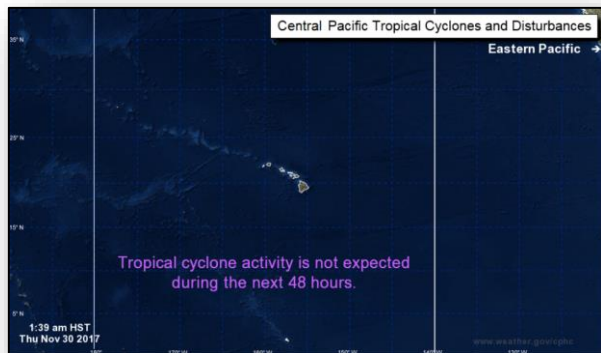

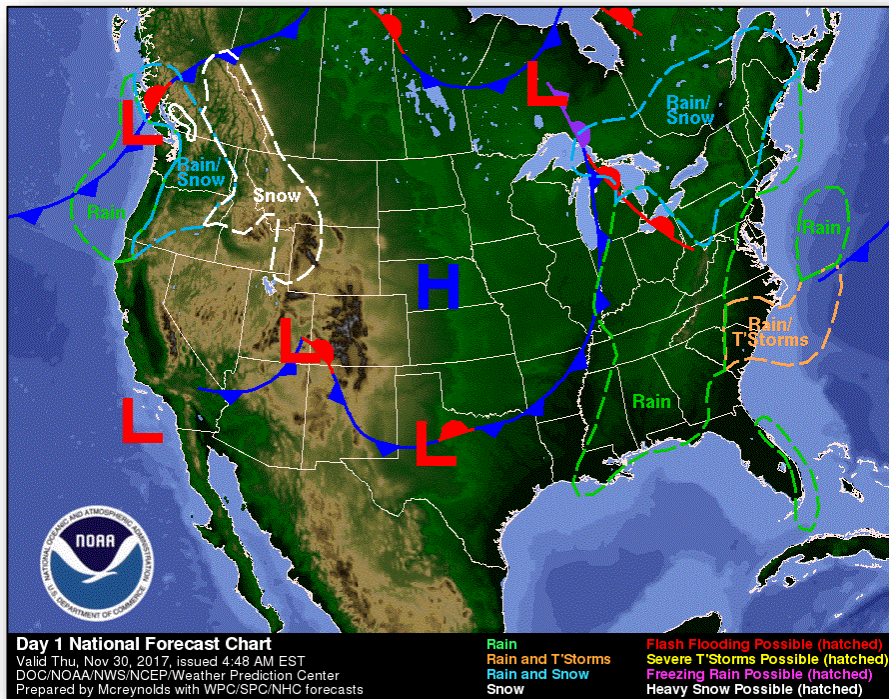

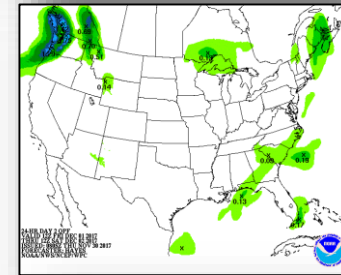
