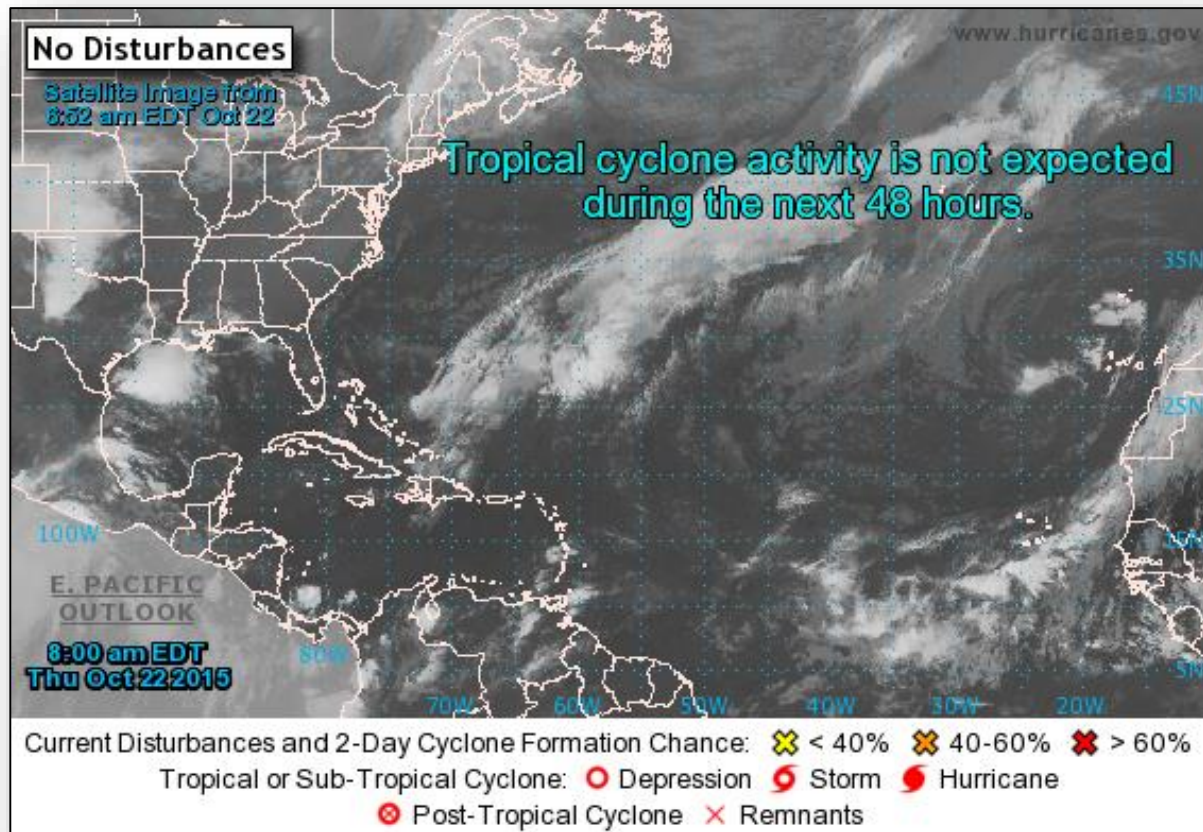

2 Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



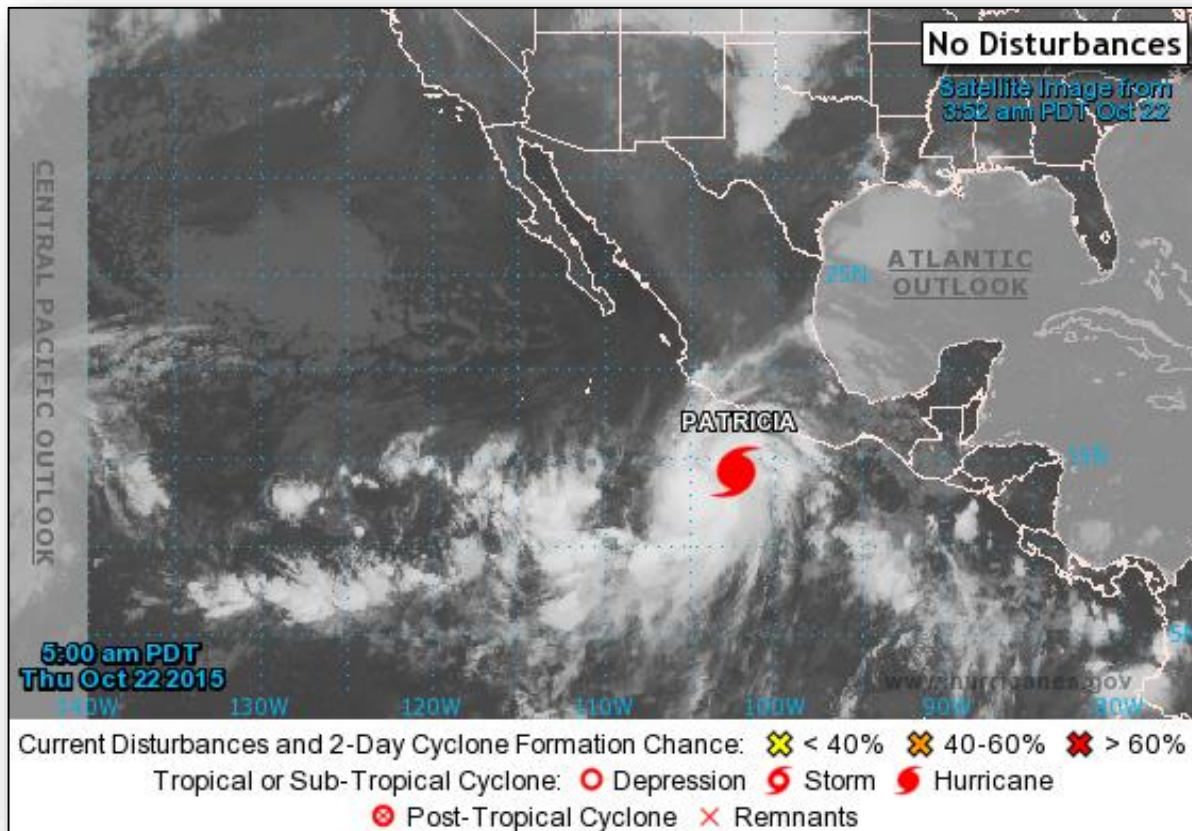
