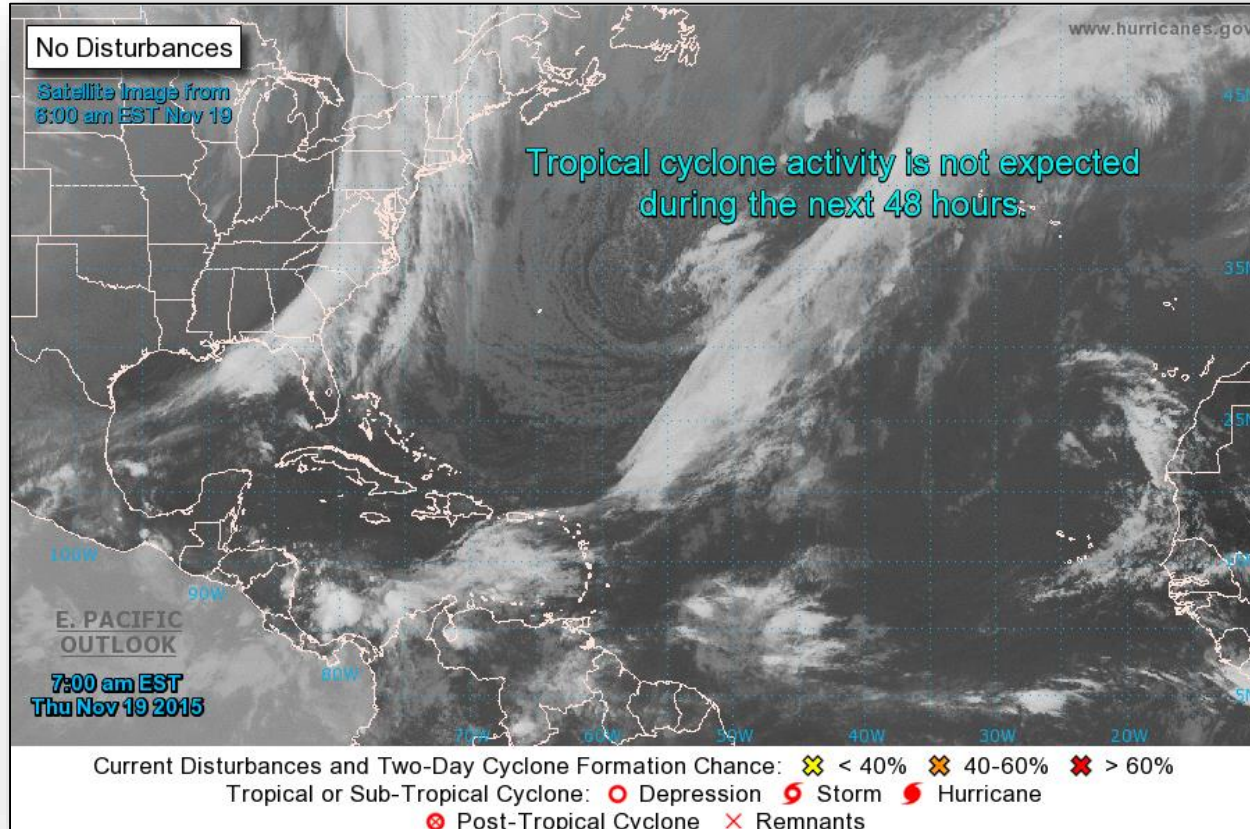

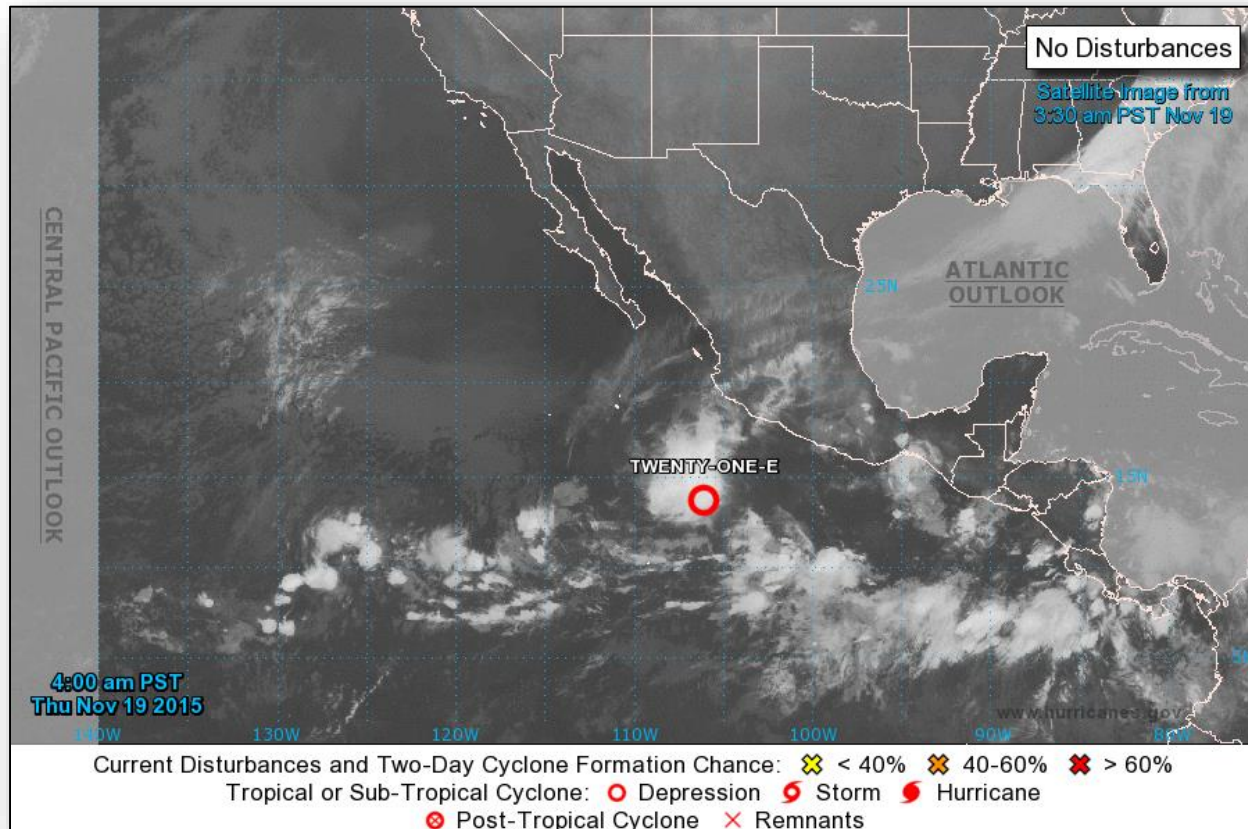




# 2 Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific

