- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. territories

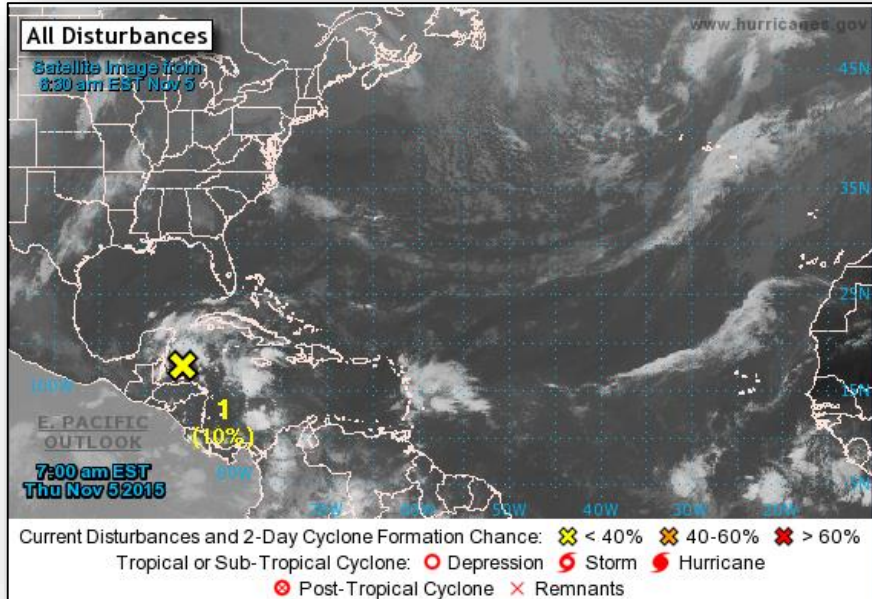

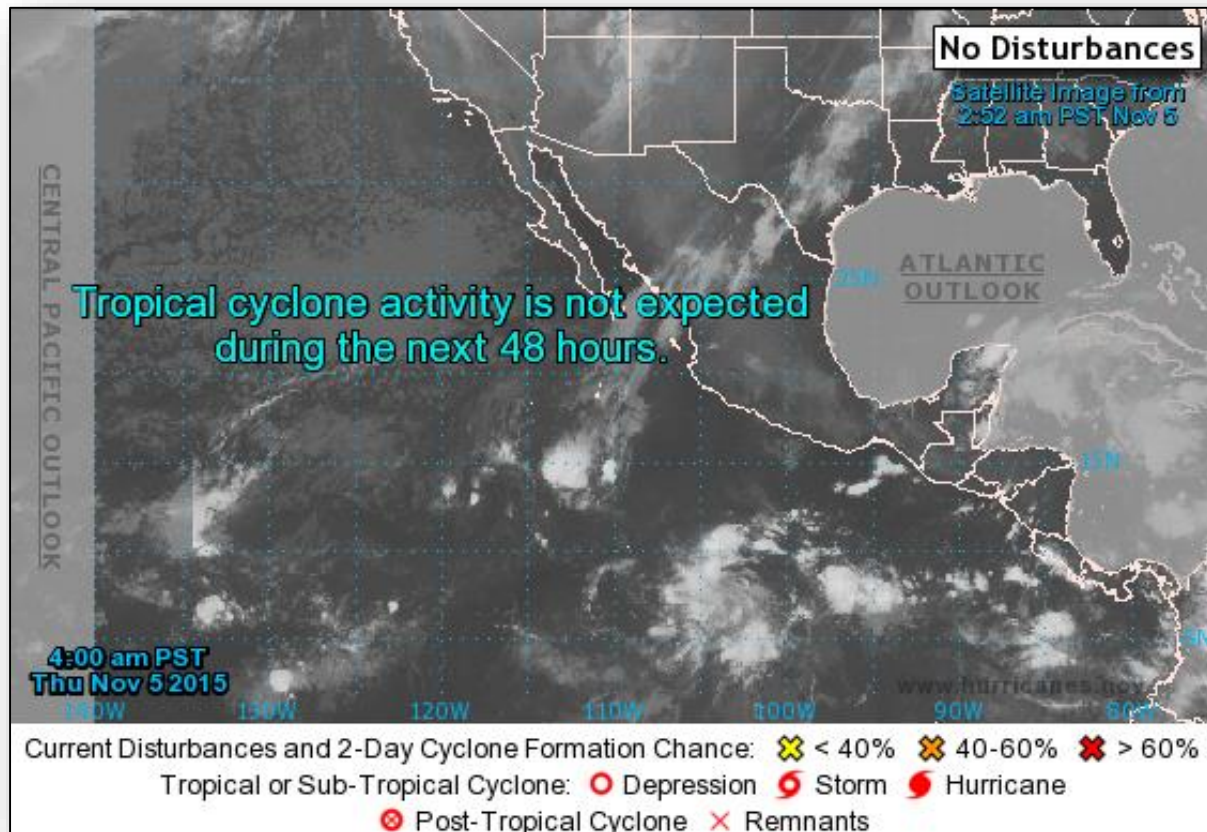

