- Moderate to Major Flood Stage persist in western WA and the Yakima basin Impacts:
- One fatality was reported in Oregon; no other fatalities or injuries reported
- Local damage assessments continue in Washington and Oregon
- Isolated flooding and small mudslides have caused numerous road closures and rail service restrictions; a portion of Interstate 5 was closed near Woodland, WA
- Approx. 8k customers are without power across Region X (Peak was 110k)
- Open Shelters/Occupants: OR 2 w/5 occupants; WA 4 w/5 occupants




Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day






River Flood Forecast









Significant River Flood Outlook