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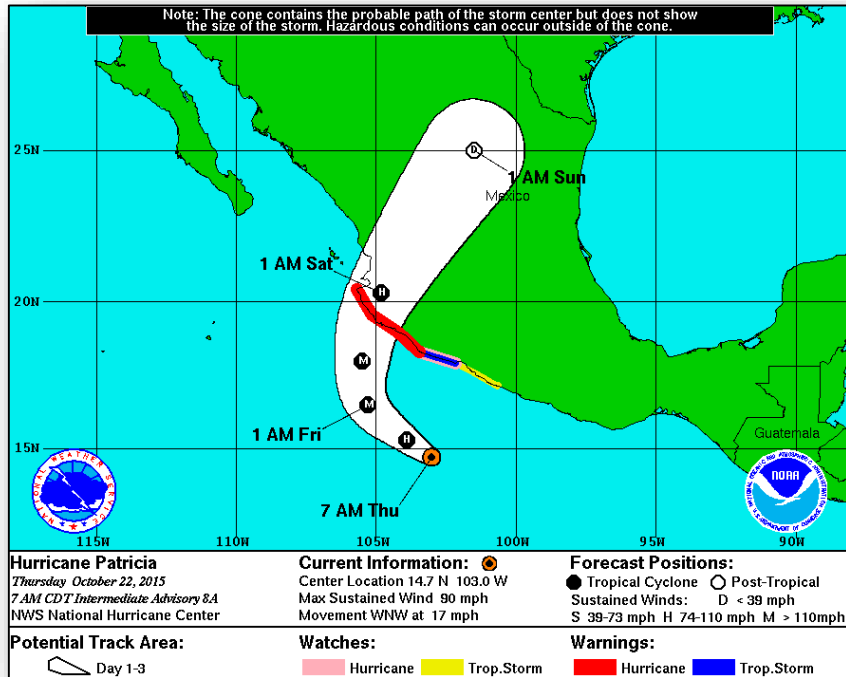
2 Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



