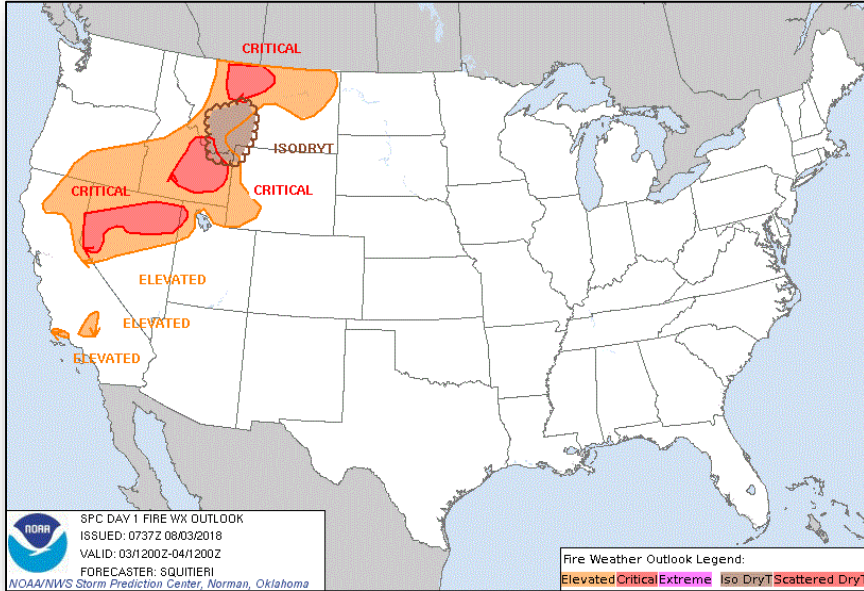
