Current Situation

Region IX continues to monitor four large fires in Los Angeles and Ventura counties. The Thomas Fire (Ventura) is the largest with over 90k acres burned. Critical to extreme fire weather conditions will persist through Friday.

Impacts

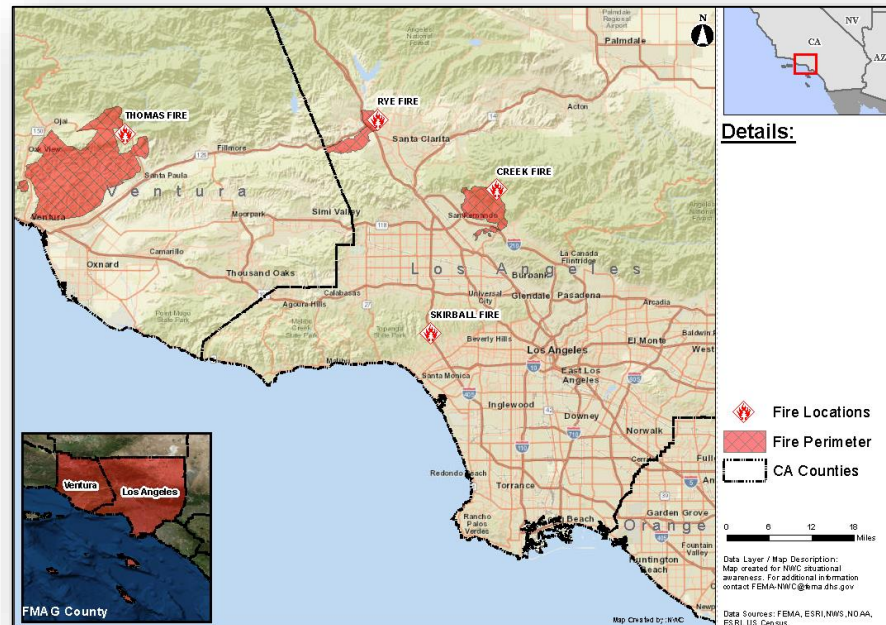
- Shelters: **13 open / 605 occupants** (*Statewide)
- Widespread mandatory evacuations are in effect: **183k**

