

Hurricane Storm Ana (as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located about 155 miles SW of Kailua-Kona, (big island) HI
- Moving NW at 13 mph; maximum sustained winds of 85 mph
- General motion expected to continue with a decrease in forward speed today
- On forecast track, center will pass 150 miles SW of the big Island tonight, Little change in strength expected Saturday; weakening expected on Sunday
- Hurricane Force winds extend 25 mile; Tropical Storm force winds extend
 115 miles

Hazards/Impacts

- · No significant impacts reported
- Gusts to Tropical Storm Force winds are possible on the Big Island of Hawaii tonight
- Tropical Storm conditions are possible across the rest of the main Hawaiian Islands over the weekend
- Total rain accumulations of 4-6 inches expected, with isolated totals of 12 inches possible
- Large swells expected over eastern end of main Hawaiian Island chain today through Saturday




2 Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic





Hurricane Gonzalo – Atlantic





2 Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific






Tropical Storm Trudy - Eastern Pacific

- Rainfall of 6 to 12 inches; isolated amounts near 20 inches over portions of S Mexico