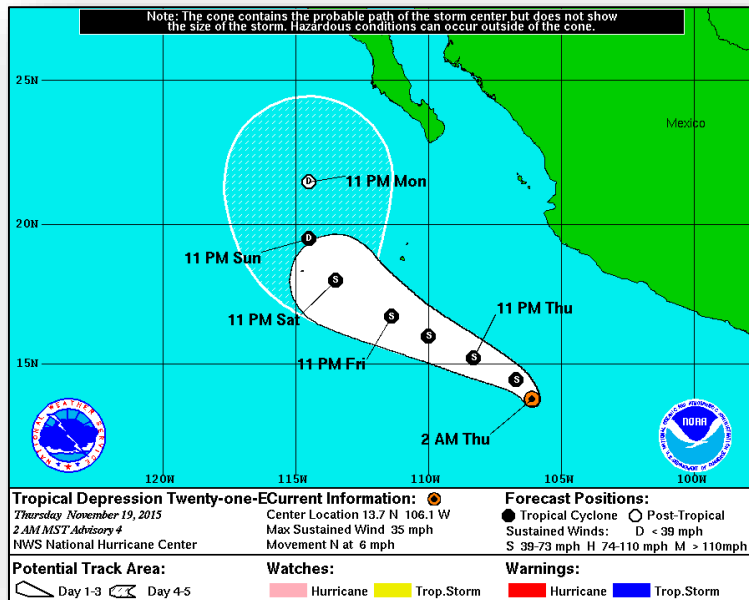


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# Eastern Pacific - Tropical Depression 21-E