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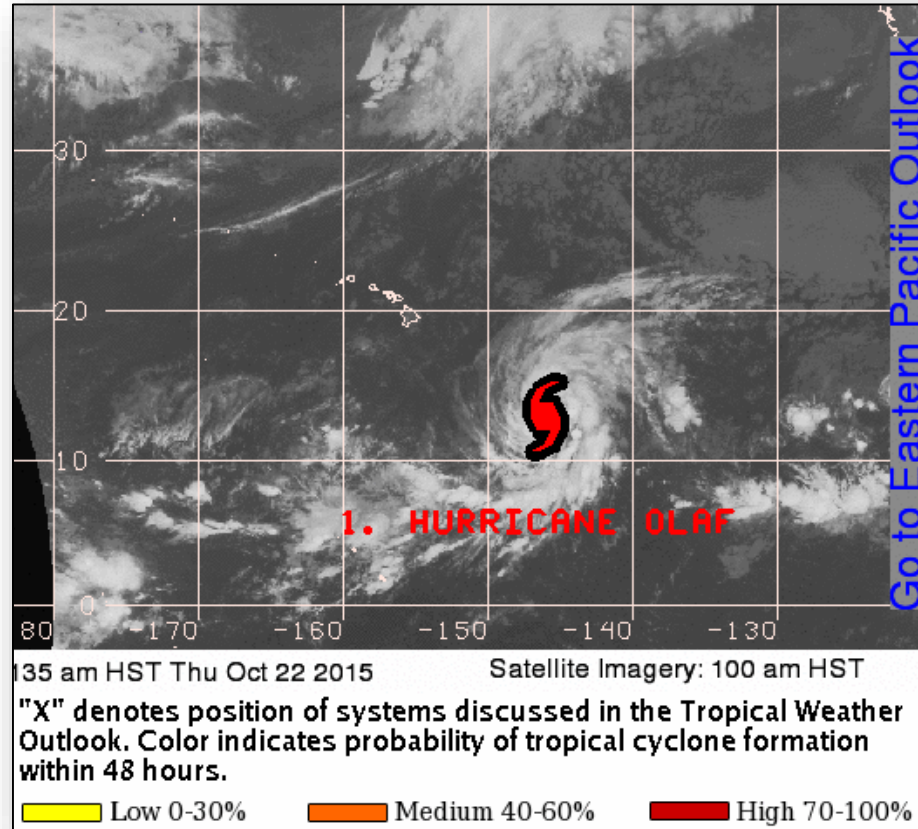
Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Patricia



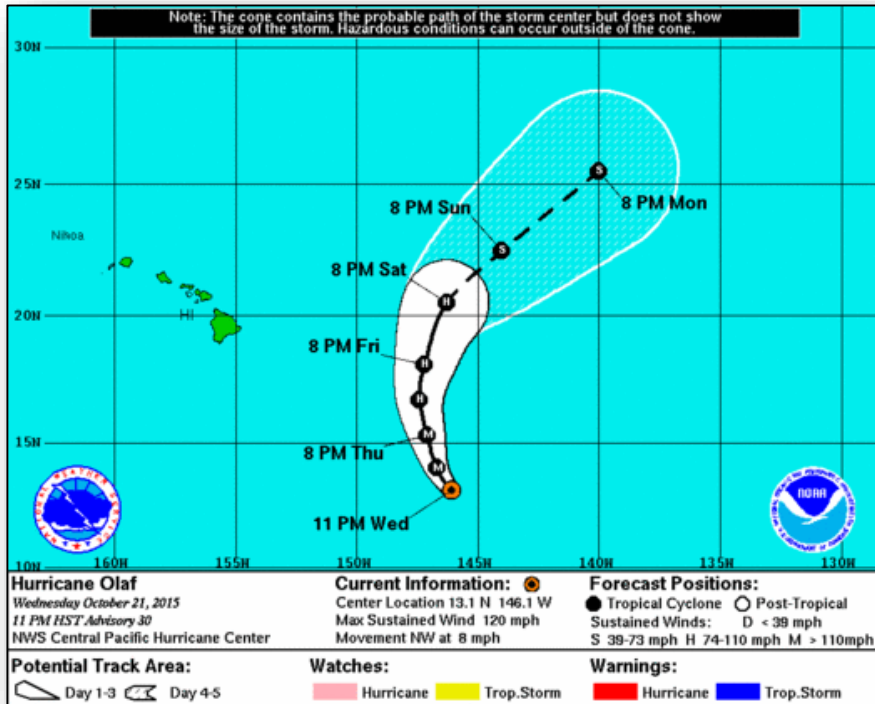
Advisory #8a as of 7:00 a.m. EDT

- Located 235 miles SSW of Lazaro Cardenas, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 17 mph; turn toward NW expected later today, turn toward N by Friday
- Maximum sustained winds 90 mph; continued strengthening forecast
- Likely to become a Major Hurricane later today or tonight
- Hurricane force winds extend outward up to 25 miles from center; tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 115 miles from center