2 Day Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



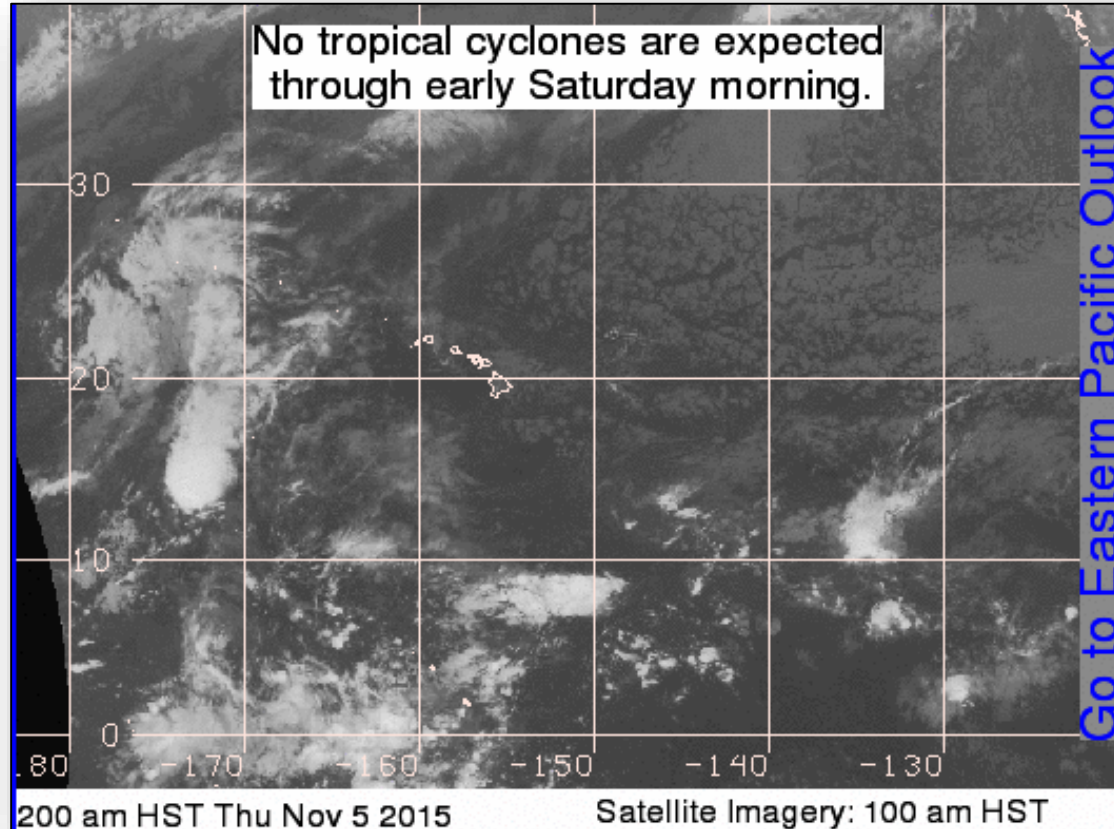

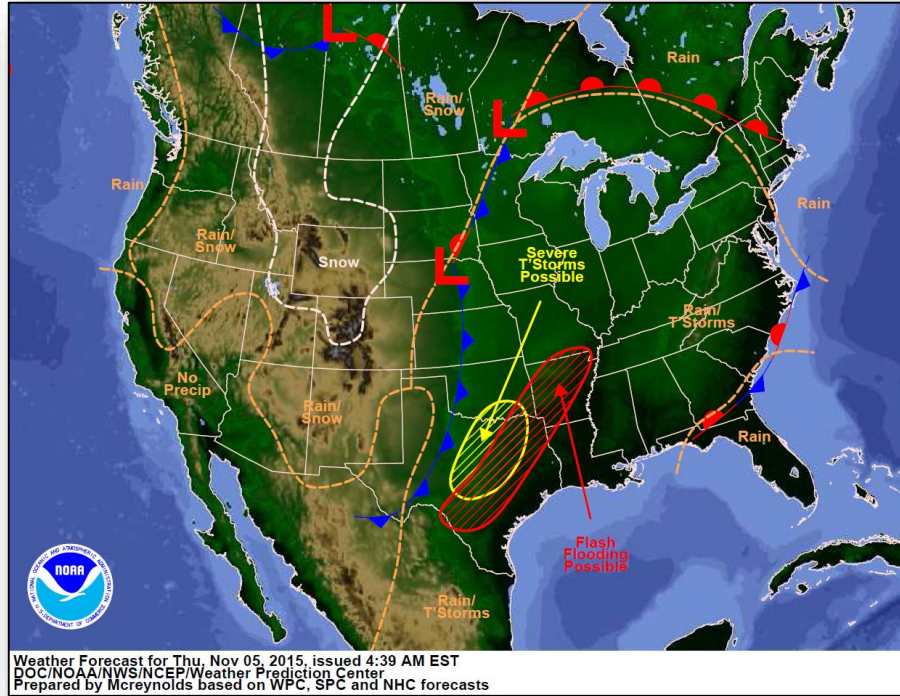
2 Day Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