State/Local Response

- Governor has declared a state of emergency
- CA EOC is at Full Activation

- R-IX IMAT-2 deployed CA EOC in Sacramento, CA

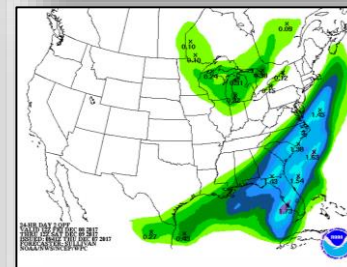
Precipitation Forecast



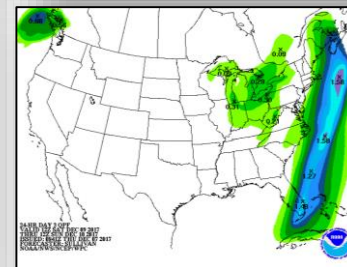

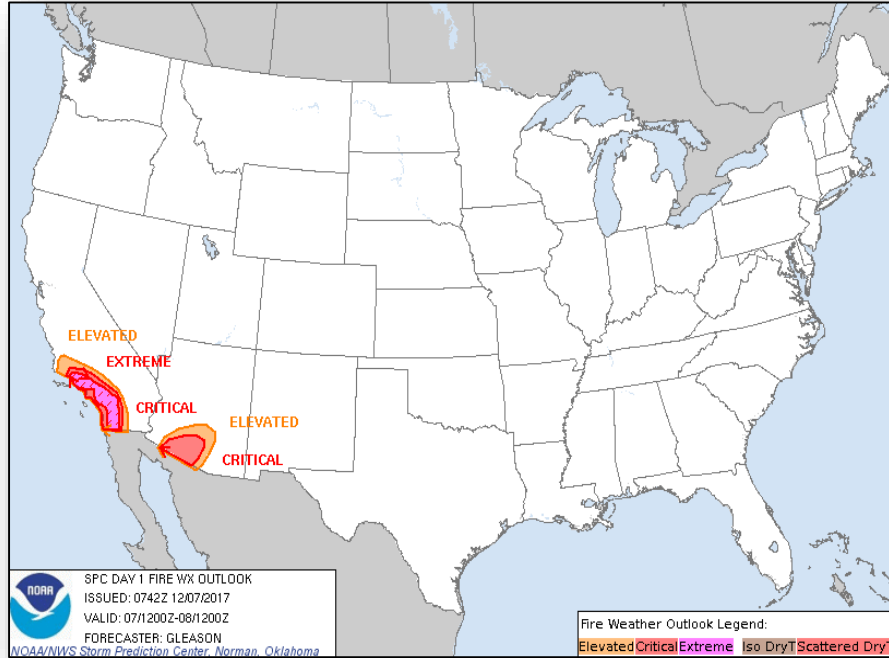

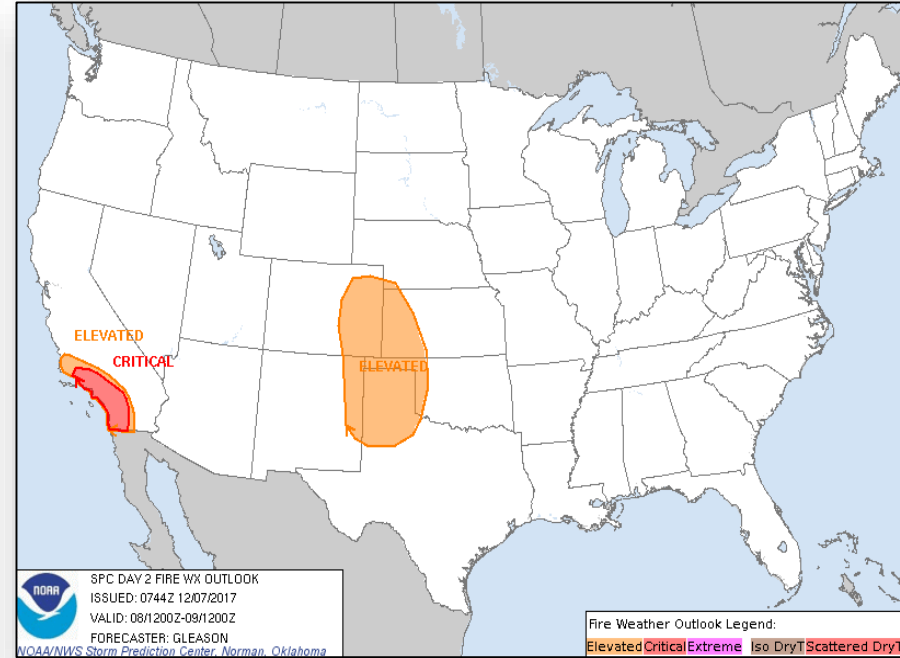
Fire Weather Outlook

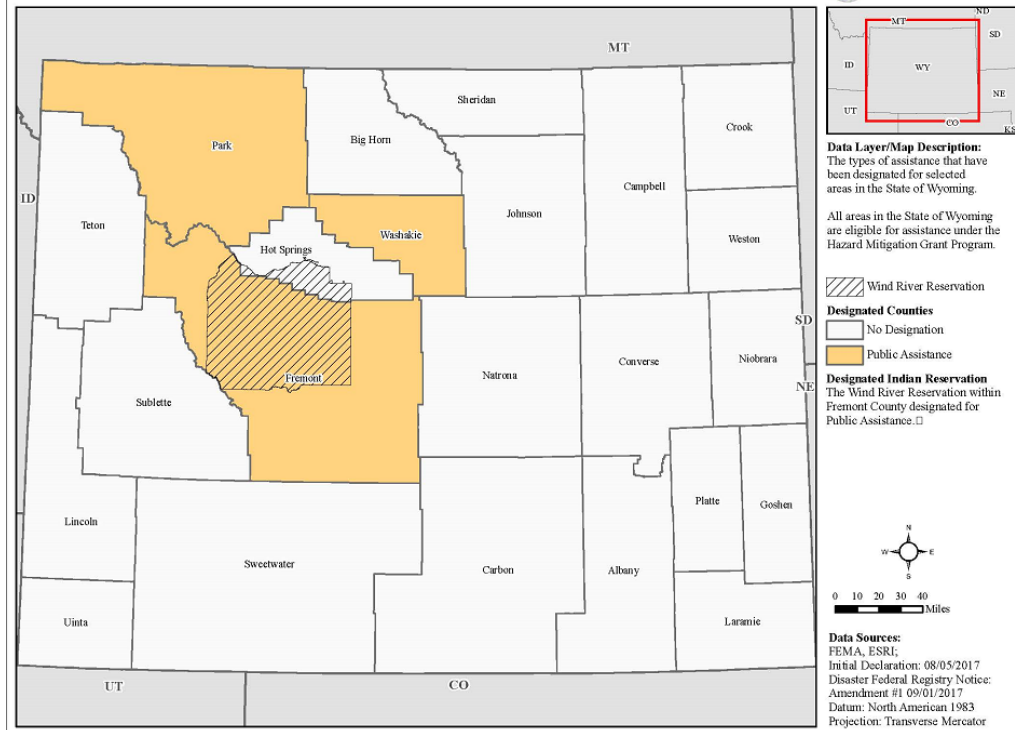
Incident Overview

On August 5, 2017, a Major Disaster Declaration was approved for the State of Wyoming designating Public Assistance (all categories) for Park County, Fremont County and the Wind River Reservation, and Hazard Mitigation statewide due to flooding. Amendment #1 on September 1 added Washakie County for Public Assistance. Amendment #2 on September 21 appointed Jon Huss as FCO in place of Tom McCool.

1. Implement and Administer New Public Assistance Delivery Model.
2. Accurate and Timely Public Information.
3. Environmental Historic Preservation Compliance.

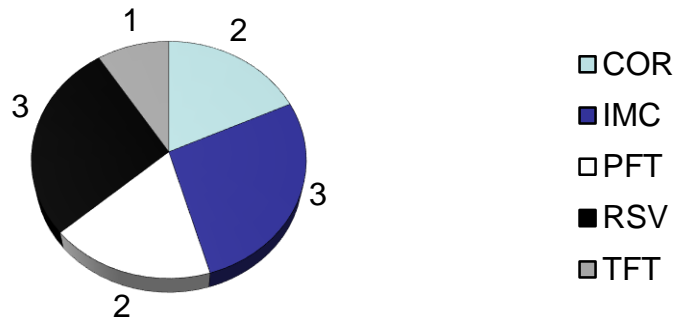

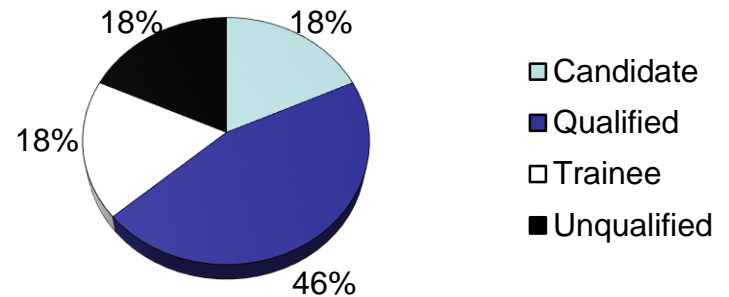
Peak Staffing