2 Day Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



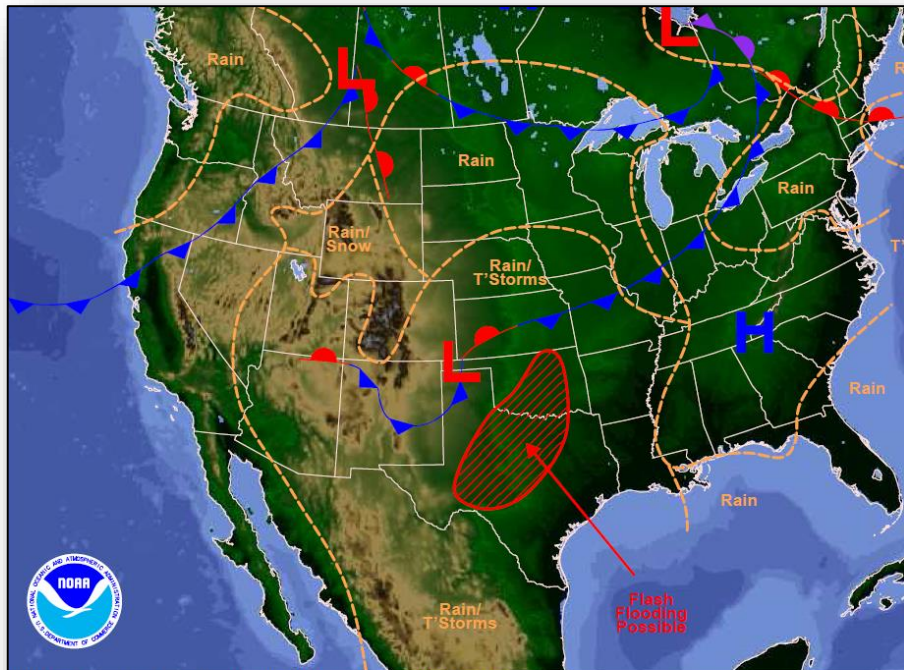
Central Pacific – Hurricane Olaf



Advisory #30 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT

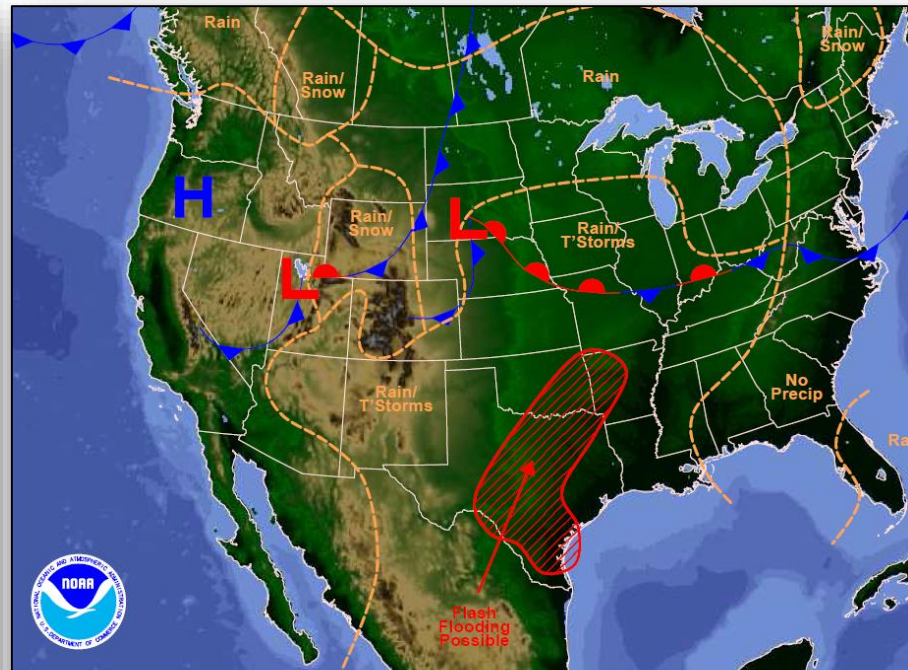