## Tropical Depression 21-E, Advisory #4 (as of 8:00 a.m. EST)

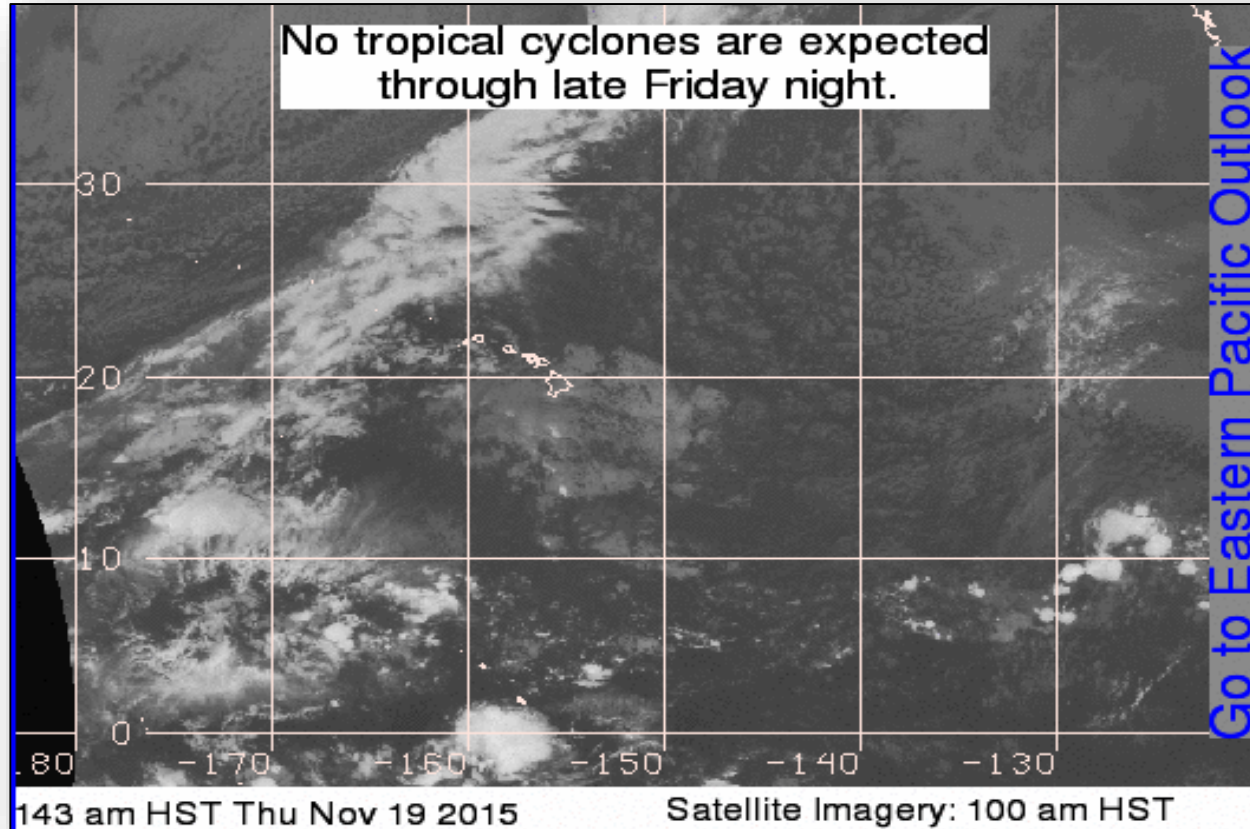
- Located 385 miles SSW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving N at 6 mph
- A turn NW expected today
- Maximum sustained winds are near 35 mph
- Strengthening possible next 48 hours
- Expected to become a tropical storm on Thursday
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect



# 2 Day Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific

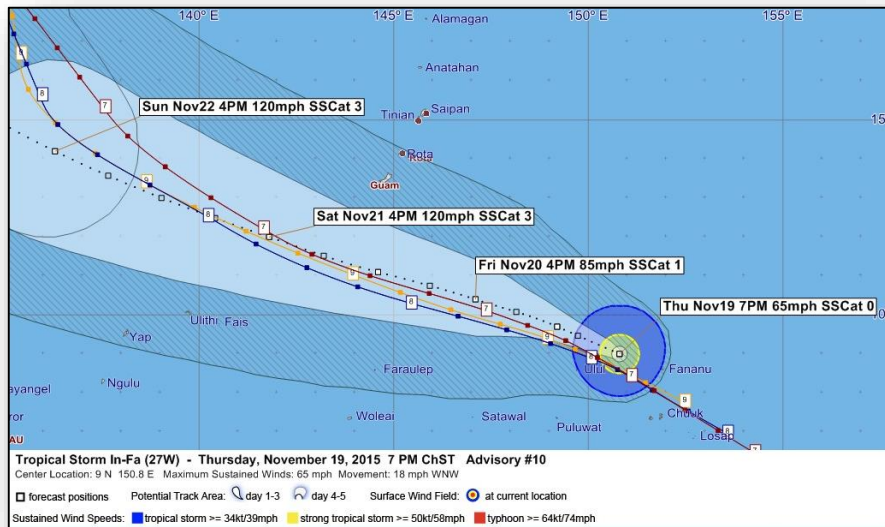


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# Tropical Outlook – Western Pacific



