



Five-Alarm Fire – Leetsdale, PA



Current Situation:

- Approx. 10:20am EST, local media and Pennsylvania SEOC reported a three-alarm fire at Weatherford Engineered Chemical Company in Leetsdale,PA
- Hazardous material involved: Sodium Chlorite and Ammonium Persulfate

Impacts:

- 72 residents evacuated to Quaker Valley High School
- PA State Police restricted traffic in the vicinity
- PA Dept. Environmental Protection have deployed to the scene; county issued an EAS for residents to shelter in place
- Media reported 2 firefighter and 3 workers were treated for injuries (non life-threatening)

State/Local Response:

• All State EOCs are at Normal Ops, and no further request for federal assistance




2 Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic





2 Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific







- Tropical Storm-Force winds extend outward up to 125 miles








Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day