- Located 750 miles SE of Hilo, Hawaii

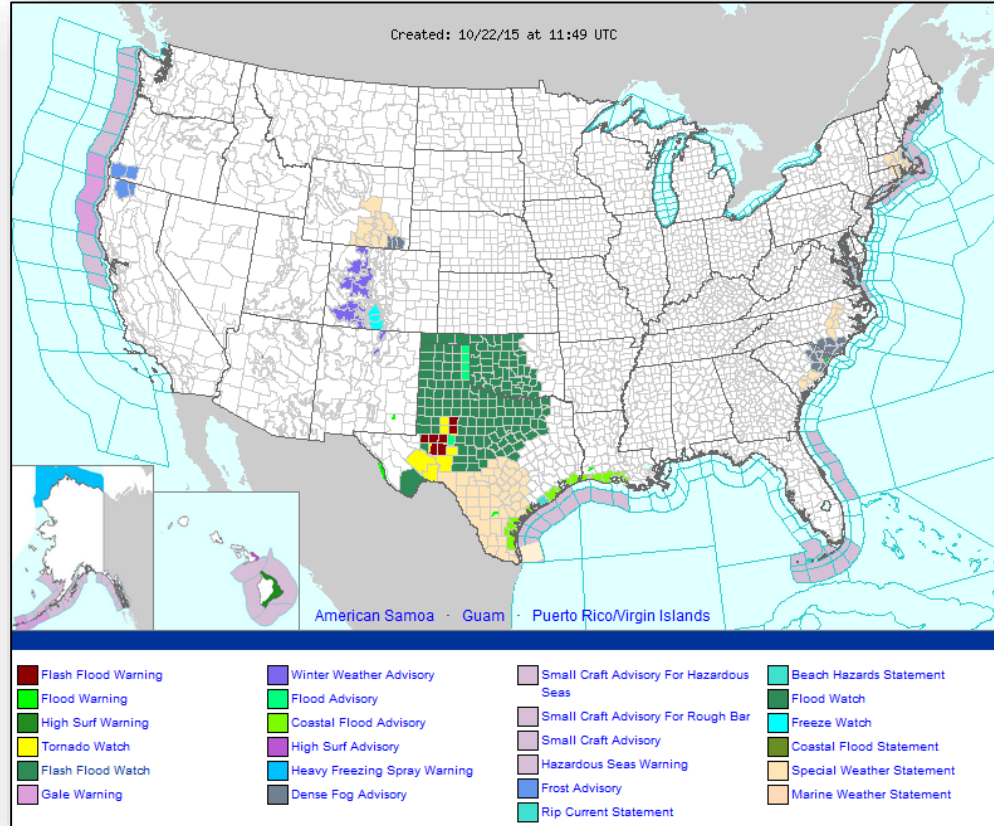

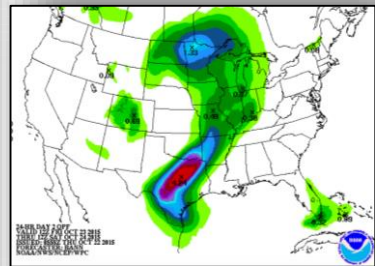
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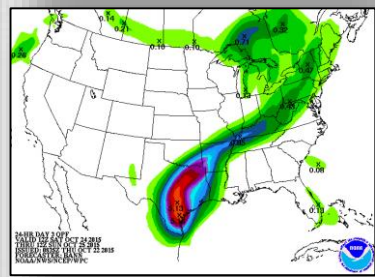
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day