Precipitation Forecast



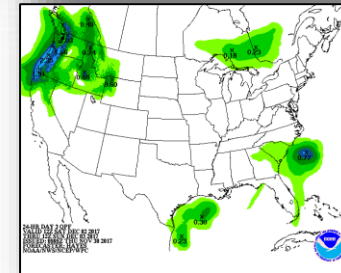

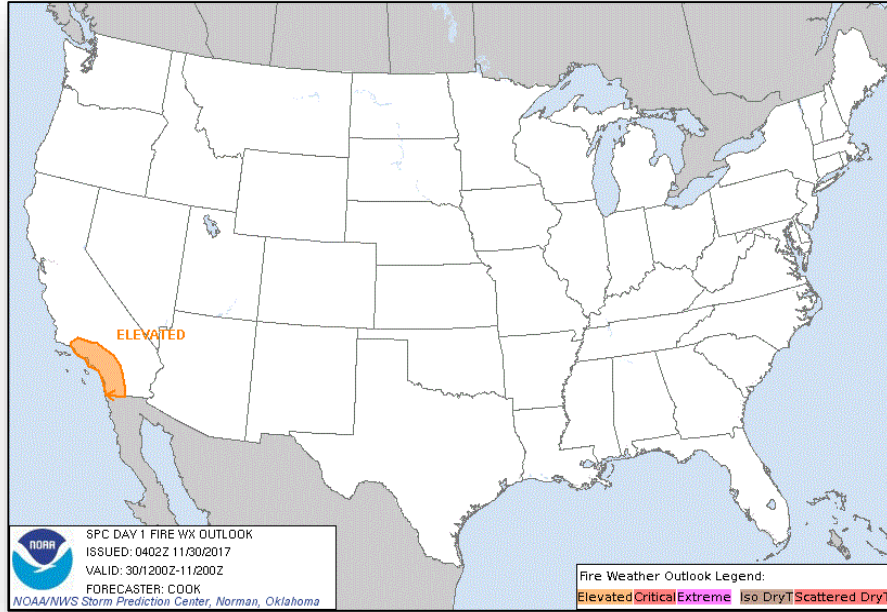