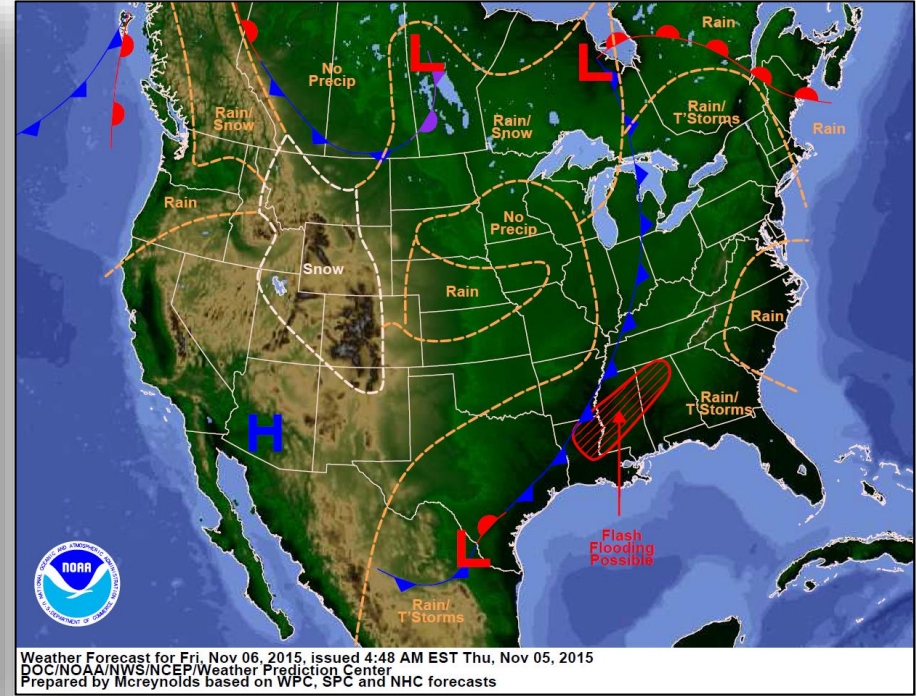

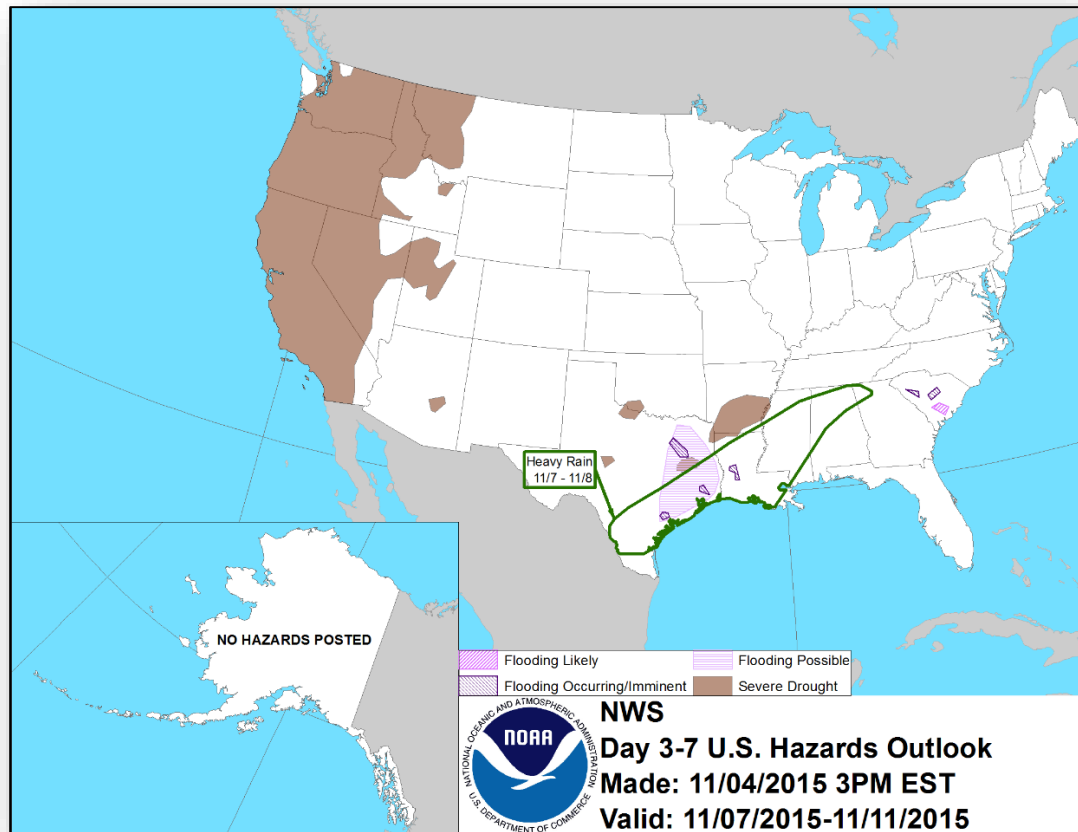
Severe Weather