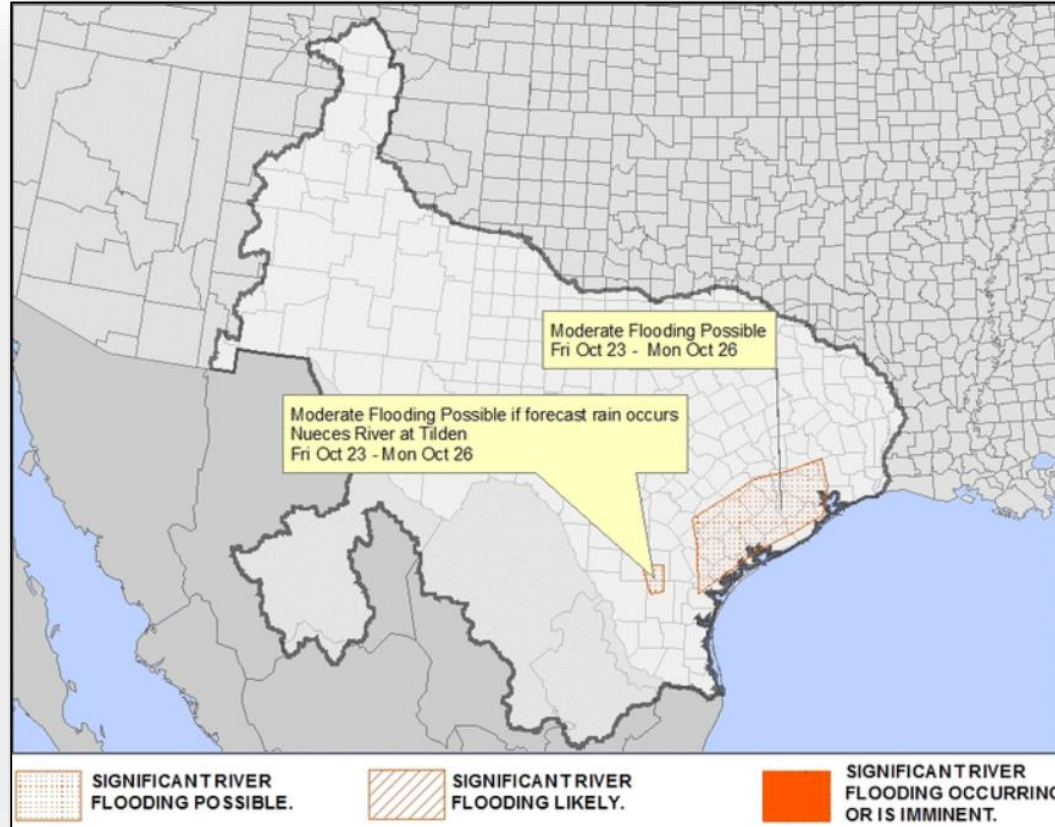
Flash Flood Potential, 1-3 Day



Precipitation Forecast, 4-5 Day



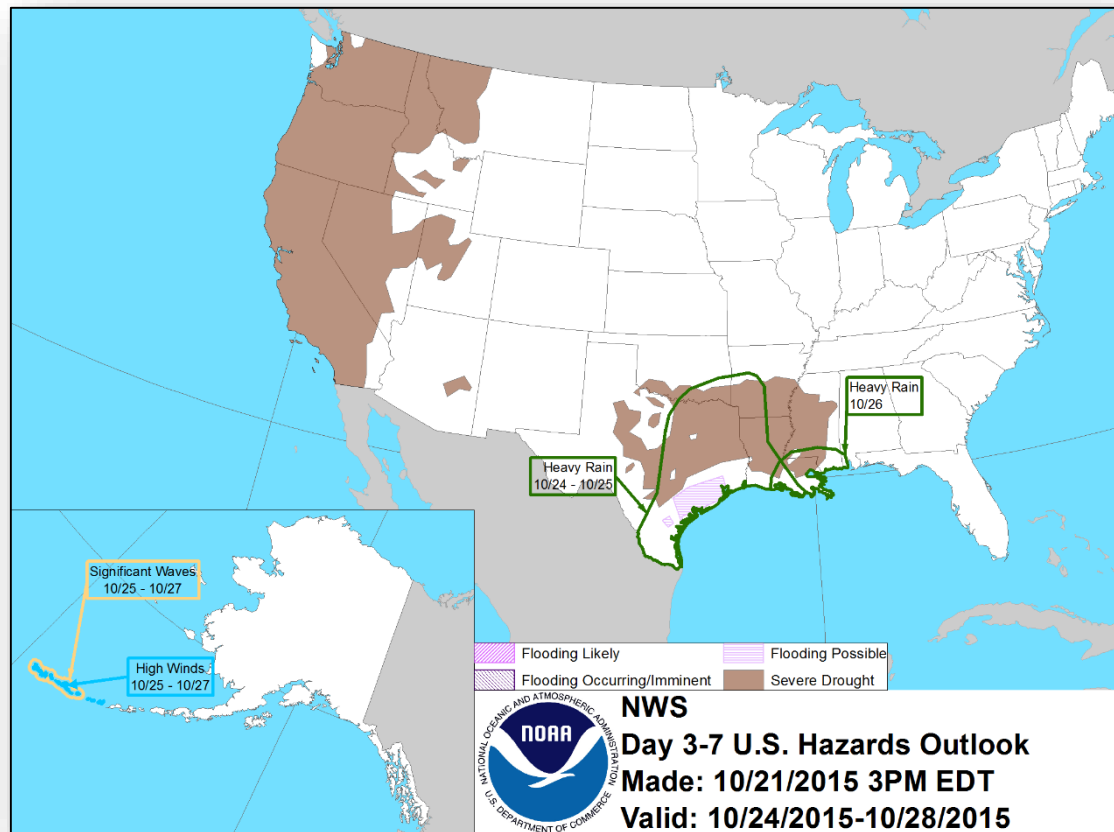