## **Tropical Storm In-Fa (27W) Advisory #10** (as of 4:00 a.m. EST)

- Located 550 miles SE of Guam; Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Expected to continue WNW next several days
- Maximum sustained winds near 65 mph
- Tropical Storm-Force winds extend outward up to 90 miles

## **Possible Impacts - CNMI/Guam**

- Rainfall 3-6 inches through Saturday
- Tropical storm force winds possible over Guam's southern coastal waters Friday
- High surf 9-12 ft, potentially larger this weekend along east facing beaches

## **Response**

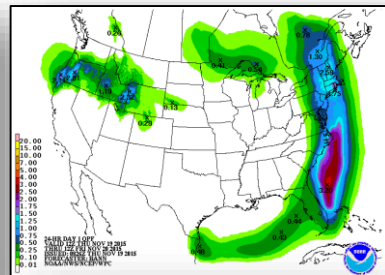
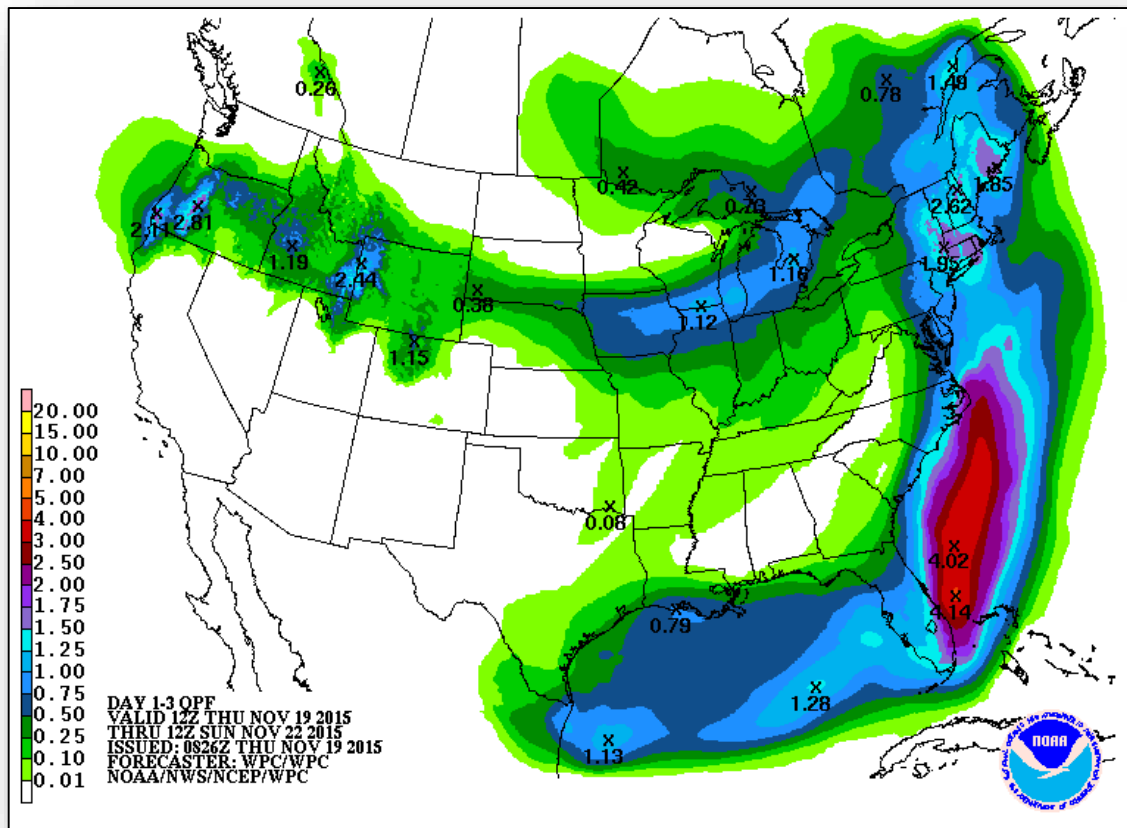




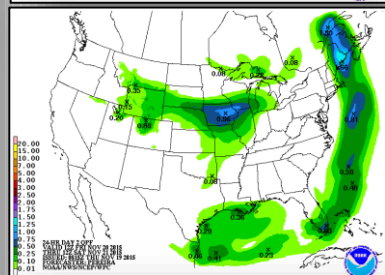
# Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



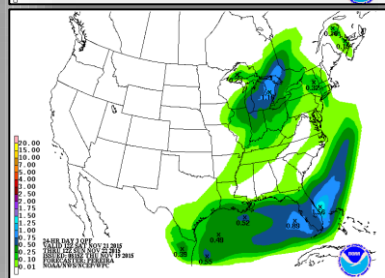