Outlook, Days 1-3

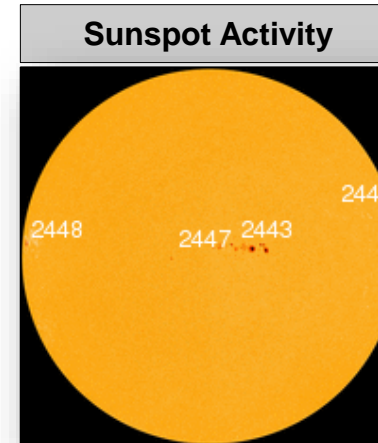
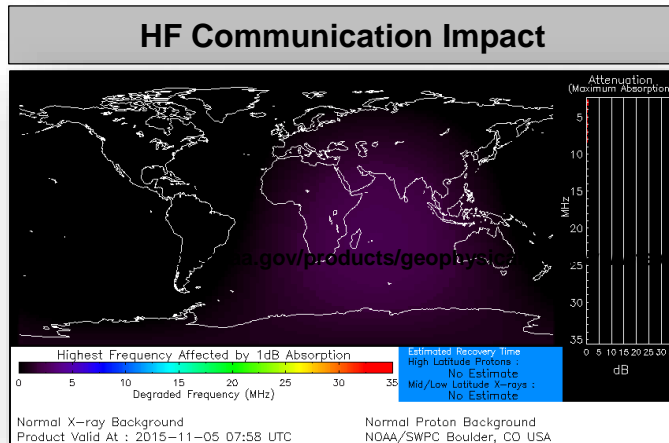