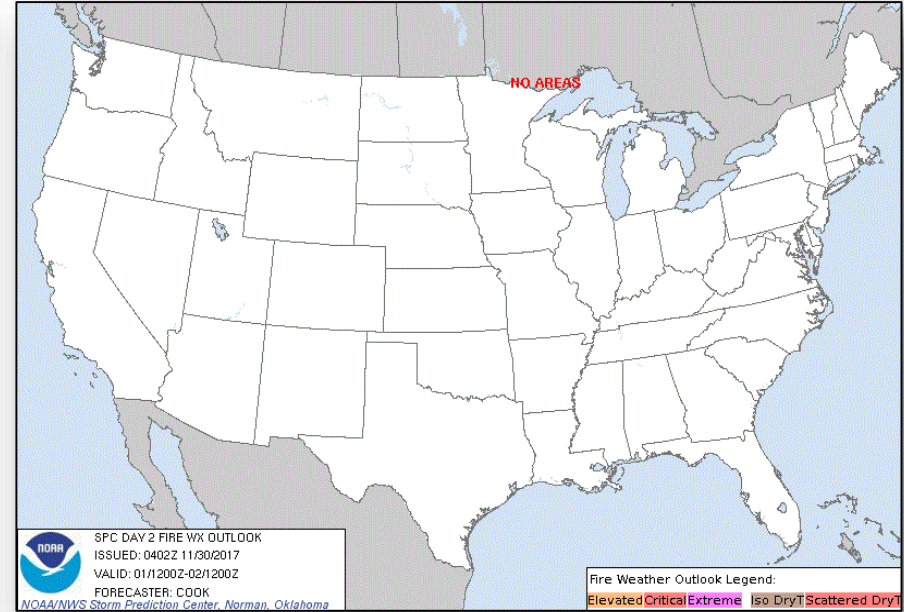
Fire Weather Outlook

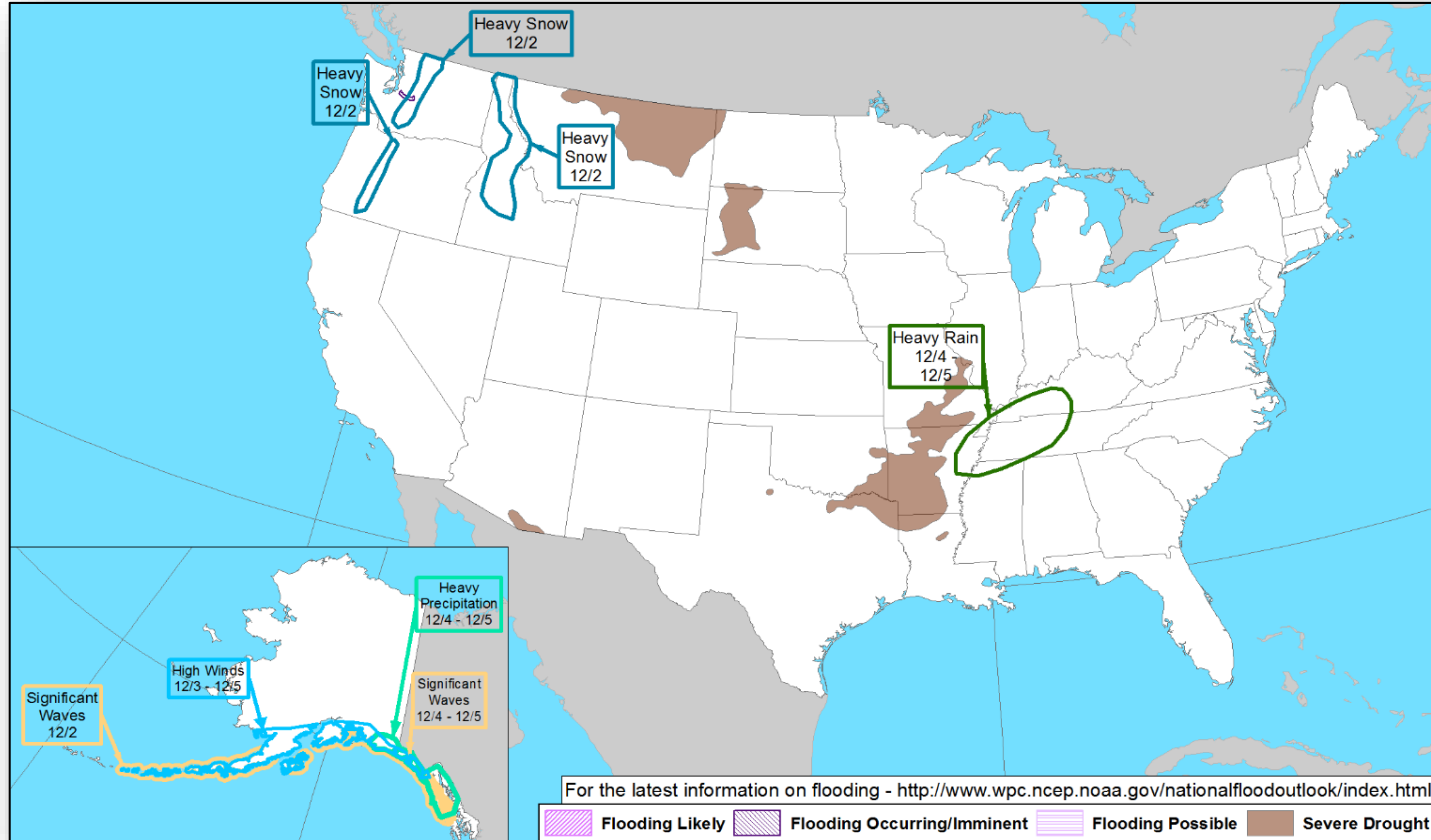

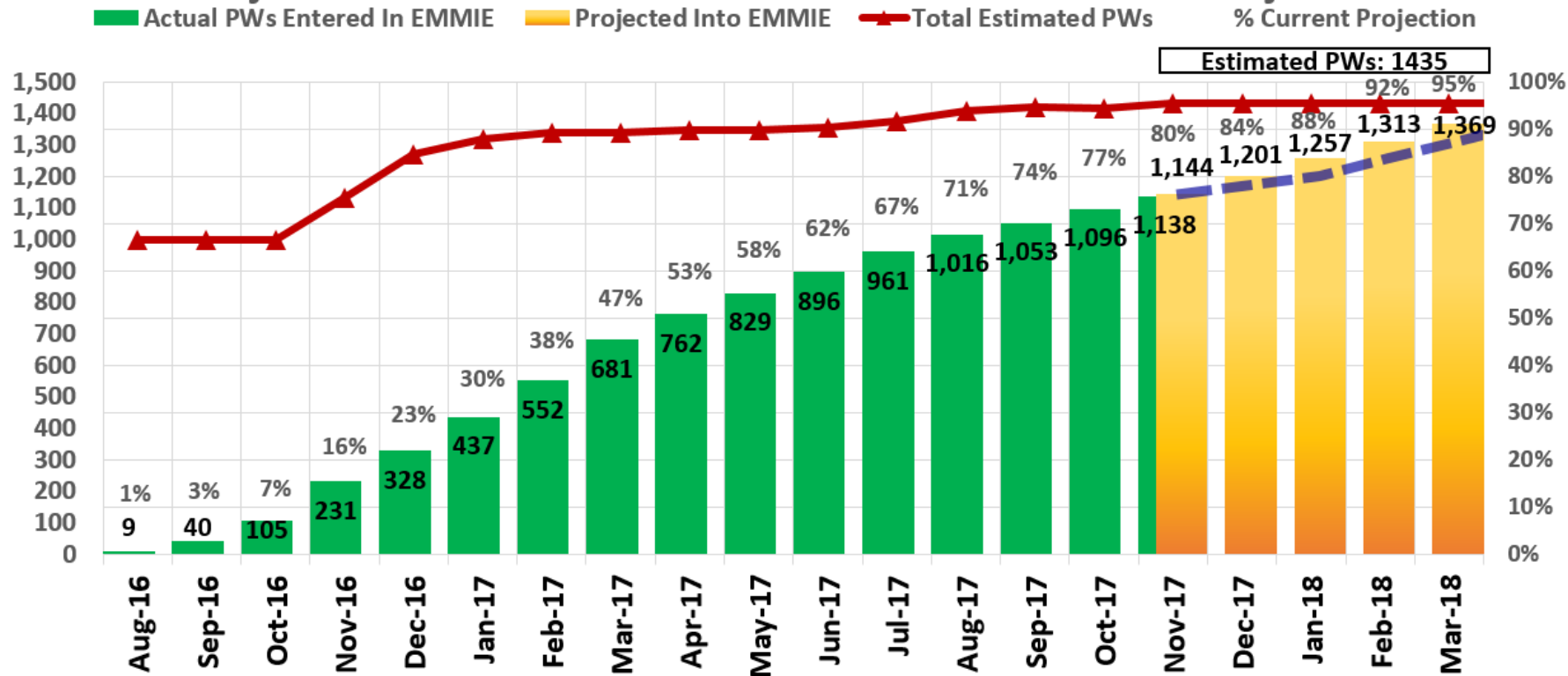

