



#### **Situation**

- Two significant lake effect snow events this past week delivered very deep snowpack (4 - 6 inches of water equivalent) to portions of western NY
- Flood Warning in effect late tonight through late Monday night
- Warming trend may reach 60 degrees on Monday
- As snowpack ripens and with addition of ½ inch or so of rainfall tonight and Monday, potential for flooding will rapidly increase
- ▲ 3 shelters open with 63 (-22) occupants (ESF-6, 3:58 am EST)

#### **Impacts**


- ▲ Minor to Moderate flooding possible
- Significant urban flooding possible; water may inundate streets & highways
- ▲ 178 buildings assessed: 62 minor, 18 moderate, 7 major damage

- No requests for FEMA assistance


### 2 Day Tropical Outlook – Atlantic






#### 2 Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific






### 2 Day Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific







#### Precipitation Forecast – 3 Day








#### **Total Forecast Snowfall**