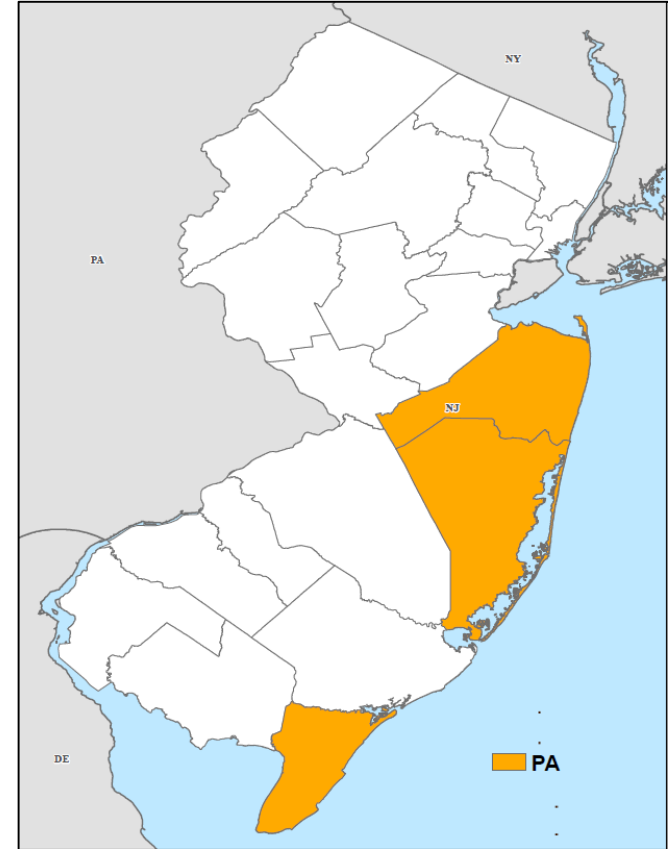


Major Disaster Declaration Request- New Jersey

 - Hazard Mitigation statewide

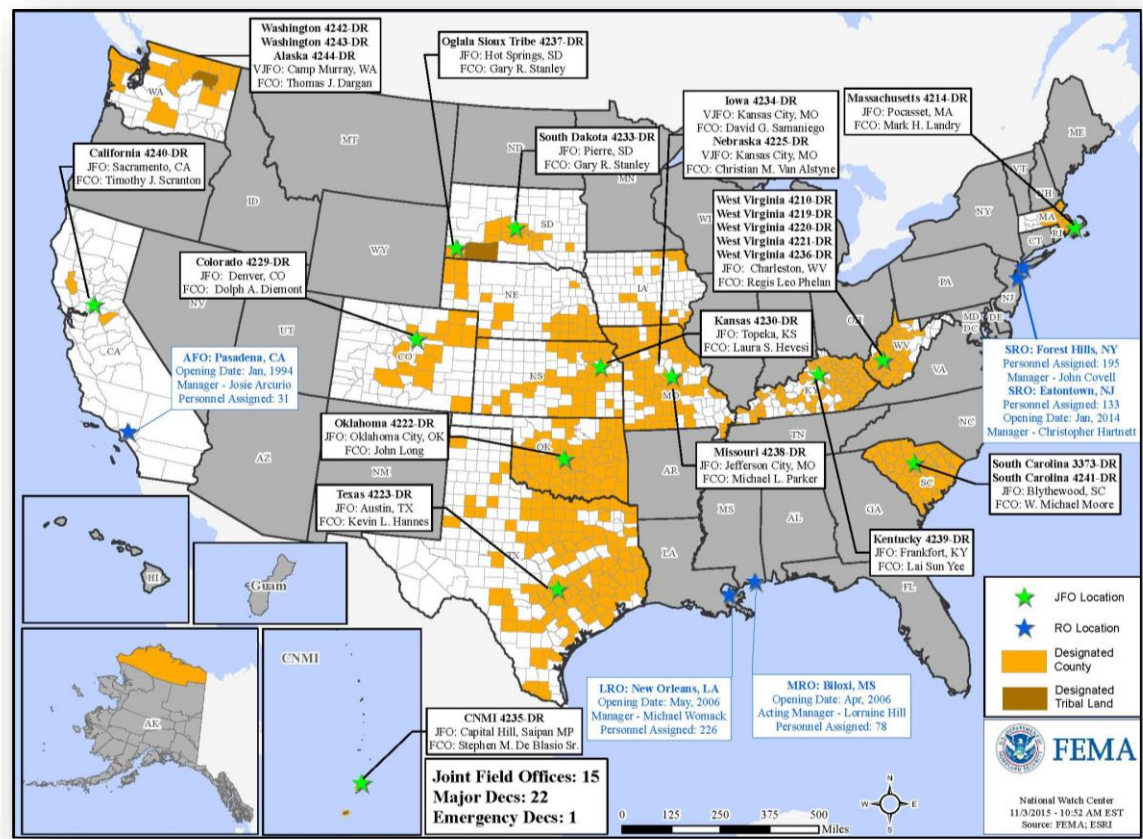

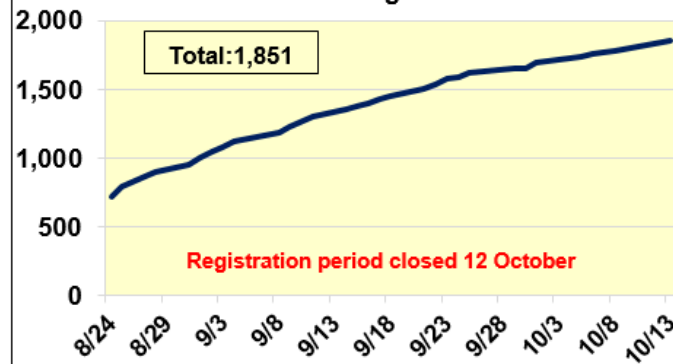

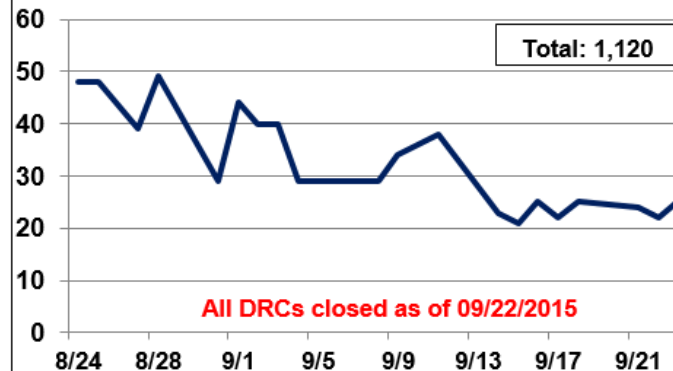