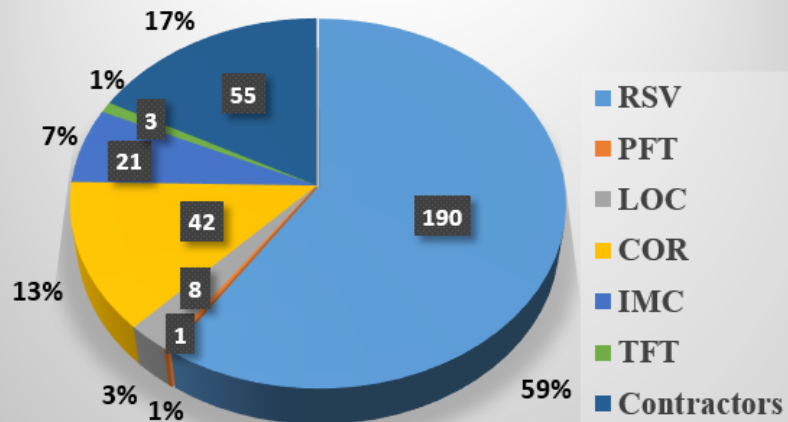

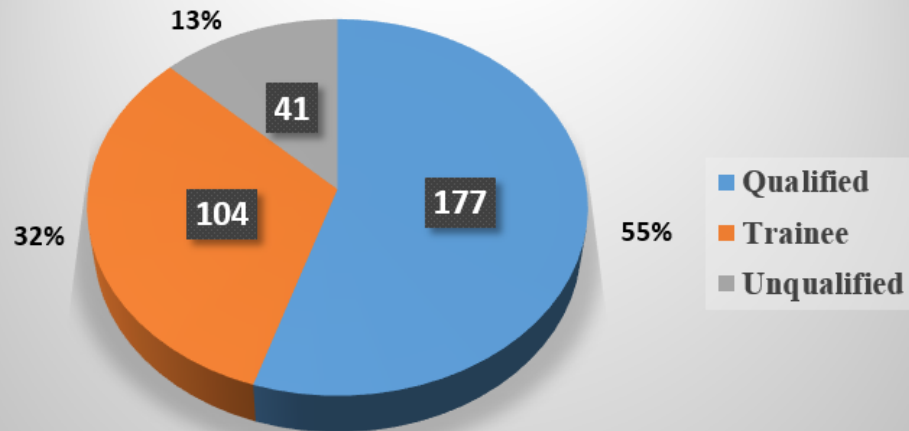
Staffing Overview