Potential River Flooding Outlook

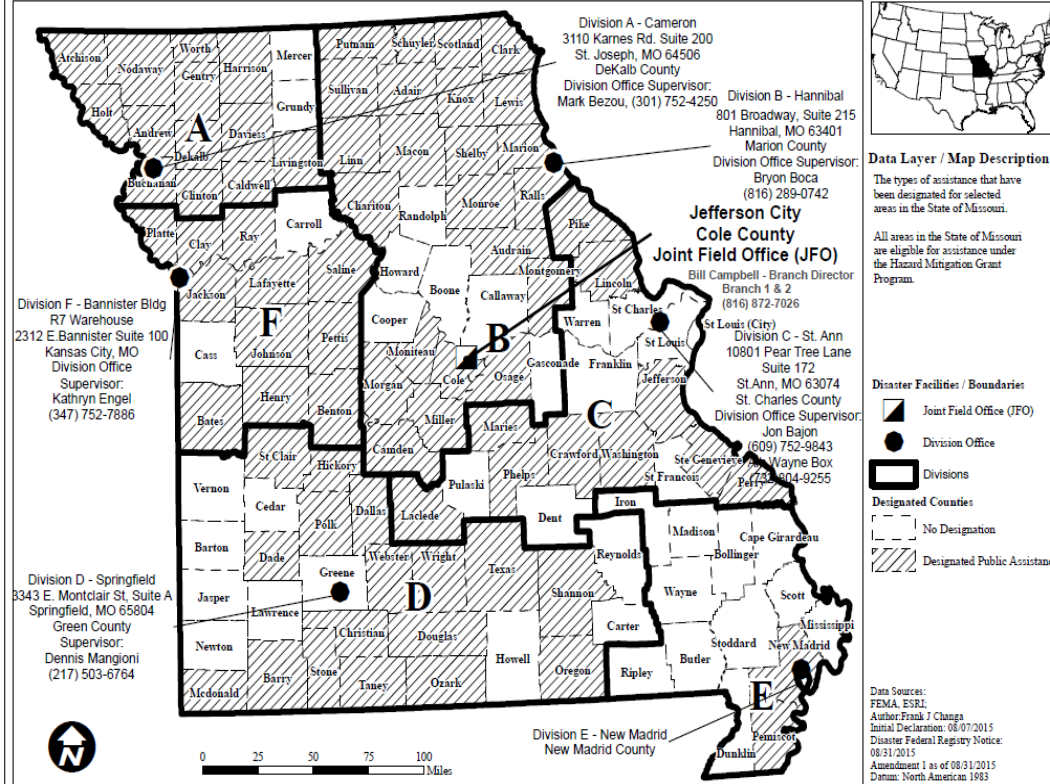

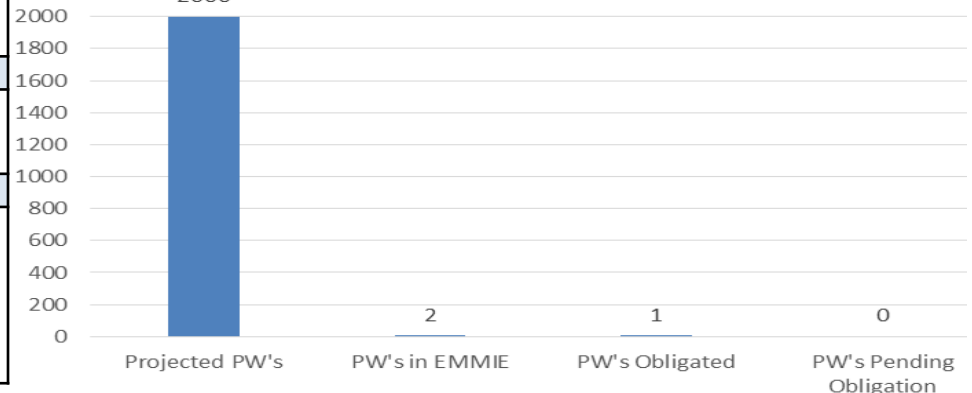