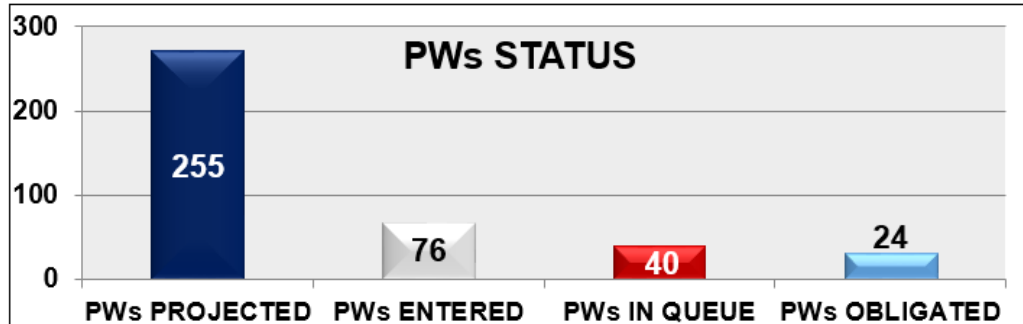

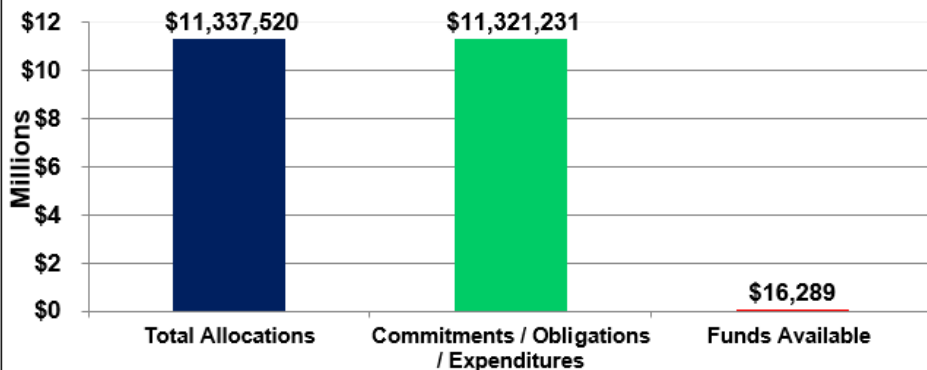

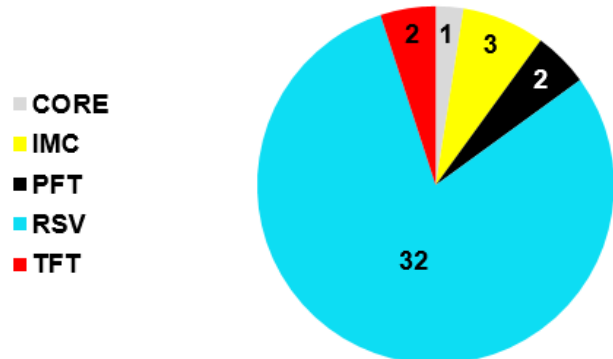

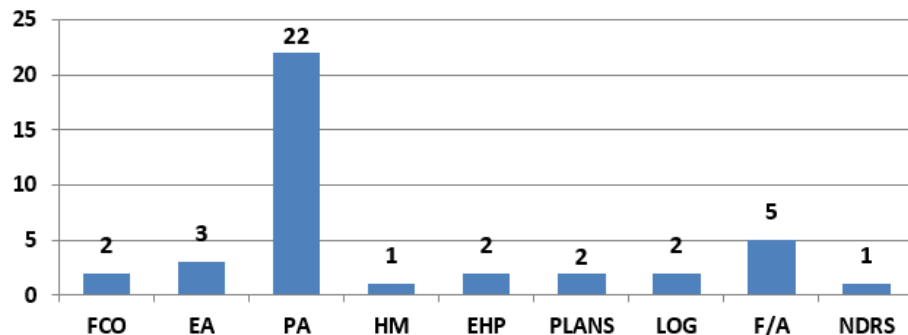
FEMA Staffing

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS / FCO COMMENTS

- IA completed a 100% review of applicant cases with the registration period in order to reduce ineligibles, appeals and recoupment of funds
- DRCs received a 100% positive review from applicants' surveys