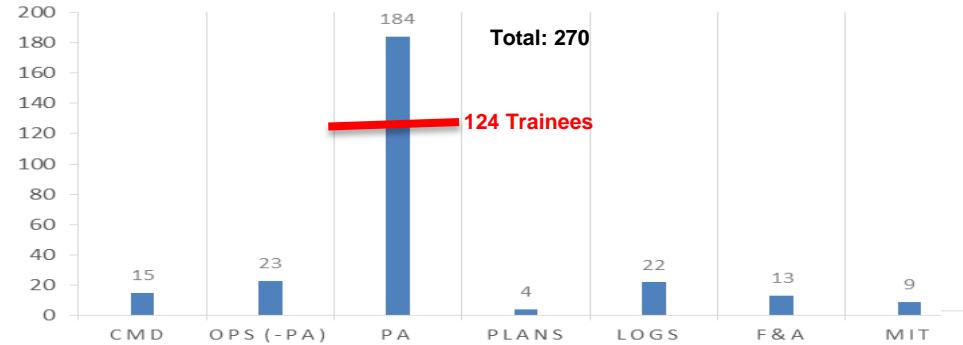

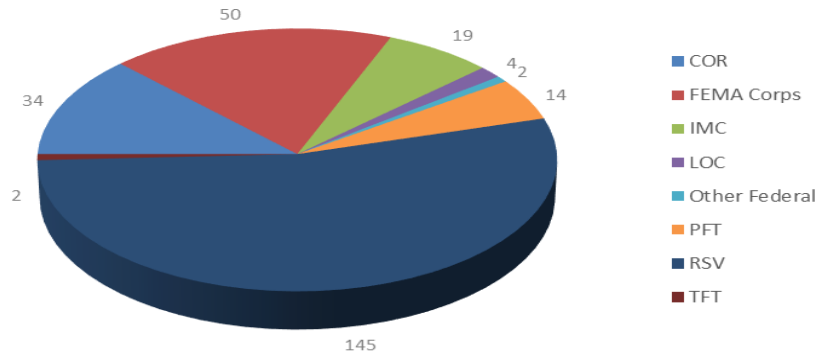

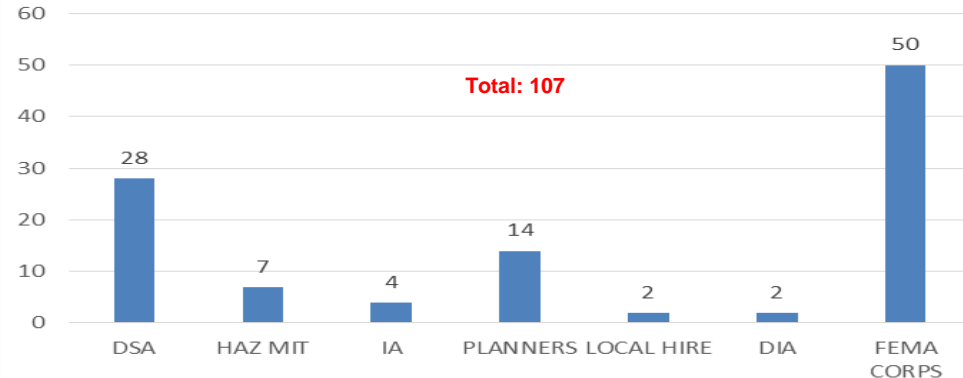
TOTAL STAFFING
